VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1926.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The number of marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 445 (380 General, 9 Kandyan, and 56 Muslim), as against 395 in the preceding month and 314 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 173 (138 General and 35 Muslim), as against 161 in the preceding month and 133 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 2,020 (1,036 males and 984 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 37·74 per 1,000 of the population, as against 36·99 in the previous month, 35·59 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31·14 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The rate ranged from 7·09 in Mullaittivu to 76·54 in Nawalapitiya. There were 1,808 births of children, whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 33·78, as against 33·96 in the preceding month.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 844 (417 males and 427 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 38·38, as against 35·06 in the preceding month, 32·37 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·94 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 16·83 in Kollupitiya to 36·25 in Kotahena North. There were 719 births of children, whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 32·70, as against 31·20 in the preceding month.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,617 (857 males and 760 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·21, as against 31·72 in the preceding month. There were 1,246 deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 25·17, as against 25·55 in the preceding month, 30·29 in the corresponding month of last year, and 32·86 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The standardized death rate, exclusive of the towns Vavuniya and Lunugala, ranged from 58·54 in Kalpitiya to 6·93 in Nawalapitiya.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 610 (346 males and 264 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 27·74, as against 30·12 in the preceding month. There were 482 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 25·24, as against 27·17 in the preceding month, 27·54 in the corresponding month of last year, and 32·87 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The death rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 24·74 in New Bazaar to 7·01 in Kollupitiya.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 134 (78 males and 56 females), as against 137 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 373 and corresponded to a rate of 201 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended December, 1926. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 18·7, as against 190 in the preceding month, 232 in the corresponding month of last year, and 277 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. There were 348 deaths of children under one year, whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 192, as against 188 in the preceding month.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 15, and corresponded to a rate of 228 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended December, 1926. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 186, as against 201 in the preceding month, 182 in the corresponding month of last year, and 290 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. There were 143 deaths of children under one year, whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 199, as against 197 in the preceding month.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 12 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Convulsions* caused 9 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year) 8 per cent.; *Phthisis* 7 per cent.; *Diarrhoea, Malaria and Malarial Cachexia*, and *Dysentery*, each 4 per cent.; *Enteritis, Ankylostomiasis, Bright's Disease and Nephritis*, and *Influenza*, each 3 per cent.; *Prematurity, Bronchitis*, and *Enteric Fever*, each 2 per cent.; *Puerperal Septicaemia* 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo the highest mortality was from *Convulsions*, to which 10 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Pneumonia* caused 9 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year) 8 per cent.; *Phthisis*, 7 per cent.; *Influenza* and *Dysentery*, each 5 per cent.; *Enteritis* 4 per cent.; *Ankylostomiasis* and *Bronchitis*, each 3 per cent.; *Bright's Disease and Nephritis, Diarrhoea*, and *Prematurity*, each 2 per cent.; *Cancer, Tetanus*, and *Enteric Fever*, each 1 per cent.

12. Two deaths from *Plague* (in Colombo) were registered, as against 1 in the preceding month and 2 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 94 cases were reported (64 in Colombo, 10 in Galle); *Chickenpox* followed with 70 (52 in Colombo, 5 in Nuwara Eliya); *Enteric Fever* 39 (8 each in Colombo and Galle, 6 in Moratuwa); *Measles* 21 (10 in Colombo, 7 in Matale); *Continued Fever* 18 (13 in Colombo); *Dysentery* 5 (3 in Kurunegala); *Smallpox* 4 (2 each in Colombo and Galle); *Plague* 2 (in Colombo); *Mumps* 1 (in Colombo); *Whooping Cough* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—The highest rainfall was recorded in Kalmunai (12·48 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 12·29 in. in Badulla to 0·49 in. in Kalpitiya. Colombo recorded 5·61 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 81·2° in Ratnapura to 58·8° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 79·8° in Colombo.
