VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 27, 4925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo, in the week were 122 (8 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 12 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 25.0. The weekly average for last year was 27.6.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 174 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 109 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 21 Moors, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 35.6, as against 34.2 in the previous week, 22.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 174 total deaths, 50 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

⁹Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty six deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 16 in Maradana hospitals (including 7 deaths of non-residents), 4 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 33 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Thirteen deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), and Maradana East, as against 18 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Eleven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North and New Bazaar, and 1 in Kotahena South, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. Twelve deaths from Philisis were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South, 2 in New Bazaar, and Leach in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Maradana North, as against 17 in the previous week, and 13 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Six deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 3 in Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Pettah, Maradana hospital, and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Seventeen deaths were registered from Debility, 14 from Infantile Convulsions, 11 from Enteritis, 8 from Dysentery, 7 from Diarrhox, leach from Worms, and Peurperal Sepicæmia, and 37 from Other Causes.
- 5. Twenty seven cases of Chickenpox, 11 of Enteric Fever, 5 of Measles, and 1 of Plaque were reported during the week, as against 23, 19, 16, and 5, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.7°, against 82.2° in the preceding week, and 81.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.771 in., against 29.821 in. in the preceding week, and 29.868 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 6.48 in., against 1.64 in. in the preceding week, and 2.10 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

No. 2,044.—The Anode Rubber Company, Limited, of 15, Throgmorton Avenue, London, E.C. 2, England, seek leave to amend the Specification of Application numbered as above for "Process and device for the direct production of rubber sheets and moulded articles from latex" alleging as the reasons "For the purpose of more clearly describing the invention and its uses."

The proposed amendments are as follows:—

On Page 2.

Line 2.--Inserting "rubber coated fabrics and threads" after "sheets."

On Page 4.

Deleting page 4 and substituting a new page 4 as follows:--

From literature on the subject it would appear that in the treatment of rubber latex by the action of electric current, laboratory experiments have already been made with a membrane of parchment inserted between the anode and the cathode as a means for preventing coagulation of the rubber on the anode, *i.e.*, for the specific purpose of obtaining merely an uncoagulated concentrate.

Closer investigation of this phenomenon has shown, however, that in spite of preventing the rubber deposit from coming into direct touch with the anode by a semi-permeable diaphragm, coagulated deposit can be obtained if the pressure and density of the electric current is sufficient to obtain a really homogeneous rubber deposit. The rubber deposit obtained on a semi-permeable backing, leaving between the anode and the rubber deposit free escape for the gases liberated at the anode as a result of the electrolysis taking place simultaneously with the electrophoresis, is a really homogeneous one.

The new process is based on the circumstance that rubber can be deposited as a homogeneous, thick and smooth layer, if a supporting surface consisting of a permeable and non-conducting material serving as a backing or mould for the formation of the electrophretic rubber precipitate is inserted between the anode and cathode and lowering the escape of the gases liberated at the anode either by the own porosity of said backing or mould or through a layer of electrolyte interposed between said backing and the anode. After removal from the bath and drying, said rubber layer is no longer peptisable when once dried and forms a transparent, homogeneous rubber skin of high elasticity and tensile strength.

The expression "non-conductive" as used above is not intended to imply that the substance of the backing should be deemed to be limited to an absolute non-conductor of electricity but merely that the resistance of the substance of the permeable backing when permeated with liquid electrolyte is greater than the resistance of the electrolyte filling the pores of the backing so that the current passes mainly through the electrolyte and not through the substance of the backing.

No fully satisfactory explanation for this behaviour of the rubber emulsion could so far be found, but extensive research on the subject would justify the assumption that the coagulation referred to may be due to acid anions liberated at the anode. This explanation will hold good, however, in certain cases only, but not in such cases where coagulation takes place and yet it has not been possible to demonstrate the presence of acid anions. In such cases coagulation is presumably caused by coagulating ions going into solution from the anode, or from the backing for instance, if this latter consists of gypsum.

If preferably clear rubber skins or articles are to be produced, the latex is first subjected to purification, if desired also to concentration, for example by centrifuging.



BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The driver of any motor vehicle licensed for hire shall not stand or permit the same to stand for hire in any street within the Ratnapura Urban District Council area otherwise than on a stand or place specially appointed for that purpose except for loading and unloading.

2. Any person committing a breach of the above by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

"THE CEYLON TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, 1908."

PULES made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 7 of "The Ceylon Telegraph Ordinance, 1908," as amended by Ordinance No. 10 of 1923.

Rules referred to.

1. No person shall establish, maintain, or work telephone lines, instruments, and exchanges unless such person has obtained in that behalf a licence from the Postmaster-General.

2. Licences for establishing, maintaining, and working telephone lines, instruments, and exchanges, hereinafter called the "Telephone System" shall be granted subject to the following conditions:—

(a) That the area within which a telephone system is to be established, maintained, and worked shall be specified.

(b) That a royalty of Re. 1 per annum shall be paid to the Postmaster-General on each telephone instrument connected to the said telephone system whether as a main instrument, operating set, or an extension, and not merely on each line connected to the exchange switchboard, provided that the system is not worked on a profit making basis.

on each line connected to the exchange switchboard, provided that the system is not worked on a profit-making basis.

(c) That should it be at any time established to the satisfaction of Government that the said telephone system is being worked on a profit-making basis, a higher scale of royalty (to be fixed by Government in each case) will be charged for each telephone connected to such system.

(d) That all connections to the said telephone system shall be notified to the Telegraph Authority within one week of the date of connection.

(e) That the Telegraph Authority shall have access to all exchange premises within the specified area during the hours they are open for business, and upon giving 24 hours' notice in writing to any other premises containing any portion of the telephone system.

(f) That Government reserves the right to take over the said telephone system and its connections at any time, the price to be paid to be settled by agreement or arbitration, without any allowance for profits or goodwill; but Government will in no case take over any apparatus or material which is, in the opinion of Government, not up to a proper standard.

(g) That neither the said telephone system nor any part of it shall be sold or leased to any person or any company as a working concern.

(h) That no connection will be given with the Government trunk or junction telephone lines if established in the neighbourhood unless the licencee's system is placed on a metallic circuit basis, and the construction and apparatus is passed as fit for-this purpose by the Telegraph Authority.

(i) That such connection, if given, will at once be withdrawn if it is found that the system is not being worked by a competent English-speaking operator, and is not in other ways efficiently maintained.

(j) (1) That no charge shall be recovered for the initial inspection of the said telephone system made for the purpose

of ascertaining whether it is in an efficient condition for trunk connection.

(2) That the following charges shall be payable for every subsequent inspection of the said telephone system made for the purpose of ascertaining whether it is maintained in an efficient condition for trunk connection, and for every inspection made for any other purpose and solely in the interests of the said telephone system:—

(k) That the Postmaster-General shall at the end of every month cause to be rendered to the licencee or his representative an account for all fees due on trunk, junction, or "disturbance" calls made by the subscribers to the licencee's system, and the licensee shall settle such accounts within fourteen days of receipt.

(l) That the licencee having access to the general trunk system shall purchase from the Postmaster-General copies of every edition of the "Ceylon Post Office Telephone Directory" and supply a copy to every subscriber to the system.

(m) That where trunk service is afforded the Postmaster-General shall show in the Telephone Directory the names of the subscribers connected to the licencee's system in such a manner as is approved by him from time to time, and any alteration or change of name shall be paid for at the current rates for such amendments. The alteration of addresses and the insertion of names of new subscribers shall be done free of charge.

(n) That no supports, poles, stays, or struts be fixed on any public road or road reservation without the previous sanction of the Director of Public Works or the local road authority (if any). Such sanction may be withdrawn at any

time by the Governor-

(1) If such roads are required for the erection of Government telegraph lines.

- (2) If the condition of the licencee's posts or lines be allowed to become such as to constitute, in the opinion of the Government, a public danger.
- (o) That all crossings over roads and over or under telegraph lines shall be erected, or, if necessary, altered to the satisfaction of the Telegraph Authority.

(p) That it shall be distinctly understood that no monopoly is granted by this concession.

(q) That a telephone connected to an exchange of the licencee may be fitted up in a local post office within the specified area, subject to terms of a special agreement to be entered into with the Telegraph Authority.

(r) That the licence is immediately revokable on the breach of any of the conditions therein mentioned.
