SCHEDULE.

By-law 10 of the by-laws relating to leave of the Municipal Council of Colombo published by Proclamation dated October 26, 1914, in *Government Gazette* No. 6,683 of November 20, 1914, as the same is amended by Proclamation dated June 15, 1921, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,183 of June 17, 1921, is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph at the end of paragraph (i.) of the said by-law, viz. :—

Appendix F.

CEYLON MEDICAL CORPS.

CAMP STANDING ORDERS.

1. *Orders.*—Regimental orders are published when necessary. Soldiers will be held personally responsible that they make themselves acquainted with such orders. Ignorance of published orders will not be admitted as an excuse for their non-observance.

2. *Arrival in Camp.*—Except those coming into camp with the main body, all soldiers will report themselves at the C. M. C. orderly room immediately they arrive in camp. Officers, on arrival, will at once sign the Arrival Book kept in the orderly room.

3. *Duties.*—The orders for the Orderly Officer, Orderly Sergeant, N. C. O's, and men living in camp, the Ward Master, &c., are laid down in C. M. C. Rules, Appendix D.

4. *Parades, &c.*—The hours for parades, lectures, &c., will be notified in Orders. Companies will fall in for inspection by Company Officers ten minutes before the time appointed for the parade, lecture, &c.

All officers and other ranks not actually on duty will attend.

5. *Sick Parades.*—The Orderly Corporal for the day will march the sick to the medical inspection room at 7 A.M. and 6 P.M. Sick reports will be rendered in duplicate, one copy being retained in the hospital and the other being handed in to the orderly room on completion.

Only urgent cases will be attended to at hours other than those stated above.

6. *Fatigues, Stretcher Squads, and Special Duties.*—Fatigues, stretcher squads, and special duties will parade as ordered. Fatigues will not be allowed to interfere with parades. Soldiers on light duty will parade under the Orderly Corporal at 8 A.M. outside the C. M. C. orderly room.

7. *Dress for Parades.*—The following are the orders of dress in camp :—

Ordinary Daily Parades.

Helmet, shirt, shorts, puttees, hose tops, belt, and black boots.

(Officers: Shirt, breeches or shorts, gaiters or puttees, and hose tops.)

Water bottles and haversacks will be worn on field manoeuvres.

Ceremonial and Church Parades.

Helmet (chin strap down), tunic, belt, shorts, puttees, hose tops, and black boots, orders and decorations.

(Officers: Breeches, gaiters, and sword.)

Walking Out.

Helmet, tunic, slacks, belt, and black boots, canes.

Caps will be worn after 4 p.m.

Physical Drill.

Shorts, shirts or vests, boots or shoes.

Mess Dress.

Khaki.

N.B.—All members must shave before the first dress parade each day. Buttons, badges, &c., must be polished before the first dress parade each day, and before walking out in the afternoon.

8. *Orderly Room.*—Orderly room will be held immediately after the conclusion of the morning parades when officers and other ranks having business, &c., to transact will attend.

(b) Parade states will be submitted to the Staff Officer, C. D. Force daily.

9. *Passes.*—Soldiers are not to leave camp without a pass. The camp radius will be one mile from the four crossroads south of the C. D. F. camp. All ranks will be properly dressed when leaving camp.

Passes will be issued only in exceptional circumstances, when recommended by the O. C., Companies, and must be signed by the Adjutant, or O. C., C. M. C. Passes must be applied for 24 hours before they are required.

10. *Picking and uprooting of Flowers and Plants.*—The practice of picking flowers and the uprooting of plants in railway station gardens is strictly forbidden. Officers and N. C. O's. in charge of parties travelling by train will see that this order is adhered to.

11. *Railway Warrants.*—Members requiring warrants to return to their stations must apply for same to the Adjutant, through the Orderly Sergeant, at least 24 hours before the warrants are required. Soldiers who have been granted leave for camp by the Heads of their Departments will not be allowed to return to their stations before the expiration of their leave. Only single warrants will be issued. "Return" warrants on camp duty will on no account be issued. No warrants will be issued for pianos.

12. *Travelling Claims.*—All travelling claims in connection with camp must be submitted in triplicate on General Form No. 177 (E) 3/24 within 10 days of the breaking up of camp. Under receipts must be attached.

13. *Complaints, Applications, &c.*—All complaints, requests for railway warrants, leave, passes, &c., must be made through the Orderly Sergeant to the Adjutant.

14. *Saluting.*—Warrant Officers, N. C. O's., and men will salute all Commissioned Officers whom they know to be such, whether in uniform or not; they will similarly salute such Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy as have rank corresponding to that of Commissioned Officers in the Army.

N. C. O's. and men will address Warrant Officers in the same manner as they do Officers, but will not salute them.

15. *Gambling Forbidden.*—Gambling in camp is forbidden. This includes bookmaking or acting as an agent for a bookmaker.

16. *Wines, Spirits, &c., forbidden in Barrack Rooms.*—The introduction of wines, spirits, &c., into barrack rooms is forbidden.

17. *Canteen Chits.*—The mess and canteen caterers must note that the Corps will not hold itself responsible for any credit allowed to its members.

18. *Concerts, &c.*—All concerts and other entertainments in camp must cease by 9.45 P.M., unless special permission has been obtained for an extension of time, and men must then go to their huts.

No singing or talking is allowed in the huts after "lights out." The senior N. C. O. in each hut will be responsible to see that this order is carried out.

19. *Precautions against Fire.*—The senior N. C. O. in each hut will see that all lights in his hut are out by 10 P.M.

Fire buckets are provided, two in each hut, one for sand and one for water. Hut orderlies will see that the water in the fire buckets is changed once a day.

If a fire breaks out or an alarm is raised, every soldier will turn out, fall in outside his hut, and await orders.

20. *Damages or Deficiency.*—(a) All damage to or deficiency of Government or regimental property must immediately be reported to the Orderly Sergeant by those concerned. The Orderly Sergeant will report same to the Orderly Officer for necessary action. Damages, &c., will as far as possible be charged to individuals, sections, or companies.

(b) The C. D. F. has incurred considerable expense in planting shade trees in camp. All ranks are warned against damaging them. The senior N. C. O. in each hut will be held responsible for any damage done to the trees in the vicinity of his hut.

21. *Camp Equipment.*—All N. C. O's. and men who have not drawn their camp equipment in Colombo or Kandy will draw same from the C. M. C. orderly room on reporting their arrival in camp.

22. *Return of Camp Equipment.*—All camp equipment will be returned into stores within a fortnight of the breaking up of camp. Colombo members will return their equipment to C. M. C. Headquarters, Colombo, and Kandy members to

Lieutenant V. H. L. Anthonisz, C. M. C., Kandy. Outstation members who have been issued their equipment in camp will return same to the C. M. C. orderly room before they leave camp.

23. *Return of Bedding, &c.*—All members, before they leave camp, are ordered to return their blankets, bedding, &c., to the Q. M. stores, C. M. C., and see that their receipts for same are cancelled. They will otherwise be held liable for loss or damage of same.

24. *Camp Followers.*—All servants and coolies employed in camp must be provided with passes signed by the Quartermaster, C. D. Force. Applications for these passes will be rendered through the Quartermaster Sergeant, C. M. C.

Sanitary.

25. (a) *Ventilation.*—The windows of every barrack room will be opened sufficiently to allow of free ventilation, and will be kept open as far as weather condition admit.

(b) *Barrack Rooms.*—Barrack rooms will be swept clean, twice daily, by the hut orderlies. No article of food should be kept or stored in the barrack rooms.

(c) *Night Urine Buckets.*—Night urine buckets will be placed outside each end of the barrack rooms and institutes by 7 P.M. and removed by reveille each day. Pollution of the ground around the huts is strictly forbidden.

(d) *Sanitary Dustbins.*—Sanitary dustbins are placed outside each hut, and hut orderlies must see that all waste, &c., is disposed of therein.

(e) *Latrines and Baths.*—Latrines and baths allotted to other units will under no circumstances be used by any member of the C. M. C. The latrines provided are of the European pattern, and must be used in the proper manner. Men are not expected to squat, and in this manner foul the seats.

(f) *Wash Basins.*—A certain number of wash basins is allotted to each hut. The hut orderlies will be responsible for these, and see that they are brought back to the huts after being used in the bath rooms, &c.

(g) *Water.*—Members using the bath rooms and wash places must see that the water taps are properly closed before they leave. Owing to a possible shortage of water, all ranks must take every precaution to prevent waste.

(h) *Water Bottles.*—All water bottles must be washed clean every day, and left open for inspection by the Orderly Officer at his daily hut inspection. Soldiers are advised to use boiling water for cleansing their water bottles.

AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 23.—Alter first paragraph to read as follows : Second class English trained teachers under clause 21 will be awarded a first class certificate after doing satisfactory work for three successive years, and second class Anglo-vernacular trained teachers after doing satisfactory work for five successive years.

Clause 38.—Alter the second paragraph to read as follows : Before leaving their stations for the vacation or under any other circumstances, teachers should make arrangements for the care of the school building, garden, and furniture according to instructions issued by the Chairman, Education District Committee.

Clause 53.—In line 7 omit "the Chief Headman of the division, or the President." In line 8 alter "these officers" to "officers who visit the school."

Clause 121.—For "Mudaliyar . . . Assistant Government Agent" substitute "Chairman, Education District Committee."

Clause 161.—Alter the second sentence to read as follows : Applications to close school on account of epidemics should be addressed to the Chairman, Education District Committee. 4. He shall only offer books, magazines, and newspapers for sale on such parts of the respective station premises as may be agreed to by the General Manager.

5. He or his employees shall not enter or travel in the carriages of the Ceylon Government Railway for the purpose of selling books, magazines, and newspapers, or any other articles.

6. The stalls should be approved by the General Manager or person delegated by him, and the attendants in charge of them must be clean and tidy in their appearance.

7. The stalls must be stocked with the latest books issued with colonial editions and with current magazines.

8. The General Manager reserves the right to prohibit the sale of any book, magazine, or newspaper which he may consider unsuitable, and to control any undue effort on the part of the contractor to further the sale of one type of literature in preference to any other.

9. Advertisements other than of books, magazines, or newspapers may not be exhibited on the stalls.

10. The persons employed to sell books, magazines, and newspapers shall be limited to two at each station, each of whom shall wear a distinctive badge to be approved of by the General Manager.

11. Free pass on the Railway will be issued to an Inspector of the contractor for the purpose of inspection of the bookstalls.

12. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the Provincial Engineer, North-Western Province, Kurunegala, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

9. Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any of the schedules of rates submitted, nor to give all the work included in either of the foregoing projects or in any one item to any one contractor.

2. Tenders should be in duplicate, sealed under one cover, and addressed to the Conservator of Forests, Kandy.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Conservator of Forests, Kandy, or be sent by registered post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for the Purchase of Timber and Firewood, Western Division," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Conservator of Forests, Kandy, not later than midday on March 30, 1927.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Divisional Forest Office, Colombo. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 for each of the sub-coupe to be tendered for will be required to be made either at the Treasury or any Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for same before any form of the tender issued.

7. Tenderers should satisfy themselves by inspection before tendering as to the acreage and contents of the demarcated sub-coupe referred to in the annexed schedules, as the figures given therein are estimated only and their correctness is in no way guaranteed. The boundaries of each sub-coupe will be pointed out by the Range Forest Officer, Agalawatta, in respect of Karawwa, and by Range Forest Officer, Waga, in respect of Ingiriya.

8. The successful tenderer will be required to execute a purchase agreement in respect of each sub-coupe, and all tenderers should read and initial a copy of this agreement at the Office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Western Division, Colombo, at the time of obtaining forms for tendering.

9. Before execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be required (a) to pay either the full purchase amount or, if payment by instalments, 40 per cent. thereof, (b) to deposit as security for efficient and punctual fulfilment of the agreement 5 per cent. of the full purchase amount tendered by him or Rs. 20 whichever is greater. If paying by instalments the balance 60 per cent. of the full purchase price shall be paid by the purchaser in two equal instalments in accordance with clause 2 and 4 of the special conditions set out below in this notice.

10. After payment of the first instalment of the purchase price, deposit of the security, and execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be entitled on application to a refund of the sum of Rs. 20 deposited by him prior to tendering.

11. Tenderers should make separate offers written both in words and figures for the timber and firewood contained in each of the sub-coupe described in the annexed schedule.

12. No tender will be considered unless the procedure laid down above has been strictly complied with. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders and of accepting any tender not necessarily the highest tender.

13. The special rules for felling, conversion and removal which the agreement will require to be observed are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing in these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability for punishment, under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he or any of the workmen in his employ be responsible for the commission of a forest offence outside the boundaries of his purchased sub-coupe of sub-coupe.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

(1) On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser shall be entitled to fell and remove on or before March 1, 1928, in the manner specified below, all the timber and firewood contained in the purchased sub-coupe. No extension of the time limit fixed for felling, and removal will under any circumstances be granted, and all timber and firewood not removed by the date of expiry of agreement, i.e., March 1, 1928, shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown.

(2) If the purchaser desires to pay by instalments payment of a first instalment of 40 per cent. of the full purchase price of any sub-coupe shall entitle him to fell and remove all the trees in an area not exceeding one-third of the total area of such sub-coupe. Payment of 70 per cent. of the full purchase price by means of a second instalment of 30 per cent. shall entitle the purchaser to fell and remove all the trees in an area not exceeding two-thirds of the total area of such sub-coupe.

(3) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling along the full length of one boundary of each sub-coupe previously pointed out to him in respect of each sub-coupe by the Range Forest Officers concerned, and laid down on the plan of the sub-coupe annexed to agreement. He shall further agree to progress the felling in a direction parallel to the boundary along which the felling has been commenced in the manner prescribed under clause (a) and (b) below:—

- (a) All tree seedlings and saplings which are under 3 in. in diameter shall be cut out flush with the ground.
- (b) All saplings and trees over 3 in. in diameter shall be felled within 6 in. of the ground.

(4) If paying by instalments, the purchaser shall pay the second instalment or in all 70 per cent. of the full purchase price, within four months, and the third and final instalment within seven months of the date of execution of the agreement.

Should the purchaser fail to pay either instalment when due it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer to cancel the agreement as from the date of such default, and to declare same to be null and void. Any unremoved or unfelled timber or firewood lying or standing in the sub-coupe shall unconditionally revert to the Crown as from the date of such cancellation and the purchaser shall have no further claim thereto. On no account shall any postponement of the date of such payment be made.

(5) Should the purchaser fell or remove trees or firewood from any area of the sub-coupe he has not paid for, or from any sub-coupe or area of forest outside the demarcated boundaries of his sub-coupe, nothing in the agreement

hall exempt him from liability to punishment for illicit felling and removal under the provisions of the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, and of the rules framed thereunder. For the purpose of special condition 6, it shall be presumed that the purchaser has previous to entering into the agreement satisfied himself as to the position of the lines and pillars demarcating his sub-coupe, and that the purchaser has further agreed that he shall not in the event of any dispute put forward a plea of ignorance of the limits or extent of his sub-coupe.

(6) The purchaser or his agent or any of his employees shall not damage any boundary pillars or block up the boundaries by depositing any brushwood or branches. Should the lines become blocked or the pillars thrown down due to unavoidable circumstances, such lines should be at once recleared or such pillar replaced.

(7) The purchaser shall not for the purpose of removing timber from his own sub-coupe enter into any other area of forest not paid for by him except with the permission of the Range Forest Officer concerned, and along paths permitted by him.

(8) The purchaser or his agent or any of his employee shall not prevent any other purchaser of timber and firewood in adjoining sub-coups from entering into the sub-coupe paid for by the former, either in person or by his agent, or by his employees or from bringing in any animal for purpose of effecting easy removal of timber and firewood, provided such entry is made with the permission in writing of the Range Forest Officer concerned. It shall, however, be incumbent on the person making such entry to refrain from such procedure, if in the opinion of the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo, whose decision in the matter shall be final, a reasonably convenient substitute exists.

(9) The purchaser shall further agree to compensate the Crown for any damage to produce caused by himself his employees, his animals, his machinery or his material, in transit over any area of forest not paid for by him at rates to be assessed by the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo.

(10) If no objection exists in the opinion of the Divisional Forest Officer, the purchaser will further be permitted to erect wire shoots for the transport of materials always, provided that he pays full royalty values for the forest produce outside his own sub-coupe damaged during such erection, or in using such shoot. The permission in writing of the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo, must be obtained before erection of any and every wire shoot.

(11) Daily removal notes must be obtained from the Overseer in charge of timber exploitation, in respect of all forest produce before removal of any such produce to depôts outside the area of the sub-coupe, and any removal of any forest produce without the authority of such notes will be considered an infringement of this rule and punished as provided hereunder. All such notes must be retained to be produced before the Range Forest Officer concerned, before removal permits can be issued for removal of such produce from such depôt to any final destination. For the purpose of this clause the purchaser shall select for his purpose, with the approval of the Range Forest Officer concerned, a plot of ground outside the limits of the annual coupes for a depôt. The site of such depôt shall not be changed without permission.

(12) In the depôts selected under clause 11 above, the timber and other forest produce shall be stacked separately, in order to facilitate check.

(13) The purchaser shall agree that for each and every infringement of the above conditions he shall become liable to a fine of an amount not exceeding Rs. 100, to be imposed in writing by and at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo, and this fine will be recovered from the tenderer's security deposit.

(14) The purchaser shall also agree that in the event of security money having become exhausted owing to imposition of fines, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 5 per cent. of the full purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid up purchase money, if any, as may remain after deducting the value of all timber and firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation, and such amount as may be needed to carry out any of the provisions of special conditions 3 and 6

which the purchaser may not, at the time of such cancellation have fulfilled. For the purpose of this clause the value of each cubic foot of timber and cubic yard of fuel removed shall be fixed at full royalty rates.

(15) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of the enforcement of any of the penalties specified in these conditions and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as final and binding.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 26, 1927.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 249 (4 Europeans, 15 Burghers, 148 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 37 Moors, 9 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1927, viz., 260,345) was 49·9, as against 46·3 in the preceding week, 26·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 147 (5 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 20 Moors, 1 Malay, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·4, as against 32·6 in the previous week, 29·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 147 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 39 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Slave Island, 2 in Maradana South, and 1 each in Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 15 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Maradana North, as against 4 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered in St. Paul's, as against 4 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 each in Kotahena South and Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North and Slave Island, and 1 each in Maradana South and Wellawatta South, as against 11 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths of Colombo Town residents from *Phthisis* occurred at the Tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Four deaths from *Plague* were registered, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in Maradana South and Slave Island, as against nil in the previous week and nil the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death of a Colombo Town resident from *Bubonic Plague* occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Twelve deaths were registered from *Debility*, 9 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 each from *Dysentery*, *Worms*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 63 from *Other Causes*.

6. Twenty-six cases of *Chickenpox* (1 in Port), 7 of *Enteric Fever*, 6 of *Plague*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 51, 3, 3, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·7°, against 79·8° in the preceding week and 79·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·909 in., against 29·920 in. in the preceding week, and 29·922 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·41 in., against nil in the preceding week, and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Improvements in and in connection with machinery for drying tea.

Abstract.—Hot air is delivered under slight pressure into an air duct, and is there divided by an adjustable deflector into two streams. One stream goes to the top of the dryer and comes in contact with the wet tea, and after passing half way down the drier passes out through the same exit ports as the second stream of air, which has passed from the bottom of the dryer upwards. This second stream may be cooled by additional cold air. Wet tea enters at the top and travels along perforated travelling trays, placed one set below the other, until it reaches the exit at the bottom. The speeds of the different sets of trays can be regulated.

The claims are:—

1. Apparatus for drying tea, in which the leaf is conveyed on travelling trays, the speed of which can be varied as required, through two superposed drying sections and is subjected to a downward current of heated air in the upper section and an upward current of heated air in the lower section, the air passing to the atmosphere through a free space formed between the sections, substantially as described.

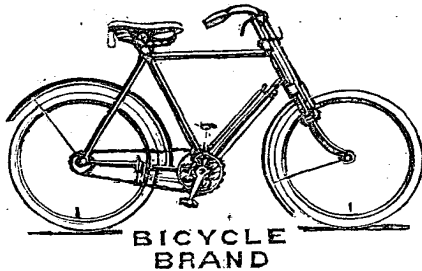

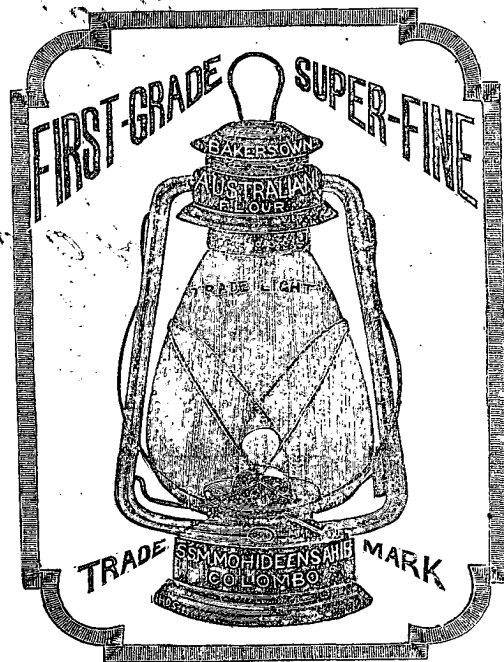
