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DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Ordinances relating to the Medical Wants of Labourers in Planting Districts.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :

CHAPTER I.

Preliminary.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Medical Wants Ordinance, 1926.

Short title and commencement.

2 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise implies—

Definitions.

“Medical officer” includes any district medical officer and any officer of the Medical Department charged with duties of supervision or inspection in connection with estates.

“District medical officer” includes district medical assistant, visiting medical officer, and visiting apothecary.

“Estate” means any estate, on which labourers are employed having ten acres of land actually cultivated in tea, rubber, coffee, cacao, cardamoms, camphor, pepper, or cinchona; and includes any estate exceeding ten acres in extent on which labourers are employed in operations preparatory to or in connection with bringing any such estate into such cultivation as aforesaid.

“Government Agent” includes Assistant Government Agent.

“Estate hospital” and “estate dispensary” mean, respectively, a hospital or dispensary established and maintained by the proprietor of an estate or group of estates for the medical treatment of the labourers employed on such estate.

“Superintendent” means any person in the immediate charge of an estate.

“Labourer” means any labourer (whether immigrant or not) employed upon an estate and includes kangani and female labourer, and the wife and any child or other relative of a labourer resident upon the same estate.

“Immigrant labourer” means any labourer introduced into the Colony for the purpose of work upon an estate and employed upon an estate.

“Prescribed” means prescribed by rules made under this Ordinance or, in the absence of such rules, by departmental rules or orders.

CHAPTER II.

Organization of Estates Medical Districts.

Declaration of estates medical districts.

3 (1) The several groups of estates set forth in Schedule A hereto are declared to be estates medical districts for the purposes of this Ordinance, and each of the said districts shall comprise the estates set out thereunder.

(2) It shall be the duty of the proprietor of every estate which is not included in Schedule A of this Ordinance, within six months of the commencement of this Ordinance, or if he is the proprietor of a land which becomes an estate after the commencement of this Ordinance, within six months of the said land becoming an estate, to apply to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services to have his estate included in the said schedule. Any proprietor who shall fail to comply with the requirements of this sub-section shall be guilty of an offence under this Ordinance.

(3) It shall be lawful for the Governor, by order in Executive Council, to amend Schedule A hereto.

District hospitals and dispensaries.

4 There shall be established and maintained for every medical district such Government hospitals and dispensaries as may be necessary for the medical wants of the estates of the district.

District medical officers.

5 (1) The Governor may appoint medical officers and apothecaries for any estates medical district at such salaries as may from time to time be provided by the Legislature, and with such duties as he may from time to time determine.

(2) All medical officers and apothecaries appointed and still holding office under the Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 9 of 1912, shall be deemed to have been appointed under this Ordinance.

CHAPTER III.

Duties of Medical Officers.

Duties of district medical officer.

6 It shall be the duty of a district medical officer for the purposes of this Ordinance—

- (a) Upon the written request of a superintendent to visit any sick labourer upon his estate;
- (b) To direct the removal to a Government or estate hospital of any such sick labourer whose removal he may consider necessary;
- (c) To attend upon all such labourers who, at the direction of a district medical officer or otherwise, may be admitted to any such hospital.

Duties of medical officer as to inspection of estates.

7 It shall be the duty of every medical officer (being a duly qualified medical practitioner registered under sections 12 and 13 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1905) for the purposes of this Ordinance from time to time—

- (a) To visit the estates within his district, or any other estate which he may be specially directed by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services to visit, and to inspect the sanitary condition thereof;
- (b) To examine the labourers on such estates for the purpose of ascertaining their condition of health, and whether they have been duly vaccinated;

- (c) To inspect all children under the age of one year resident upon such estates, and to give directions to the superintendent for their proper care and nourishment;
- (d) To direct the removal to a Government or estate hospital of any sick labourer whose removal he may consider necessary;
- (e) To draw the attention of the superintendent to any defect in the sanitary condition of his estate, and in the condition of health of the labourers;
- (f) If any estate has an estate hospital or dispensary, to inspect such hospital or dispensary;
- (g) To report to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services on all or any of the above matters.

8 Any person who shall wilfully obstruct any medical officer acting in the discharge of his duties under this chapter shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

Obstruction of medical officer an offence.

CHAPTER IV.

Rights, Duties, and Obligations of Superintendents, &c

9 (1) Every superintendent shall be entitled—

- (a) To medical attendance by a district medical officer upon any sick labourer upon his estate;
- (b) To the reception at a Government hospital (subject to the accommodation available in the hospital) of any labourer who, in the opinion of a district medical officer, ought to be admitted to the hospital;
- (c) To the free supply from the Medical Department for the purpose of any estate hospital or dispensary of all such prescribed drugs as he may require for the medical wants of his labourers to a value not exceeding seventy-five cents per annum for every labourer employed on the estate or such other value as may from time to time with the approval of the Governor be fixed by resolution of the Legislative Council;
- (d) To the supply at cost price from the Medical Department or from a Government dispensary of all such prescribed drugs as he may reasonably require for the medical wants of his labourers other than those authorized by the last preceding paragraph.

Rights of superintendents.

(2) If it is proved to the satisfaction of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services that a superintendent is not able to obtain drugs from the Medical Department to the extent to which he is entitled to do so under sub-section (1) (c) of this section and that he has purchased them elsewhere, the amount paid by such superintendent in respect of the drugs so purchased by him shall be refunded to him by the Medical Department.

10 The following sums, or such other sums as may from time to time be fixed by the Governor in Executive Council by notification in the "Government Gazette," shall be payable to the Government Agent by every superintendent in respect of medical services rendered under this Ordinance—

Charges payable by superintendent.

- (a) In respect of every visit to an estate for the purpose of attendance on any sick labourer or labourers, a fee of fifty cents per labourer, provided that such fee shall not be less than two rupees and fifty cents nor more than ten rupees per visit. Such fees shall on recovery be paid to the visiting medical officer.
- (b) In respect of the maintenance of a sick labourer in a Government hospital for each day's maintenance, a sum of fifty cents.

11 All amounts due under the last preceding section shall be a debt to the Crown recoverable from the proprietor of the estate, and shall constitute a charge upon the estate.

Liability for charges.

12 (1) It shall be the duty of every superintendent—

- (a) To maintain the lines of his estate and their vicinity in a fair sanitary condition;
- (b) To inform himself of all cases of sickness on his estate, and to take such steps as he may deem best for the immediate relief of the sick;

Duties of superintendents.

- (c) To assist any labourer to proceed to a Government or estate hospital as and when so required by a medical officer ;
- (d) To send for the district medical officer in any case of serious illness or accident ;
- (e) To inform the district medical officer within forty-eight hours of every birth and death upon the estate ;
- (f) To supply at the cost of the estate every female labourer resident upon the estate and giving birth thereon to a child with six measures of rice and two rupees in cash per week and lodging for the period of one month after the birth of such child, and to take care that the female labourer be not required to work on the estate for one month, unless the district medical officer shall report that she is fit to work sooner ;
- (g) To see that all children under the age of one year resident upon the estate receive proper care and nourishment, and to comply with all directions given by a medical officer under section 7 (c).

(2) Any superintendent who shall wilfully make default in the performance of any of his duties under this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

Duties of kanganies.

13 (1) It shall be the duty of every kangani employed upon an estate to give information to the superintendent of every birth, death, and case of sickness or accident in his gang.

(2) Any kangani wilfully making default under this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

CHAPTER V.

Recovery of Charges.

Government Agent to give notice of sums due.

14 When any sum of money shall be payable—

- (a) In respect of drugs supplied under section 9 (d) ;
- (b) In respect of medical services under section 10 (b)—

it shall be the duty of the Government Agent to give notice in writing to the superintendent of the estate in respect of which the same is payable, requiring the payment thereof within one month after such notice.

Power to seize property in default of payment.

15 In default of such payment it shall be lawful for the Government Agent or any person authorized by him in writing in that behalf to seize from time to time all the crops, live stock, and implements, or any part thereof, found on the estate liable in respect of such sum, or any other article or thing whatsoever belonging to the proprietor or any of the proprietors of such estate, until the full amount due by such estate shall be recovered.

Power to seize timber and materials of buildings.

16 If there be no sufficient crop, live stock, or implements on such estate to realize the amount due, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent or other person authorized as aforesaid to cause the timber on the said estate to be cut, or the materials of the buildings erected thereon to be removed and to seize the same.

Power to sell property seized.

17 At any time after thirty days from the date of seizure, unless the sum due shall be sooner paid, with the costs and charges incurred in respect of such seizure, it shall be lawful for such Government Agent or any person as aforesaid to sell the property so seized by public auction : Provided that perishable property may be sold at any time after the date of such seizure.

No seizure for arrears.

18 No seizure shall take place under this chapter for any sum of money which shall have been in arrear for a period of one year or longer.

Removal of property seized.

19 Any property seized under this chapter may be removed for safe custody, pending the sale thereof, to such place as the person directing the seizure may think fit.

Possession of property not removable.

20 In the case of the seizure of any property which cannot conveniently be removed, it shall be lawful for the person making the seizure to place and keep a person in possession thereof pending such sale.

21 The costs and charges of seizure and sale shall also be payable from the proceeds of the property seized, and they shall be as follows :

Costs of seizure and sale.

- (1) For costs of proceeding to the house or land of the party in default in order to seize property, a charge not exceeding eight per centum on the amount due ;
- (2) For removal of the goods seized, in case such removal takes place, a charge not exceeding eight per centum on the amount due ;
- (3) For keeping the same in safe custody in case of such removal, a charge not exceeding one rupee per day ;
- (4) For keeping a person in possession, if the goods seized are not removed, a charge not exceeding one rupee per day ;
- (5) For the expenses of sale, where any takes place, a charge not exceeding two and a half per centum on the nett proceeds of the sale.

22 It shall be lawful for the Government Agent or person authorized as aforesaid to break open or cause to be broken open in the daytime any house or building for the purpose of seizing property in pursuance of this chapter, if he shall have affixed to a conspicuous part of such house or building three clear days previously a notice of his intention so to do.

Buildings may be broken open.

23 In the event of a sale of property seized, the Government Agent at whose instance such seizure was made shall, after deducting the amount due by the defaulter, and also the costs and charges payable under section 21, restore the overplus arising from such sale, if any there be, to the owner of the property sold.

Return of overplus.

24 Whoever shall wilfully obstruct any person in the performance of any duty imposed upon him, or in the exercise of any authority vested in or conferred upon him under or by virtue of this chapter, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

Obstruction of persons acting under this chapter.

CHAPTER VI.

Medical Wants Committee.

25 There shall be established a Committee to be called the Medical Wants Committee, consisting of such members, official and unofficial, as the Governor may from time to time appoint : Provided that three of such members shall be persons whose names are submitted to the Governor by the Planters' Association of Ceylon and three by the Ceylon Estates' Proprietary Association.

Constitution of Medical Wants Committee.

26 The Medical Wants Committee shall have the duties hereinafter specified and shall advise the Governor—

Duties of Medical Wants Committee.

- (a) On the requirements of labourers as regards the construction of Government hospitals and dispensaries ;
- (b) On the financial working of this Ordinance ;
- (c) On the rebates or grants to proprietors authorized by section 27 ;
- (d) On all rules made under this Ordinance ;
- (e) Generally on all such matters relating to the administration of this Ordinance as the Committee may desire to bring to the notice of the Governor, or as the Governor may refer to it for advice.

27 (1) Where the proprietor of an estate or group of estates or the proprietors of adjacent estates have at his or their own cost established an estate hospital and made provision to the satisfaction of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services for the medical treatment of the labourers employed on such estate or group of estates or adjacent estates, and for the sanitary conditions of the aforesaid estates, the Medical Wants Committee may, at its discretion and subject to rules made under section 32, allow to such proprietor or proprietors a rebate of the whole or part of the duties deemed to have been paid under section 28 of this Ordinance on the exportation of the produce of such estate or group of estates or adjacent estates.

Power to make rebates to certain proprietors.

(2) In the case of any produce not directly exported by the proprietor of the estate, such rules may provide for the calculation as nearly as may be upon such evidence as the

Committee may determine of the amount of export duty paid upon such produce, and any amount so calculated shall for the purpose of the allowance of rebate be deemed to have been paid upon exportation.

(3) Where the proprietor of an estate or group of estates which is in process of development for the production of exportable produce on which an export duty is chargeable has at his own cost established an estate hospital and made provision to the satisfaction of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services for the medical treatment of the labourers employed on such estate or group of estates, and for the sanitary conditions of the aforesaid estates, the Medical Wants Committee may, at their discretion and subject to rules made under section 32, make an annual grant from the funds at the disposal of the Committee based on the annual expenditure (including salary of staff, but excluding sums payable to the Government for treatment in Government hospitals) incurred by such proprietor in maintaining such estate hospital and in the medical treatment of the labourers on such estate or group of estates: Provided, however, that such annual grant may be diminished or discontinued altogether by the Medical Wants Committee when such Committee is satisfied that such estate or group of estates is producing exportable produce.

CHAPTER VII.

Financial Provisions.

28 Of the export duties of Rs. 2·50, Re. 1·50, and Rs. 3 per 100 lb. paid on rubber, cacao, and tea, respectively, under Ordinance No. 17 of 1922, it shall be deemed that 40 cents, 15 cents, and 40 cents, respectively, are raised, levied, and collected for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the administration of this Ordinance, in so far as the same are not herein otherwise provided for.

29 It shall be the duty of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services to prepare annually for submission to the Legislative Council a financial statement of the expenses of the administration of this Ordinance.

30 The said statement shall contain on the debit side of the account the following expenses:

- (a) Any deficiency brought forward on the working of the account for the period of twelve months anterior to that covered by the statement;
- (b) A *pro rata* share of the actual expenditure (including salaries of staff) during the twelve months immediately preceding the date up to which the statement is made up of all Government hospitals in which immigrant labourers have been treated, based upon the proportion which the number of days passed by the said immigrant labourers in the said hospitals bears to the number of days passed by other patients in the same hospitals;
- (c) A *pro rata* share of the actual expenditure (including salaries of staff) during the same period of twelve months of all Government dispensaries at which immigrant labourers have been treated, based upon the proportion which the number of visits paid by the said immigrant labourers to the said dispensaries bears to the number of visits paid by other patients to the same dispensaries;
- (d) In the case of all expenditure properly chargeable to a capital account in respect of all Government hospital or dispensary buildings declared by the Governor, with the advice of the Medical Wants Committee, to have been primarily constructed or to be primarily maintained for the accommodation of immigrant labourers (including, in the case of buildings completed after the commencement of this Ordinance, the cost of construction), such an annual amount as would be sufficient to liquidate such expenditure, together with interest at four per centum per annum on any unliquidated part thereof, in such equal annual instalments as the Governor, with the like advice, may from time to time determine, until such expenditure is so liquidated, or alternatively, if the

Expenses of Ordinance to be met by export duty on certain products.

Annual financial statement.

Debit side of statement.

Governor, with the like advice, shall, with reference to any period of twelve months in question, so determine, the amount of any such expenditure, or of any part thereof outstanding, in a lump sum ;

- (e) In the case of any special Government hospital or dispensary building completed after the commencement of this Ordinance, such contribution to the cost of construction, whether by way of annual instalments on the terms aforesaid or otherwise, as the Governor, with the advice of the Medical Wants Committee, may determine ;
- (f) The cost of all drugs supplied to superintendents under section 9 (1) (c) during the aforesaid period of twelve months and the amount refunded to the superintendents under section 9 (2) during the same period ;
- (g) The cost price of all drugs supplied to superintendents under section 9 (1) (d) during the aforesaid period of twelve months ;
- (h) Any expenditure incurred under any general scheme undertaken by the authority of Government for combating any disease prevalent among estate labourers which the Governor, on the recommendation of the Medical Wants Committee, may direct to be so debited ;
- (i) All miscellaneous expenses incidental to the administration of this Ordinance during the same period.

31 The said statement shall contain on the credit side of the account—

- (a) Any surplus brought forward on the working of the account for the period of twelve months anterior to that covered by the statement ;
- (b) The amount of all sums recovered as maintenance fees under section 10 during the twelve months preceding the date up to which the statement is made up ;
- (c) The amount of all fines recovered in respect of all offences against the Ordinance during the same period ;
- (d) The amount of all sums received as the cost price of drugs supplied to superintendents under section 9 (d) during the same period ;
- (e) The amount of the export duty deemed to have been collected during the same period under section 28 ;
- (f) An annual contribution out of moneys provided by the Legislative Council of an amount equal to fifteen per centum of the total expenses of the administration of this Ordinance during the same period, as shown by the debit side of the account.

Credit side of statement.

CHAPTER VIII.

Miscellaneous.

32 (1) The Governor in Executive Council may make rules regulating—

- (a) The fees payable to district medical officers by superintendents and persons other than labourers engaged upon estates for medical attendance and for medicines dispensed at Government dispensaries ;
- (b) The management of estate hospitals and dispensaries ;
- (c) The supply of drugs to superintendents from Government dispensaries and from the Medical Department ;
- (d) The powers and duties of hospital and dispensary visitors ;
- (e) The conditions subject to which rebates will be allowed and grants made under section 27 and the evidence which will be required in support of applications for such rebates and grants ;
- (f) The form in which and the time within which applications for rebates and grants shall be made ;
- (g) The manner in which such rebates and grants shall be made, and generally on all matters connected with the allowance thereof ;
- (h) Any other matters necessary for the administration of this Ordinance that cannot be provided for by departmental rules and orders.

Governor in Council may make rules.

(2) All such rules shall be laid as soon as conveniently may be before the Legislative Council, and may at any of the next following three meetings be rescinded by resolution of the Legislative Council but without prejudice to anything already done thereunder, and if not so rescinded shall be deemed to be valid.

(3) The rules set out in Schedule B hereto shall, until amended by the Governor in Executive Council, be the rules in force under this Ordinance.

Penalty for offences.

33 (1) Any person convicted of any offence under this Ordinance shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees.

(2) Every such offence shall be triable by a Police Magistrate, and such Magistrate shall have power to impose the full penalty provided for by this section, notwithstanding any limitation of the ordinary jurisdiction of such Magistrate.

Repeal.

34 Ordinances Nos. 9 of 1912, 16 of 1915, 25 of 1916, and 29 of 1916 are hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE B.**Rules under Section 32 (3) of "The Medical Wants Ordinance, 1926."****A.—Fees payable to District Medical Officers.**

1. By Superintendents and persons other than labourers engaged upon estates for medical attendance and for medicines dispensed at dispensaries:—

- Visit and medical attendance at patient's own place of residence, for themselves, their wives, and children: Rs. 10·50 for the first visit, and Rs. 7·50 for subsequent visits (in same illness).
- For midwifery: Rs. 125; to include three subsequent visits.
- Vaccination: Rs. 15.
- Medical attendance at doctor's house or dispensary, or for prescription by letter: Rs. 3·75.

2. By Assistant Superintendents:—

- Visit and medical attendance at patient's own place of residence, for themselves, their wives, and children: First visit, Rs. 7·50; subsequent visits, Rs. 5·25 (in same illness).
- For midwifery: Rs. 75, to include three subsequent visits.
- Vaccination: Rs. 10.
- Medical attendance at doctor's house or dispensary, or for prescription by letter: Rs. 2·50.

3. If the District Medical Officer be a Visiting Apothecary, the following shall be the fees payable instead of those in rules 1 and 2 above:—

- Visit and medical attendance at patient's own place of residence, for themselves, their wives, and children: Rs. 3 for first visit, and Rs. 2 for each subsequent visit (in same illness).
- For midwifery: Rs. 20, to include three subsequent visits.
- Vaccination: Rs. 2, and the cost of lymph if at the patient's own residence.

(d) Medical attendance at dispensary, or for prescription by letter: Re. 1.

4. By clerks, conductors, teamakers, carpenters, masons, kanakapillais, storekeepers, chauffeurs, domestic servants, and employes of similar status:—

(a) Visit and medical attendance at patient's own place of residence, for themselves, their wives, and children: Rs. 3 for each visit.

(b) For midwifery: Rs. 15.

(c) Vaccination: Rs. 3, or free at the dispensary.

(d) Medical attendance at doctor's house or dispensary, or for prescription by letter: Re. 1.

5. If the District Medical Officer be a Visiting Apothecary, the following shall be the fees payable instead of those in rule 3 above:—

(a) Visit and medical attendance at patient's own place of residence, for themselves, their wives, and children: Rs. 2 for each visit.

(b) For midwifery: Rs. 10.

(c) Vaccination: Rs. 2, and the cost of the lymph if at patient's own place of residence, otherwise free at dispensary.

(d) Medical attendance at dispensary, or for prescription by letter: Re. 1.

Note.—The scale of fees for Medical Officers includes transport, but in the case of Visiting Apothecaries mileage should be paid at the rate of 20 cents per mile each way, if transport is not found by the patient.

6. In the absence of an efficient private dispensary or drug store, prescriptions for the above 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 may be dispensed at a Government dispensary at the same rate as for Government servants, viz.:—

Concentrated mixtures and expensive drugs are to be charged for at cost price.

B.—The Supply of Drugs to Superintendents from Dispensaries and from the Medical Department.

7. Superintendents may obtain such drugs as those prescribed in Appendix A at cost price from Government dispensaries to the total value of Rs. 5 for cash with order, provided that no quantity of any one drug of the value of more than Re. 1 shall be supplied at any one time; and from the Civil Medical Stores, Colombo, to any amount on application to the Superintendent on Medical Form 159 accompanied by a remittance.

8. Superintendents of estates having a dispensary with a qualified apothecary may have such prescribed drugs free of payment to the extent of 75 cents worth per head of the estate labour population per annum.

9. The free drugs supplied to estate dispensaries by Government are for the use of labourers exclusively, and shall not be put to any other use whatever.

10. In requisitioning for free drugs for an estate dispensary, Superintendents of estates must confine themselves to the list of drugs published in Appendix A.

11. The half-yearly requisitions for free drugs, to be dispatched within a month, must reach the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services on or before the dates given below:—

For estates in the Central Province on January 10 and June 10.

For estates in the Uva and Southern Provinces on March 1 and August 1.

For estates in the Sabaragamuwa and North-Western Provinces on April 1 and October 1.

For estates in the Western Province on May 1 and November 1.

Drugs required between the half-yearly requisitions shall be applied for by an intermediate requisition (Medical Form 166).

12. Quinine and tincture of opium shall be applied for separately from other drugs, on Medical Form 166 for quinine, and on Opium Form No. 1 for tincture of opium.

13. All columns of requisition forms must be accurately filled up. The "Remaining" column must show the actual amount in stock at date of requisition. Requisitions shall be signed by the Superintendent of the estate and be accompanied by a certificate as in Appendix B.

C.—The Powers and Duties of Hospital and Dispensary Visitors.

14. Hospitals and Dispensaries will be open daily at any time between the hours of 6 A.M. and 6 P.M. for the visits of Official and Unofficial Hospital Visitors duly appointed by the Governor.

15. The Medical Officer in charge of the hospital or, in his absence, the next senior officer of the hospital staff or, in the case of dispensaries, the officer in charge shall accompany the Visitor on his inspection.

16. It is desirable that Unofficial Visitors should ascertain whether the patients have any complaints, and if so, that they should inquire into them and record particulars in the Visitors' Book.

17. The quality and quantity of the food supplied to the patients and the cleanliness and tidiness of the hospital and its surroundings are important subjects for inspection.

18. The perusal of the official records does not necessarily come within the scope of the Unofficial Visitor's inspection.

19. Visitors are not competent to give orders, and shall avoid offering criticism except in the form of remarks and observations recorded in the Visitors' Inspection Book, which will be submitted to them, containing questions, to which it is desirable that full answers should be recorded.

D.—Rules for the Guidance of Estate Proprietors desirous of qualifying for Rebates and Grants under Section 27.

20. New estate hospitals shall be erected in open clearings as far removed as possible from jungle and swamps. Where possible a space of not less than 100 feet all round shall be kept clear of jungle, and only ornamental cultivation should be permitted within that area.

21. The accommodation provided shall be sufficient for the requirements of the estate, as approved by the Inspecting Officer and the Medical Wants Committee, but separate wards must be provided for bowel diseases. In the event of serious overcrowding occurring in any estate hospital, the erection of temporary accommodation may be permitted.

22. Separate accommodation shall be provided for males and females.

23. Estate hospitals, dispensaries, and latrines constructed subsequent to these rules coming into force shall be in accordance with plans approved by the Medical Wants Committee. Copies of type plans can be obtained on application to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

24. A bed shall be provided for each patient, and the minimum superficial area allowed for each bed in ordinary wards shall be 60 square feet, and 90 square feet in wards for infectious or dirty cases. The cubic space shall not be less than 900 and 1,200 feet respectively per bed.

25. Kitchen, mortuary, earth-closet, and bathrooms shall be erected for each estate hospital at a suitable distance from the wards.

26. A dispensary and quarters for the medical staff and servants shall be provided at each estate hospital.

27. The beds for the patients shall consist of three separate hard wood planks each 10 inches wide, and of uniform thickness, resting on iron trestles, or such other type of beds as may be approved by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

28. Efficient mosquito curtains or gnat-proofing in malarious districts shall be provided.

29. Two suits of estate hospital clothing and one pillow shall be provided per bed, and cumblies or blankets in the proportion of three for every two beds.

30. Bed pans and other utensils shall be provided for patients unable to leave the wards. Enamelled iron chamber pots with covers shall be provided for all diarrhoea and dysentery cases. The excreta of all infectious bowel diseases shall be disinfected before being disposed of.

31. All articles of equipment shall be cleansed as often as may be necessary.

32. The scales of diets and the quality shall be those set out in Appendix C, but extra articles of diet and medical comforts shall be provided as ordered by the Medical Officer in charge of the estate hospital.

33. The medicines specified in Appendix A shall be kept in stock in each estate hospital and dispensary with the necessary apparatus for compounding and dispensing.

34. The instruments and appliances provided shall be in accordance with modern requirements, subject to the approval of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

35. The number of male and female attendants shall not be in a less proportion than one for every ward of twelve beds, and dhobies and scavengers shall be employed in sufficient numbers.

36. The officer in charge of an estate hospital shall live in the immediate vicinity of the building; subject to supervision, he shall have the immediate care of all estate hospital patients, and shall see that all treatment ordered is carried out.

37. The officer in charge shall see that the estate hospital is kept clean and in good order. Each ward shall be swept twice a day, and the floor washed once a week at least. Latrines shall be cleansed twice daily, and their contents buried or otherwise disposed of in a satisfactory manner.

38. The officer in charge shall see that the supply of medicines is sufficient, that poisons are kept under lock and key in a separate place, and that the instruments and general equipment of the hospital are in order. He shall be responsible for the keeping up to date of all hospital documents. He shall indent on the Superintendent for the estate hospital food supplies and all extras.

39. An Attendance Register of the staff shall be kept in every estate hospital.

40. The Admission and Discharge Book, Temperature Charts, and Bed-head Tickets shall be in the forms used in hospitals. Separate records shall be kept of out-patients treated, giving date, name, and disease.

41. Monthly and annual returns shall be furnished to the Provincial Surgeon on the prescribed forms. The returns for each month shall reach the Provincial Surgeon not later than the 10th of the following month, and the annual returns not later than January 20.

42. Every estate hospital must be inspected from time to time by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, Provincial Surgeon, or some other duly qualified Inspecting Officer not below the rank of District Medical Officer.

43. There must be kept in every estate hospital a Visitors' Book, in which the Inspecting Officers must record their visits, with any remarks regarding the hospital.

44. The Superintendent of the estate to which the estate hospital belongs shall be responsible that any recommendation, criticism, or complaint of any of the Inspecting Officers mentioned in rule 42 shall receive prompt attention.

45. A sufficient supply of potable water shall be provided for the estate hospital, and the Medical Officer or dispenser shall see that there is no chance of contamination of the supply.

E.—The Form in which and the Time within which Applications for Rebates and Grants should be made; the manner in which such Rebates shall be made; and generally on all Matters connected with the Allowance thereof.

46. Applications for rebates and grants shall be made in writing on the prescribed forms (see Appendix D) within three months of the close of the calendar year, and shall be addressed to the Secretary of the Medical Wants Committee, Colonial Secretary's Office, Colombo. Any claim made after the prescribed time may be rejected or reduced at the discretion of the Committee.

47. The Medical Wants Committee on receipt of such application shall refer the application to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, who shall direct that the estate hospital in respect of which a rebate or grant is claimed be specially inspected for report to the Committee.

48. At the meeting of the Committee at which such application is brought up for consideration the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services shall lay before the Committee the report above called for and any available returns relating to estate hospitals in respect of which a rebate is claimed.

F.—Any other Matters necessary for the Administration of this Ordinance that cannot be provided for by Departmental Rules and Orders.

49. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent of every estate to provide a sufficient supply of potable water for his labour force. Such supply shall be free from contamination; and if in the opinion of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services

supply is deficient, inferior, or open to contamination, it shall be the duty of the Superintendent to provide a proper supply to the satisfaction of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. Where wells are used, they must be covered and supplied with a pump, and be surrounded by a cement platform. All water pipes must be made of iron. Bathing places, where possible, shall be paved.

50. It shall be the duty of every Superintendent to provide proper dwelling accommodation for his labour force, and sufficient clearing around the lines, and proper drainage to the satisfaction of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

51. An estate dispenser shall request the Superintendent to send for the District Medical Officer in serious cases, and for women in unduly prolonged labour.

52. An estate dispenser shall keep a register of patients treated, and a book in which he shall record all prescriptions compounded by him. He shall submit a monthly return to the Provincial Surgeon of the Province, on Medical Form 5A.

53. In the event of any Superintendent feeling aggrieved at any order or direction issued under the foregoing rules, he shall have the right to appeal to the Governor in Executive Council.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

THE object of the draft Bill is to consolidate and amend in certain particulars the legislation affecting the medical wants of labourers on estates.

2. The main feature of the Bill, as of the legislation which it is intended to replace, is that it imposes upon those who introduce Indian immigrant labourers into the Colony to work upon estates obligations in regard to the medical requirements of such labourers. In effect, the proprietors of the estates are required collectively to repay to Government 85 per cent. of the expenditure which it incurs in supplying medical facilities for labourers on estates, the remaining 15 per cent. of the expenditure being considered as a Government contribution towards these medical requirements. The repayment is made mainly by means of a special export duty on rubber, cacao, and tea, but also in part by means of direct payments to Government for the services of medical officers, apothecaries, &c., the maintenance of patients in hospitals, and supplies of drugs.

3. Sections 29 and 30 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1912 provided for an annual account of receipts (including the Government contribution) and expenditure on account of medical wants in planting districts. The balance of the account is not represented by a separate fund, receipts and payments being merged in general revenue and expenditure, but the account ensures that the relative proportions of Government expenditure and the sums contributed by the estates in the form of export duties, &c., shall be kept under proper observation.

4. Practically no change has been made as regards the methods of preparation of this account, but the opportunity has been taken to redraft section 28 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1912 (section 28 of the present Bill) so as to place on a surer foundation the legal sanction for the recovery of the special export duties and their appropriation for the particular purposes of this Ordinance.

5. While the existing Ordinances and the proposed Bill deal mainly with the provision of medical facilities through the agency of the Ceylon Medical Department, it recognizes the desirability of permitting and indeed encouraging estates to establish their own hospitals and to make their own provision for medical facilities for their labourers. Accordingly, where this has been done to the satisfaction of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services the Medical Wants Committee created by the Ordinance is empowered to give back the whole or part of the special export duties paid under the Ordinance.

6. This, of course, is no more than a recognition of the fact that if estates make their own provision for medical treatment at their own cost they cannot equitably be called upon to pay for it over again by means of a special export duty. A new and important principle, however, has been introduced by sub-section (3) of section 27 of the present Bill, which provides that the proprietor of an estate or group of estates which is in process of development may receive a grant based on the average annual expenditure incurred by him in maintaining a hospital and in the medical treatment of his labourers, notwithstanding the fact that, owing to the estate not having come into bearing, no export duty has been paid.

7. Both in sub-section (1) of section 27 of the Bill, which corresponds with sub-section (1) of section 27 of the present Ordinance, and in sub-section (3) of the Bill, which is entirely new, it has been provided that provision for the prevention of disease by the maintenance of proper sanitary conditions (healthy lines, good water supply, and proper latrines, &c.) is a necessary qualification for recovering rebate. In actual practice this requirement is already insisted on, but the actual wording of section 27 of the present Ordinance makes payment of rebate dependent solely upon provision for the treatment of disease. In the Bill both requirements—prevention and treatment—are explicitly laid down.

8. In consequence of the new provision, an important amendment has been made to the definition of "estate" in section 2. At present, only estates which have ten acres

under actual cultivation come within the provisions of the Ordinances now under amendment. In the draft Bill "estate" includes estates on which labourers are employed in development operations.

9. Section 3 (2) is new, and is intended to secure the inclusion of all "estates" in Schedule A of the Ordinance.

10. Sub-section (2) of section 9 is new. It provides that if the Medical Department cannot supply the drugs referred to in section 9 (1) (c), the superintendent should be allowed to buy them and the cost price should be refunded to him by Government.

11. An important change has also been made in section 10, which provides that fees for visits by medical officers to estates shall be paid to them instead of being appropriated by Government. By the same section these fees and also the charges for maintenance of patients from estates in Government hospitals are increased.

12. The remaining alterations to the existing legislation are of a formal character and do not call for special comment.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to Incorporate the Ceylon Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

Preamble.

WHEREAS a society called and known as "The Ceylon Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals" has hithertofore been established in Ceylon for the purpose of effectually carrying out and transacting all matters connected with the said society according to the rules agreed to by its members :

And whereas the said society has hithertofore successfully carried out and transacted the several objects and matters for which it was established and has applied to be incorporated, and it will be for the public advantage to grant the said application :

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Ceylon Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Incorporation) Ordinance, No. of 1926."

Incorporation.

2 (1) From and after the passing of this Ordinance the President, Vice-Presidents, and the members of the committee for the time being of the said society, and such and so many persons as now are members of the said society or shall hereafter be admitted members of the corporation hereby constituted, shall be and become a corporation with continuance for ever under the name and style of "The Ceylon Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals" and by that name shall sue and be sued in all courts, with full power and authority to have and use a common seal and to change and alter the same at their pleasure.

(2) In the event of the society ceasing to exist from lack of members or from any other reason, the property of the society may be applied to such purposes as nearly as possible resembling the objects of the association as the Governor in Executive Council may direct.

3 The general objects of the society are hereby declared to be to prevent the cruel treatment of, and secure the welfare of animals throughout the Island of Ceylon, to see that all moneys collected by the society be utilized for such purposes, and to do all such acts and to employ all such means as might be necessary for the attainment of the said objects.

4 The affairs of the society shall be managed by such committee or committees as may be prescribed by rules under this Ordinance.

5 It shall be lawful for the society hereby incorporated from time to time, at any general meeting of its members and by a majority of votes, to make all such rules as may be deemed necessary for the general management of the society and the accomplishment of its objects.

Such rules, when made, may at any subsequent like meetings be altered, added to, amended, or cancelled, subject, however, to the requirements of section 7 of this Ordinance.

6 Subject to the provisions in the last preceding section contained, the rules set forth in the schedule hereto shall be, for all purposes, the rules of the society. Provided, however, that nothing in this section contained shall be deemed or held or construed to prevent the society at all times hereafter from making fresh rules or from altering, amending, adding to, or cancelling any of the rules in the aforesaid schedule contained or to be hereafter made by the society.

7 No rule in the schedule hereto and no rule passed at a general meeting as provided for in section 5 of this Ordinance shall be altered, added to, amended, or cancelled except by a majority of the members present and voting at any subsequent general meeting.

8 On the coming into operation of this Ordinance all property movable or immovable belonging to the said Ceylon Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, whether held in the name of the said society or in the name or names of a person or persons in trust for the said society, shall be and the same is hereby vested in the society hereby incorporated, and the same shall be held by the said society for the purposes of this Ordinance, and subject to the rules for the time being of the said society.

9 The society shall be able and capable in law to take and hold any property movable or immovable which may become vested in it by virtue of any purchase, gift, grant, testamentary disposition, donation, or otherwise, and all such property shall be held by the society for the purposes of this Ordinance and subject to the rules for the time being of this society, with the full power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, or otherwise encumber or dispose of the same.

10 All debts and liabilities of the said society existing at the time of the coming into operation of this Ordinance shall be paid by the society hereby incorporated, and all debts due to and subscriptions, contributions, donations, and fines payable to the said first-named society shall be paid to the hereby incorporated society for the purposes of this Ordinance.

11 The seal of the society shall not be affixed to any instrument whatsoever except in the presence of at least two members of the general committee for the time being, and the members so present shall sign their names to the instrument in token of their presence, and such signing shall be independent of the signing of any person as witness.

12 Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall prejudice or affect the rights of His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, or of any body politic or corporate or any other person or persons except such as mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from, or under them.

SCHEDULE.

Rules.

1. *Membership.*—(a) There shall be no limit to the number of members of the society.

(b) The society shall be open to persons of all nationalities.

(c) Membership shall be of three kinds—

(1) Ordinary members.

(2) Life members.

(3) Honorary members.

(d) Applications for membership shall be made to the Secretary, and all such applications shall be dealt with in committee by the members of the general committee, who shall have power to refuse any application without giving a reason.

(e) The general committee shall have power to elect any person an honorary member (without voting powers), and such persons on election shall, in all other respects, enjoy the full privileges of membership of the society and shall not be liable to pay any subscription.

(f) Any member who, on a complaint by any member to the general committee or on the complaint of any member of the general committee, is found guilty of conduct opposed to the constitution or spirit of the society may be suspended or expelled from the society by a vote of four-fifths of those present and voting at a meeting of the general committee.

2. *Subscription.*—(a) The annual subscription for ordinary members shall be five rupees payable on the first day of January of each year.

(b) The payment of such subscription shall entitle the member to all the privileges of membership of the society for a period of one year.

(c) No member shall be allowed to remain on the list of members of the society if his subscription be unpaid on the first day of March of any year, unless under special circumstances, which in each case shall be decided upon by the general committee.

(d) The fee for life membership shall be one hundred rupees (Rs. 100) payable on election, and such payment shall entitle the member to all the privileges of membership of the society for life.

3. *General Committee.*—(a) The affairs of the society shall be managed by a general committee consisting of the Chairman, the Secretary, and Treasurer, and not less than four members of the society, other than honorary members, to be elected annually by ballot, together with such *ex officio* members as hereinafter provided.

(b) Three members shall form a quorum.

(c) The general committee shall hold office until the next election of members of such committee.

(d) The annual election shall take place as soon after the first day of January as possible.

(e) The following shall be *ex officio* members of the general committee:—

(1) The President and Vice-Presidents.

(2) The Hony. Veterinary Surgeon of the society.

(3) The Hony. Secretary for the Colombo Refuge for Animals.

(4) The Superintendent of Police, Colombo.

(5) The Hony. Lawyers of the society.

(f) The general committee shall have power to add to its number by the inclusion of not more than thirty members not resident in Colombo and representing branches of the society in other parts of the Island.

(g) In the event of any member of the general committee dying or resigning or becoming disqualified from serving on such committee for any reason whatsoever during the currency of the term for which he was elected, the general committee shall have power to elect any duly qualified person to fill his place for unexpired period of such term.

(h) The general committee shall have power to appoint any such sub-committee or sub-committees as may be deemed necessary for the purposes of the society.

(i) The general committee shall meet at least once a quarter. Special meetings shall be convened by the President for the time being or by the Secretary at the request of not less than three members of such committee. Notice of at least seven days shall be required for a meeting.

4. *Finance.*—(a) All moneys received on behalf of the society shall be paid into a banking account in the name of the society, or shall be invested in the name of the society in such manner as the general committee shall from time to time direct subject to the provisions of the Trusts Ordinance, No. 9 of 1917, and of any amendment or amendments thereto.

(b) All payments shall be sanctioned by the general committee or by such other committee as may be appointed by the general committee for such purpose, and all cheques for such purposes must be signed by the Treasurer.

5. *Audit.*—(a) An auditor shall be elected for the current year by the general committee for the time being.

6. *General Meetings.*—(a) The annual general meeting shall be held as soon as possible after the first day of June of each and every year on such day as the general committee may appoint, when a statement of the affairs of the society of the previous financial year duly audited shall be exhibited. Ten days' notice of such meeting shall be given to the members of the society.

The functions of such meetings shall be—

- (1) To determine any such question of policy as may arise from time to time.
 - (2) To decide general proposals relating to organization and propaganda.
 - (3) To deal generally with all matters affecting the interests of the society.
 - (4) To pass the accounts and report for the previous year.
 - (5) To elect office-bearers for the current year.
 - (6) To elect a general committee for the current year.
 - (7) To transact any other business of which due notice shall have been given.
- (b) Six members shall form a quorum.

7. *Extraordinary General Meetings.*—The President shall summon all extraordinary general meetings of the society at the request of the general committee at any time to deal with urgent matters of importance, and shall also be bound to do so within a month of receiving a written requisition signed by not less than ten members of the society. Such requisition shall state the business proposed to be brought before such meeting.

Ten days' notice of an extraordinary general meeting shall be given to the members of the society.

8. *Notice of Amendments, &c.*—Fourteen days' notice in writing of the intention to propose any rule or alteration, amendment or addition to, or cancellation of any existing rule shall be given to the Secretary.

9. *Branches.*—The general committee may, at such times and places as may seem to it advisable, establish branches of the society, and such branches shall for all purposes be subject to the control of the general committee.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

THE society seeking incorporation was formed many years ago with the object of preventing the cruel treatment of and securing the welfare of animals throughout the Island of Ceylon.

The nature of the work of the society is such as necessitates the upkeep of establishments in every town of importance in the Island, and the work of administration from small beginnings has now assumed vast proportions.

The income of this society is derived from donations and other voluntary offerings and also subscriptions and fines, and the administration and charge of these funds is at present in the hands of certain persons who act as trustees for this society, and it is felt that incorporation would greatly facilitate the proper management of the affairs of this society.

Although this society is now possessed of property both movable and immovable it has no legal status, and the title in such property is vested in certain individuals acting as trustees of this society. Incorporation will confer on this society that legal status which will enable it to hold property and effectually manage its affairs.
