SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Colombo Fire Brigade.

Rules and Conditions of Service.

1. A person selected for employment in the Department must pass a satisfactory medical examination, by a medical officer selected by the Chairman, previous to entering the service.
2. Only single men will be enlisted, who are over 19 and under 25 years of age, who are generally intelligent and able to read and write English.
3. Testimonials must be produced as to character, giving a continuous record from date of leaving school.
4. All ranks shall devote the whole of their time and attention to the service of the Brigade.
5. They shall at all times conduct themselves in an orderly and sober manner, and must be clean and smart as far as the nature of their duties admits.
6. They shall not receive any reward or gift for service performed in connection with the Brigade without the sanction of the Council.
7. They shall obey, without hesitation, all orders received from superiors, and shall be considered to be always on duty when not on leave.
8. They shall make themselves acquainted with the work of the Brigade, and will do their utmost to save life and property from destruction by fire.
9. They shall wear such uniforms as the Council may provide, and shall return it on leaving the service.
10. They shall live in quarters provided by the Council when ordered to do so, and shall at all times keep the quarters, station, and appliances clean under the orders of their superiors. The Council does not bind itself to provide quarters. A house allowance of Rs. 90 a year will be paid if quarters are not available.

11. The Superintendent shall have power to inflict fines, subject to appeal to the Chairman, in case of misconduct or breach of these regulations. Should the offence be such as to merit dismissal, the Superintendent shall report to the Chairman.

12. Leave is granted with full pay as follows:—

Periodic Leave.—Twenty-four hours once in every period of seven days.

Annual Leave.—Fourteen days in every year.

Privilege Leave may also be granted by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Superintendent for a period not exceeding thirty-one days in any five years. All leave shall be subject to the exigencies of the service.

13. *Sick Leave* on full pay will be allowed for one month in every year in addition to other leave available. During such period free medical attendance and a free supply of medicines will be provided, except when the illness is due to misconduct. After six weeks' continuous illness a medical board shall examine the patient to ascertain if he is fit for further service in the Brigade.

The following rules regarding pensions to officers of the Colombo Fire Brigade shall be added to the rules for the grant of pensions or gratuities to officers and servants of the Colombo Municipality, published by Notification dated October 26, 1910, in *Government Gazette* No. 6,408 of October 28, 1910, and numbered 33 A and 33 B:—

33 A. These rules shall apply to all ranks of the Fire Brigade, subject to the next following rule, and except that 50 shall be substituted for 55 in rules Nos. 12, 13, and 15.

33 B. The case of any man of the Fire Brigade who is compelled to retire in consequence of injuries received in the execution of his duties permanently disabling him from further service in the Department, or who succumbs to such injuries, shall be specially considered on its merits by the Council on the recommendation of the Superintendent of the Fire Brigade, and the Council shall be empowered to grant him or his widow or minor children such pension as shall seem fit, whatever his term of service may have been, provided that such pension shall in no case exceed the maximum admissible under these rules.

Oil Installations Scheme at Colombo.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the following charges will be levied from October 1, 1925, until further notice, in connection with the Oil Installations Scheme at Colombo:—

Rs. 9 per 1,000 gallons on all petroleum, whether fuel oil, kerosine, or petrol imported in bulk or transhipped at Colombo.

Rs. 2.60 per 1,000 gallons working and maintenance charge.

Half cent per ton on the gross tonnage of the vessel for every six hours or part thereof during which a vessel is berthed alongside the Oil Jetties for purposes other than discharging or bunkering petroleum in bulk. Vessels discharging or bunkering petroleum in bulk at the Oil Jetties, and at the same time unloading or loading any other cargo on to, or from the jetties, will also be charged at the same rate for the time occupied in the unloading or loading of such other cargo.

To have always ready for transport 10 per cent. more wood than is actually delivered monthly.

2. Felling to commence within a week of signing the contract and to cease on July 31, 1926. Final delivery of wood to be made on or before September 30, 1926.

3. All herbaceous and other undergrowth to be cut out in a straight line as specified above at least a fortnight before any tree sapling or tree seedling is felled. This operation must be carried out throughout the block even where no utilizable trees remain from previous fellings.

4. Thereafter to coppice-cut with sharp cattles or other suitable instrument within two inches of the ground all saplings and seedlings which are under one inch diameter.

7. In order to perform this work systematically, cheaply, and efficiently, operation 3 above should be completed by a separate working party a fortnight before operation 4 commences. Operation 3 should always cover in advance a depth of the block sufficient to provide three weeks' material for the firewood cutters. Operation 4 should be completed one week ahead of operation 5. Separate working parties should be assigned to the separate operations, and separate workmen should be detailed to keep the coppicing tools continually sharp. Surplus sharpened tools should always be ready to hand in the felling area. The cost of coppicing in this manner is estimated at 15 cents per cubic yard.

8. The contractor, if so required by the Divisional Forest Officer, shall submit a list of every carter employed by him and be responsible for the due delivery of all woods to the Railway.

To fell all trees and saplings with the exception of marked hora, milla, keena, and nedun in a block of forest about 36 acres in extent demarcated in the Kekanadure Proposed Reserve; the block being bounded on the north by land

appearing in title plans 204,522, 262,834, and 219,178, east by Udupoldeniya and by cut line, south by cut line separating the hora and mahogany plantations, west by Kekanadurewewa.

2. Quantity to be supplied from the above area is 4,000 cubic yards more or less.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 19, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 122 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 83 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 10 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1925, viz., 256,049) was 24.8, as against 27.5 in the preceding week, 30.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 150 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 25 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.5, as against 35.6 in the previous week, 25.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 150 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, Maradana East, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 16 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 7 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 20 in the previous week, and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 5 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana North. The number in the previous week also was the same against 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Ten deaths each were registered from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Debility*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 6 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 each from *Dysentery* and *Worms*, 2 from *Tetanus*, and 60 from *Other Causes*.

6. Fifteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 11 of *Enteric Fever*, 8 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, against 23, 3, 7, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.9°, against 81.4° in the preceding week and 81.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.886 in., against 29.880 in. in the preceding week, and 29.864 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.26 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0.28 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

The shares forming the capital (original, increased, or reduced) of the Company may be subdivided or consolidated or divided into such classes with any preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto, and be held upon such terms as may be prescribed by the Articles of Association and regulations of the Company for the time being or otherwise.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE BIDDESCAR RUBBER COMPANY, LIMITED.

THE regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context, viz. :—

The word "Company" means "The Biddescar Rubber Company, Limited," incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The "Ordinance" means and includes "Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the Company.

"Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

"Presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by proxy or by attorney.

"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors assembled at a Board.

"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

"Month" means a calendar month.

"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and *vice versa*.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine, and *vice versa*.

"Holder" means a Shareholder.

"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy (in cases where by these Articles proxies are allowed) at any meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly given.

BUSINESS.

2. The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted as soon as in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

3. The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors, and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with these presents. The Company being established on the basis that it shall acquire Horanakande, Biddescar, and Daphne estates, it shall be no objection that the vendors are in a fiduciary position to the Company, or that there is no independent Board of Directors, nor shall any claim be made on any of the vendors on any such ground. Every member of the Company, present or future, shall be deemed to have joined the Company on this basis.

CAPITAL.

4. The nominal capital of the Company is One million Rupees (Rs. 1,000,000), divided into 100,000 shares of Ten Rupees (Rs. 10) each.

5. The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share and in the aggregate, and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

6. Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls, and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

7. The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

SHARES.

8. The Company may issue the balance capital whenever the Directors shall think fit, and may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid and the time of payment of such calls.

9. If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company by the holder of the shares.

10. The shares, except when otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they consider proper. Provided that such unissued shares, except when otherwise provided, shall first be offered by the Directors to the Shareholders in proportion, as nearly as possible, to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may at their discretion allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any estates or lands being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such estates or lands, or as remuneration for work done for or services rendered to the Company, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

11. In case of the increase of the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares, such new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights and privileges annexed thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof, or any other General Meeting of the Company, shall direct, and, if no direction be given, as the Directors shall determine; and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends, and in the distribution of the assets of the Company, and with a special or without any right of voting.

Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion, as nearly as possible, to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice, specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors, may, at their discretion, allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any estates or lands being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such estates or lands, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

12. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company may from time to time direct.

13. Shares may be registered in the name of a firm or partnership, and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies in respect of shares registered in the name of firm.

14. Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons jointly.

15. Any one of the joint-holders of a share, other than a firm, may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint-shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

16. In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

17. The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except any absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under clause 35 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

18. The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and calls due in respect of such share.

19. Every Shareholder shall be entitled to a certificate or certificates under the common seal of the Company, specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid thereon, provided that in the case of shares registered in the names of two or more persons, the Company shall not be bound to issue more than one certificate to all the joint-holders, and delivery of such certificate to any one of them shall be sufficient delivery to all.

20. If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then, upon production thereof to the Directors, they may order the same to be cancelled, and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then, upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof may be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

CALLS.

21. The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times, provided that three months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made to the persons and at the time and place appointed by the Directors.

22. If any Shareholder fail to pay the amount of any call due by him on or before the day appointed for payment thereof, he shall be liable to pay interest on the same at the rate of nine per centum per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of actual payment.

23. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such call was passed.

24. The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine. But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

25. The Directors may at their discretion receive from any of the Shareholders willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit all or any part of the moneys uncalled upon their respective shares beyond the sums actually called up; and upon the moneys so paid in advance, or upon so much thereof as from time to time and at any time thereafter exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon, and due in respect of the shares in respect of which such advances have been made, the Board may pay or allow interest at such rate as the Shareholders paying such sums in advance, and the Directors may agree upon, not exceeding, however, eight per centum per annum.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

26. Subject to the restrictions contained in these Articles any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares by instrument in writing.

27. No transfer of shares shall be made to an infant or person of unsound mind.

28. The Company shall keep a book or books, to be called "The Register of Transfers," in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

29. The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien, or otherwise; or in case of share not fully paid up, to any person not approved of by them, and in no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

30. Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by the certificate for the shares to be transferred and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Two rupees and Fifty cents or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Article 29, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

31. The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

32. In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only if at all, upon the transferee.

33. The Register of Transfers may be closed at such times and for such periods as the Directors may from time to time determine, provided always that it shall not be closed for more than twenty-one days in any year.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

34. The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

35. Any guardian of any infant Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title, as the Directors think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares; or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

36. If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 35 shall not, from any cause whatever, within twelve calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if in the case of the death of any Shareholder, no person shall, within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may sell such shares, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money; and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such shares, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same, and the nett proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

37. The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed, a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company, provided such acceptance is properly legalized.

38. If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder requiring him to pay the same, together with any interest that may have accrued, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on, and a place or places at, which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid. The notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

39. Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall notwithstanding be liable to pay, and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, premia, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at nine per centum per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

40. Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

41. The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved.

42. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture, and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share, and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company, and thereupon such purchaser shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase; and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

43. The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit as they shall think fit, not being less than nine per centum per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share *bona fide* sold or re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under Article 40-hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

44. The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders, or in respect of any other debt, liability, or engagement whatsoever, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls which the Directors shall have resolved to make, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. And the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

45. Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid: Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

46. The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

47. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary that the power of sale given by clause 45 has arisen, and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

48. Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title to such share.

PREFERENCE SHARES.

49. Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right or preference, whether in respect of dividend or of repayment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or at such a premium, or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally on such terms as the Company may from time to time by special resolution determine.

50. If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes, then the holders of any class of shares may, by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders, consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares; and such resolution shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolutions could have been affected without it.

51. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no member not being a Director shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any members personally present and entitled to vote at the meeting.

BORROWING POWERS.

52. The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained, from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed Rupees Fifty thousand (Rs. 50,000).

53. With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary, or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

54. For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purposes, the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

55. Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise.

56. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

57. The First General Meeting shall be held at such time not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

58. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is so prescribed, then at such place and at such time as soon after the first day in each year as may be determined by the Directors.

59. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clause shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other Meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

60. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-eighth of the number of Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-eighth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for.

61. Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company.

Upon the receipt of such requisition, the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such place and at such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

62. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than five days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting.

63. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

64. Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given by advertisement in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution, the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice, and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently upon the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

65. Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends and to elect Directors and Auditors in place of those retiring by rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors; and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatsoever of which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

66. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened except resolutions submitted under Article 62.

67. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present or represented at the commencement of the business three or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

68. If, at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

69. The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present at the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the Chair, the Shareholder shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Director be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

70. No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting, except the election of a Chairman, whilst the Chair is vacant.

71. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice thereof shall be given.

72. Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

73. At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by a show of hands, and in case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder; and unless a poll be immediately demanded by some Shareholder, or in the case of a special resolution by five Shareholders, present and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. The power of demanding a poll conferred by this clause may be exercised by the proxy or attorney of any Shareholder duly appointed in that behalf.

74. If at any meeting a poll be demanded by some Shareholder present, his proxy or attorney, or in the case of a special resolution by five Shareholders, their proxies or attorneys at the meeting and entitled to vote, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and place and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided; and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder or proxy or attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

75. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

76. No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

77. On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. Where a Shareholder is present by an attorney who is not a Shareholder, such attorney shall be entitled to vote for such Shareholder on a show of hands. In case of a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

78. The parent or guardian or curator of an infant Shareholder, the Committee or other legal guardian or curator of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such infant, lunatic, female, or deceased Shareholder, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

79. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney.

80. No Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or to vote either personally or by proxy or attorney at any meeting, unless all calls due from him on his shares have been paid, and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or to vote at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote at least one month previous to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote.

81. No person shall be entitled to hold a proxy who is not a Shareholder in the Company, but this rule shall not apply to a power of attorney.

82. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written, and shall be signed by the appointor (whether a Shareholder or his attorney), or if such appointor be a company or corporation, it shall be under the common seal of such company or corporation.

83. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

The instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form:—

The Biddescar Rubber Company, Limited.

I, _____ of _____, appoint _____, of _____ as my proxy, to represent me and to vote for me and on my behalf at the Ordinary (or Extraordinary, as the case may be) General Meeting of the Company to be held on the _____ day of _____, One thousand nine hundred and _____, and at any adjournment thereof, and at every poll which may be taken in consequence thereof.

As witness my hand this _____ day of _____, One thousand Nine hundred and _____.

84. No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) except at the meeting or poll at which such votes shall be tendered, and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

85. No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

DIRECTORS.

86. The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than six; but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least fifty fully or partly paid shares in the Company upon which all calls for the time being have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors.

87. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding Two thousand rupees annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration granted for special or extra services hereinafter referred to, nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company.

88. The first Directors shall be Messrs. F. F. Roe of Colombo and R. B. Préttejohn of Maskeliya and F. N. Sudlow of Colombo and G. J. Pickett of Kurunegala, who will join the Board after allotment. The first Directors shall hold office till the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

89. One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Manager, Managing Director, and (or) Agent, Visiting Agent, or Superintendent, for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office, and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Manager, Managing Director, and (or) Agent, Visiting Agent, or Superintendent.

The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be conferred on any Manager of the Company.

If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money, as they shall think fit.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

90. At the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company all the Directors shall retire from office, and at the First Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 91.

91. The Director to retire from office at the Second Ordinary General Meeting shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office.

92. In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire, the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

93. Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

94. The Ordinary General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent Ordinary General Meeting.

95. Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors or provisional Directors arising from death, resignation, or otherwise may be filled up by the Directors, but any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

96. A General Meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also determine in what rotation such increase or reduced number is to go out of office.

97. If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place, the place of a retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the First Ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

98. A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary, or by leaving the same at the registered office of the Company, or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors, but not before, his office shall become vacant.

99. The Company may, by a special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

100. Every Director or officer of the Company, and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him in or about the discharge of his duties, except such as happen from his wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer shall, nor shall the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortuous act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

101. No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager, exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS.

102. The office of Director shall be vacated—

- (a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Manager, Managing Director, Visiting Agent, Superintendent, Agent, or Secretary of the Company or trustee for debenture holders.
- (b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.
- (c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
- (d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office.
- (e) If he resigns his office under the provisions of clause 98.
- (f) If he ceases to ordinarily reside in Ceylon or is absent from Ceylon for a period of three consecutive months.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for, the Company, or by reason of his being agent, or secretary, or solicitor, or broker, or being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, solicitors, or brokers of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested, and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract, work, or business.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

103. The Directors shall have power to carry into effect the acquisition of the said Horanakande, Biddeskar, and Daphne estates, and the lease, purchase, or acquisition of any other lands, estates, or property they may think fit, or any share or shares thereof.

104. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing Director, or with the assistance of an agent or agents, and secretary or secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors subject to the provisions of Article No. 122 for such a period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in and about the valuation, purchase, lease, or acquisition of the said estates and lands, and the opening, clearing, planting, and cultivation thereof, and otherwise in or about the working and business of the Company.

105. The Directors shall have power to make, and may make such rules or regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and, in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, superintendents, assistants, clerks, artisans, labourers, and other servants, for such period or periods and with such remuneration and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, treasurers, accountants, officers, clerks, or servants of the Company for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause for so doing.

106. The Directors shall exercise in the name and on behalf of the Company all such powers of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting, and shall generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by any Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of any such Ordinances and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made.

The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed power.

107. The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company, on such terms as they may consider proper, and from time to time to revoke such appointment.

108. The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company any account or accounts which such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

109. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the secretary or secretaries, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney, or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or company as such secretaries.

110. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by a special resolution of the Shareholders of the Company in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or companies, or person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

111. In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice, to the general powers conferred or implied in the last preceding clause, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say, :—

- (a) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, settle, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or other legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to or from the Company, and any claims or demands made by or against the Company.
- (b) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform or enforce the awards.
- (c) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company and for claims and demands by the Company.
- (d) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents with power to accept the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, or inspector or any similar office.
- (e) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not to be immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time to vary or release such investments.
- (f) To delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being, or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon, or elsewhere, all or any of the powers or functions given to or exercisable by the Directors; and to confer such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes, and upon such terms and conditions and with such restrictions as the Directors may think expedient, and to confer such powers either collaterally with or to the exclusion of, and in substitution for, all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf, and from time to time to revoke, withdraw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers. The Directors may allow to any person or company to whom any powers may be so delegated such remuneration as they in their absolute discretion shall think fit.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

112. The Directors may meet for the dispatch of business, ad orem, and otherwise regulate their meetings at such places and times, and in such manner as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

113. A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

114. The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

115. Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereof shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a Director.

116. The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

117. The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee, respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board.

118. The acts of the Board or of any committees appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment or qualification of any Director or of any member of the committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if such person had been duly appointed or qualified, provided the same be done before the discovery of the vacancy or defect.

119. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

120. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books to be provided for the purpose—

- (1) Of all appointments (a) of officers and (b) committees made by the Directors.
- (2) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors.
- (3) Of the names of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.
- (4) Of all orders made by the Directors.
- (5) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings of the Company.
- (6) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors.
- (7) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of committees appointed by the Board.

121. All such minutes shall be signed by the person who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, as the case may be; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be *prima facie* evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

AGENTS AND SECRETARIES.

122. The firm of Gordon Frazer and Company, Limited, shall be the first Agents and Secretaries of the Company.

ACCOUNTS.

123. The agent or secretary, or the agents or secretaries for the time being, or, if there be no agent or secretary or agents or secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such sums were received and expended, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company. The accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company, as the Directors think fit.

124. The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders, and no Shareholders shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

125. At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the previous financial year, and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to the end of the same period.

126. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income, distinguishing the several sources from which it has been derived and the amount of gross expenditure, distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other heads of expenditure. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of profit and loss may be laid before the meeting, and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item shall be stated with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the income of the year.

127. The balance sheet shall contain a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company arranged under the heads appearing in the form annexed to the table referred to in Schedule C to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," or as near thereto as circumstances admit.

128. Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company and as to the amount which the Directors recommend should be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders.

129. A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

130. The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

AUDIT.

131. No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company; and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during the continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.

132. The Directors shall appoint the First Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration. He or they shall hold office till the First General Meeting of the Company. All subsequent appointments shall, except as is hereinafter mentioned, be made at the Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and the Auditor or Auditors appointed at such meeting shall hold office only until the First Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.

133. The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.

134. Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.

135. If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor is not supplied at the Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person or persons who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment.

136. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting after his appointment, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto and to report thereon to the meeting, generally or specially, as he may think fit.

137. The Auditor or Auditors for the time being shall have a list delivered to him or them of all books kept by the Company, and he or they shall at all reasonable hours in the daytime have access to all accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company for the purpose of audit.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

138. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of nett profits.

139. The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, or pay a bonus to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year, provided the Directors are satisfied that the nett profits of the Company will be sufficient to justify such interim dividend or bonus.

140. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend or bonus, set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and may invest the same in such securities as they may select, or place the same on fixed deposit in any bank or banks, and may from time to time deal with and vary such investment and apply such reserve fund or such portion thereof as they think fit to meet contingencies or for special dividends, or for equalizing dividends or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing, maintaining, or extending the buildings and premises of the Company, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purposes connected with the interest of the Company that they may from time to time deem expedient without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets.

141. Any General Meeting may direct payment of any dividend or bonus declared at such meeting or of any interim dividends or bonuses which may subsequently be declared by the Directors, wholly or in part by means of drafts or cheques on London, or by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company or of any other company, or in any other form of specie, or in any one or more of such ways, and the Directors shall give effect to such direction, and when any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution they may settle the same as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates, and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets, or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Shareholder upon the footing of the value so fixed in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend or bonus as may seem expedient to the Directors.

142. No unpaid dividend or bonus shall ever bear interest against the Company.

143. No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares, or otherwise howsoever.

144. The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding the fact that such sums or any of them are not payable until after the date when such dividend or bonus is payable.

145. Notice of any dividend that has been declared, or of any bonus to be paid, shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto, and any dividend or bonus unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company, and, if the Directors think fit, may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund.

146. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

147. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly, other than a firm, may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

NOTICES.

148. Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or persons appointed by the Board to authenticate the same.

149. Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

150. Any notice, if served by post, shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which the letter containing the same would in ordinary course of post have been delivered at its address, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into a post office or post box, and the entry in the Company's books of the leaving or sending by post of any notice at or to such address shall be sufficient evidence thereof, and no further evidence shall be necessary.

153. Any Shareholder who fails to give and register an address in Ceylon as provided in Article No. 149 shall not be entitled to be given any notices.

EVIDENCE.

154. On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was, when the claim arose, on the Register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly conveyed or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

155. MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 12, 1925, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated August 5, 1925.

Present.—Mr. H. E. Newnham, C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias, J.P.; Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. W. Philips; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Mr. G. Adamjee Lukmanjee; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Dr. G. Thornton; Mr. A. H. Morgan; and Mr. J. S. Collett.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 1, 1925, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of July 1, 1925, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that this Council places on record its great appreciation of the many services rendered to the city by Mr. E. W. Jayewardene, K.C., during his membership of the Council. Mr. W. Philips seconded.—Carried.

Mr. H. L. De Mel moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 3 to 6 (inclusive) on the agenda. Mr. W. Philips seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of July 27, 1925.

(2) To consider:—(a) A letter dated July 11, 1925, from the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C., M.M.C., regarding the dumping of refuse in Prince of Wales' Avenue; (b) A report of the Municipal Engineer thereon.—Recommended.—(a) That only one dump, namely, the one at Prince of Wales' Avenue, should be used in future within Municipal limits; (b) That the ash from the destructor should be conserved and used for daily spreading over the unburnt refuse; (c) That Rs. 10,000 should be voted for the cost of carrying out these proposals; (d) That the question of a refuse destructor for South Colombo should be at once investigated; (e) That no dumping of unburnt refuse should be allowed in private lands; (f) That provision of Rs. 52,500 should be made in the next year's Budget for the purchase of four new lorries, hand carts, and for construction of shelter for the lorries; (g) That a supplementary vote of Rs. 4,500 be passed for procuring apparatus to be fitted to an existing lorry for cleaning gullies.

(4) To consider an application from Dr. L. F. Hirst, City Microbiologist, for permission to act as examiner in practical pathology at the final examinations of the Ceylon Medical College, about July 28 and 29.

Note.—Permission to conduct such examinations has been granted in past years.—Recommended.

(5) With regard to the by-law adopted by Council on May 6, 1925, regarding the treatment of tuberculosis in residential areas to consider a report of the Solicitor-General and a memorandum thereon of the Chairman.—Recommended that the words "in any residential or commercial area" be added at the beginning of the by-law.

(6) To consider:—(a) A petition from the poor residents of Slave Island, praying that more seating accommodation be provided at the Slave Island Municipal Free Dispensary.—(a) Considered; (b) A memorandum of the Chairman asking for approval to vote Rs. 100 a month in 1926, in order to provide a better building.—(b) Recommended.

(8) To consider the suggestion made by Mr. R. L. Pereira, M.M.C., in Council on July 1, 1925, regarding the adoption of a by-law under the provision of section 18 (2) (j) of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, prohibiting the use by motor buses and lorries of the following roads:—Huftsdorp street from San Sebastian street—Lockgate junction to Dam street, and the whole of Belmont street.—Recommended with the alteration of "San Sebastian street" to "San Sebastian Hill."

(9) To consider a report of the Medical Officer of Health with regard to Kanatta Cemetery improvements, recommending that provision be made in the Budget for 1926, for the employment of 8 additional coolies at the Kanatta Cemetery as the staff allotted to the general portion of the cemetery is inadequate.

Note.—The increased cost at 88 cents per cooly per day will be Rs. 2,569.60 a year. As a set off against this, the Council collected last year, for tending graves, a sum of Rs. 2,328.51.—Recommended.

Resolutions.

With regard to item No. 2, it was resolved that the matter be considered in connection with the recommendation of item No. 2 of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of July 29, 1925.

With regard to item No. 8 (corresponding to item No. 6 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 29, 1925), the Chairman pointed out that the words "and lorries" should be deleted in the by-law, in view of a communication from Government, pointing out that the use of lorries on all public roads in the Island is already prohibited by by-law No. 19 of the special by-laws passed under section 22 of Ordinance No. 4 of 1916, and that lorries may only be used on such roads as His Excellency the Governor declares are suitable. The Chairman also called attention to the second part of the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works.

It was resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works be adopted, and that the words "and lorries" be deleted from the by-law.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 29, 1925.

(3) To consider the proposal to change the following double-barrelled names of roads as mentioned below:—

(1) Colombo-Galle road (from Wellawatta bridge to Dehiwala bridge)—To Galle road.

(2) Bambalapitiya road, Pamankada road, Pamankada-Bambalapitiya road (i.e., from Buller's road to the Pamankada bridge)—To Bamabalapitiya road.

(3) Wellawatta Station road, Pamanakada-Cotta road, (i.e., from Wellawatta Station to the Kirillapone bridge)—To Pamankada road.

(1) and (3) Recommended. (2) Deferred.

(4) To consider letter No. 6,382 of July 4, 1925, from the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, requesting that a Municipal by-law be passed closing 1st Division, Maradana, from Skinner's road-Maradana Junction to Panchikawatta Maradana Junction to bullocks carts, buses, and lorries.—Recommended.

(5) To recommend street lines for the narrow lane off Thimbrigasyaya road, near No. 129, as indicated in plan No. 316, dated June 2, 1925, signed by Mr. N. M. Ingram, Municipal Engineer, to be declared a minor street, under section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.—Recommended.

(6) To consider the suggestion made by Mr. R. L. Pereira, M.M.C., in Council on July 1, 1925, regarding the adoption of a by-law under the provision of section 18 (2) (j) of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, prohibiting the use by motor buses and lorries of the following roads:—Hulftsdorp street from San Sebastian street-Lockgate junction to Dam street, and the whole of Belmont street.—Recommended with the alteration of San Sebastian street to San Sebastian Hill. Also recommended that that part of Buller's road between East and West Baseline road and the Cotta road be closed to buses only.

(7) With regard to the vote of Rs. 3,000, sanctioned by Council on June 10, 1925, for the erection of a set of cool lines for Kanatta Cemetery to approve the proposal of the Medical Officer of Health to erect the buildings on the site shown in blue instead of in red on plan No. 303, dated April 21, 1925, signed by Mr. N. M. Ingram, Municipal Engineer.—Recommended.

(9) To consider:—(a) A schedule of quotations received through the Councils' Agents for the supply of certain materials, as per schedule, dated July 11, 1925, initiated by the Works Engineer required for the Slave Island Market.—(a) Considered; (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Engineer that the lowest quotation be accepted in each case. The total cost is estimated at £510 13s. 6d., c.i.f., Colombo.

Note.—The cost will be met from Advance Account, Stores, and debited to works as usual.—(b) Recommended.

(10) To consider:—(a) Letter No. 108 of July 6, 1925, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, asking whether the services of Mr. W. M. Thyne, Waterworks Engineer, could be spared for such a period as would enable him to inspect and make a report on the proposed duplication of the water main at Galle.—(a) Considered; (b) A memorandum of the Waterworks Engineer on the subject, stating that he is unable to state definitely what his fee would be, but it would not exceed Rs. 1,000, half of which, in accordance with the Council's rules, would be credited to Municipal Council's Revenue.—(b) Recommended.

(11) To select from the applicants and submit to the Council the names of candidates for the post of Surveyor, Municipal Engineer's Department, indicating if the Committees think fit, the candidate whom they recommend the Council to appoint.

(12) To consider an application from the Waterworks Engineer for supplemental provision of Rs. 4,880 15 under vote K-3, "Maintenance of Colombo Waterworks," owing to repairs to leak on 30-inch diameter water main at 1 1/4 miles and to the renewal of a large number of service connections to private premises found defective on complaints received from owners of premises, and also owing to road improvements.—Recommended.

(14) To consider:—(a) A letter dated July 9, 1925, from the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C., M.M.C., asking that a bus stand be provided in the Mutwal area.—(a) Considered. (b) A report of the Municipal Engineer asking for a vote of Rs. 1,500 for erecting a bus stand at the junction of Vaystwyk, Ferguson's, and Vine street south roads.—(b) Recommended.

(15) To consider:—(a) An application from Mr. M. Hamid Haniffa for water service to his block of land situated in the lane off Colpétty road.—(a) Considered; (b) A plan and an estimate of Rs. 1,756 89 from the Waterworks Engineer for laying a 3-inch diameter water main for a distance of 221 yards in the lane. The lane being a private lane the application will have to be dealt with under Ordinance No. 9 of 1916. The applicant and Mr. M. F. M. Munsoor have expressed their willingness to contribute their shares which amount to Rs. 852 47. The Waterworks Engineer recommends that the main be laid on payment of the above sum of Rs. 852 47. Funds are available.—(b) Recommended.

(16) To consider a report of the Medical Officer of Health with regard to Kanatta Cemetery improvements, recommending that provision be made in the Budget for 1926, for the employment of 8 additional coolies at the Kanatta Cemetery as the staff allotted to the general portion of the Cemetery is inadequate.

Note.—The increased cost at 88 cents per cooly per day will be Rs. 2,569·60 a year. As a set off against this the Council collected last year, for tending graves, a sum of Rs. 2,328·51.—Recommended.

(17) To consider an application from the Municipal Engineer for the purchase, through the Council's Agents, of 3,000 barrels of cement in monthly shipments of 1,000 barrels at 11s. 6d. per barrel, c.i.f., Colombo.

Note.—The cement will be put into stock, and the cost will be debited to Advance Account, Stores, and charged to sanctioned votes as and when the cement is used.—Recommended.

(19) To consider a report of the Municipal Engineer dated July 23, 1925, regarding the expenditure incurred under the vote of Rs. 1,000 provided for general expenses of the Public Library and a memorandum of the Chairman, asking for supplemental provision of Rs. 1,000.—Recommended.

Note.—Funds are provided in the Supplemental Budget for 1925.—Recommended.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on August 22, 1925, at 2 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated August 17, 1925.

Present :—Mr. T. B. Russell, Chairman; Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe; Dr. E. P. Aserappa; and Mr. S. W. Dassanaikie.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 11, 1925, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. I. Durham moved :—“That the Superintendent of Works be authorized to keep in good order and condition the War Memorial at the entrance to the Fort gate.” Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. W. Dassanaikie moved :—“That the Superintendent of Works be asked to submit estimates for trapping all the gullies in the Fort of Galle connected with the sewers, providing, of course, for proper ventilation, at as early a date as possible, say, before the next meeting of Council.”

With the permission of Council, the mover added the word “Municipal” before the word “gullies.” Dr. E. P. Aserappa seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved :—“That the meetings of the Standing Committees be held either immediately after the monthly meetings of the Council, or a fortnight earlier; and that the recommendations of the Committees be circulated among those members of the Council who are not members of the Committees before they are submitted for consideration by the Council.”

With the permission of Council, the mover amended the motion by deleting the words “either,” and “or a fortnight earlier.” The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar seconded.—Carried.

It was agreed that the Council Meetings should be held at 1.15 p.m., in future.

5. Progress report dated August 14, 1925 of the Government Electrical Engineer of progress of work done in connection with the Galle Electric Lighting Scheme.—Read.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

6.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 22, 1925.*

(2) Papers *re* sewer at Lighthouse street.—Recommended that the estimate of Rs. 115 for trapping the gully opposite Messrs. A. R. Ephraums' Co-operative Company's Stores, and providing an inspection manhole, be approved.

(3) To consider the following estimates :—(a) Rs. 100 for enclosing the dressing room at Victoria Park, for the use of females.—Recommended.

(b) Rs. 650 for widening the southern side of Middle street, between Messrs. A. R. Ephraums Co-operative Company's Stores and the Public Works Department Office.—Recommended that consideration be deferred till the 1926 Budget is considered.

(c) Rs. 950 for repairs to the Municipal cart shed.—Recommended.

(4) Ricksha stands.—Recommended that the stands provided at the following places, viz., (1) Hospital street, near the Police Station, (2) Church street, opposite the New Oriental Hotel, (3) Bazaar road, opposite the Dutch cemetery, and (4) Park road, north of Victoria Park, be declared public ricksha stands.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

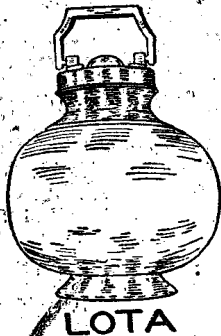

A process of oil conversion, consisting in passing hydrocarbon oil in a continuous stream through an elongated passageway in a furnace where said oil is subjected to a cracking temperature, in transferring the oil to an enlarged chamber where vaporization of a substantial portion occurs, in introducing the vapors to a dephlegmator, and in aiding the condensation of the insufficiently cracked vapors passing through said dephlegmator by introducing charging stock to the dephlegmator, in passing the condensate from said dephlegmator and the charging stock to the inlet side of said passageway to travel there through and in maintaining a superatmospheric pressure on the oil undergoing treatment.
2. A process as described in claim 1 in which the charging stock admitted to the dephlegmator physically commingles with the vapors and is introduced to the cracking passageway while mixed with the condensate.
3. A process of oil conversion, consisting in passing oil through a coil where said oil is subjected to a cracking temperature, in introducing the oil in a substantially liquid phase to an enlarged conversion chamber, in discharging vapors from said chamber to a reflux condenser, in maintaining differential superatmospheric pressure on said oil in said coil, conversion chamber and dephlegmator, in re-cracking reflux condensate from said reflux condenser, and in discharging residuum from the system.
4. A process of oil conversion, comprising passing oil through a cracking coil where it is subjected to a cracking temperature, in introducing the oil to enlarged oil receivers adjacent said coil through which oil successively passes, in discharging vapors from said receptacles to a dephlegmator, in returning reflux condensate from said system, and in maintaining a superatmospheric pressure on the oil undergoing treatment.

5. A process of oil conversion, comprising passing oil through a cracking coil where it is subjected to a cracking temperature, in introducing the oil to enlarged oil receivers adjacent said coil through which oil successively passes, in discharging vapors from said receptacles to a dephlegmator, in returning reflux condensate for retreatment to the cracking coil, in discharging residuum from said system, and in maintaining superatmospheric pressure on the oil in the coil and the reaction chamber, and in reducing the pressure in the dephlegmator below the pressure on the cracking coil and enlarged receivers but above atmospheric.

6. A process of oil conversion, consisting in heating oil in a cracking coil to a cracking temperature, in introducing the highly heated oil to a conversion chamber, and in controlling the temperature and introduction of oil to said chamber so that the oil introduced thereto separates into vapors and a residue consisting principally of coke, in discharging said vapors continuously to a dephlegmator, in condensing the insufficiently cracked vapors in said dephlegmator while permitting the lighter vapors to escape, and in withdrawing the coke at the end of a run from said conversion chamber.

7. A process in accordance with claim 5 wherein the reflux condensate is returned to the cracking coil under a mechanical pressure.

8. A process in accordance with claim 7, in which the reflux condensate may or may not collect in a body and be then returned under a pump pressure to the cracking coil.

9. Process of producing lighter products from heavier hydrocarbons, consisting in subjecting relatively heavy hydrocarbon oil to a cracking temperature in a heating zone, comprising superposed rows of tubes and permitting the release of the generated vapors, subjecting the vapors to dephlegmation in a dephlegmating means through which the vapors travel in obstructed paths, and in assisting the condensation of the heavier insufficiently cracked vapors in said dephlegmating means by passing oil thereto, in returning said condensate and the preheated oil to the heating zone, first causing it to pass through the upper rows of tubes which are in the hottest part of the heating zone, passing this oil from the upper rows of tubes downwardly to the lowermost rows of tubes, and then upwardly through the tubes, and in maintaining a superatmospheric pressure on the system.

10. A process of producing lighter fractions from heavier hydrocarbons, consisting in subjecting hydrocarbon oil to a cracking temperature in a heating zone, in permitting the release of generated vapors, in passing the vapors to dephlegmators located away from the heating zone through which the vapors travel in obstructed paths, and in assisting condensation of the heavier insufficiently cracked vapors passing through said dephlegmators by introducing oil thereto, in returning said condensate to the heating zone and re-cracking same, in introducing the preheated oil to the heating zone, and in maintaining a superatmospheric pressure on said system.

11. A process of producing lighter fraction from heavier hydrocarbons, consisting in subjecting hydrocarbon oil to a cracking temperature in a heating zone, in separating the generated vapors, introducing said vapors at various heights into vertical dephlegmating means located away from the heating zone through which the vapors travel in obstructed paths, in assisting the condensation of the heavier insufficiently cracked vapors in said dephlegmating means by introducing charging oil thereto, in returning the condensate to the heating zone, and re-cracking same in introducing the preheated oil to the heating zone, and in maintaining a superatmospheric pressure on said system.

12. A process as defined in claims 5 and 6, in which regulated quantities of incondensable gas produced in the process is returned to the vaporizing cracking zone to assist conversion.

13. A process as defined in claims 5 and 6, in which regulated quantities of incondensable gas produced in the process is heated and returned to the vaporizing cracking zone to assist conversion.

14. A process of oil conversion, consisting in passing hydrocarbon oil in a continuous stream through an elongated passageway in a furnace where said oil is subjected to a cracking temperature, in transferring the oil to an enlarged chamber where vaporization of a substantial portion occurs, in introducing the vapors to a dephlegmator, and in aiding the condensation of the insufficiently cracked vapors passing through said dephlegmator by introducing charging stock and distillate produced in the process to the dephlegmator, in passing condensate from said dephlegmator and the preheated unvaporized portion of the charging stock to the inlet side of said passageway, to travel there through continuously, and in maintaining a superatmospheric pressure on the system.

“Improvements in electric radiators.”

Abstract.—The nature of the invention is described in the claims as follows:—

1. An electric radiator comprising one or more tubes of a substance which is heat refractory, and a conductor of electricity in the form of a helical coil disposed around the external surface of the tube or tubes so that when an electric current is passed through the conductor the tube or tubes is or are heated to a high degree so as to radiate heat by incandescence and at the same time cause an upward current of air through the said tube or tubes where whereby the air in the room or space containing the radiator is heated by radiation and by convection currents.

2. A radiator as claimed in claim 1, wherein the heating tube or tubes is or are mounted in a frame or stand with their upper and lower ends open to the atmosphere, and wherein one or more deflectors are arranged for directing the heated air from the tubes in a forward direction.

3. A radiator as claimed in claims 1 and 2, wherein the frame or stand is furnished behind the heating tube or tubes with a curved or concave deflecting surface which is directed forwardly and upwardly from its lower edge for the purpose set forth.

4. A radiator as claimed in claims 1, 2, or 3, wherein the heating tube or tubes is or are surrounded by another tube of heat refractory material for protection and radiation purposes.

5. A radiator as claimed in claims 1, 2, 3, or 4, wherein the heating tube or tubes is or are provided with means for disturbing or mixing the air in its passage through it or them.

6. A radiator according to claim 1 comprising a single tube having a conductor coiled around its external surface and provided with supporting feet at its lower end substantially as described.

7. An electric radiator comprising an open-ended tube of heat refractory material having an electric resistance applied around its external surface, and contact pins projecting longitudinally from one end of said tube, said pins being connected to the ends of said electric resistance for the purpose specified.

8. The improved radiators, constructed, arranged, and operating as hereinbefore described and illustrated in the accompanying drawings.
