Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Negombo, in the said Western Circuit, on or about Tuesday, September 1, 1925.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The following market area is hereby assigned to be public market established under the control of the Urban District Council, Kalutara, and shall be called the Kalutara South Market area, *viz.*:—The area bounded on the west by the sea, on the north by the Kalu-ganga, on the east by a line drawn from a point on the Riverside road 6 chains to the east of the Old road and running southwards to the east of and parallel to the Old road to a point 6 chains to the south of Hill street, on the south a line from the last-mentioned point due west to the sea.
2. No person shall sell within the Kalutara South Market area any meat, fresh fish, fruits, or vegetables, except in the public market or except as hereinafter provided in by-law No. 3.
3. (a) Any person may sell by public auction on that portion of the seabeach lying between the railway line and the sea any fresh fish which may be landed therein by fishing boats.
(b) Every itinerant vendor duly licensed by the Chairman may sell fresh fish within the market area in terms of such licence.
(c) Every itinerant vendor may sell poultry, fruit, or vegetables within the market area, provided he does not sell at a fixed place or does not for the purpose of such sale establish himself on the public roads or other public places.
(d) Every keeper of a licensed eating-house or tea and coffee boutique may sell ripe plantains on the licensed premises.
(e) Any person may sell young coconuts anywhere within the market area.
4. No private market for the sale of meat, fresh fish, fruits, or vegetables shall be established within the Urban District Council area without a licence from the Chairman.
5. Within the Kalutara South Market area the Chairman may, on payment to the Council of a fee of Rs. 3 for each year, payable half-yearly, issue a licence to itinerant vendors for the sale of fresh fish.
6. Any person committing a breach of any one of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for any one offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention. This clause shall not apply to persons punishable under section 162 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1920.

RULES made by the Assistant Government Agent of the District of Trincomalee, in the Eastern Province, under section 17 of "The Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917," and approved by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council in terms of section 19 of the said Ordinance.

RULES REFERRED TO.

Rules framed under Section 11 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917 for regulating Cultivation under all Irrigation Works and on all Manavari Lands in the Trincomalee District, the Assistant Government Agent being in charge of all Paddy Cultivation therein.

1. The officers appointed by the Assistant Government Agent, under section 20 A of "The Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917," as amended by Ordinance No. 22 of 1922, shall be called Irrigation Superintendents or Cultivation Officers.

2. The Vaddai Vidana is the Irrigation Headman in charge of a vaddai or a tract or series of tracts of fields, and shall hold no other appointment without the sanction of the Assistant Government Agent.

The Vaddai Kavalan is the assistant of the Vaddai Vidana. One or more Vaddai Kavalans shall be appointed, if considered necessary, by the Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer.

The Vaddai Vidana is responsible for the acts of his assistants. Vaddai Vidanas and Vaddai Kavalans shall, during the cultivation season, reside whenever possible within three miles of their vaddais, and shall not absent themselves during the cultivation season or at other times when their services are required, without making special arrangements to the satisfaction of the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer for the discharge of their duties.

The Vaddai Vidana shall ordinarily be elected by the proprietors of the vaddai, subject to the approval of the Assistant Government Agent. Provided that the Assistant Government Agent may make a temporary appointment pending the holding of an election.

3. The Vaddai Vidanas shall have entire supervision of all paddy cultivation within their respective areas, subject to instructions from and to the control of the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer.

They shall enforce these rules and bring all breaches of the same before the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer in order that prosecutions may be entered.

4. The Vaddai Vidanas shall be entitled to receive from the cultivators one maraikkal of paddy for each avanam of land sown as Vaddai Vidana's share; and when a Vaddai Kavalan has been appointed, one maraikkal per avanam in addition shall be set apart for Vaddai Kavalan's share; if more than one Vaddai Kavalan shall be appointed, this share shall be divided proportionately between them. The Vaddai Vidana and the Vaddai Kavalan shall grant a receipt for the amount of paddy drawn before the paddy is removed from the threshing-floor. The whole or any portions of these payments may be withheld if, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer, the work has been improperly performed, and he may, if he considers it necessary, cause the amount withheld to be paid to any person who has acted for a Vaddai Vidana or a Vaddai Kavalan or into the Irrigation Fine Fund.

The Assistant Government Agent may appoint a person to receive the share or portion of the share of any Vaddai Vidana or Vaddai Kavalan which he has ordered to be withheld from such Vaddai Vidana or Vaddai Kavalan. Such appointment shall be made in writing, and the Assistant Government Agent may devote a portion of such withheld share to the remuneration of the collector appointed and to the cost of collection. For the purpose of this rule an avanam shall be taken to mean 2 acres of area. The share of the crop due to the Vaddai Vidana or Vaddai Kavalan shall be handed over to such Vaddai Vidana or Vaddai Kavalan within four months of the date when the crop was reaped, and failing this the equivalent money value of such share shall be payable immediately after the expiration of this term, the money value being reckoned at the current market rate.

5. As the season for cultivation approaches, whether it be munmari, kala vellamai, pinmari, or other harvest, a meeting of the proprietors of lands concerned shall be convened and presided over by the Assistant Government Agent or some person deputed in writing by the Assistant Government Agent for the purpose.

The time and place of the meeting shall be fixed by the Assistant Government Agent or person deputed by him as aforesaid, who shall cause at least seven days' notice thereof to be published in such manner as shall appear to him best adapted for giving publicity thereto.

6. The meeting convened as in rule 5 shall—

(i.) Advise the Assistant Government Agent or person deputed by him in writing as aforesaid as to—

- (a) The most suitable dates for the commencement and completion of sowing and irrigation.
- (b) The most suitable dates for furnishing dappus.
- (c) The most suitable dates for the completion of fencing.
- (d) Extent to be cultivated.

The above dates shall be fixed by the Assistant Government Agent or person deputed by him.

(ii.) Determine—

- (e) The order in which different vaddais shall be sown.
- (f) The method of cultivation.
- (g) The kind of paddy to be sown in each vaddai.
- (h) The place and manner in which black cattle and buffaloes are to be confined during cultivation.
- (i) Applications from proprietors to be exempted from cultivation duties.

7. Should it not be possible to commence cultivation on the dates fixed or if there will be insufficient water to irrigate the whole area decided on originally, a meeting convened as in rule 5 shall be called to decide (subject to the advice of the Irrigation Officer) what alterations of dates are necessary, and what proportions of the tracts are to be abandoned owing to anticipation of an insufficiency of water; provided that, should the meeting so convened not be able to arrive at a unanimous decision as regards the curtailment of the area proposed to be cultivated in consequence of a probable shortage of water, the Assistant Government Agent or officer deputed by him shall have power to decide what area of land shall be irrigated. All the proprietors or lessees of the area which it was originally decided to irrigate shall have a right to cultivate a proportional share of the reduced area. Proprietors shall carry out their cultivation in accordance with the decision of the meeting under rules 6 and 7.

8. The Assistant Government Agent or officer deputed by him shall cause the decision of a meeting under rule 6 or 7 to be published by beat of tom-tom by fixing written notices in conspicuous places or other suitable means. All proprietors shall be bound by the decisions of the meeting. Provided that, if, after due notice no proprietors attend, it shall be competent for the Assistant Government Agent or person deputed by him in writing as aforesaid either to fix a fresh date for the meeting or to decide himself all such matters as are referred to in rule 6 or 7, and his decisions will have the same validity as the decision of a meeting.

9. Each proprietor or lessee shall deliver to the Vaddai Vidana not later than on the day fixed under rule 6 (i.) (b) a list (dappu) of the mullaikkaran and cultivators to be employed in his field. This list shall be on a printed form supplied by the Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer, and shall bear the signatures of the proprietor and of the mullaikkaran and cultivators or their marks made before two witnesses. All the information required by this form shall be accurately filled in, and any person supplying false information shall be guilty of an offence. From the date of the delivery of the list the mullaikkaran and cultivators, as well as the proprietor or lessee, shall be liable for all works of cultivation, and in the event of neglect or default without sufficient reason shall be guilty of an offence.

10. In the absence of a legal document showing that another person has been placed in actual possession of the land, dappu shall be accepted, in case of dispute from those persons who furnished dappu for the preceding harvest. The acceptance by the Vaddai Vidana of a dappu involves the due observance of these rules on all persons who have signed it (witnesses excepted).

11. Should it be found that any proprietor does not intend to cultivate his share, the Vaddai Vidana shall submit the matter to the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer who may, if possible, exclude such share from the tract, or may allow such share to be cultivated by any other proprietor or lessee in the tract, or failing such proprietor or lessee any other applicant having knowledge and experience of paddy cultivation, should the proprietor of such lands agree in writing thereto. Such other proprietor (or lessee) shall not be liable for any payment to the proprietor of the land, but shall be liable for everything required by these rules for the season's cultivation to the same extent as if he were the proprietor of the field thus apportioned to him. Provided that should the proprietor of the land in question not agree to its being cultivated by such other proprietor (or lessee), he himself shall be liable for all such duties as are required by these rules.

12. No proprietor (or lessee) shall be exempt from contributing everything required by these rules for the season's cultivation, unless exempted at the meeting under rule 6. In the event of any proprietor (or lessee) becoming liable for any work and failing to perform it, the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer shall inform the Assistant Government Agent in writing of the estimated cost thereof. The Assistant Government Agent shall advance the sum necessary from the Irrigation Fine Fund; the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer shall do the work and certify the sum expended, which will be recovered as provided in Chapter VIII. of "The Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917."

13. All tanks, dams, channels, water-courses, &c., not in charge of the Director of Irrigation shall be kept in a proper state of repair to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer, by the proprietors in proportion to their respective holdings. Similarly all fields shall be levelled and field ridges constructed to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer.

14. Trees or jungle on private land likely to occasion damage by giving cover to birds or wild animals shall be removed by the proprietors (or lessees) thereof.

15. Paths between cultivated places shall be kept open by the proprietors (or lessees) according to the limits prescribed by ancient custom and in proportion to their respective shares. Inspection paths through cultivated fields shall also be constructed and maintained by the proprietors (or lessees) if required by the Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer.

16. Subject to the control of the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer, the apportioning of water after it has left the irrigation works and within the tracts or vaddais shall be done by the Vaddai Vidana. During the period for which his tract or vaddai will receive water, the Vaddai Vidana thereof may cause any dam (not being a work in charge of the Director of Irrigation) which impedes the flow of water thereto to be cut and any channel (not being a work in charge of the Director of Irrigation) which is depriving it of water to be closed. Except during that period he may not interfere with any dam or channel outside his vaddai.

17. If any person shall wilfully prevent water from flowing to the field below his own, or shall obstruct the flow of surplus water from the field on a higher level, or shall in any other way interfere with the general apportioning of the water within the vaddais, the Vaddai Vidana shall proceed to the spot with witnesses and open the gaps or remove the obstruction himself, and no person shall issue, apportion, cut off, divert, or use the water in any manner except in accordance with his instructions.

18. The fence round the whole vaddai shall be measured by the Vaddai Vidana within three days of sowing being completed, and by him apportioned to the cultivators of each proprietor in proportion to the extent of the proprietor's field without regard to whether the fence adjoins his field or not. The Vaddai Vidana shall forthwith after such apportionment send a list to the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer to be filed for reference, showing the length of fence apportioned to the cultivators of each proprietor. If fresh sticks are required, the Vaddai Vidana shall inform the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer as soon as possible, who will obtain a licence to have them cut.

19. The cultivators shall finish the fence within the time fixed at the meeting under rule 6, and each cultivator shall construct the necessary watch huts. The cultivators shall keep both fence and watch huts in repair, and shall keep regular watch in accordance with the orders of the Vaddai Vidana. No person shall be employed as watcher who is incompetent or under the age of 16 years.

20. The mullaikkaran or cultivators shall accompany the Vaddai Vidana or his Vaddai Kavalan with lights on their rounds at nights until such time as the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer considers this no longer necessary.

21. Should any portion of any tract ripen before the rest from any cause, the cultivators thereof shall be allowed the right to reap and store their crop, but shall not be permitted without the permission of the Vaddai Vidana to thresh and remove the whole crop. They shall continue to watch the field and preserve the fence until the crops of the remainder of the vaddai have been reaped and stored. Should any portion of a tract not ripen until after the reaping of the crop sown in accordance with the decision under rules 6 and 7, either on account of default in sowing in proper time or because of the sowing of a different kind of paddy to that agreed upon by the meeting, the cultivators of the other portion of the tract shall not be bound to continue preserving the fence and watching the field until that portion of that tract ripens.

22. After the reaping is over the Vaddai Vidana shall order the removal of the fence, and shall cause the fence sticks to be heaped by the cultivators in such places as he may direct. Proprietors may, with the consent of the Vaddai Vidana, remove the fence sticks from the fields. They shall, however, furnish the Vaddai Vidana with a receipt for the number taken and return them to the land for the following harvest, whether they cultivate or not, or shall be liable for their assessed value.

23. The threshing-floor shall be cleared and fenced with a strong fence of stakes by the joint labour of all the cultivators of each field. The paddy shall be stacked there, and the cultivators shall take their turn in watching the stacks for a period of two months from the date of reaping.

24. No paddy shall be removed from the fields at the termination of the harvest until the shares due to the Headmen under rule 4 and the wages due to all persons engaged in the harvest and the hire of cattle and other cultivation charges have been paid, and in the case of fields cultivated for share until the landlord's dues have been paid.

In cases in which there is serious risk of damage to the paddy if it is left on the threshing-floor, the owner or cultivator, as the case may be, may remove it with the consent of the other party concerned, or if consent is not given he shall be responsible for leaving sufficient paddy to settle the claim and may only remove the remainder.

25. All field channels and water-courses which are not in charge of the Director of Irrigation are in charge of the Vaddai Vidanas under the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer, and no person shall fill up, or encroach upon, such channels or water-courses or any of their reservations.

26. Should any channel, dam, or other work be required either outside or inside any field, it shall be constructed by the proprietors interested in proportion to their holdings as in rule 13.

Under schemes in charge of the Director of Irrigation, all applications for permission to construct such works must be made in writing to the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer.

As a general rule the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer may then give the proprietors the necessary permission to construct the work required or may refuse to do so. In cases where, in the opinion of the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer, the proposed work will affect the general irrigation under the scheme or will affect detrimentally proprietors of lands other than those of the applicants, he shall forward the application to the Assistant Government Agent with his report. If the Assistant Government Agent, after considering any representations which the owners of any lands affected by the proposed work may desire to make, is of opinion that the application should be favourably considered, he shall forward it to the Irrigation Officer, who, if he approves of it, will inform the proprietors that permission is granted, and will arrange to give them any help in setting out the work or advice which they may require to enable them to construct the work.

The proprietors or lessees of new lands which have been surveyed and demarcated by landmarks with reservations for field channels shall construct their proportion of the field channel which is shown on the plan to irrigate the group of lots in which their holdings are situated.

Any such field channels shall be constructed by the proprietors in accordance with alignments approved by the Irrigation Officer.

If any proprietor of such lands is unable to obtain water for irrigation owing to the neglect of any other proprietors to cut their shares of the field channels, such other proprietors shall be called upon by the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer to do the necessary work.

27. All proprietors must grant way leave for such channels, dams, or other works, even though their land may not be benefited thereby; but those proprietors whose lands are benefited by any such work shall be liable under this rule to pay to the owners of lands, which suffer damage by the construction of the work, compensation for any land taken, or damage done, in proportion to the area of the holdings benefited. The amount of such compensation shall be determined by the Assistant Government Agent on the advice of the Irrigation Officer, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer.

28. Should any proprietor fail to perform the work required under rules 13, 19, and 26, within the time fixed by the Assistant Government Agent, it shall be done by the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer who shall certify the costs incurred, and the same shall be recovered as provided in Chapter VIII. of "The Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917."

29. No person shall in any way alter or injure any ridge or boundary between two fields in the same tract. On information that such alteration or injury has been effected, the Vaddai Vidana shall notify the owners and proceed to the spot with witnesses, and call upon the owners to restore the boundary to its original state, and on their failing to do so within three days after notice, the Vaddai Vidana shall report the matter to the Village Council.

30. The owners and cultivators of all lands which may have been or may hereafter be bought from the Crown or from others shall become liable to the provisions of these rules, and shall be entitled to water (provided the Director of Irrigation considers that the water supply is sufficient) from any of the field channels which may be most advantageous to their lands as soon as it shall be declared irrigable and included in the specification of land irrigable from the work. Such owners and cultivators shall, in all respects, enjoy the privileges and rights that belong to the owners and cultivators of the lands already irrigable, except as regards the question of the rates.

31. A meeting of proprietors may be convened whenever the Assistant Government Agent or a majority of the proprietors consider it desirable to obtain their advice or assistance in any matter concerning the cultivation.

32. These rules shall be enforced by the Assistant Government Agent and such officers and Headmen as may from time to time be appointed and breaches of the rules are punishable as provided in "The Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917."

33. Any proprietor shall, when required, point out the correct boundaries of his lands, and if required by the Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer, shall erect bunds or other suitable marks to define such boundaries.

34. Proprietors and others concerned shall be held liable for waste of water occurring on their fields. The Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer may, at his discretion, prevent, alter, or stop, or otherwise deal with, as he thinks fit, supplies of water to lands which owing to the default of the proprietors or cultivators to carry out any work required by these rules, demand an undue supply of water. No paddy shall be sown in any irrigation or other channel.

35. Proprietors of lands not paying irrigation rate, but cultivating simultaneously with the specified irrigable lands, shall, if such lands fall within the common fence, be liable for the observance of Nos. 14, 15, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, and 26 of these rules.

36. The customary right of way for taking cattle and agricultural implements, and for transporting fence sticks, paddy, and for other agricultural purposes shall be allowed to all proprietors under any irrigation work.

37. During cultivation the Vaddai Vidana is empowered to seize all cattle found in his vaddai, or on a tank bund, or bank of an irrigation channel, or straying near by and likely to endanger the crops. Cattle seized under this rule should be handed over to the local Police Headman without delay to be produced before the Village Tribunal.

38. Each proprietor or lessee who employs cultivators shall keep a book in which he shall enter all advances of paddy or money paid to his cultivators under the dates upon which such advances are made. He shall go through the accounts with his cultivators at least three times, viz., immediately after the sowing has been completed, immediately before the harvest, and after the threshing, and take their signatures or thumb marks to the accounts in the books if these are admitted by them to be correct.

39. All previous rules are hereby cancelled.

Note.—Wherever the term "Irrigation Officer" occurs in the foregoing rules, it shall be held to refer to the Officer of the Irrigation Department working under the Director of Irrigation in charge of irrigation works in the Trincomalee District.

Rules framed under Section 11 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917 for Maintenance of Irrigation Works whereof the Maintenance is in charge of the Assistant Government Agent, and for which no Irrigation Rate is recovered for the District of Trincomalee.

1. The tank is the property of Government; but so long as the tract of fields attached to it is occupied, it shall for agricultural purposes be considered to be the joint property of the proprietors of the fields in proportion to the shares held by them.

2. In distributing water as a general rule from any source of supply to the fields in a tract, the water shall first be taken to the fields on the higher level and thence to those on the lower level, and no one shall in any way interfere to the prejudice of others with the distribution of water.

3. No person other than a proprietor or lessee of the lands under the tank shall be entitled to the use of water from the tank for agricultural purposes.

4. It shall not be lawful for any one to issue the water of one tank for the cultivation under any other tank nor for the shareholders of lands cultivated under a tank to utilize for their cultivation the water of any other tank without first obtaining the sanction of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. The shareholders shall not cut the bund nor block up the spill of their tank without the permission of the Assistant Government Agent or Chief Headman or Village Tank Inspector, or shall carry out any work upon the bund, spill, or channels contrary to the orders of any of these officers.

Provided that in cases in which such action is necessary to prevent otherwise inevitable damage to the tank, and it is impossible to communicate with any of the above-mentioned officers in time, the said permission may be dispensed with, but the burden of proving such special circumstances shall lie upon the shareholders.

6. No fence shall be put on any part of tank bund without authority of the Assistant Government Agent or Chief Headman or Village Tank Inspector.

7. Tanks, dams, minor channels, water-courses, or other minor works shall be repaired or improved by the proprietors whenever the Assistant Government Agent shall consider it necessary. The work to be performed by each proprietor shall be in proportion to the extent of his land likely to be benefited by the work in question.

8. All ordinary repairs incidental to cultivation, such as clearing of channels, repairs of bunds, shall be done by the cultivators.

9. The bunds of all tanks shall be divided equally among the proprietors of lands under them, and each proprietor shall keep the portion assigned to him always free from jungle, brushwood, and overgrowth of every description, and from white ants' nests, and also shall keep such portion properly turfed.

10. The full amount of labour which each proprietor of paddy land shall be liable to contribute under rules 7, 8, and 9 shall not, except in urgent cases provided for in rule 11, exceed two cubes of earthwork or four days' labour annually for each acre of his land likely to be benefited, or their equivalent in money paid in advance at the rate of Rs. 2 per acre. If in any year it shall not be found necessary to require from the proprietors the full amount of labour, the Assistant Government Agent shall decide what amount of labour shall be contributed by them.

11. In addition to the ordinary labour of the year as above provided for, whenever the Assistant Government Agent or person authorized by him to supervise the work shall find it necessary to call out labour to perform an urgent work of repair, or of prevention of impending damage, uncommuted labour, either in person or by substitute, shall at once be furnished by every proprietor and continued daily until the completion of the work.

Provided that double the ordinary labour provided in rule 10 shall not be exceeded in any year.

12. Notice shall be given by the Vaddai Vidana by beat of tom-tom not less than twenty-one days beforehand of the intention to call out labour provided for in rule 10 and of the proportion of labour required. Copies of such notices shall be forwarded by the Vaddai Vidana to the Assistant Government Agent or person authorized by him to supervise the work.

13. No person other than the Village Tank Inspector or Chief Headman or someone duly authorized by him in that behalf shall in any way interfere with, or alter the level of, the spill water or sluice of any village tank.

14. The tank bed may be cultivated when the majority of the proprietors under it so decide, with the permission of the Assistant Government Agent. Unless the majority decide to cultivate the tank bed and the permission of the Assistant Government Agent is obtained, no proprietor shall cultivate the tank bed or any portion thereof.

"THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, NO. 45 OF 1917."

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council has been pleased, under the provisions of section 45 of the said Ordinance, to sanction the under-mentioned Irrigation Scheme passed at a meeting held on June 30, 1921, by the proprietors of lands irrigated from Diulwewa tank, in the North-Central Province.

SCHEME REFERRED TO.

That the proprietors of the lands irrigated from Diulwewa tank and included in the Kalawewa specification agree that if Government places their lands on the Nachchaduwa specification, they shall pay an irrigation rate of Rs. 2 per acre per annum, subject to revision by Government every five years, provided that the revised rate will be Rs. 2 less than that charged on new lands under the Nachchaduwa scheme, subject, however, to a minimum rate of Rs. 2 per acre per annum.

Rules for the Conduct of Voting by Ballot for or against the Existence of Arrack, Toddy, and Foreign Liquor Taverns, Bar Liquor Licences for Hotels, and Places licensed for the Sale of Beer and Porter by Retail.

1. (i.) In these rules—

- (a) The expression "Government Agent" shall include an Assistant Government Agent or any person authorized by the Governor to act for the purposes of these rules.
- (b) The expression "area" means an area ascertained in accordance with these rules.
- (c) The expression "presiding officer" shall mean the Government Agent or any person authorized by him in writing to preside at a local option poll.

(ii.) In areas outside the Municipality of Colombo all persons shall be entitled to vote who have resided in the area for six months immediately before April 30 and prior to that date have commuted or performed labour due by them for the current year in that area or have been certified to be *bona fide* efficient soldiers under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910 for the current year.

(iii.) In areas within the Municipality of Colombo all persons shall be entitled to vote who have resided in the area for six months immediately preceding April 30 and are on the register of voters for any constituency of the Legislative Council or for any Municipal Council.

2. A local option poll shall be held upon the application of at least 25 per cent. of the persons who are on the division officers roll in force at the time of the application, or, in the case of an application for a poll in Colombo, at least 50 persons who will be entitled to vote at the poll. Such application shall be made to the Government Agent in the year 1925 before September 15, and in subsequent years between December 31 and the following April 1 in writing, and shall be signed by all the applicants. Each applicant shall, in the case of an area where road tax is collected, place after his signature his place of residence, the number of his last road tax receipt or his last certificate of performance of labour, or, if he is a person exempted for military service, his rank, regimental number, and the unit to which he belongs. Each applicant shall, in an area where no road tax is collected, place after his signature his place of residence and the name of the constituency or Municipality in respect of which he will be entitled to vote.

Provided always that an application for a poll in Colombo in the year 1925 may be made at any time before September 15. In such case the preliminary list shall be prepared on or before September 30, objections to the list shall be received up to October 15, and a certified copy of the final list shall be posted on or before November 15, and polls may be held on any date before January 31, 1926, as may be determined by the Government Agent.

3. Local option polls may be held to decide whether or not the licences for all or any arrack, toddy, and foreign liquor taverns, bar liquor licences for hotels, and licences for places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail in an area shall be abolished.

Provided that the Governor in Executive Council may, if he thinks fit, refuse to allow a poll in respect of any specified hotel.

4. A poll may also be held to decide whether all or any of the licences specified in the preceding rule shall be regranted for an area.

5. Where an application is made under rule 2 that a local option poll shall be held, the Government Agent shall cause a preliminary list of all persons entitled to vote at such poll to be prepared on or before May 15. Such list shall be available for inspection by the public. Objections to and claims for the inclusion of names in the list shall be made and received up to and including May 31, and the Government Agent shall investigate all such claims and objections.

If the Government Agent is satisfied that any names objected to were wrongly included in, or that any names which have been claimed for inclusion were wrongly excluded from, the preliminary list, he shall amend the said list accordingly, and shall, on or before June 30, post a certified copy of the final list on the Kachcheri notice board. No name shall be added to or struck out from such final list after such publication, and the local option poll shall be held on such list, which shall be final and conclusive for all the purposes of these rules.

6. The poll shall be held at such place and on such date between October 1 and December 15 as the Government Agent shall determine. At least 20 days' notice of the poll shall be given by publication in one or more local newspapers by fixing copies of the notice at the Kachcheri, the local Police Court, and the Village Tribunal within the jurisdiction of which the area is situated, and at prominent places within the said area, and by beat of tom-tom or by such other method as the Government Agent shall direct. The notice shall state the names of the villages comprised in the said area.

7. The place of voting shall be within the area, if such arrangement be practicable, and if not, within as close a distance to the area as possible.

8. (i.) If at a local option poll—

(a) In an area outside the Municipality of Colombo, 60 per cent. of the persons on the final list of voters in the area; or

(b) In an area within the Municipality of Colombo, 51 per cent. of such persons;

vote for the abolition of the licences, the licences shall be abolished with effect from the commencement of the rent period commencing next after the date on which the poll is held.

(ii.) The same percentages of votes as mentioned above shall be required in any poll for the regranting of licences.

9. The names of voters who before the holding of the poll have died or left the Island, and the names of those who at the time of the ballot are in jail or are prevented by operation of law from being present at the poll shall not be taken into consideration in determining the proportion of votes recorded to the number of voters in the list.

10. The area shall, in the case of a single tavern, hotel, or place licensed to sell beer or porter be as nearly as practicable the whole area, within a radius of two miles from the licensed premises in question. Where the circumference of the resultant circle cuts a village in two, the whole of such village shall be excluded unless more than half of it falls within the said circumference.

11. Where in any area there is more than one tavern, hotel, or place licensed to sell beer or porter, provided they are not more than one mile apart, the area for all such taverns, hotels, or places shall be one and the same, but the circle comprising the area shall have its centre at as central a point as possible.

12. Provided that for polls in Colombo the area shall always be a ward.

13. The Government Agent, with the advice of his Advisory Committee, shall have power to define the exact boundaries of any area.

14. It shall be the duty of all division officers of the villages forming any area to allow voters and any person or persons interested in the ballot to inspect the returns prepared by such division officers under sections 4 and 9 of the Ordinance No. 31 of 1884 and to take copies thereof.

15. The presiding officer shall have power to decide all questions arising in connection with the ballot. Objections shall be noted and the decision of the presiding officer on such objections shall be recorded. Such records shall be at the disposal of the Advisory Committee. The Government Agent may appoint such officers as he may consider necessary to assist the presiding officer.

16. An agent accredited by the voters in the area may be present during the progress of the ballot in the building where the poll is held.

17. No person shall be entitled to vote unless his name is on the final list of voters for the area and in an area where the road tax is collected, he—

(a) Produces at the time of voting a receipt for road tax paid by him within the 12 months preceding April 30 of the year in which the ballot is held; or

(b) Has been certified during the same period by the local authority as having performed the labour due by him under the *Thoroughfares Ordinances* and produces such certificate at the time of voting; or

(c) Has been certified during the same period to the local authority as a *bona fide* efficient soldier of the Defence Force under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910, and produces such certificate at the time of voting.

18. Polling shall in Municipal areas be from 7 A.M. to 7 P.M. and in other areas from 8 A.M. to 7 P.M., provided that the Governor in Executive Council may in any particular case otherwise direct. But the Government Agent or presiding officer shall have power to postpone the poll if, in his opinion, the inclemency of the weather justifies such postponement. Voting shall be carried on as expeditiously as possible, and no voter shall be kept waiting until other voters from his village have arrived.

19. The votes shall be counted as soon as possible after the close of the ballot, and the result declared immediately after it has been ascertained.

20. Only ballot papers in the forms annexed hereto (which may be varied as circumstances may require) and issued by the presiding officer shall be used in recording votes. Each ballot paper shall have a number printed on the back and shall have a counterfoil with the same number printed on the face.

21. The ballot paper shall be marked on both sides with an official mark and delivered to the voter within the polling station and a number corresponding to the number of the voter on the list shall be marked on the counterfoil. A mark shall be placed on the list of voters against the number of the voter to denote that he has received a ballot paper, but so that it shall not indicate which particular ballot paper he received.

The voter shall record his vote by marking a × on the right hand side of the ballot paper opposite the words expressing the action for which he wishes to vote, and in no other way. He shall then fold it so as to conceal his vote, and place it in a closed box in the presence of the presiding officer or an officer appointed by the Government Agent to assist him. The presiding officer or such other officer as aforesaid, on the application of any voter who states that he is unable to read, shall cause the vote of such voter to be marked on a ballot paper in manner directed by such voter, but he shall take such steps as will secure that no one but himself and the voter knows how such ballot paper was marked. Ballot papers which do not comply with this rule shall not be considered in recording the votes.

22. No votes shall be recorded by proxy. All votes shall be given by the voters personally.

23. The Government Agent shall make all necessary arrangements for the ballot.

24. Where as a result of a local option poll licences of any description have been abolished in any area, the licensing authority shall not, save as provided by rule 8 (2), issue any new licence of that description in that area.

25. If a tavern which, in the opinion of the Government Agent, mainly serves a population of Indian coolies is closed by ballot, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent on the application of the District Planters' Association to issue a licence for another tavern at which liquor shall be sold to Indian coolies exclusively. Provided that no such licence shall be issued without the order of the Governor in Executive Council.

26. The rules published by Excise Notification No. 130 in the *Government Gazette* of June 23, 1922, and by Excise Notification No. 142 in the *Government Gazette* of June 20, 1924, are hereby repealed.

Conditions of Storage of Explosives in the Government Explosives Magazine at Welikada.

FROM and after September 1, 1925, all explosives, &c., accepted for storage in the Government Explosives Magazine at Welikada will be subject to the following conditions, viz. :—

- (i.) The rent to be recovered for the storage of explosives in the Government Explosives Magazine at Welikada shall be at 3 cents per pound for each period of 4 months or part thereof ;
- (ii.) The rent due on explosives stored in the Magazine shall be paid to the Colonial Storekeeper within the first month of each period of 4 months ; in the event of the rent falling into arrears for any period of 4 months the explosives so affected shall be liable for double rent for the whole period in arrears ; in the event of the rent being in arrears for 12 months the explosives so affected shall, after notice to the owner, be sold by public auction with or without the consent of the owner, and the nett proceeds thereof shall be applied to the payment of rent ; and the surplus, if any, shall be paid to the owner ; but if such owner cannot be found, such surplus shall be paid into the Treasury, and if not claimed within one year from the date of the sale of such explosives, such overplus shall be brought to account as revenue ; but if such explosives shall not be worth the rent, then the same after such public advertisement as aforesaid may be destroyed with or without the concurrence of the owner thereof, and the owner shall have no claim for or on account thereof.
- (iii.) The explosives stored in the Magazine prior to the date with effect from which the new scale of storage rent shall come into force shall not be subject to such new scale of storage rent until the original period of 6 months from the date of acceptance of each such consignment of explosives shall have expired.

RULE.

Rule 22 of the rules relating to the Conveyance of Traffic by Goods Trains published by notification dated October 11, 1907, in *Government Gazette* No. 6,210 of October 11, 1907, as amended by notification dated August 17, 1923, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,345 of the same date and by notification dated October 24, 1924, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,426 of the same date is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor :—

Rule 22. Warehouse Rent.—(a) All goods left in the railway premises beyond the day after their arrival will be subject to a rent charge of 5 cents per cwt. per diem (exclusive of Sundays, Christmas Day, New Year Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Wesak Day, and for Colombo only Muslim Hadji Day) with a minimum charge as for one cwt., and as for one day, subject to the following exceptions :—

- (i.) Consignees residing more than two miles and not exceeding ten miles from the railway station (outside the Municipal limits of Colombo, Kandy, and Galle) will be allowed free storage up to and including the second day after arrival.
- (ii.) Consignees residing more than ten miles from the railway station (outside the Municipal limits of Colombo, Kandy, and Galle) will be allowed free storage up to and including the third day after arrival.

(b) Manure stored in special manure sheds provided by the Railway will be subject to a rent charge of 50 cents per ton or portion of a ton per day or portion of a day (exclusive of Sundays, Christmas Day, New Year Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Wesak Day, and for Colombo only Muslim Hadji Day) on and from the second day after arrival, with the following exceptions :—

- (i.) Consignees residing more than ten and not exceeding fifteen miles from the railway station (outside the Municipal limits of Colombo, Kandy, and Galle) will be allowed free storage up to and including the third day after arrival.
- (ii.) Consignees residing more than fifteen miles and not exceeding twenty miles from the railway station (outside the Municipal limits of Colombo, Kandy, and Galle) will be allowed free storage up to and including the fourth day after arrival.
- (iii.) Consignees residing more than twenty miles from the railway station (outside the Municipal limits of Colombo, Kandy and Galle) will be allowed free storage up to and including the fifth day after arrival.

Note.—Goods not removed within twenty-four hours will be at owner's risk, and the Government will not be responsible for loss of whole or part of any consignment of goods by virtue of the fact that the rent charge has been levied in respect of such consignment. If the goods arrive at the station of delivery between 5 P.M. and 7 A.M., the latter hour will, for the purpose of warehouse rent, be considered the hour of arrival.

Candidates are required to send in their names so as to reach this office not later than September 30, 1925.

Close utilization, avoidance of wastage, and adequate outturn will be insisted on, and the contractor will be liable to pay the royalty value of any timber wasted by inefficient utilization, together with any compensation the Divisional Forest Officer may demand in respect thereof.

(b) No enumerated tree not previously stamped for felling by a Forest Officer shall be felled, and any breach of this rule renders the contractor liable in the same way as if such fellings were an illicit felling as defined by the rules of the Forest Ordinance No. 16 of 1907.

(c) The best quality trees of each of the species felled shall be converted as under :—

(i.) Into not less than 250 logs of which 100 shall be of not less than 18 feet in length, 100 shall be of not less than 15 feet, and the balance shall be of not less than 12 feet. All measurements to be taken after trimming as below :—

Logs shall be 4 ft. 6 in. and upwards in mean girth, and shall be of any of the following species, viz., satin, palu, ranai, milla, halmilla, and na. Payments in respect of halmilla logs will only be made for straight logs or parts of straight logs not less than 10 feet in length. The mean girth of a log for the purposes of this contract shall be determined by three girth measurements at the big end, centre, and small end of the log.

Logs shall be trimmed before delivery at the Habarana Station Depôt as follows :—Each end shall be sawn with a clean face at right angles to the axis of the tree. These faces shall be covered with a coating of tar or suitable paint to eliminate the risk of splitting.

All logs shall be barked before delivery, and payments will only be made on measurements taken after such operations. Transport of logs from the felling area to Habarana shall be by means of double sling carts for logs of 18 feet and over and double or sling carts for logs under 18 feet in length, unless the Divisional Forest Officer sanctions any other transport method in writing.

The inferior quality trees and branchwood and end pieces of the best quality trees shall be converted into—

(ii.) Not less than 2,500 broad gauge sleepers. Broad gauge sleepers shall be of sound material, sapwood, or parts rendered defective by fungus or by any other cause shall not be sawn for this purpose. They shall be sawn parallel on all sides and be rectangular in shape. They shall be of the following dimensions, viz. :—

Nine feet in length by 10 inches by 5 inches cross section, and shall be of the following species, viz., milla and of suitable portions and branchwood of palu, satin, na, and ranai not utilizable for log supply.

(iii.) Not more than 1,000 narrow gauge sleepers. They shall be similar in all respects to broad gauge sleepers, with the exception that they shall be of one of the following dimensions, viz. :—

Five feet in length by 10 inches by 5 inches cross section, or 5 feet in length by 9 inches by 4½ inches cross section.

(iv.) Not more than 500 telegraph posts. They shall be of parts of trees or any one of the following species not capable of conversion for logs or sleepers, viz., satin, palu, na, or milla, and of the following dimensions, viz. :—

(a) Twenty-one feet in length by 6 inches by 6 inches cross section.

(b) Twenty-four feet in length by 6 inches by 6 inches cross section.

(c) Thirty feet in length by 8 inches by 8 inches cross section at the base tapering to 6 inches by 6 inches cross section at the top.

The number of each length will be intimated to the contractor at the commencement of the contract, but it is estimated that the following percentages will be required :—

Eighty-five per cent. of 21 feet length, 12 per cent. of 24 feet length, 3 per cent. of 30 feet length.

(d) Where logs or other converted material are rejected by other Departments or disposed of at reduced rates the contractor will be entitled to no payment, but may at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests be paid any sum realized in excess of the royalty value of the material.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 8, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 105 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 52 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 18 Moors, 10 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1925, viz., 265,049) was 21·4, as against 24·4 in the preceding week, 22·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 150 (6 Burghers, 87 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 27 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30·5, as against 29·7 in the previous week, 33·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 150 total deaths, 34 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 38 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 22 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Kotahena South and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana East, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 13 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena South and Maradana hospital, as against 3 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana North, as against nil in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

5. Fifteen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 11 from *Debility*, 8 from *Diarrhoea*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Enteritis* and *Worms*, 1 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 59 from *Other Causes*.

6. Twelve cases of *Chickenpox*, 8 of *Enteric Fever*, 4 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 9, 2, 4, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·2°, against 80·8° in the preceding week and 82·5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·814 in., against 29·878 in. in the preceding week and 29·822 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·88 in., against 2·48 in. in the preceding week and 2·76 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
