II IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased; with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to make the following amendments to sections 4, 27, 29, and 30 (iii.) of the Minute on Pension dated December 9, 1908 :--

Section 4 — Delete the words " but may count for a long service allowance granted under section 29 of this Minute."

Section 27.—Public servants drawing a salary at a yearly or monthly rate whose service has been entirely in a non-pensionable office may be awarded a retiring allowance not exceeding three-fourths of the amount payable under section 2.

Provided that to become eligible for an allowance under this section an officer shall have been reported by a Medical Board, nominated by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, to be permanently unfit for further active service, or shall be retired on abolition of office after serving continuously for a period of not less than fifteen years.

Provided further, that this privilege shall not be held in any way to interfere with the power of the Governor to dispense with the services of any such officer, or to reduce his salary in case of reorganization or abolition of office; and no claim to any additional grant on account of such reduction or abolition shall in any case be recognized. Any such officer shall continue to be liable to suspension, dismissal, or removal from office in the same manner as if this section did not exist.

Provided also that an assistant shroff shall not be debarred from the benefits of this section or section 28 or section 4 by reason of the fact that he has been nominated by and holds or has held office at the pleasure of a shroff, and that an assistant shroff compulsorily retired on a change of shroffs shall be deemed to have been retired on abolition of office for purposes of this section. In the case of officers of the age of 60 years no Medical Board need be appointed, but the Head of the Department should furnish proof that the officer is 60 years of age or over.

Section 29.—Daily paid employees with continuous service of fifteen years and upwards may, if the Governor be satisfied from the report of a Medical Board, to be nominated by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, that they are physically unfit to discharge the duties of their offices owing to infirmity either of mind or body, be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of 1/18th of a month's pay for each complete month's service.

In the case of officers of the age of 60 years no Medical Board need be appointed, but the Head of the Department should furnish proof that the officer is 60 years of age or over.

Provided that the service of daily paid employees in the Public Works Department shall be deemed to have been continuous, if the only breaks therein were occasioned by periods of employment on "agreement work," though such periods shall not count as service in calculating the amount of gratuity which may be awarded. It shall, moreover, be competent for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to award such gratuities in other cases in which the service has not been continuous.

In the case of a daily paid employee who dies whilst still in the service, or on leave, and who at the time of his death would, if he had retired, have been eligible for a gratuity under this section, the gratuity that would in the ordinary course have been paid to him had he retired may be paid to his widow or next of kin.

Section 30 (iii.).—Delete the words "or the long service allowance" in line 2, and "or long service allowance," in line 6.

and bounded as follows: on the north by a Gansabhawa road, Nugagahayaya, and Wembuwewamukalana Tisbambe (sanitary reserve) belonging to Crown; on the east by Wembuwewamukalana, Tisbambe (sanitary reserve) belonging to the Crown; on the south by Wembuwewamukalana, Tisbambe (sanitary reserve) belonging to hawa road; and on the west by Miyellewawewa belonging to the Crown. 107. In furtherence, and not in limitation of, and without prejudice to, the general powers conferred or implied in the last preceding clause, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say) :-

(a) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, settle, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or other legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction

- of any debts due to or from the Company, and any claims or demands made by or against the Company. (b) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform or enforce the award.
- (c) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company, and for claims and demands by the Company.
- To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents, with power to accept (d) the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, or inspector, or any similar office. (e) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not to be immediately
- required for the purposes thereof upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time to vary or release such investments.
- (f) To delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being residing or carrying on the business in Ceylon or elsewhere all or any of the powers or functions given to or exercisable by the Directors; and to confer such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes, and upon such terms and conditions and with such restrictions as the Directors may think expedient, and to confer such powers either collaterally with or to the exclusion of, and in substitution
 - for, all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf, and from time to time to revoke, with-draw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers. The Directors may allow to any person or company to whom any powers may be so delegated such remuneration as they in their absolute discretion, shall think fit.
- (g) Before recommending any dividend to set aside out of the profits of the Company such sums as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies or for special dividends, or for equalizing dividends, or for repairing, improving, and maintaining any of the property of the Company, and for other purposes as the Directors shall in their absolute discretion think conducive to the interests of the Company, and to invest the several sums so set aside upon such investments and dispose of all or any part thereof for the benefit of the Company, and to divide the reserve fund into such special funds as they think fit, and to employ the reserve fund or any part thereof in the business of the Company, and that without being bound to keep the same separate from their assets.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

108. The Directors may meet for the despatch of business adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings at such places and times and in such manner as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee either wholly or in part, and either as to person or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

113. The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board. 114. The acts of the Board and of any committees appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy

in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment or qualification of any Director or of any member of the committee be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if such person had been duly appointed or qualified, provided the same be done before the discovery of the vacancy or defect.

115. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

116. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books to be provided for the purpose :-

- (3) Of the names of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the

- Of all resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings of the Company. (5)
- (6) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors.
- (7) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of committees appointed by the Board.






