A PROCLAMATION.

HUGH CLIFFORD.

W HEREAS by section 12 of "The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, No. 15 of 1921," as amended by "The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 11 of 1922," it is enacted that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any British possession or any territory under His Majesty's protection, for the enforcement within such possession or territory, of maintenance orders made by courts in Ceylon, the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, extend that Ordinance to maintenance orders made by courts within such possession or territory, and thereupon the said Ordinance shall apply to such maintenance orders as if they had been made in England or Ireland:

And whereas We are satisfied that reciprocal provisions as aforesaid have been made by the Legislature of the territory under His Majesty's protection appearing in the schedule hereto, for the enforcement within the said

territory, of maintenance orders made by courts in Ceylon:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby extend "The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, No. 15 of 1921," to maintenance orders made by courts within the said territory.

WHEREAS by Chapter II., section 5, and sub-section (b), of "The Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907," it is enacted that whenever the following event has occurred, viz., when lands have been declared the property of the Crown by an order passed under the Waste Lands Ordinances, 1897 to 1903, the Governor may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, declare all or any of such lands or any part or parts thereof to be a reserved forest, and such Proclamation shall specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas the lands hereinafter mentioned have been declared the property of the Crown by an order passed under the Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1903, on October 23, 1926, and appearing in the Government Gazette No. 7,562 of January 7, 1927, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know all men that We, the Governor, do by this our Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest from and after March 21, 1927; and We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Public stands for mechanically propelled coaches and other mechanically propelled vehicles plying for hire shall be appointed at the following places:

At the Back Bay beach in Division No. 10 and at such other places whereof due notice shall be given.

When such public stands shall be appointed the proper authority shall cause due notice thereof to be given in such public manner as to him may seem fit, that the same will be opened for public use on a date to be fixed in the said notice, and no mechanically propelled coach or mechanically propelled vehicle shall remain for hire from that date, except at one of such stands, or at the owner's residence or place of business, or other place belonging to private individuals.

3. A mechanically propelled vehicle brought into the stand shall be parked in such a manner that it shall cause

no inconvenience to other vehicles in the stand or coming into the stand, and in such a manner that it shall not obstruct the free movements of other vehicles in the stand. The driver of such a vechicle shall always be in attendance on his vehicle and shall move his vehicle when reasonably called upon to do so by other drivers of vehicles for the purpose of

All drivers and other persons in charge of vehicles in the stand shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner

and shall not be found in a stand in a state of drunkenness and shall not accost or molest passengers.

No mechanically propelled coaches or lorries for the conveyance of goods shall be left or permitted to remain in any public road, except for such time as shall be necessary only for the taking up or setting down of passengers and for loading and unloading goods respectively.

6. No mechanically propelled coaches shall be halted in any part of the Bazaar street or Esplanade street at any

time for any purpose whatsoever. Lorries for the conveyance of goods shall be halted in the Bazaar street only for such time as shall be necessary for loading and unloading goods.

7. No mechanically propelled coach or lorry for the conveyance of goods shall be driven at a greater speed than 8 miles an hour within the Local Board limits of the town.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to make the following amendments to sections 4, 27, 29, and 30 (iii.) of the Minute on Pension dated December 9, 1908:-

Section 1.—Delete the words "but may count for a long service allowance granted under section 29 of this Minute.

Section 27.—Public servants drawing a salary at a yearly or monthly rate whose service has been entirely in a non-pensionable office may be awarded a retiring allowance not exceeding three-fourths of the amount payable under section 2.

Provided that to become eligible for an allowance under this section an officer shall have been reported by a Medical Board, nominated by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, to be permanently unfit for further active service, or shall be retired on abolition of office after serving continuously for a period of not less than fifteen

Provided further, that this privilege shall not be held in any way to interfere with the power of the Governor to dispense with the services of any such officer, or to reduce his salary in case of reorganization or abolition of office; and no claim to any additional grant on account of such reduction or abolition shall in any case be recognized. Any such officer shall continue to be liable to suspension, dismissal, or removal from office in the same manner as if this section did not exist.

Provided also that an assistant shroff shall not be debarred from the benefits of this section or section 28 or section 4 by reason of the fact that he has been nominated by and holds or has held office at the pleasure of a shroff, and that an assistant shroff compulsorily retired on a change of shroffs shall be deemed to have been retired on abolition of office for purposes of this section. In the case of officers of the age of 60 years no Medical Board need be appointed, but the Head of the Department should furnish proof that the officer is 60 years of age or over.

Section 29.—Daily paid employees with continuous service of fifteen years and upwards may, if the Governor

be satisfied from the report of a Medical Board, to be nominated by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, that they are physically unfit to discharge the duties of their offices owing to infirmity either of mind or body, be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of 1/18th of a month's pay for each complete month's service

In the case of officers of the age of 60 years no Medical Board need be appointed, but the Head of the

Department should furnish proof that the officer is 60 years of age or over.

Provided that the service of daily paid employees in the Public Works Department shall be deemed to have been continuous, if the only breaks therein were occasioned by periods of employment on "agreement work," though such periods shall not count as service in calculating the amount of gratuity which may be awarded. shall, moreover, be competent for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to award such gratuities in other cases in which the service has not been continuous.

In the case of a daily paid employee who dies whilst still in the service, or on leave, and who at the time of his death would, if he had retired, have been eligible for a gratuity under this section, the gratuity that would in the

ordinary course have been paid to him had he retired may be paid to his widow or next of kin.

Section 30 (iii.).—Delete the words "or the long service allowance" in line 2, and "or long service allowance." • in line 6.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 2, 1927.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 155 (4 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 89 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 20 Moors, 9 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1927, viz., 260,345) was 31 0, as against 37 0 in the preceding week, 27, 3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31 1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were registered were 147 (1 Burgher, 91 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and rs). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29 4, as against 26 4 in the previous week, 22 9 in the corresponding

week of last year, and 28.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 147 total deaths, 42 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Nineteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 18 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.


