THE following instructions with regard to Applications for Certificates of Naturalization by Aliens resident in a Colony not possessing responsible Government are published for general information :—

The British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914.

INSTRUCTIONS AS TO APPLICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATES OF NATURALIZATION BY ALIENS RESIDENT IN A COLONY NOT POSSESSING RESPONSIBLE GOVERNMENT.

The Act requires an applicant to satisfy the Governor—

- (a) That he has resided in His Majesty's dominions for not less than five years in the following manner : that is to say, for one year immediately preceding the application in the Colony, and for a period of four years within the last eight years before the application either in the Colony or in some other part of His Majesty's dominions ;
- (b) That he is of good character and has an adequate knowledge of the English language ; and
- (c) That he intends, if his application is granted, either to reside in His Majesty's dominions or to serve under the Crown.

1. An application for a Certificate of Naturalization must be by way of a memorial addressed to the Governor.
2. The applicant's memorial must show the following particulars :—

The memorial must also show—

- (a) That the applicant has fulfilled the conditions with respect to residence in the British dominions required by the Act (see above). Full details should be given both as to time and place of residence during a period of at least five years immediately preceding the application. If these five years have not been spent entirely within the British dominions, details both as to residence in the British dominions and residence elsewhere over such longer period, not exceeding eight years, as may comprise five years' residence in the British dominions should be shown.

The details should be set out clearly by dates and address as follows :—

- (b) That the applicant intends, if his application is granted, either to reside in His Majesty's dominions or to serve under the Crown.

3. For the purpose of the requirements of the Act as to residence whether in the Colony or elsewhere in His Majesty's dominions, residence will be taken as meaning continuous personal presence subject to such brief and occasional periods of absence as may seem to the Governor not inconsistent with essential continuity of residence. Any period of absence, however brief, must be stated in the memorial in the way indicated above.

4. If the applicant desires that the certificate should extend not only to him personally, but also to any child or children of his, being minors, the memorial should contain a statement to that effect, and should give the full name, the date and place of birth, and the present place of residence of any child whose name is sought to be included in the certificate.

5. The statements in the memorial must be supported by a statutory declaration§ made by the applicant.

6. The statements in the memorial with respect to residence must be verified by a like declaration made by some person who is able to testify thereto. This declaration must repeat specifically, as to both time and place, the statements which it purports to verify. The declarant must be—

- (a) A natural-born British subject ;
- (b) Not the agent or the solicitor of the applicant ; and
- (c) Able to testify to the facts of residence from personal knowledge and not from information only.

* If the applicant is known by a name other than his original name, both should be stated thus—

"A. B. (original name), commonly known as C. D."

† The place of birth should be stated, so far as practicable in the form of a postal address, showing the province or other division of the country as well as the town or district in which the applicant was born.

‡ Nationality should be described accurately, by reference to the Sovereign State of which the applicant is a subject, e.g., a Russian Pole or a Finn should be described as a Russian ; a Prussian Pole or a Honoverian, as a German. If an applicant has lost the nationality he acquired at birth, or acquired any other nationality, his original natinality should nevertheless be specified, with a statement of the circumstances in which it was lost or the new one acquired.

§ A statutory declaration means a declaration of the nature provided for by the Statutory Declarations Act, 1835. If the law of the Colony makes no provision for such declarations, an affidavit will be necessary.

These particulars and also the declarant's place of residence and occupation must be set out in the declaration. The manner in which knowledge of the facts of residence was acquired must be stated in detail. A statement that it was acquired, through "business transactions" will not be sufficient, unless it is made plain that the business transactions were of such a nature, or carried on in such circumstances, as to give the declarant the knowledge to which he testifies. Should there be no one such person who is able from personal knowledge to testify to the facts of residence during the full statutory terms of five years, declarations by two or more persons may be submitted, made either jointly or by each declarant separately, so as to cover the whole term. Each declarant must set out the particular facts of residence as to which he has personal knowledge, and in the case of a joint declaration each declarant must state separately with regard to himself the particulars under headings (a), (b), and (c) above. Where any part of the residence relied upon his residence in any other part of His Majesty's dominions, the Governor will be prepared to accept a declaration made in that part which is proved to him to be of a binding character. In case of residence in any other British Possession, however, if possible, either the declarant should be a responsible public official in the Possession or the declaration should be accompanied by a written statement made by such an official as to the position and credibility of the declarant. In case of residence in the United Kingdom a statutory declaration made under the Statutory Declarations Act, 1835, must be furnished.

7. The statements in the memorial must, in addition, be verified generally, and the good character and loyalty of the applicant must be vouched for by statutory declarations made in like manner by four persons, each of whom must be—

- (a) A householder ;
- (b) A natural-born British subject ; and
- (c) Not the agent or solicitor of the applicant.

These particulars and also the declarant's place of residence, his occupation, and the period during which he has personally known the applicant must be set out in his declaration. The declaration may be made by the declarants jointly, or by each separately. In the case of a joint declaration each declarant must state separately with regard to himself the particulars under headings (a), (b), and (c) above. The person who makes a declaration for the purposes of Article 6 of these instructions may also, if he is a householder, make a declaration for the purposes of this Article.

8. A declaration made for the purposes of these instructions must not be made before a person who is the agent or solicitor of the applicant.

9. The memorial to which any declaration made for the purposes of these instructions relates must be made an exhibit to the declaration in such a way as to make it clear that the declaration does relate to the memorial.

10. The statements in the memorial and the declarations will be made the subjects of independent inquiry directed by the Governor.

11. When a certificate is granted, further instructions as to taking and registering the Oath of Allegiance will be issued.

12. The above instructions are not applicable in the case of a woman who was a British subject previously to her marriage to an alien, and whose husband has died, whose marriage has been dissolved, or in the case of persons relying on service under the Crown, or where the certificate sought comes within one of the following exceptional classes, viz., Certificates of Naturalization which the Governor is empowered to grant :—

- (a) To a person with respect to whose nationality as a British subject a doubt exists (s. 4 of the Act) ;
- (b) To minors in special cases (s. 5 of the Act) ; and
- (c) To persons who have been naturalized under repealed Acts (s. 6 of the Act).

Special instructions should be applied for by persons desiring any of these certificates.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 29, 1927.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 145 (2 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 74 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 26 Moors, 7 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1927, viz., 260,345) was 29.0, as against 37.1 in the preceding week, 29.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 140 (7 Burghers, 74 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 26 Moors, 5 Malays, and 6 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.0, as against 29.8 in the previous week, 34.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 140 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twelve deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, as against 17 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

A process for automatically controlling the speed of runners moving on overhead rails, ropeways or wireshoots.
Abstract.—Vanes are attached to the spindle of the pulley of the runner so that they rotate therewith when the runner is in motion.

The claims are :—

1. Means for controlling the maximum speed of Rubbers on Wireshoots and the like, comprising vanes, paddles or impellers fixed to the axle of the grooved wheel of the runner and revolving with it, substantially as and for the purpose described.
2. Means for the purposes aforesaid comprising flat vanes.
3. Means for the purposes aforesaid comprising vanes or paddles bent and/or returned at the tips.

Improvements on portable apparatus for incinerating rubbish.

Abstract.—A single cylindrical metal shell is fixed vertically on steel legs. Three flat steel bars bolted to the fire bar grid form a clear central air space. A cone-shaped cover can be lifted for feeding purposes and has at its top a flat circular pivoted door for regulation of the draught.

The claims are :—

1. In portable apparatus for the incineration of rubbish and the like a centre shaft constructed to create a passage of air for creating and accelerating combustion in centre of cylindrical casing, this keeping the sides cool.
2. In portable apparatus for the incineration of rubbish and the like a pivoted door is provided on to of the cover for regulating the draft according to the nature of the material to be destroyed.
3. In portable apparatus for the incineration of rubbish and the like a centre shaft constructed to create a passage of air for accelerating combustion and a pivoted door fitted on the top of the lid to regulate the draft according to the nature of the material to be burnt.

Improvements relating to a process and apparatus for completely atomising heavy hydrocarbons.

Abstract.—The jet of primary mixture impinges vertically on the lower conical end of a hollow body, which is heated internally, and is thereby deflected into narrow passages between this body and the inner wall of the jacket, which is also heated. The ends of the narrow passages terminate in spiral passages which give a whirl to the gas, which then enters a Venturi tube, in which it is intimately mixed with more air.

The claims are :—

1. A process for atomising heavy hydrocarbons, consisting in directing a stream of a primary mixture (air-fuel or steam-fuel) against a hollow body, having a conical end and heated internally the conical end of this body penetrating into the central portion of an deflecting the stream of mixture into a number of passages formed outside the body, after passing through which a gyratory or whirling movement is imparted to the thin streams so as to obtain a completely atomised and homogeneous mixture whereupon the mixture is passed into a secondary mixing chamber and mixed with an additional supply of air, substantially as described.
 2. Apparatus for carrying into effect the process according to claim 1, and which may be applied to or form an integral portion of a liquid fuel injector used for heating the grates of boilers, metallurgical furnaces, for the supply of internal combustion engines and so forth, the said apparatus comprising a hollow body, having a conical end and heated internally, this body serving as a deflector for the primary mixture, a number of passages around the body through which the mixture passes, means for imparting a gyratory movement to the mixture after it leaves the passages, and a secondary mixing chamber in the form of a venturi disposed beyond said body, wherein the primary mixture is mixed with additional air, substantially as described.
 3. An apparatus as claimed in claim 2, wherein the hollow body is provided on its periphery with passages which terminate in spiral passages at the upper end of the hollow body, these spiral passages imparting a whirling movement to the atomized fluid passing from the first mentioned passages, substantially as described.
 4. An apparatus as claimed in claims 2 and 3, wherein the cross sectional area of the passages increases in the direction of the movement of the fluid, substantially as described.
 5. An apparatus as claimed in claim 2, wherein the walls of the passages through which the primary mixture passes and the walls of the secondary mixing chamber, are heated by the circulation of a suitable fluid, substantially as described.
 6. An apparatus as claimed in claim 2, wherein the wall of the hollow body is provided with ports of suitable shape, so that the interior of the hollow body may be placed in communication with the remainder of the apparatus, substantially as described.
 7. A process for completely atomising heavy hydrocarbons, substantially as described.
- Apparatus for completely atomising heavy hydrocarbons constructed and arranged as a whole substantially as described, in connection with the various figures of the accompanying drawings.

Improved process of treating the skins of plagiostome fishes preparatory to tanning.

Abstract.—Skins are sterilized, pickled and decalcified by immersion in a bath of pure salt solution and hydrochloric acid.

The claims are :—

1. An improved process for sterilizing, pickling and decalcifying the skins of plagiostome fishes which consists in removing the said skins from the fishes as soon as possible after they are caught and without delay, immersing said skins in a bath comprising a saturated solution of sodium chloride strong acidulated with hydrochloric acid, said bath simultaneously dehydrating and decalcifying said skins, substantially as described.

2. An improved process for sterilizing, pickling and decalcifying the skins of plagiostome fishes as claimed in claim 1 characterised by the addition of 250 c.c. of hydrochloric acid to every litre of saturated solution of sodium chloride to effect the required acidulation, substantially as described.

Process and device for the skinning of cartilaginous fishes, such as, and particularly, sharks.

Abstract.—The fins and tail are first cut off: the next cuts are down the middle of the back, and then round the body behind the head. Cuts are made from this line to the holes left by the pectoral fins, so removing the gills, and from the tail to the holes left by the ventral and anal fins. The head is attached to a pulley and the jaws of pinchers are attached to the skin at the neck and are also attached to pulleys—the skin is then removed by pulling the pinchers down keeping the body fixed, or by raising the body while the pinchers are fixed.

The claims are :—

1. A process for the skinning of cartilaginous fishes, particularly sharks, comprising the cutting off of the dorsal, pectoral, ventral, anal and caudal fins, the cutting of the skin at the back along a middle line, starting from the section of the tail and proceeding up to the head where the cut meets a transverse cut of circular section adjacent the gills, said cut passing around the fifth or foremost gills and avoiding the holes left by the ablation of the pectoral fins, the application of strong tractions or pulls directed towards the tail, at several points on the edge of the skin which has been cut transversely until the whole skin is reversed upon itself and is detached from the body of the cartilaginous fish, substantially as described.

2. A mechanical device for carrying out the process as claimed in claim 1, in a rapid and easy manner consisting of a clamping means for holding the edge of the skin, at several points on the transversal circular cut, cable or chains for traction or pulling purposes attached to said clamping means for suspending the fish by the head from the top of a tripod or other suitable structure, and means for exerting a continuous or alternating pull simultaneously or not, on the cables connecting the clamping devices, so that the seized edge of the cut skin is turned back upon itself and is thus detached from the body, substantially as described.

3. A modification of the device as claimed in claim 2 for use when the fish is suspended by the head, at the end of a traction cable passing over a pulley secured to the top of a structure, tower or the like, so that the fish shall be entirely in a trench or an opening below the level of the ground or of the floor, the arrangement of the jaws of pinchers or other clamping element attached to the ground or to the floor, around the trench or the opening being so adapted that by exerting a continuous or intermittent traction upon the suspension cable for the fish, the body is raised to the top of the structure and is progressively stripped of its skin, substantially as described.

"THE EDUCATION ORDINANCE, NO. 1 OF 1920."

BY-LAWS made by the Jaffna Urban Education District Committee under section 25 (1) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920," approved by the Board of Education and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. *Definitions.*—In these by-laws the terms "boy," "girl," and "child" shall mean a boy or a girl or a child residing within the administrative limits of the Jaffna Urban District Council.

The term "parent" includes a guardian and any person who has the actual custody of a child.

The term "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Jaffna Urban Education District Committee elected under section 19 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

The term "Code" means the Code for assisted schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an attendance register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "school" means an elementary school recognized as such by the Director of Education and shall include the schools specified in Schedule A hereto.

The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the same meaning given to them in sub-sections (2) and (3) of section 25 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

2. *Parents' Obligation.*—The parent of any child between the ages of 6 and 14, or in the case of Muslim and Tamil girls between the ages of 6 and 10, residing within the administrative limits of the Jaffna Urban District Council, shall cause such boy or girl to attend school unless other adequate and suitable provision has been made for the education of such boy or girl or unless there is reasonable excuse for his or her non-attendance.

Provided that (a) no boy over 8 years of age shall be compelled to attend school from any distance exceeding 2 miles from his residence; (b) no boy of less than 8 years of age shall be compelled to attend a school more than $\frac{3}{4}$ mile distant from his residence; (c) no girl shall be compelled to attend a school more than $\frac{3}{4}$ mile distant from her residence, or a school in which no female teacher is employed; and (e) provided always that when a child between 10 or 14 years of age, being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Urban Education District Committee has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he or she has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic the 4th Standard prescribed by the Code for the time being he or she shall not be required to attend school.

3. *Householders' Obligation.*—The Chairman shall cause to be served on each householder before December 31 in every year a copy of schedule in form A showing date of birth, parents' name and residence, and name of school of all children of school-going age. It shall be the duty of every householder to fill up the same and return it within 14 days.

4. No elementary school shall be kept open for the purpose of giving instruction to pupils for more than 6 hours a day including intervals for meals, &c. The hour at which school work should commence may be left to the discretion of the Manager or the Headmaster, but no school should open earlier than 8 A.M. or later than 10 A.M. The school Time Table should be approved by the Inspector of Schools.

5. No elementary school, shall, except with the permission of the Divisional or District Inspector of Schools, be kept open for school work on more than 6 days in a week or 22 days in the month, or on less than 200 days a year.

6. *Penalties for Offences.*—Every parent or householder who shall not observe or shall neglect or violate these by-laws or any of them shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding Rs. 5, and in the case of a continuing offence an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day.
