**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF MARCH, 1926.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The marriages of residents in the proclaimed towns numbered 356 (323 General, 1 Kandyan, and 32 Muslim), as against 419 in the preceding month and 316 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 148 (125 General and 23 Muslim), as against 167 in the preceding month and 140 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,901 (976 males and 925 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 35·51 per 1,000 of the population, as against 36·42 in the preceding month, 34·08 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·87 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The rate ranged from 22·14 in Lunugala to 53·48 in Mannar. There were 1,741 births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 32·53, as against 32·37 in the preceding month.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 687 (357 males and 330 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 31·24 per 1,000, as against 31·47 in the preceding month, 30·72 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25·30 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 11·38 in Maradana South to 33·60 in Maradana East. There were 606 births of children whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 27·56, as against 26·74 in the preceding month.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,613 (861 males and 752 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·14 per 1,000 of the population, as against 38·24 in the preceding month. There were 1,165 deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 23·54, as against 30·67 in the preceding month, 26·78 in the corresponding month of last year, and 28·97 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The standardized death-rate ranged from 74·24 in Hatton-Dikoya to 10·46 in Kegalla.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 557 (297 males and 260 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 25·33, as against 30·56 in the preceding month. There were 432 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 22·62, as against 28·70 in the preceding month, 28·33 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·65 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The death-rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 24·24 in Kotahena South to 7·72 in Wellawatta North.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 135 (82 males and 53 females), as against 124 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 318 and corresponded to a rate of 181 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March, 1926. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 167, as against 225 in the preceding month, 216 in the corresponding month of last year, and 227 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. There were 293 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 169, as against 226 in the preceding month.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 113 and corresponded to a rate of 177 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March, 1926. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 164, as against 213 in the preceding month, 241 in the corresponding month of last year, and 240 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. There were 107 deaths of children whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 177, as against 233 in the preceding month.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 15 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Convulsions* caused 8 per cent.; *Phthisis*, *Malaria*, and *Malarial Cachexia*, each 6 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year) 5 per cent. *Anchylostomiasis*, *Bright's Disease*, *Nephritis*, *Diarrhoea*, and *Enteritis* each 4 per cent.; *Dysentery* and *Bronchitis*, each 3 per cent.; *Prematurity*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, each 2 per cent.; *Influenza*, 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 13 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Convulsions* caused 10 per cent.; *Phthisis*, 7 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year), 5 per cent.; *Enteritis*, 4 per cent. *Diarrhoea*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Bronchitis*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, and *Influenza* each 3 per cent.; *Puerperal Septicaemia*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Dysentery*, each 2 per cent.; *Cancer*, *Anchylostomiasis*, and *Prematurity*, each 1 per cent.

12. One death from *Plague* (in Puttalam) was registered, as against 4 in the preceding month and 9 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 333 cases were reported (201 in Colombo, 31 in Moratuwa, 25 in Batticaloa, 17 in Galle, 16 in Jaffna); *Measles* followed with 97 (84 in Colombo 6 in Galle); *Phthisis*, 81 (74 in Colombo); *Enteric Fever* 33 (15 in Colombo; 5 in Kandy); *Continued Fever*, 24 (13 in Colombo, 7 in Kandy); *Smallpox*, 12 (in Galle); *Dysentery*, 4 (2 in Weligama), *Plague*, 3 (2 in Colombo, 1 in Puttalam); *Mumps*, 2 (in Colombo); *Whooping Cough*, 1 (in Batticaloa).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall.*—Ratnapura recorded the highest rainfall (10·88 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 9·36 in. in Kegalla to 0·08 in. in Mullaitivu; Colombo recorded 5·74 in.

15. *Mean Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 84·3° in Mannar to 59·1° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 82·4° in Colombo.
