## GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

### “THE TRUSTS ORDINANCE, No. 9 OF 1917.”

CECIL CLEMENTI.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of “The Trusts Ordinance, No. 9 of 1917,” power is given to the Governor in Executive Council to authorize, by Order in Council, the incorporation of the trustees of any charitable trust :

And whereas certain moneys had been subscribed and paid over to the Director of Education by certain members of the public interested in education for the establishment of Scholarships to be awarded to pupils attending the schools of the Colony :

And whereas the said Director of Education had applied to the Governor in Executive Council for the incorporation of trustees to hold and administer the said moneys and any other moneys that may be subscribed by members of the public for the purposes aforesaid or for similar purposes :

And whereas the Governor in Executive Council granted the said application and by Order in Council dated May 19, 1919, published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,058 dated October 17, 1919, made under section 114 of the said Ordinance, ordered and declared, *inter alia*, that the Colonial Secretary for the time being, the Treasurer for the time being, the Director of Education for the time being, Leslie de Saram, Esq., and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed trustees under the provisions of the said Order to be a body corporate by the name of “The Ceylon Scholarship Fund,” and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may receive, take, hold, or otherwise dispose of all descriptions of property, both real and personal, and shall and may be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, answer and be answered, in any Court or elsewhere, in all causes and actions whatsoever :

And whereas power has been reserved to the Governor in Executive Council from time to time to vary or amend the said Order in Council by Order of the Governor in Executive Council :

And whereas it is expedient to vary the said Order :

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council, do hereby vary the said Order dated the said May 19, 1919, and published in the said *Government Gazette* No. 7,058 dated the said October 17, 1919, by the omission of the words “The Colonial Secretary for the time being” in paragraph 1 of the said Order, and do hereby order and declare that from and after the date hereof the Treasurer for the time being, the Director of Education for the time being, Leslie de Saram, Esq., and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed trustees under the provisions of the said Order be a body corporate by the name of “The Ceylon Scholarship Fund,” and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may receive, take, hold, or otherwise dispose of all descriptions of property real and personal, and shall and may be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, answer and be answered, in any Court or elsewhere, in all causes and actions whatsoever :

And We do in all other respects confirm the said Order in Council.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

Whereas by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual dated the Ninth day of June, One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-one, We were graciously pleased to make, ordain, and establish Rules and Ordinances for the government of the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration reserving to Ourselves, Our Heirs, and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with those regulations or any part thereof by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual:

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 29, 1925.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 119 (5 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 24 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1925, viz., 256,049) was 24.2, as against 26.3 in the preceding week, 27.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 148 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.1, as against 31.2 in the previous week, 27.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 148 total deaths, 20 were of infants under one year of age, as against 19 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 4.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in St. Paul's, Maradana East, and Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Kotahena South, as against 18 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eleven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in St. Paul's, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 in Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), as against 2 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 18 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Wellawatta North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana hospital, Maradana North, and Wellawatta South, as against 5 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta North. The number in the previous week was also 2, as against 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. One death from *Chickengpox* was registered in Wellawatta North.

6. Nine deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 each from *Dysentery* and *Debility*, 4 from *Diarrhœa*, 3 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 2 each from *Enteritis* and *Tetanus*, 1 from *Worms*, and 64 from *Other Causes*.

7. Ten cases of *Chickengpox*, 9 of *Measles*, 6 of *Enteric Fever*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 13, 8, 13, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 81.6°, against 81.3° in the preceding week, and 80.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.873 in., against 29.888 in. in the preceding week, and 29.875 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 0.16 in. in the preceding week, and 1.35 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

#### Regulation with regard to the Exemption from Duty of Articles of Foreign Production Re-imported.

THE following regulations have been framed by the Principal Collector of Customs, under the provisions of Schedule B of Ordinance No. 17 of 1922, with regard to the exemption from duty of articles of foreign production re-imported.

Articles of foreign production re-imported, upon which import duty has previously been paid, are admitted duty free upon re-importation provided:—

- (1) That the article is one which can be readily and unmistakably identified;
- (2) That the Collector of Customs is satisfied as to the identity of the article by proof that it was registered at the Customs Office prior to exportation or by such other proof as he may deem adequate for the purpose;
- (3) That, if so required, proof of the previous payment of duty is furnished to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs;
- (4) That no drawback of duty was paid on the export of the article;
- (5) That there has been no change of ownership between the time of export and subsequent re-import;
- (6) That the article is private personal property re-imported for personal use or, if it is merchandise for sale has been sent out of the Island "on approval";
- (7) That not more than two years have elapsed since the article was exported unless such period is specially extended by the Principal Collector;
- (8) That the article is re-imported unchanged in form and condition except to the extent of such reasonable repair as does not involve the substitution or addition of any appreciable quantity of new material or in any way affect the identity of the article or the possibility of identifying it.

*Note.*—An article of private personal property for personal use, and not merchandise for sale, which on its first importation into Ceylon has been passed free of duty as passenger's baggage would be exempted from duty on subsequent re-importation after export, provided that the Collector of Customs is satisfied that the same article was exported without payment of drawback not more than 2 years previous to the date of re-importation.

(2) Where articles of "Merchandise for sale" are sent out of Ceylon for repairs or alteration, drawback should be claimed on the goods at the time of export. Such articles when re-imported will be assessed for duty on their full value.

(3) The contents of Postal Parcels originally posted in Ceylon and returned to the Ceylon Post Office as unclaimed, refused, or re-directed from any place outside Ceylon without having at any time left the custody of the Post Office will be admitted free of import duty.

The regulations dated August 21, 1924, published in the *Government Gazette* of August 29, 1924, are hereby cancelled.

### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on July 11, 1925, at 2 p. m., pursuant to Notice dated July 6, 1925.

*Present* :—Mr. T. B. Russell, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonawardena, M.B.E.; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; and Mr. S. W. Dassanaike.

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe presented a petition from E. A. Babaihamy, with reference to an application to erect a building at Elliott road, and requested that a report may be obtained. The Chairman undertook to report on it.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 13, 1925, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonawardena, M.B.E., moved—"That immediate steps be taken for the preparation of the scheme for improving the water supply of the town on the lines suggested by His Excellency the Acting Governor on his recent visit." Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.

The Council resolved themselves into Committee to consider the steps to be taken to give effect to the resolution.

When Council resumed, it was resolved to have detailed estimates (a) for duplicating the 8-in. main; (b) for laying a 10-in. main to supplement the existing main, framed by the Superintendent of Works.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

3. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works on July 11, 1925 :—

(2) Applications for water service to the following premises :—No. 22, Kumbalwella, No. 44, Kaluwella, No. 6, Lighthouse street, and No. 12, Chando street—(1) Considered; (2) recommended that the applications be refused, as it is considered undesirable to allow further services with storage tanks.

(3) To consider (a) a report from the Superintendent of Works dated June 13, 1925, on the proposed road from Jail road to Kandewatta road; (b) a memorandum of the Chairman on the subject—(a) Considered; (b) recommended that the matter be dropped as the trace proposed by the petitioners is impracticable. The new trace is not acceptable to the residents, and they are unwilling to give the land for making the road.

(4) To consider the question of building a retaining wall along the Keppu-ela opposite Victoria park—(a) considered; (b) recommended that the rubble barrier be extended at an estimated cost of Rs. 1,600, and that the Superintendent of Works be authorized to carry out the work.

(5) Plan and estimate of Rs. 1,500 from the Superintendent of Works for an office and store at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Dadalla. Funds are provided in the 1925 Budget under vote 82.

*Note.*—Tenders were invited for this work, but there was no response.—Recommended, and that the Superintendent of works be authorized to carry out the work.

(6) To consider the following estimates :—(a) Rs. 475 for a street watering cart.—Recommended; (b) Rs. 150 for necessary repairs to the pavilion.—Recommended; (c) Rs. 155 for repairing and painting garden seats.—Recommended; (d) Rs. 65 for painting the footbridge over Keppu-ela.—Recommended; (e) Rs. 100 for two notice boards.—Resolved that the boards are not necessary; (g) Rs. 100 for two iron barrels for water carts for road consolidation.—Recommended.

*Resolution.*

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe left the Meeting at this stage.

4. Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of July 11, 1925 :—

(3) Appointment of a keeper for Victoria park.—Recommended (a) that a park-keeper for Victoria park be appointed on a salary of Rs. 360 per annum rising to Rs. 600 per annum by biennial increments of Rs. 60, with a rent allowance of Rs. 10 per mensem till quarters are provided; (b) that the appointment of Park-keeper be made on probation for one year; (c) that the Superintendent of works be asked to furnish an estimate for repairing the building in the park to serve as quarters for the Park-keeper.

(4) Application from the Slaughter-house Keeper for increase of salary.—Recommended that the application be refused.

(5) Reports of the demolished buildings in Wards 3, 4w, 4E, and 5.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

*Resolution.*

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted. Mr. C. E. de Vos and D. I. Durham left the Meeting at this stage.

5. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of July 11, 1925 :—

(2) Amendment to the Council's Pension Rules.—Recommended that the proposed amendment to rules 20 and 29 be adopted.

(3) Non-payment of rent of shop No. 15 of the meat market.—Recommended that civil action be taken for the recovery of rent due from the month of May.

*Resolution.*

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.
