SEMINAR ON NATIONAL UNION CATALOGUE

A seminar on the National Union Catalogue (NUC) was held at the National Library and Documentation Centre on 27 February 2001.

The objective of the seminar was to create an awareness on compilation of the NUC among librarians of contributing Institutions and the newly joined libraries of the NUC project. Problems encountered in transmitting data to the NUC using ISIS was also discussed. 21 librarians participated at the seminar.

WORLD BOOK DAY: 1 MARCH 2001

WORKSHOP ON RE-ORGANISATION OF THE LIBRARY SERVICES IN THE CENTRAL PROVINCE

A workshop on re-organisation of the library services in the central province was held on 20 January 2001 at Hotel Thilanka, Kandy. Chief Minister of the Central Province, Hon. Sarath Ekanayake, was the chief guest at the workshop.

The main objective of the workshop was to review the Central Province Library Services Board established under the statute. In addition the workshop aimed in formulating a plan to re-structure the entire library services of the Central Province.

48 participants including Members of Provincial Councils, Mayors of Municipal Councils, Chairmen of Town Councils and Pradeshiya Sabhas, Officials of Ministries of Local Government and Education of the Central Province, representatives of the National Library and Documentation Services Board, Library Services Board of the Central Province, Sri Lanka Library Association and librarians of University of Peradeniya, Postgraduate Institute of Agriculture and the Kandy and Gampola Public Libraries attended the workshop.

VISIT OF SINGAPORE DELEGATION

A delegation from the National Library Board (NLB) Singapore, consisting of Mr R Ramachandran, Assistant Chief Executive, National Library Board Singapore; Ms Jennifer Yin, Director, International Relations Division, NLB and Mr Arun Mahizhnan, Deputy Director, Institute of Policy Studies Singapore, visited Sri Lanka from 27 February to 1 March 2001.

The purpose of the visit was to explore the possibility of mutual access to collections and databases between NLB Singapore and libraries in Sri Lanka.

The delegates visited the National Library of Sri Lanka and National Library and Documentation Services Board on 28 February 2001 and had a meeting with senior librarians of Sri Lanka. In addition they visited the University of Colombo Library, Department of National Archives and the National Museum Library.

SEMINAR ON ISBN AND ISSN

A Seminar on International Standard Book Numbering (ISBN) and International Standard Serial Numbering (ISSN) was held at the National Library auditorium on 15 March 2001 with the objective of creating an awareness among book publishers and serial publishers on ISBN and ISSN. Publishers were enlightened on the modalities of implementation of the two systems. About 50 publishers participated at the seminar.

Mr. Sarathchandra Wanniarachchi, President Sri Lanka Book Sellers Association was the chief guest at the seminar. Messrs Henry Samaranayake, Upali Amarasiri and Sunil Gomes addressed the gathering.

MEETING ON INTERCHANGE AND EXCHANGE OF SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION AMONG S & T INFORMATION CENTRES AND LIBRARIES OF THE SOUTH ASIA REGION

Sri Lanka Scientific and Technical Information Centre of the National Science Foundation in collaboration with UNESCO. New Delhi office organised a meeting on Interchange and Exchange of Scientific Information among S & T Information Centres and Libraries of the South Asia Region which was held from 29-30 January 2001 at the National Science Foundation.

A total of 15 participants representing six countries, namely, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal and Sri Lanka attended the meeting. The main objectives of the meeting were to design a mechanism to exchange information among South Asian countries and promote co-operation among libraries and information centres in the South Asia.

The meeting consisted of presentations of country papers by participants, group discussions, presentations of groups and formulation of recommendations of the meeting. Mr N U Yapa, Head Librarian, International Water Management Institute; Dr D M Karunaratne, Director, National Intellectual Property Office of Sri Lanka; Mr L A Jayatissa, Senior Assistant Librarian, University of Kelaniya and Ms Deepali Talagala, Director / Information, SLSTIC, National Science Foundation served as resource persons.



Meeting on Interchange and Exchange of Scientific Information of South Asia Region

The following recommendations were formulated at the end of the meeting.

- Establish a regional committee to be coordinated by UNESCO, New Delhi and national committees in each country in consultation with the UNESCO National Commissions
- Establish a regional consortium to access S & T information in the South Asia region
- Identify an institution or organisation at national level in each country, to act as the clearing-house for document delivery
- Train the trainers to facilitate training all library and information professionals in information skills, cataloguing, documentation and usage of IT at national level training
- Formulate guidelines for maintaining uniformity in data formats in developing databases and compiling bibliographies, directories etc
- Provide publications and full text documents at local rates for member countries and for producing CD-ROM databases

- Free access or subsidised rates to use online databases for member countries
- Identify published and unpublished materials available for exchange within SAARC countries
- Update directories of centres of excellence
- Compile a directory of experts (S&T) in the South Asia region

SLSTINET AGM

The Annual General Meeting of Sri Lanka Scientific and Technical Information Network (SLSTINET) for the year 2000 was held on 15 December 2000 at the National Science Foundation.

Subcommittee of the SLSTINET was appointed at the meeting. It includes representatives from AGRINET, HELLIS, ENLINET, National Library and Documentation Centre, University of Kelaniya, Industrial Technology Institute. International Water Management Institute and Centre for Industrial Technical Information Services of the Industrial Development Board.

TRAINING WORKSHOP ON WEB BASED INFORMATION SYSTEMS OVER THE INTRANET AND INTERNET WITH WEB ISIS

A five day training workshop on "Web Based Information Over the Intranet and Internet with Web ISIS" was held at the Institute of Computer Technology, University of Colombo from 23-27 April 2001. The workshop was organised by the HELLIS Sri Lanka Network in collaboration with the Sri Lanka Library Association.

20 Librarians of the HELLIS Sri Lanka Network member libraries and 25 librarians who are members of the Sri Lanka Library Association participated at the workshop.

The main objective of this training was to introduce a web based information system as a first step towards setting up a web based health information system in Sri Lanka, which would facilitate sharing information with regional and to the entire health information system of the World Health Organisation.

The software presented at the workshop was developed and modified by the chief resource person, Mr Maung Aung Myint and

was distributed among all workshop participants free of charge. This is the web version of the library software package CDS/ISIS. The software is also aimed at encouraging HELLIS member librarians to develop their own web pages and to start a web based information system leading to a information maximised health sharing network.

RE-ORGANISATION OF THE ENLINET

A meeting of the Environmental Library Network (ENLINET) was held on 8 February 2001 at the Central Environmental Authority. 13 members of the network attended the meeting.

The main purpose of the meeting was to re-organise the Environmental Library Network, as it was not functioning properly for the past five years due to financial constraines.

The following decisions were taken at the meeting.

- University Libraries that are interested in environmental sciences should be invited to join the network and this has to be included in the ENLINET membership policy.
- To discontinue compilation of the Union Catalogue of Environmental Books (UNICEB) and Union List of Environmental Periodicals (UNILEP) as National Library and Documentation Centre compiles the National Union Catalogue (NUC) and National Science Foundation compiles the Union List of Scientific & Technical Periodicals (UNILIST)

- To revive the compilation of Current Contents on Environment
- To compile a Bibliography on Water Pollution with the co-operation of the member libraries of ENLINET

TEEAL AT CARP

Council for Agricultural Research Policy (CARP) which is the focal point of Agricultural Information Network (AGRINET) has acquired the CD-ROM TEEAL - The Essential Electronic Agricultural Library.

The TEEAL CD includes the scanned and digitized contents of 140 of the world's most important scientific journals in the field of Agriculture, as most essential to research and education in: Rural Development, Sustainable Agriculture, Natural Resources, Environment, Food Processing, Veterinary Medicine, Range Management, Agricultural Engineering, Crop Development, Animal Management, Pest Control, Economics, Soil Science, Nutrition and Forestry.

e-tlas – To train a critical mass of senior managers in new trends and strategies in managing knowledge-based organisations; to identify and share individual and institutional contacts as well as information sources and to build robust professional linkage amongst all participants in the programme and of continuing usefulness well beyond the conference.

Pal Asia – To provide a platform for leading publishers, book experts and information professionals to discuss emerging trends and issues that will make an impact in the publishing industry and information centres; to enable publishers and book industry professionals to understand the impact of technology on publishing and book selling and to present opportunities for networking with book professionals to explore business prospects.
