

And whereas it is necessary for the purposes of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924," to exclude the said village of Ambana from the subdivision of Gampahasiya pattu of the Chief Headman's division of Matale South and to include it as a village in the subdivision of Ambanganga korale of the Chief Headman's division of Matale East:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by sections 4, 5, and 6 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924," and section 11 a of "The Interpretation Ordinance, 1901," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after the date of this Proclamation, exclude the said village of Ambana, the boundaries whereof are set out in the schedule hereto annexed, from the subdivision of Gampahasiya pattu of the Chief Headman's division of Matale South, and do hereby bring the said village called Ambana within the operation of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924," as a village of the subdivision of Ambanganga korale, in the Chief Headman's division of Matale East, in the Matale District of the Central Province.

# Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 17, 1927.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 196 (1 European, 17 Burghers, 110 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 26 Moors, 8 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1927, viz., 261,793) was 39 0, as against 40 0 in the preceding week, 36 7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31 1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 170 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 96 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 19 Moors, 8 Malays,

and 10 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33 9, as against 31 3 in the previous week, 29 0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28 7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 170 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 21.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty-two deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 20 in Maradana hospitals (including 7 deaths of non-residents), 3 in St. Paul's, 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 22 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana North, and 1 each in

St. Paul's and Kotahena North, as against 1 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year. (c) Two deaths from Influenza were registered, 1 each in Kotahena South and Maradana North, as against 8 in

the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from Phthisis were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, as against 12 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from Phthisis of a resident of Colombo Town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama,

during the week.

3. One death from Enteric Fever was registered in St. Paul's, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly

average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 13 from Debility, 6 from Enteritis, 5 from Puerperal Septicaemia, 4 from Dysentery, 3 from Diarrhoea, 2 from Tetanus, 1 from Worms, and 70 from Other Causes.

5. Twenty cases of Chickenpox and 3 of Measles were reported during the week, as against 16 and 2, respectively, of the preceding week. No cases of Enteric Fever or of Plague were reported during the week. 5 cases of Enteric Fever were reported during the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·1°, against 81·2° in the preceding week, and 80·1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·905 in., against 29·620 in. in the preceding week, and 29·839 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 1·03 in. in the preceding week and 2·40 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

"Month" means a calendar month.

"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and vice versa.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine, and *vice versa*. "Holder" means a Shareholder.

"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy (in cases where by these Articles proxies are allowed) at any meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly given.

The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon alter the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors, and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with these presents. The Company being established on the basis that it shall acquire Wagolla estate, it shall be no objection that the vendors are in a fiduciary position to the Company, or that there is no independent Board of Directors nor shall any claim be made on any of the vendors on any such ground. Every member of the Company present or future shall be deemed to have joined the Company on this basis.

# CAPITAL.

4. The nominal capital of the Company is One million Rupees (Rs. 1,000,000), divided into 100,000 shares of Ten Rupees (Rs. 10) each.

The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share and in the aggregate and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

6. Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

# SHARES.

8. The Company may issue the balance capital whenever the Directors shall think fit, and may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid, and the time of payment of such calls.

9. If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company by the holder of the shares.

The shares, except when otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they consider Provided that such unissued shares, except when otherwise provided, shall first be offered by the Directors to the Shareholders in proportion as nearly as possible to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may at their discretion allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any estates or lands being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such estates or lands, or as remuneration for work done for or services rendered to the Company, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

11. In case of the increase of the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares, such new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights and privileges annexed thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof, or any other General Meeting of the Company shall direct, and, if no direction be given, as the Directors shall determine, and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends, and in the distribution of the assets of the Company, and

with a special or without any right of voting.

Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion as nearly as possible to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled and limiting a time within which the offer, if not ac epted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may, at their discretion, allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any estates or lands being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such estates or lands, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

12. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand

in such form as the Company may from time to time direct.

13. Shares may be registered in the name of a firm or partnership and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies in respect of shares registered in the name of the firm.

Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons jointly.

15. Any one of the joint holders of a share, other than a firm, may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint-shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares, shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

16. In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any shares, the survivor or usrvivors shall be

the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except any absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under clause 35 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and

calls due in respect of such share.

19. Every Shareholder shall be entitled to a certificate or certificates under the common seal of the Company, specifying the share or shares, held by him and the amount paid thereon, provided that in the case of shares registered in the names of two or more persons, the Company shall not be bound to issue more than one certificate to all the joint-holders,

and delivery of such certificate to any one of them shall be sufficient delivery to all.

20. If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then, upon production thereof to the Directors, they may order the same to be cancelled, and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then, upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof may be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

# CALLS.

21. The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times, provided that three months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made to the persons and at the time and place appointed by the Directors.

If any Shareholder fail to pay the amount of any call due by him on or before the day appointed for payment thereof, he shall be liable to pay interest on the same at the rate of nine per centum per annum from the day appointed

for the payment thereof to the time of actual payment.

23. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such

call was passed.

The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shereholders, exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine.

But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

25. The Directors may at their discretion receive from any of the Shareholders willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the moneys uncalled upon their respective shares beyond the sums actually called up; and upon the moneys so paid in advance, or upon so much thereof as from time to time and at any time thereafter exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon, and due in respect of the shares in respect of which such advances have been made, the Board may pay or allow interest at such rate as the Shareholders paying such sums in advance and the Directors may agree upon, not exceeding, however, eight per centum per annum.

# TRANSFER OF SHARES.

26. Subject to the restrictions contained in these Articles, any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares by instrument in writing.

No transfer of shares shall be made to an infant or person of unsound mind.

The Company shall keep a book or books, to be called "The Register of Transfers," in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

29. The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien, or otherwise; or in case of shares not fully paid up, to any person not approved of by them; and in no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

30. Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by the certificate for the shares to be transferred, and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Two Rupees and Fifty cents or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Article 29, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as

Shareholders, without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose

32. In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only if at all, upon the transferee.

The Register of Transfers may be closed at such times and for such periods as the Directors may from time

to time determine, provided always that it shall not be closed for more than twenty-one days in any year.

# TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

34. The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder (not being one of several joint holders)

shall be the only persons recognized by the Company, as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

35. Any guardian of any infant Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title, as the Directors think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares; or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 35, shall not, from any cause whatever, within twelve calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if in the case of the death of any Shareholder, no person shall within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may sell such shares, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money; and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such shares, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same, and the nett proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

# SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

37. The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company provided such acceptance is properly legalized.

If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder requiring him to pay the same together with any interest that may have accrued, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on, and a place or places at which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid. The notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the share in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, beforepayment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses

due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall notwithstanding be liable to pay and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, premia, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at nine per centum per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share,

except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved.

A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture, and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share, and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company, and thereupon such purchaser shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase; and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit as they shall think fit, not being less than nine per centum per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share bona fide sold or re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under

Article 40 hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

44. The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders or in respect of any other debt, liability, or engagement whatsoever, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls which the Directors shall have resolved to make, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. And the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twentyeight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

46. The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or

engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholder or his representatives

47. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary that the power of sale given by lause 45 has arisen and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

48. Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title to such share.

# PREFERENCE SHARES

49. Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right or preference, whether in respect of dividend or of repayment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or at such a premium or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally

on such terms as the Company may from time to time by special resolution determine.

50. If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes, then the holders of any class of shares may by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders. consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the or naving any priority district, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares; and such resolution shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolution could have been effected without it.

51. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no member, not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any members personally present and entitled to vote at the

meeting.

# Borrowing Powers.

52. The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed Rupees Fifty thousand (Rs. 50,000).

53. With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums and

at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary, or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions

between the Company and its creditors.

54. For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purposes, the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to

redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise.

56. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

57. The First General Meeting shall be held at such time not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

58. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year, at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is so prescribed then at such place and at such time as soon after the first day in each year as may be determined by the Directors.

59. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clause shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all

other Meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

60. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-eighth of the number of Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-eighth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for.

61. Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company.

Upon the receipt of such requisition, the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such place and such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

62. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than five days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same

to a meeting.

63. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

64. Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given by advertisement specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting; shall be given by advertisement in the Ceylon Government Gaz tt, or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently upon the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

65. Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends,

and to elect Directors and Auditors in place of those retiring by rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors; and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatsoever of which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

66. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at

Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened except resolutions submitted under Article 62.

67. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present or represented at the commencement

of the business three or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

68. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present at the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall sefuse to take the Chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Director be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the Shareholders present shall

choose one of their number to be Chairman.

70. No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting, except the election of a Chairman, whilst the Chair is

The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice thereof shall be given.

# VOTING AT MEETINGS.

72. At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by a show of hands, and in case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder; and unless a poll be immediately demanded by some Shareholder, or in the case of a special resolution by five Shareholders. present and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of yotes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. The power of demanding a poll conferred by this clause may be exercised by the proxy or attorney of any Shareholder duly appointed in that behalf.

73. If at any meeting a poll be demanded by some Shareholder present, his proxy or attorney, or in the case of a

special resolution by five Shareholders, their proxies or attorneys at the meeting and entitled to vote, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and place and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided; and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as Shareholder o proxy or attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

The demand of a poll shal not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of business other than

the question on which a poll has been demanded.

75. No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. Where a Shareholder is present by an attorney who is not a Shareholder such attorney shall be entitled to vote for such Shareholder on a show of hands. In case of a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him up to ten shares he shall have an ad itional vote for every ten shares held by him beyond the first ten shares up to one hundred shares and he shall have an additional vote for every hundred shares held by him beyond the first hundred shares. When voting on a resolution involving the winding up of the Company, every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

77. The parent or guardian or curator of an infant Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian or curator

of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as se arate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such infant, lunatic, female, or deceased Shareholder, unless such person shall have been

registered as a Shareholder.

Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney.

No Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or to vote either personally or by proxy or attorney at any meeting, unless all calls due from him on his shares have been paid, and no Shareholder, other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, shall be entitled to be present or to vote at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claim to vote at least one month previous to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote.

80. No person shall be entitled to hold a proxy who is not a Shareholder in the Company, but this rule shall not

apply to a power of attorney.

The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written and shall be signed by the appointor (whether a Shareholder or his attorney) or if such appointor be a company or corporation, it shall be under the common seal of such company or corporation.

The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes

to vote

83. No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) except at the meeting or poll at which such votes shall be tendered, and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

# DIRECTORS.

The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than six; but this clause shall be construed as

being directory only, and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least one hundred fully or partly paid shares in the Company upon which all calls for the time being have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors.

As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding six thousand rupees annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall no be considered as including any remuneration granted for special or extra services hereinafter referred to, nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company.

87. The first Directors shall be Messrs. F. O. Francillon and H. Hopwood both of Colombo, and Mr. D. C. Senanayake of Colombo, who will join the board after allotment. The first Directors shall hold office till the first

Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

88. One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Manager, Managing Director, and (or) Agent, Visiting Agent or Superintendent, for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons a pointed to the office, and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and a point another or other Secretary, Manager, Managing Director, and (or) Agent, Visiting Agent or Superintendent.

The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might

be conferred on any Manager of the Company.

If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money, as they shall think fit.

# ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

At the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company all the Directors shall retire from office, and at the first Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 90.

90. The Director to retire from office at the second Ordinary General Meeting shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office.

In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire,

the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

93. The Ordinary General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation, shall appoint successors

to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent Ordinary General Meeting.

94. Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors or provisional Directors arising from death, resignation, or otherwise, may be filled up by the Directors, but any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

95. A General Meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also determine

in what rotation such increase or reduced number is to go out of office.

- 96. If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place the place of a retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the first Ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.
- A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary or by leaving the same at the registered office of the Company, or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors, but not before, his office shall become

The Company may, by a special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office,

98. The Company may, by a special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

99. Every Director or officer of the Company, and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him in or about the discharge of his duties, except such as happen from his wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer shall, nor shall the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses happening that he Company by the insufficiency of deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on helpelf of the Company or for Director or officer, be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses nappening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortuous act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

100. No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if

any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

# DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS.

101. The office of Director shall be vacated-

(a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Manager, Managing Director, Visiting Agent, Superintendent, Agent, or Secretary of the Company or trustee for debenture holders.

(b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.

(c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
(d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office.
(e) If he resigns his office under the provisions of clause 97.

(f) If he ceases to have his ordinary place of residence in Ceylon or is absent from Ceylon for a period of three consecutive months.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for the Company, or by reason of his being agent or secretary, or solicitor, or breker, or being a member of a firm who are agents or secretaries, solicitors, or brokers of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested, and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract, work, or business.

# Powers of Directors.

102. The Directors shall have power to carry into effect the acquisition of the said Wagolla estate and the lease. purchase, or acquisition of any other lands, estates, or property they may think fit, or any share or shares thereof.

103. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing

Director, or with the assistance of an agent or agents, and secretary or secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors subject to the provisions of Article No. 121 for such a period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in and about the valuation, purchase, lease, or acquisition of the said estates and lands, and the opening, clearing, planting, and cultivation thereof, and otherwise

in or about the working and business of the Company.

The Directors shall have power to make, and may make such rules or regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company, as they may from time to time think proper, and shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, superintendents, assistants, clerks, artizans, labourers, and other servants, for such period or periods and with such remuneration and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, treasurers, accountants, officers, clerks, or servants of the Company for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause for so doing.

105. The Directors shall exercise in the name and on behalf of the Company all such powers of the Company as

are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting, and shall generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by any Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of any such Ordinances and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have

been valid if such regulation had not been made.

The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be

limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed power.

106. The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company, on such terms as they may consider proper, and from

time to time to revoke such appointment.

107. The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company

108. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney, or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf

of the said firm or company as such secretaries.

It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by an extraordinary resolution of the Shareholders. of the Company in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individuals or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or companies, or person or persons upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

110. In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice to, the general powers conferred or implied in the last preceding clause, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the

Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say) :-

- (a) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, settle, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or other legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to or from the Company, and any claims or demands made by or against the Company.
- (b) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform or enforce the awards.
- (c) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company and for claims and demands by the Company.
- (d) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents with power to accept the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, or inspector or any similar office.
- (e) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not to be immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time to vary or realize such investments.
- (f) To delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being, or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon or elsewhere, all or any of the powers or functions given to or exercisable by the Directors; and to confer such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes, and upon such terms and conditions and with such restrictions as the Directors may think expedient, and to confer such powers either collaterally with or to the exclusion of, and in substitution for, all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf, and from time to time to revoke, withdraw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers. The Directors may allow to any person or company to whom any powers may be so delegated such remuneration as they in their absolute discretion shall think fit.

# PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

- 111. The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings at such places and times and in such manner as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.
  - 112. A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.
- 113. The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then, and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.
- 114. Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a Director.
- 115. The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.
- 116. The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board.
- 117. The acts of the Board or of any committees appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment or qualification of any Director or of any member of the committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if such person had been duly appointed or qualified, provided the same be done before the discovery of the vacancy or defect.
- 118. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.
  - 119. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books to be provided for the purpose-
    - (1) Of all appointments (a) of officers and (b) committees made by the Directors.
    - (2) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors.
    - (3) Of the names of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the Committee.
    - (4) Of all orders made by the Directors.
    - (5) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings of the Company.
    - (6) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors.
    - (7) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of committees appointed by the Board.
- 120. All such minutes shall be signed by the person who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, as the case may be; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be prima facie evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

# AGENTS AND SECRETARIES.

121. The firm of Aitken Spence and Company shall be the first Agents and Secretaries of the Company.

# ACCOUNTS.

- 122. The Agent or Secretary or the Agents or Secretaries for the time being, or if there be no Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such sums were received and expended, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company. The accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company as the Directors think fit.
- 123. The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders, and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.
- 124. At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the previous financial year, and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to the end of the same period.
- 125. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income, distinguishing the several sources from which it has been derived, and the amount of gross expenditure, distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other heads of expenditure. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of profit and loss may be laid before the meeting, and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item shall be stated with the addition of the reasons why only a portion portion of such expenditure is charged against the income of the year.
- 126. The balance sheet shall contain a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company arranged under the heads appearing in the form annexed to the table referred to in Schedule C to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," or as near thereto as circumstances admit.

- 127. Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company and as to the amount which the Directors recommend should be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders.
- 128. A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.
- 129. The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained, by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

## AUDIT.

- 130. No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during the continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.
- 131. The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration. He or they shall hold office till the First General Meeting of the Company. All subsequent appointments shall, except as is hereinafter mentioned, be made at the Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and the Auditor or Auditors appointed at such meeting shall hold office only until the First Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.
- 132. The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.
  - 133. Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.
- 134. If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor, is not supplied at the Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person or persons who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment.
- 135. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting after his appointment, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto and to report thereon to the meeting, generally or specially, as he may think fit.
- 136. The Auditor or Auditors for the time being shall have a list delivered to him or them of all books kept by the Company, and he or they shall at all reasonable hours in the daytime have access to all accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company for the purpose of audit.

# DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

- 137. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of nett profits.
- 138. The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, or pay a bonus to the Shareholders on account, and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year, provided the Directors are satisfied that the nett profits of the Company will be sufficient to justify such interim dividend or bonus.
- 139. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend or bonus set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and may invest the same in such securities as they may select, or place the same on fixed deposit in any bank or banks, and may from time to time deal with and vary such investment and apply such reserve fund or such portion thereof as they think fit, to meet contingencies or for special dividends or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing, maintaining, or extending the buildings and premises of the Company, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purposes connected with the interest of the Company that they may from time to time deem expedient without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets.
- 140. Any General Meeting declaring a dividend or bonus may resolve that such dividend or bonus be paid wholly or in part by means of draft or cheques on London or by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company, or paid-up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of any other company or in any one or more of such ways; any General Meeting may resolve that any moneys, investments, or other assets forming part of the undivided profits of the Company standing to the credit of the reserve fund or in the hands of the Company and available for dividend (or representing premiums received on the issue of shares and standing to the credit of the share premium account) be capialized and distributed amongst the Shareholders in accordance with their rights on the footing that they become entitled thereto as capital and that all or any part of such capitalized fund be applied on behalf of the Shareholders in paying up in full any unissued shares of the Company and that such unissued shares so fully paid be distributed accordingly amongst the Shareholders in the proportion in which they are entitled to receive dividends and shall be accepted by them in full satisfaction of their interest in the said capitalized sum. For the purpose of giving effect to any resolution under this or the last preceding Article the Directors may settle any difficulty which may arise in regard to the distribution as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates, and may fix the value for distribution of any specific assets, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any members upon the footing of the value so fixed or that fractions of less value than Rs. 10 may be disregarded in order to acjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such cash or specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend or capitalized fund as may seem expedient to the Directors.
  - 141. No unpaid dividend or bonus shall ever bear interest against the Company.
- 142. No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares, or otherwise howsoever.
- 143. The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding the fact that such sums or any of them are not payable until after the date when such dividend or bonus is payable.
- 144. Notice of any dividend that has been declared, or of any bonus to be paid, shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto, and any dividend or bonus unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company, and, if the Directors think fit, may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund.
- 145. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

146. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly, other than a firm, may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

# Notices.

- 147. Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or persons appointed by the Board to authenticate the same.

- 2. The highest bid will be accepted, subject to the approval or disapproval of the Conservator of Forests. The highest bidder will be required by the officer conducting the sale to sign the sale book kept for the purpose directly a lot has been knocked down to him.
- 3. Payment of 25 per cent. of the successful bid to be made at time of sale, if so required.
- 4. Depôt measurements must be accepted, but previous to date of auction any prospective bidder is at liberty to check the measurements recorded in the notice and to represent any differences promptly.
- 5. No timber shall be removed before payment of the full price bid, and all timber sold must be removed from the depôt within ten days of date of notification of acceptance by the Conservator of Forests of such bid and will be at the risk of the purchasers until removed.
- 6. Should any person to whom a lot is knocked down refuse to take it over at the full price bid, or refuse or fail to sign the sale book and pay 25 per cent. of his bid when so required, or refuse or fail to pay the full purchase amount or balance thereof, as the case may be, and to remove the timber within the time' specified in clause 5 above, the lot will again be put up for auction, and the original purchaser or bidder will be held liable for any loss of Government owing to a lower price being realized at such resale; he shall, however, have no claim to the profit which accrue to Government.
- 7. Agents bidding for others will be required to produce a written authority from the firm or person for whom they bid, such authority will be retained by the Assistant Conservator of Forests and will hold good only at the particular sale at which it is produced.
- 8. Fraction of a cubic foot less than '5 will be ignored, and anything over will be counted as one cubic foot in calculating of value of each.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, November 9, 1927, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated November 2, 1927.

Present:—Mr. W. T. Stace, C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Mr. G. Adamjee Lukmanjee; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. A. H. F. Clarke; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Docds; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.,; Lieut-Col. C. D. Myles, O.B.E., M.B., R.A.M.C.; Mr. M. L. M. Reyel; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike; Mr. F. E. Jolliffe; and Dr. V. Van Langenberg, V.D.

Before proceeding to the business of the day, the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, the senior Member, on behalf of himself and the Council, offered a cordial welcome to Mr. W. T. Stace, C.C.S., on his assuming the duties of Chairman of the Municipal Council, and Mayor of Colombo, and assured him of their co-operation and assistance in his work.

The Chairman thanked the members for their kind welcome and assurance of co-operation and assistance.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 5, 1927, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of October 5, 1927, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman be pleased to state how many cases of plague were dealt with in this City—(a) During 1926; (b) up to October 31 of the be pleased to state how many cases of plague were dealt with in this City—(a) During 1926; (b) up to October 31 of the current year? (2) Could the Medical Officer of Health account for the re-appearance of the disease in this City after it had been free from it entirely during a long period last year? (3) Did the late Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Marshall Philip, prior to his retirement report that he was convinced that the Government Granaries were acting as a plague focus from which the disease is being disseminated through the town? (4) Has Government been informed by the Chairman that regulations passed by Government in August, 1925, in regard to the storage of grain cannot be enforced on the public in this City, until Government itself complies with them, and that Government has failed to do this in the case of the so called "rat-proof" Chalmers Granaries and Manning Markets owned by Government? (5) Will the Chairman be pleased to inquire if and when Government intends to carry out the recommendations of the present Medical Officer of Health for rat-proofing its granaries, as according to that officer plague is imported and disseminated through the City through rat-proofing its granaries, as according to that officer plague is imported and disseminated through the City through agencies, outside the control of this Council, but within the control of Government?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) 13; (b) 80. (2) The City was free from plague from May, 1926, until September, 3, 1926. There are strong grounds for believing that plague was eradicated in May, and that in September. it was reintroduced from abroad, by means of infected fleas in grain cargoes through the port and the granaries into the town. (3) Yes. (4) The Chairman of the Board of Immigration and Quarantine was so informed. (5) On June 21, 1927, town. (3) Yes. (4) The Chairman of the Board of Immigration and Quarantine was so informed. (5) On June 21, 1927, the Chairman of the Board of Immigration and Quarantine informed the Chairman of this Council that the funds necessary for taking steps towards bringing the Chalmers Granaries into conformity with the regulations had been included in the draft estimates for the following year. I will inquire from the Chairman of the Board whether the funds were finally

included in the Budget and when the work is to begin.

Arising out of the replies, Dr. S. Muttiah wished to bring to the notice of the Council the need for impressing on the Government the urgent necessity for disinfecting the imported rice bags with cyanide gas, as suggested by the City Microbiologist.

The Chairman stated that the matter was under consideration, and was awaiting the return to Ceylon of Dr. Hirst, who had been asked to make certain inquiries while on leave. Certain experiments are expected to be made immediately

on his return. The matter would be pressed.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal asked the Chairman the following questions:—(1) Is the Chairman aware of the imminent peril to life and limb incurred by motorists and pedestrians at the junction of Hulftsdorp and Kuruwe, New Moor, and Messenger streets? (2) In view of the extreme slope and the narrowness of the road, will the Chairman take immediate steps to get rid of this blind corner? (3) Is the Chairman aware of the fact that infantile mortality is remarkably high and epidemics very frequent in those parts of Saunder's place, known as Akbar's, Dhobies', and Marties lanes? (4) Is this state of affaire due to leak of covere cornection to these topoments? and Marties lanes? (4) Is this state of affairs due to lack of sewage connection to these tenements? If so, will the Chairman take immediate steps to remedy matter after consultation with the Council's Health Officer?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The Chairman is aware that two narrow streets intersect at this junction and that there is a danger of accidents if either motorists or pedestrians are careless in crossing it. (2) This is one of many and that there is a danger of accidents if either motorists or pedestrians are careless in crossing it. (2) this is one of many dangerous corners in the City which are taken up for improvements, as funds permit. If the Council considers that priority should be given to the improvement of this junction by rounding off the corners, estimates can be called for. (3) The infant mortality figures from January 1 to October 29, 1927, are as follows:—Akbar's lane, 222 per 1,000; Dhobies lane, 91 per 1,000; Marties lane, 333 per 1,000. The figures for the whole of San Sebastian ward for the same period are 281 per 1,000, from which it appears that infant mortality in Akbar's lane and Dhobies lane is below the general average of the ward, while infant mortality in Marties lane is somewhat above it. On the whole these lanes do not seem to compare unfavourably, as regards these figures, with the rest of the ward. There is no evidence that epidemics are frequent.

(4) High infant mortality is due to many factors of which the absence of drainage is only one. Nevertheless, a report will be called for as regards the possibility and advisability of arranging sewage connection.

Arising out of the replies to questions (1) and (2) Mr. Reyal asked that the Police be requested to place Constables

on duty at this junction as accidents occur here almost every day.

The Chairman undertook to address the Police on the subject.

4. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike:—With reference to my motion at the meeting of Council on October 5, 1927, that a Sub-Committee be appointed to inquire into the system of working the Stores, I move that the title "Sub-Committee" be changed to "Special Committee" and that such a Committee of five members be appointed by this Council.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike, with the permission of Council, amended his motion by the addition of the words "exclusive of the Chairman" after the words "five members" and added the words "and that the following do form the Committee:—Dr. E. A. Coorey, Mr. G. W. Doods, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, Mr. N. R. Blande, and Mr. A. H. F. Clarke." Mr. T. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 5 to 11

(inclusive) on the agenda. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held in the Municipal Office, on Saturday, November 12, 1927, at 1.15 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated November 7, 1927.

Present:—Mr. L. W. C. Schrader, Chairman; Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C.; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. J. E. Perers; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe; Dr. E. P. Aserappa; Mr. F. W. Sproule; and Mr. S. H. Dahanayake.

- 1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 8, 1927, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.
- 2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe asked—(1) Are there any by-laws which authorize this Council to recover through auctioneers appointed by the Council a tax of nine per cent. on all fish brought for sale to the fish auction shed? (2) If so, will the Chairman be pleased to refer me to same? (3) If as a matter of fact there are no such by-laws does the Chairman consider it fair to impose such a high tax on the food of the poor?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) There is no by-law authorizing the Council to levy nine per cent. commission on the proceeds of the sale of fish at the auction shed. By-laws 30, 31, and 32 of Chapter VI. make it obligatory on every person bringing fish within the Municipal limits to take it first to the fish auction shed, there to be sold by public auction by the "renter," who was entitled to recover a commission of four per cent. on the proceeds.

On August 9, 1913, the Council resoved (1) that the renting system should be abolished; (2) that fish should be sold at the auction shed by the fishermen themselves, or by a licensed auctioneer engaged by them; and (3) that the commission of four per cent. should be paid to the Council by the purchasers of fish.

Owing to complaints made against the auctioneer engaged by the fishermen the Council resolved, on December 12, 1914, that the auctioning of fish should be done by Municipal officers on payment by the owners of five per cent. auctioneer's commission on the proceeds.

- (2) This question does not arise in view of my reply to No. (1).
- (3) The resolutions referred in my reply No. (1) have not been rescinded by the Council, and are therefore binding on the Chairman.
- 3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. I. Durham moved—(1) That the Council erect two notice boards at the top of Dickson road warning motorists of bad corners and hidden drives. (2) That the Council consider acquiring from Government a piece of land at the bottom of the Residency drive, with a view to doing away with the present blind corner at the entrance of the Residency drive with Dickson road. The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C., seconded.

The Chairman, Mr. S. H. Dahanayake, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe, and Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe also spoke,

The first motion was put to the meeting and carried.

The Chairman moved the following amendment to the second motion:—That Government be approached with a view to reduce the dangerous corner affected by the junction of the Residency drive with Dickson road. The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C., seconded.

The mover accepted the amendment, and, with the leave of Council, withdrew the motion. The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

- 4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayake moved—"This Council is of opinion that a scheme of Constitutional Reforms of the Municipal Council of Galle should be formulated and submitted to His Excellency the Governor at the earliest opportunity." Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. Mr. C. E. de Vos also spoke.
- Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved, as an amendment, that a Committee be appointed to formulate a scheme of Constitutional Reforms, and submit it to the Council. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded the amendment.

The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C., supported the amendment.

- Mr. Dahanayake replied, and with the leave of Council withdrew his motion. The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.
- Mr. S. H. Dahanayake moved that the following do form the Committee:—The Chairman, with the elected members of the Council, and the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C., three to form a quorum. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.
- 5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved—(1) That as the present water time table causes grave hardship and much inconvenience, the time table be done away with and the Council revert to the practice which existed prior to the drawing up of the time table. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.

The Chairman said that we could not revert to the previous time table because no provision was made in it for the hospital. He moved as an amendment—that the Council do revert to the whole day service and a night service to the elevated parts of the town.

- Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe accepted the amendment, and seconded it. The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.
- Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved—(2) That the Superintendent of Works be requested to draw up an estimate of the cost of acquisition of that portion of land on Richmond Hill road between the Octagon and Siri Bawana which is a source of great danger to those making use of this road. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.—Carried.
- 6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved—That the General Manager of Railways be requested to have the roof over the platform at the Galle Railway Station extended so as to cover the full length of the platform; as at present a good deal of inconvenience, and damage is caused to passengers detraining at the Galle Station, especially on a wet day. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.
- 7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perere moved—(1) That the Superintendent of Works be asked to report whether drains could be built with success on either side of Dangedera road, Talapitiya road, Hall road, Kongtree road, and Circular road; and to draw up an estimate for cement drains on such roads as it is possible to build them. The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C., seconded, and the Chairman supported the motion, which was put to the meeting and carried.
- Mr. J. E. Perera moved—(2) That the Medical Officer of Health be directed to keep the Talapitiya road side drains in good order; and that extra coolies if necessary be given him to enable an efficient service to be kept up. Mr. S. H. Dahanayake seconded.—Carried.

8. The following motion having been received after the prescribed date stood in the name of Mr. S. H. Dahanayake, for submission with the permission of the Council:—Owing to the fact that the cutting down of the coconut trees overhanging the electric wire is a great loss to the poor rate payers, this Council resolves that underground cables be laid wherever necessary.

The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C., moved that the motion be allowed. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayake moved the motion, and Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded pro forma.

Mr. C. E. de Vos, the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C., and Mr. J. E. Perera spoke against the motion.

The mover, with the leave of Council, withdrew the motion.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works and Finance and Assessment were laid before the Council:—

- 9. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of October 8, 1927.
- (3) Amended estimate of Rs. 1,000 for draining the swamp near the quarry and the waste water from the power station.—Recommended that the amended estimate be passed, and that the work be carried out departmentally.
- (4) Estimate of Rs. 2,500 for widening the junction of Morris road with Circular road.—Recommended that the estimate be passed, and the work carried out departmentally.
- (5) Estimate of Rs. 3,700 for enclosing eight stalls in the meat market and extending the verandah.—Recommended that the estimate be passed, and the work carried out departmentally.

#### Resolution

With regard to item (3) it was resolved to let it stand over till the next meeting. With regard to item (5) it was resolved to defer consideration till the Council is better able to afford the expenditure. The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining item was adopted.

- 10. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of October 8, 1927.
- (3) Application from scavenging cooly, Punchikankanange Davith, for a gratuity on his retirement.—Recommended that he be granted a gratuity of Rs. 130 on the assumption of 20 years' service.
  - (5) Demolished buildings in Wards 4 East and 5.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.
- (6) Irrecoverable conservancy fees and assessment rates.—Recommended that a sum of Rs. 25.50 being arrears of conservancy fees due from January to June, 1926, and Rs. 3.26 being arrears of assessment rates for 1925 and 1926, be struck off as irrecoverable.
- (7) Rating of properties along Richmond Hill road and Wackwella road.—Recommended (1) that the rates be increased from seven per cent. to eleven per cent.; (2) that the rates on properties on Elliott road, within the area lit by electricity, be increased from 7 to 11 per cent.; (3) that the Ward Member and the Secretary do report as to the boundaries of the areas in which the increased rates should be levied; (4) that, as electric lights have not been provided along Hume road, the assessment be reduced from 173 per cent. to 11 per cent. from 1st quarter, 1928.
- (8) Sale of market stalls for 1928.—Recommended (1) that the sales be confirmed; (2) that purchasers of stall in the green market, fish market, and fruit market be given the option of retaining the stalls for another year at the same rent; (3) that the sale of stalls in the other markets, the refreshment stall (Fort), the betel shed (Bazaar), and the bathing wells be for one year only.

### Resolution.

With regard to item (7) it was resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be not adopted, and that the lighting of Hume road by electricity be carried out as soon as possible.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

- 11. Visit of Mahatma Gandhi.—Resolved that a sum of Rs. 100 be voted in connection with the visit of Mahatma Gandhi to Galle.
- 12. Visit of His Excellency the Governor to Galle.—Resolved (1) that steps be taken by this Council to accord His Excellency the Governor a fitting reception on the occasion of his visit to Galle on December 26; (2) that an illuminated address enclosed in a suitable casket be presented to him at the Pavilion; (3) that a sum of Rs. 750 be voted for the necessary expenses; and (4) that the Chairman, Mr. C. E. de Vos, Mr. D. I. Durham, and Mr. J. E. Perera be appointed to draft the address.
  - 13. The following documents were laid on the table :-
    - (1) An estimate of probable receipts and the proposed expenditure of the Municipality for the ensuing financial year.
    - (2) Statement of receipts and disbursements to end of October, 1927.
    - (3) Progress report of works done on estimates during October, 1927.
    - (4) Report of the Inspector of Vehicles on carriages plying for hire during October, 1927.
    - (5) Diaries of (a) the Medical Officer of Health, (b) the Superintendent of Works, (c) the Inspector of Works, and (4) the Manager, Health Department.




