A PROCLAMATION.

HUGH CLIFFORD.

WHEREAS by sections 4, 5, and 6 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be by him for that purpose issued, to declare from time to time, as he may think desirable, that any Chief Headman's division or part thereof shall be brought from a time, to be named therein, within the operation of the said Ordinance, and that the same shall be subdivided into villages or convenient groups of villages in such manner as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall appoint, and that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the like advice, from time to time, to alter and amend the said subdivisions or to exclude from the operation of the said Ordinance any Chief Headman's division or any part thereof:

And whereas the subdivisions constituted by the Proclamation dated January 18, 1907, published in *Government Gazette* of January 24, 1907, were altered in the manner set forth in a Proclamation dated December 6, 1922, published in *Government Gazette* of December 8, 1922:

And whereas it is expedient to again alter and redivide the Batticaloa North, Batticaloa South, Bintenna, and Wewgam divisions specified in the said Proclamations dated January 18, 1907, and December 6, 1922:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the said Batticaloa North, Batticaloa South, Bintenna, and Wewgam divisions and the subdivisions specified thereunder in the Proclamations dated January 18, 1907, and December 6, 1922.

And We do substitute the divisions and subdivisions in the schedule hereto specified for the Batticaloa North division and its subdivisions specified in the Proclamation dated January 18, 1907, for the Batticaloa South division and its subdivisions specified in the Proclamation dated December 6, 1922, for the Panama pattu division and its subdivisions specified in the Proclamation dated December 6, 1922, for the Bintenna pattu division and its subdivisions specified in the Proclamation dated January 18, 1907, and for the Wewgam pattu division and its subdivisions specified in the Proclamation dated December 6, 1922, with effect as from and after the date hereof.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Public stands for mechanically propelled coaches and other mechanically propelled vehicles plying for hire shall be appointed at the following places:—

At the Back Bay beach in Division No. 10 and at such other places whereof due notice shall be given.

2. When such public stands shall be appointed the proper authority shall cause due notice thereof to be given in such public manner as to him may seem fit, that the same will be opened for public use on a date to be fixed in the said notice, and no mechanically propelled coach or mechanically propelled vehicle shall remain for hire from that date, except at one of such stands, or at the owner's residence or place of business, or other place belonging to private individuals.

3. A mechanically propelled vehicle brought into the stand shall be parked in such a manner that it shall cause no inconvenience to other vehicles in the stand or coming into the stand, and in such a manner that it shall not obstruct the free movements of other vehicles in the stand. The driver of such a vehicle shall always be in attendance on his vehicle and shall move his vehicle when reasonably called upon to do so by other drivers of vehicles for the purpose of obtaining ingress or egress.

4. All drivers and other persons in charge of vehicles in the stand shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner and shall not be found in a stand in a state of drunkenness and shall not accost or molest passengers.

5. No mechanically propelled coaches or lorries for the conveyance of goods shall be left or permitted to remain in any public road, except for such time as shall be necessary only for the taking up or setting down of passengers and for loading and unloading goods respectively.

6. No mechanically propelled coaches shall be halted in any part of the Bazaar street or Esplanade street at any time for any purpose whatsoever. Lorries for the conveyance of goods shall be halted in the Bazaar street only for such time as shall be necessary for loading and unloading goods.

7. No mechanically propelled coach or lorry for the conveyance of goods shall be driven at a greater speed than 8 miles an hour within the Local Board limits of the town.

Clause 38.—Alter the second paragraph to read as follows: Before leaving their stations for the vacation or under any other circumstances, teachers should make arrangements for the care of the school building, garden, and furniture according to instructions issued by the Chairman, Education District Committee.

THE following regulations made by the Urban District Council of Kalutara in pursuance of the powers vested in them by sections 18 and 23 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, No. 9 of 1899, in respect of the general cemeteries known as Hamidiriya cemetery in Kalutara South, Ugalboda cemetery in Kalutara North, and the Kalutara North cemetery in Temple road, are hereby published for general information.

REGULATIONS.

1. All applications for graves are to be made to the keeper of the cemetery at least six hours before the time fixed for the burial of the body for which the grave is required, provided, however, that the Chairman shall have the power to entertain any application for a grave at any time.
2. The keeper must intimate the line to be followed by a funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one come at the same time the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.
3. Should it be necessary, for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by the other, and not otherwise, the keeper of the cemetery may require that one burial service should be concluded before another can be commenced.
4. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a distance of less than 3 feet from any other grave.
5. No grave or vault shall be reopened for an interment within the periods specified hereunder :—
 - (i.) No grave in which the body of a person has been buried without a coffin shall be reopened within 12 months.
 - (ii.) No grave in which the body of a person has been buried in an unlined coffin of wood other than teak or oak shall be reopened within 2 years.
 - (iii.) No grave in which the body of a person has been buried in a coffin of teak or oak or of other wood lined with tin or other metal shall be reopened within 7 years.
 - (iv.) In the case of a family vault, intended to be reopened for further burials, the body shall be enclosed in an hermetically sealed metal coffin.
Such a vault may be opened at any time for further burials.
 - (v.) In the case of all other vaults, the Chairman of the District Council shall exercise his discretion regarding reopening, due consideration being given to the structure of the vault, the nature of the coffin, and the time that has elapsed since the last burial.
6. No dead body shall be buried without the permission of the cemetery keeper; such permission shall not be granted till all fees due have been paid.

Provided that paupers dying in the Government Civil Hospital shall be buried free of charge by the hospital contractor or servants under the directions of the cemetery keeper.

8. On the production of a certificate signed either by a Minister of the Christian religion, or by the Mudaliyar of the district, or a Justice of the Peace, or a Member of the Urban District Council, that the relatives and friends of any deceased person are not able to pay the fees herein prescribed for the digging of a grave, the keeper of the cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried therein free of charge.

9. All burial and cremation grounds not proclaimed as general cemeteries under Ordinance No. 9 of 1899, now in use, or which it may be hereafter desired to use, must be registered in the Office of the Urban District Council.

10. The regulations dated June 26, 1898, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 5,560 dated July 1, 1898, are hereby revoked.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. Fishing in lakes, streams, and rivers, save with rod and line, is prohibited during the months of February, March, and April, with the exception contained in the following rule.
2. Fishing by kraals is permitted in the Madu-ganga throughout the year, but the use of all connecting nets between kraals is prohibited during the period from January 1 to April 30 of each year.
3. The use of madel, kodel, kundeliya, nuldal, and other nets which destroy ova or make a clean sweep of fry in rivers, streams, or lakes is prohibited.
4. No kraals for fishing will be allowed within a distance of 50 yards one from another.
5. The open space to be left for the waterway between the ends of kraals on either bank of a lake, river, or stream shall be not less than 16 yards.
6. Lamps shall be fixed at either end of the open space between kraal ends and kept alight between sunset and sunrise by the owners of the respective kraals.
7. Rules dated May 29, 1905, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,055 dated June 2, 1905, are hereby repealed.

(3) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling along the full length of the southern boundary of each coupe, and to progress this felling line in the direction of the northern boundary, always keeping it parallel to the southern boundary along which felling commences.

(4) The purchaser shall pay for the second instalment, or in all 70 per cent. of the full purchase price, within four months, and the third and final instalment within seven months of the date of execution of the agreement. Should

the purchaser fail to pay the second and final instalment when due, it shall be within the discretion of Divisional Forest Officer to cancel the agreement as from the date of such default. Any unremoved timber will revert to the Crown as from the date of such cancellation, and the purchaser will forfeit all claims thereto. On no account shall any postponement of the instalment payments or extension of the felling dates be granted.

(5) Should the purchaser fell or remove timber trees in excess of the quantity specified in special condition 2, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from being liable for illicit felling and removal under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907.

(6) The purchaser will be required to spread the branchwood evenly over the coupes immediately after conversion, so as to leave no bare patches liable to soil erosion.

(7) The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure the conditions of this agreement being efficiently executed or employ an efficient supervisor.

(8) The purchaser or his agent or workmen shall not damage any boundary pillars or Jaga Saman plants or block up the boundaries by depositing any brushwood or branches. All lines so blocked must be re-cleared by the purchaser.

(9) A general removal permit will be issued by the Divisional Forest Officer authorizing the purchaser to remove the firewood standing in one-third, two-thirds, or of the full coupe (according to the purchase amount paid *vide* conditions 2 and 4) in such daily quantities as will be specified in cart notes which must accompany each and every cart in transit. The Forest Ranger or the Forest Overseer or the Forest Guard will measure up the wood which is ready for removal twice daily at 9.30 A.M. and 3.30 P.M., and will issue the necessary cart notes which shall accompany each and every cart in transit.

(10) The purchaser shall agree that for each and every infringement of the above conditions he shall become liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100, to be imposed by the Divisional Forest Officer in writing at his discretion, and to be recovered from the purchaser's security money.

(11) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid up purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each removed cubic yard of firewood shall be reckoned at full royalty rates.

(12) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of the enforcement of any of the penalties specified in these conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as final and binding.

In the case of services B and C the purchaser shall be required to cut all material in the coupes in the coppice system by four distinct operations as follows:—

Operation 1.

All herbaceous and undergrowth other than tree growth shall be cut out. This operation shall commence along the full length of one boundary of each coupe and proceed in a straight line to the opposite boundary of that coupe. The whole area of each coupe must thus be covered including those portions, if any, which contain no tree growth.

Operation 2.

All tree seedlings and saplings which are under one-inch diameter shall be coppiced out within two inches of the ground by means of sharp cutties or any other instrument authorized by the Divisional Forest Officer. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries and in the same alignment as operation 1. Not less than three days shall have elapsed between the execution of operation 1 and the commencement of operation 2 in any portion of the area, and there shall be an interval on the ground of not less than one chain between operations 1 and 2 except where the terminating boundary is reached.

Operation 3.

All saplings which are over one inch in diameter and not exceeding eight-inches diameter shall be felled within twelve inches of the ground, and on the day of felling the stools shall be coppiced by means of sharp adzes cleanly and flush with the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 2, as the latter is required to proceed with in relation to operation 1.

Operation 4.

All trees over eight inches in diameter shall be felled within two inches of the ground and within three days of felling all the stools which are between eight inches and fifteen inches diameter shall be coppiced cleanly and to within one inch of the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 1.

Separate working parties shall be assigned to these four separate operations, and separate workmen shall be detailed to keep the coppicing tools invariably sharp. The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure this work being executed efficiently, or employ an efficient supervisor.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, February 12, 1927, at 1.15 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated February 7, 1927.

Present:—Mr. L. W. C. Schrader, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E.; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe; and Mr. W. W. Morgan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of January 22, 1927, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

Arising from the Minutes, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E., asked the Chairman whether the Director of Public Works had replied to questions (9) and (11) which had been referred to him. The Chairman replied in the affirmative, and said he would circulate the papers.

With reference to motions 5 (i.), (iii.), and (iv.) the Chairman said no information was available.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked—(i.) Was a theodolite ordered out from England. If so, when and by whom. When is it expected to reach Galle?

The Chairman replied:—I placed an order for a theodolite and a level with Messrs I. H. Stewart & Co., London, on October 25 last. The order was acknowledged on November 15, and they hoped to despatch the instruments in about four weeks' time. Attention was invited on January 30. I cannot say when they will reach Galle.

Q.—(ii.) If there is a delay in its arrival will the Chairman employ a licensed surveyor to take the necessary levels?

R.—(ii.) I shall certainly do so if the Council desires it, but it was the opinion of the Special Committee that the work should be carried out by the Council's Officers on the arrival of the necessary instruments.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E. asked—(i.) Is it a fact that Mr. Aralishamy, who was given a temporary connexion for electric lighting on December 27, 1926, to his garage next to the Kaluwella Kittangi, has been supplied with a meter, whereas Mr. G. Abeysundera, who was given a temporary connexion four days earlier, viz., December 23, has not been allowed a meter notwithstanding repeated application?

(ii.) If so, what is the explanation for different treatment?

The Chairman replied to (1) and (2) as follows:—I have referred the questions to the Electrical Inspector, Public Works Department, who gave these connexions, and am awaiting his reply.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved—(i.) That the Special Committee appointed to examine the questions incidental to the Electric Lighting Scheme be requested to go into the question of the proper distribution of electric lights in the streets in consultation with each Ward Member. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E., referred to a rumour that the supply is not equal to the demand, and asked that some authentic information be obtained as to the capacity of the power station plant. He suggested the following addition to the motion:—And, before a scheme for such distribution is prepared, that the Chairman do obtain for the guidance of the said Committee the following information from the Director of Public Works:—

- (a) Whether the three engines now installed can give current to further lights without undue strain likely to impair their efficiency.
- (b) If so, how many lights can be allowed, assuming that street lights are to be kept going the whole night, and that the probable number of further street lights required will be 100.
- (c) That the Director may be informed the number of lights now installed, giving details as to street and private lights, the number of lights in houses already wired and awaiting connection, and also in houses which have applied, but yet not wired; and that he be requested to advise the Council if the number of house lights so quoted is about one-third the number of lights which the Council must be prepared to provide; and, if approximately another 100 street lights are to be provided, what further engines will be required to allow such lights.
- (d) Whether the engine house now in existence can be added to without any structural alterations to make room for such engines, even if the engine proposed to be added is one of 200 h.p.

Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe, who came in at this stage, agreed that the information was necessary.

The mover and seconder had no objection to the addition.

The motion as amended was put to the meeting and carried.

(ii.) That a constable be employed to patrol the sea beach round the inner harbour to prevent nuisance being committed on it. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E. moved—(i.) That a standpost, from a place where it is not of much use, may be transferred to the Abeysundera road, where the same is urgently needed. Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded.—Carried.

(ii.) Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E. asked leave of Council to withdraw the following motion standing in his name:—“That a Special Committee composed of the five elected members may be appointed to re-arrange the existing street lights where necessary, and to suggest sites for additional lights.”

Leave having been given, the motion was withdrawn.

6. To consider the proposed erection of a bungalow for the Superintendent of Police on the site of the present Police Office.

Mr. W. W. Morgan explained that the proposal was to pull down the Inspectors' quarters in Hospital street, and erect the Police Office on the site, and to build a bungalow for the Superintendent of Police on the site of the present Police Office. The building was within the circuit of the ramparts; but it was on a part of the ramparts not used by the public.

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E., Mr. J. E. Perera, and Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe were opposed to the proposal.

The Chairman said that the rule of preserving open spaces would not be broken, as a building already stood on the site.

Resolved, by 4 votes to 2, that it is not desirable that the site should be utilized for the purpose.

7. To consider the Government Agent's application for a site in Victoria park for a tennis court for the Government Servants' Tennis Club.—Resolved that it is not desirable to build a tennis court on the site proposed.

8. To consider the proposed time table for the distribution of water in the town.—Resolved that the time table be adopted, provision being made for a supply to the whole town between 5 and 6 A.M.

9. Letter No. 98 of February 9, 1927, from the Provincial Engineer, that the contribution from the Council toward the cost of the drain between the Kaluwella market and Galle Jail, is Rs. 3,135.—Resolved that the balance Rs. 135 be voted. (Rs. 3,000 was voted for this drain on November 13, 1926).

10. The following recommendation of the Special Committee on electric lighting were laid before the Council:—

Considered letter No. G 737 of February 1, 1927, from the Superintendent of Police referring to street lamps being switched off at 11.30 P.M.—Recommended that all street lamps be kept alight throughout the night.

Considered letter No. W. E. 9/3 of February 4, 1927, from the Director of Public Works, suggesting that a sum of Rs. 2,500 be forwarded to him on the first of every month to pay the cost of fuel, oil, and labour in running the power house.—Recommended that the suggestion be adopted.

Considered letter No. T. 19 of January 12, 1927, from the Chief Electrical Engineer, Public Works Department, recommending the purchase of two meggers for testing installations, at an approximate cost of £20 each.—Recommended that for the present one megger be provided.

Resolution.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Special Committee be adopted.

"THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE, 1899."

THE following regulations made by the Sanitary Board of the Kalutara District, in pursuance of the powers vested in it by sections 18 and 23 of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," and by section 34 (2) of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," in respect of the general cemetery known as the Beruwala General Cemetery, situated in the village Ambepitiya, Kalutara totamune of the Kalutara District, Western Province, are published for general information.

Regulations referred to.

1. All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery at least six hours before the time fixed for the burial of the body for which the grave is required.
2. The keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by a funeral party on arrival at the cemetery, and if more than one funeral party arrive at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves; and funeral parties shall obey the directions of the keeper.
3. Should it be necessary for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper of the cemetery may require that one burial service should be concluded before the other commences.
4. The keeper of the cemetery shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his orders shall be obeyed.
5. No grave shall be less than four feet in depth, or at a distance of less than four feet from any other.
6. No grave shall be reopened within a year, or vault within eighteen months, from the date of the last interment therein, except upon orders made by a competent court or other legally competent authority.
7. No dead body shall be buried without the permission of the cemetery-keeper; such permission shall not be granted till all fees due have been paid.

9. Provided (a) that paupers and coolies dying on estates shall be buried free of charge under the directions of the cemetery-keeper.

(b) And that on the production of a certificate signed by a Minister of any Christian denomination, or by a Mudaliyar or Muhandiram of the district, or by a Justice of the Peace, or by an Inquirer under the Criminal Procedure Code, that the relatives and friends of any deceased person are not able to pay the fees herein prescribed for the digging of a grave, the keeper of the cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried therein free of charge.

Parties may choose the person to perform the burial service, and the fee agreed upon shall be paid to him by the parties concerned.

Improvements in and relating to machines for sorting and grading tea or other materials and in methods of operating the same.

Abstract.—Trays are carried on flexible, elastic or spring supports fixed at one end, and caused to oscillate at the other. For example, vertical flat steel spring bars may be fixed at their lower ends and connected at the top, so that they all vibrate together. Horizontal members flexibly attached to these bars serve as supports for the sieve trays. The last are attached to the horizontal members in such a way that they can oscillate along the members but not at right angles to them.

The claims are:—

1. A grading or sorting machine for tea or other material which is characterised by the sorting sieve tray or trays being carried on flexible, elastic or spring supports which are fixed at one end and the other end caused to oscillate or vibrate by a suitable device applied thereto for the purpose explained.
2. A grading or sorting machine according to claim 1, wherein the flexible, elastic or spring supports consist of spring steel, preferably flat spring steel bars, two or more—but preferably four or six, of which are used, securely fixed at their bases and also connected at their free ends by a suitable frame or the like, to which frame the oscillating or vibrating movement is applied.
3. A grading or sorting machine according to claim 1 or 2, in which the flexible spring arms carry the sieving tray, or a multiplicity of sorting or grading trays one above the other, the said tray or trays being loosely held in or between the two sets of arms and having a clearance between said arms so that as the arms oscillate the trays move between the sets of arms striking opposite sets in turn.
4. A grading or sorting machine according to claim 3, wherein the tray or trays are carried on rods or members spanning the gap between the sets of arms, and are capable of moving or sliding to and fro on said rods or members in the direction in which the oscillation is applied, the amount of relative movement between said trays and the spring arms (carrying their supporting rods or members) being limited by the clearance provided between the edges of the trays and the spring arms, or being limited by other suitable movement limiting stops.

5. A grading or sorting machine according to claim 4, the tray carrying rods or members being connected to the spring supporting arms with a flexible or non-rigid connection or joint.

6. A grading or sorting machine according to any of the preceding claims, having a series of superposed sorting or grading trays carried on spring or elastic supporting arms which are fixed at one end, whereby the tray nearest the free end of the arms is oscillated through the greatest amplitude, and the amplitude of oscillation of the remaining trays progressively decreases as the fixed end of the supporting arms is approached.

7. A grading or sorting machine according to any of the preceding claims, but more particularly according to claim 4, 5 or 6, wherein the spacing and inclinations of the different trays is capable of being adjusted or regulated within limits.

8. A grading or sorting machine according to claim 7, in which means are provided whereby the rods or members upon which the trays actually rest may be moved up or down their spring supporting arms, and be fixed or clipped in any one of a multiplicity of different elevations, so that the positions of the trays and/or their inclinations may be adjusted.

9. A grading or sorting machine according to any of the preceding claims, the spring supporting arms of which are fixed at one end and the other ends of the same caused to oscillate by a connecting member driven by a crank shaft which is caused to rotate for the purpose.

10. A grading or sorting machine constructed, arranged or adapted to function in the manner or for the purpose, substantially as described or substantially as described and illustrated.

11. A manner of grading or sorting tea or other suitable material which consists in mounting the necessary sorting trays or sieves upon spring or elastic supporting means, which latter are caused to oscillate, the trays being loosely held so that they not only oscillate more or less to conform to the movements of said supporting means but also are subjected to shocks or impacts as their directions of movement are reversed, owing to their striking against the sides of the machine or against suitable stops which limit the movement of the trays relatively to that of their supporting means.

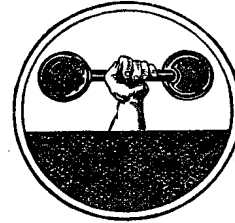
