SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of the Sanitary Board Limits of the Town of Hikkaduwa.

North.—The Hikkaduwa-ganga.

East.—The Madabokka-ela and a line drawn south-westward from the source of the said ela to the north-western corner of title plan No. 118,293; thence along the western boundary of this title plan as far as the south-western corner, from this corner a line drawn south-westward to the junction of the Hikkaduwa-Baddegama road and the footpath 10½ chains east of the Colombo-Galle road, thence along this footpath as far as it meets the northern boundary of lot Q 11 in preliminary plan No. 9,321, and thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of the same lot up to the landmark at the south-eastern corner, from this landmark a line drawn south-westward to the landmark at the north-eastern corner of lot 9 in preliminary plan No. 11,477, thence along the northern boundaries of lots 9, 8, 7, 2, and 1 in the same preliminary plan up to the iron pillar on railway boundary at the north-western corner of lot 10 in preliminary plan No. 11,477, thence along the eastern boundary of lot 8,849 in preliminary plan No. 3,644 and western boundary of lot 10 in preliminary plan No. 11,477 as far as the landmark at the south-western corner, thence a line drawn south-eastward to a point 5 chains due east from the landmark at the south-eastern corner of title plan No. 279,434, thence along the southern boundary of title plan No. 279,434, as far as the landmark at the south-western corner of the said title plan, thence southwards along the railway boundary up to the south-eastern corner of lot γ 351 in preliminary plan No. 3,644.

South.—By the cart track up to the junction where it meets the Colombo-Galle road, from this junction a line drawn south-westward to the sea.

West.—By the sea and Hikkaduwa-ganga.

WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," as amended by section 2 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1924, it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Southern Circuit twice at least at Galle, and such other place or places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Galle on April 25 and September 15 in every year.

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Matara, a place included within the said Southern Circuit:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Matara, in the said Southern Circuit, on or about Monday, October 4, 1926.

RULES REGARDING THE IMPORTATION OF PETROLEUM.

1. These rules may be cited as "The Petroleum Rules, 1926," and the rules published in *Government Gazette* of July 23, 1920, are hereby cancelled.
2. These rules shall come into operation from and immediately after October 25, 1926.
3. (a) All words and expressions used in these rules and defined in the Ordinance shall in these rules have the meanings respectively assigned to them by the Ordinance.
(b) In these rules :—
"Petroleum declared dangerous" means petroleum which the master, owner, or agents of a ship have declared under rule 5 to be dangerous petroleum.
"Petroleum reported dangerous" means petroleum stated in a report signed by the testing officer duly authorized in that behalf, and deposited in the Office of the Collector of Customs, to be dangerous petroleum.
"Petroleum reported not dangerous" means petroleum stated in a report as aforesaid not to be dangerous petroleum.
4. Colombo, Galle, and Trincomalee are hereby declared to be the only ports at which petroleum may be imported from or transhipped to any port beyond the limits of Ceylon; but nothing in these rules shall prevent the transport of petroleum by vessel from any port in Ceylon to any other port in Ceylon, provided that such petroleum shall have been duly tested and reported not dangerous at the time of its importation into the Island.
5. The master, owner, or agents of every ship conveying petroleum shall on entering a port mentioned in rule 4 and before discharging any petroleum or other cargo, immediately declare in writing to the Collector of Customs, apart from the production of the ship's manifest.
(a) What quantity of petroleum the ship is carrying; and
(b) Whether any, and if so what part, is dangerous petroleum.
6. No cargo of petroleum shall be discharged or landed until the master, owner, or agents produce or cause to be produced at the Customs House the following documents :—
(a) The manifest issued at the port of shipment showing the quantity of petroleum in tons.
(b) A loading certificate signed by the Customs or Port authority at the port of shipment giving the following particulars :—
(i.) The gallonage pumped into the ship from the shore tanks.
(ii.) The specific gravity and the temperature of the oil at the time of loading.
7. When petroleum is imported in bulk, the contents of each compartment of the tankship shall be regarded as a separate consignment.
8. No petroleum in cases, tins, or drums shall be discharged from the importing vessel until permission for that purpose has been obtained from the Collector of Customs or an officer specially authorized by him to grant such permission.

9. After the production of the documents mentioned in rule 6, and the granting of the permission mentioned in rule 8 petroleum not being dangerous petroleum may be discharged subject to the following rules, on production to the Collector of Customs of a flash point certificate signed by one of the following authorities :—

- (i.) By the Government Inspector under the Petroleum Ordinance at a British port of shipment, or at a British port where the ship has called ; or
- (ii.) By the analyst of the port of shipment ; if foreign, certified by the British Consul there ; or
- (iii.) If the port of shipment is one at which there is no British Consul, by the Refinery Chemist or Manager, attested by the Colombo Agents of the importer duly authorized thereto by the Collector of Customs.

Provided that in any case the Collector of Customs may cause samples to be taken for the purpose of testing the nature of the cargo, whether before or after landing.

Provided further that no petroleum shall be discharged until the importer in the opinion of the Collector of Customs has made adequate arrangements for the landing, transport, removal from the Customs premises, and storage of the petroleum in a licensed installation or store. In the event of these arrangements not being considered satisfactory at any stage, the Collector of Customs may order the discharge of the petroleum to be stopped forthwith.

10. (a) When the master, owner, or agents of a ship shall have made the declaration in rule 5, and if the petroleum does not fall within the class of petroleum described in rule 9, the officer appointed thereto by the Governor in this behalf shall, as soon as possible, go on board, and, unless the petroleum is inconveniently stowed (see (d) *postea*) obtain samples of all the petroleum on board.

(b) The master shall give to such officer as aforesaid in accordance with section 10 of the Ordinance, a sample of each variety of petroleum comprised in the petroleum of which samples are to be taken under 10 (a), and shall, if such officer as aforesaid shall so require, take those samples from the particular receptacles indicated by him.

(c) When petroleum is imported in bulk, one sample shall be taken from each of the compartments of the ship from which petroleum is to be landed.

(d) Such officer as aforesaid shall forthwith seal the packages containing the samples, and, having labelled them with the name of the ship, the name of the consignee, and such other distinguishing marks as may be necessary, shall hand them over to the officer appointed under section 11 of the Ordinance to be tested ; and this officer having tested them, shall sign a report certifying that they are or are not dangerous petroleum (as the case may be), and forward that report to the Office of the Collector of Customs where it shall be deposited.

(e) In the event of a ship being so inconveniently stowed that the sampling cannot be done satisfactorily on board, it shall be competent for the Collector of Customs to cause such petroleum as may be declared to be not dangerous petroleum to be landed, upon such conditions and removed to such places as he may appoint, with a view to its being sampled.

11. When a consignment of petroleum on board a ship otherwise than in bulk is stated by the master of the vessel or the consignee of the cargo, as the case may be, to be of one uniform quality, the officer appointed thereto by the Governor in this behalf shall select not less than one sample for every consignment up to 40,000 gallons, and so on in proportion for each multiple of 40,000 gallons, and the testing officer in ascertaining the average flashing point of the several samples shall be guided by the same procedure as is prescribed in section 3 of the schedule to the Ordinance for ascertaining the average flashing point of each sample.

12. In the event of any doubt arising as to the uniformity of the quality of the petroleum in any such consignment it shall be competent for the testing officer to require the division of the consignment into as many lots as he may deem necessary, and instruct the officer detailed to draw samples, to take as many samples of each lot as may seem to him sufficient ; and in determining the average flashing point of the samples of each lot, he shall be guided by the same principles as are prescribed under the preceding rule, and he shall withhold his certificate for any lots the average flashing points of which fall below the limits defined for dangerous petroleum under the Ordinance.

13. Where no certificate is produced in accordance with rule 9 or where such certificate having been produced is found by the Government Analyst to be incorrect, the following fees shall be paid to Government by the consignee :—

A fee of Rs. 25 for every sample tested during office hours, viz., between the hours of 10 A.M. and 2 P.M. on Saturdays and 10 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on other working days, and an additional fee of Rs. 17.50 for every sample tested out of office hours or on Sundays and public holidays.

14. The rates for the storage of petroleum in any Government warehouse shall be one cent per case of eight gallons per week ; such rent to commence at the expiration of three clear days excluding Sundays and Customs holidays, from the date on which the Collector of Customs has notified to the consignee that the petroleum has been certified as not dangerous.

15. The requirements of these rules with regard to the testing of petroleum shall not apply to petroleum imported from British India at Trincomalee in quantities not exceeding 24 tins at a time, if the Assistant Collector at the port is satisfied by a certificate from the Chief Officer of Customs at the port of shipment, or his Deputy, that such petroleum forms part of a consignment which has passed the test prescribed by law in British India.

16. When petroleum in cases, tins, or drums is discharged or shipped within the aforesaid ports—

- (a) It shall be discharged or shipped only in cargo boats, and after sunrise and before sunset and only at such place or places as the Collector of Customs shall direct. Every such cargo boat shall carry at its bows and stern a red flag not less than two feet square on a staff not less than six feet above the deck. When conveying petroleum the boat shall carry no other cargo.
- (b) No smoking, fire, or light of any description shall be allowed in any cargo boat during the time that the petroleum is on board the boat.
- (c) No boat shall be engaged in the discharging, landing, shipping, or transhipping of petroleum or any of its products from any vessel within the harbour until three hours' notice shall have been given by the master, owner, or agents of the vessel to the Inspector of Harbour Police, and an officer of the Police Force shall have been appointed by him and occupies the boat to see the regulations carried out.

17. Any petroleum landed as aforesaid shall not be deposited or stacked on the ground, but shall be removed at once from the boat in which the petroleum has been conveyed either to a place indicated by the Collector of Customs under rule 10 (e) or to premises in respect of which a licence for the possession of petroleum has been granted, or to trucks for removal from the Customs premises. No trucks or other vehicles laden with petroleum shall remain in the Customs premises and no lighter containing petroleum shall remain alongside any jetty after sunset.

18. All barges containing petroleum in cases, tins, or drums shall be removed at sunset to the mooring specially appointed by the Master Attendant, and such barges shall be moored fore and aft by chains.

19. No damaged or leaking cases, tins, or drums of petroleum shall be discharged from the importing ship or received into lighters.

20. No smoking, fire, or light of any description shall be allowed within the vicinity of 50 feet of any hatch from which dangerous petroleum in cases, tins, or drums is being discharged.

21. At least three hours' notice in writing shall be given to the Collector of Customs before any petroleum is brought to the Customs premises by the person in control of such petroleum. Petroleum in cases, tins, or drums shall not be allowed to remain in the Exports premises, but shall be removed therefrom with as little delay as possible.

Section 25 (1) (a).

1. The ordinary meetings of the Committee shall be held at such time and place as the Committee shall from time to time by resolution determine.
2. In the absence of the Chairman any member elected by a majority of the members present shall preside at any meeting.
3. The Chairman at any meeting shall preserve order and decide on all disputed points of order, and his decision on such matters shall be final.
4. As soon after the hour appointed for any meeting as a quorum shall assemble the Chairman or the member elected to preside shall take the chair, and the Committee shall proceed to business. Should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, the meeting shall stand adjourned, if an ordinary meeting, to the day appointed for the next ordinary meeting, or if a special meeting, *sine die*.
5. Any member desiring to ask a question or to make a motion, unless in the course of discussion or in case of emergency by special leave of the Committee, shall give notice of such question or motion either at some previous meeting of the Committee or by notice in writing at least four days before the day on which he intends to ask such question or make such motion, and when any such notice is given, a copy of the question or motion shall be delivered by such member to the clerk of the Committee.
6. All questions asked and motions made shall be in the order of the notice thereof unless the Committee shall unanimously decide otherwise.
7. Any member presenting a petition or other communication will be held responsible for its contents being throughout respectful and no document shall be laid by him before the Committee, unless the name and address of the drawer be legibly recorded on it.
8. When a petition or communication is presented by a member, the purport thereof shall be concisely stated, by him, and on the motion of any member, duly seconded, the question shall be put whether or not the document shall be read.
9. The business of the meetings shall be conducted in the following order:—
 - (a) The Minutes of the previous meeting shall be read and confirmed after being, if necessary, corrected.
 - (b) Memorials, petitions, or other communications addressed to the Committee shall be laid before the meeting and orders made thereon.
 - (c) The other business shall be considered in the order set down in the order book hereinafter mentioned.
10. The clerk shall keep an order book in which shall be entered and numbered in succession the subjects to be brought under discussion at each meeting, and he shall serve on each member or leave at his residence 10 days at least before each meeting a notice containing the order of the day copied from the order book. The proceedings of the Committee in respect of each item shall be minuted in this book during each sitting.
11. Notice of every special meeting shall be served on each member or left at this residence 7 days at least before the day of such meeting.

Section 25 (1) (c).

12. The area described in the Schedule A hereto is an area within which efficient provision has been made for elementary education by means of schools situated within the said area.

Section 25 (1) (d).

13. In these by-laws—

The term "boy," "girl," and "child" shall mean a boy, or a girl, or a child residing in the area described in the Schedule A hereto. The term "attendance" shall mean an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in the Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code. The term "Inspector of Schools" means an Inspector of Schools appointed by His Excellency the Governor. The term "school" shall mean any school recognized by the Director of Education and shall include the schools specified in Schedule B hereto. The term "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the meaning given to them in sub-sections (2) and (3) of section 25 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920. The term "Code" shall mean the Code for schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

14. The parent of every boy of not less than 6 shall, until such boy has reached the age of 14 years, cause such boy to attend an elementary school within a radius of 2 miles of his residence, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. The parent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 14 years of age, or in the case of Muslim and Tamil girls the parent of every girl not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age, shall cause such girl to attend an elementary school within a radius of 2 miles of her residence, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such girl or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. Provided that no Muslim girl shall be required to attend school unless there is a school in which a female teacher is employed within 2 miles of the girl's residence.

15. The time during which every boy or girl shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children of similar age. Provided always that when a boy between 12 and 14 years of age being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Education District Committee has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he has passed the examination prescribed by the Code for the V. Standard, he shall not be required to attend school. And provided that when a girl over 10 years of age is beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Education District Committee she shall not be required to attend school.

Sub-section (e).

16. No elementary school shall be kept open for the purpose of giving instructions to pupils for more than 6 hours a day including intervals for meals, &c. The hour at which school work should commence may be left to the discretion of the managers or head masters, but no school should open earlier than 8 A.M. or later than 10 A.M. The school time table should be approved by the Inspector of Schools.

17. No elementary school shall, except with the permission of the Divisional or District Inspector of Schools be kept open for school work on more than 5 days a week or on less than 200 days a year.

18. Every person who shall not observe, or shall neglect or violate, these by-laws or any of them, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine of Rs. 5 for the first offence and Re. 1 per day for a continuing offence.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. (a) The Chairman, when specially empowered thereto by resolution of the Sanitary Board, may by notice in writing require the owner or occupier of any house or building or land (1) having a cesspit in his premises to close the same, or (2) disposing of the night soil by burial or otherwise upon the premises to desist therefrom and to provide a dry-earth closet instead.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order under sub-section (a) shall be guilty of an offence.

2. Permission may be granted in writing by the Chairman, Sanitary Board, to any householder having on his premises a dry-earth closet or a cesspit to have night soil from the same buried or otherwise disposed of in some place sanctioned by the Chairman. Any householder having on his premises a dry-earth closet or a cesspit who shall permit any night soil to be buried or otherwise disposed of on his premises or in any place other than that sanctioned by the Chairman without permission in writing from the Chairman shall be guilty of an offence.

3. All owners or occupiers of premises furnished with dry-earth closets within the limits of the Sanitary Board towns of the Jaffna District shall pay to the Board for the removal of the night soil a fee which shall be Re. 1.50 per mensem per bucket or such amount as the Board may from time to time determine. All such fees shall be paid at the Sanitary Board Office before the 10th of the month following that during which the service was rendered.

4. (a) The Board may order in writing the owner or occupier of any premises to construct within the time prescribed by such order a closet on the dry-earth system of such type and size and in such a position as the Board may prescribe.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under sub-section (a) shall be guilty of an offence.

Regulations referred to.

BAKERIES.

I.—General Regulations.

1. No person shall within the limits of the Small Towns of Point Pedro, Valvedditarai, and Kayts keep a bakery without a licence from the Chairman of the Sanitary Board, Jaffna.
2. The Chairman shall subject to the provisions of regulation No. 4 issue such licence to any applicant on compliance with the conditions hereinafter specified for the issue of licence and on payment of such fees as may be fixed by the Board with the sanction of the Governor in Council.
3. Such licence shall remain in force for the period stated on the licence or till cancelled by a competent court.
4. On a second or subsequent conviction of a licensee of a breach of the regulations relating to bakeries, the court recording such conviction may cancel his licence and the Chairman may in his discretion refuse to issue him a fresh licence.
5. It shall be lawful for any Sanitary Inspector or other person duly authorized by the Chairman at all times when the process of baking is being carried on and at other reasonable times to enter upon and inspect the bakery and all furniture, equipment, stores, articles, and things used in the making or storing of bread.
6. Any person acting in contravention of any of the regulations relating to bakeries shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

II.—Conditions of Issue of Licence.

No person shall be entitled to a licence to keep a bakery unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions:—

1. (a) That the premises are in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted, and that every room is provided windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open shall be not less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space.
- (b) That the walls of every room in every part are not less than 7 feet in height, and are built of brick, stone, or cabook, with the inside thereof limeplastered and limewashed.
- (c) That all the eaves are at least 6 feet from the ground.
- (d) That the roof is made of some permanent material.
- (e) That all the woodwork is oilpainted or limewashed.
- (f) That the floor is cemented throughout.
- (g) That the premises are provided with adequate drainage.
2. (a) That the room in which kneading takes place has a superficial floor space of not less than 12 feet by 15 feet and that the lower 4 feet of the internal surface of the walls is covered with glazed tiles or plastered with cement.
- (b) That there is a free external air space on at least two sides of the kneading room not less than 7 feet wide to permit of thorough ventilation.
- (c) That the door of the oven does not open directly into the kneading room.
- (d) That every kneading room is provided with a ceiling which is either plastered and limewashed or made of closely fitting boards which are either limewashed or oilpainted.
3. (a) That the troughs, tables, and all the utensils used in the making of bread are capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor and the walls.
- (b) That the tops of the tables used in the making of bread are made of well seasoned closely fitting planks, or of some non-harmful impervious material.
4. (a) That the bakery is provided with a sanitary dust bin, at least two spittoons and with sufficient latrine accommodation.
- (b) That the bakery is at least 50 feet distant from any latrine, cesspit, manure heap, or open sewer.
- (c) That there is no cesspit, latrine, or ashpit within or directly communicating with the bakery.

III.—Regulations for Licensed Bakeries.

1. Every licensee of a bakery shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of the licensed premises a board with his name and the words "Licensed Bakery" legibly painted thereon in the English and vernacular languages.
2. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause a copy of these regulations in English and Sinhalese or Tamil, and the licence to be framed and hung in a prominent place in the licensed premises, and shall also cause a list of the names and addresses of all employees (including the vendors of bread) to be kept in the bakery so as to be available for inspection at all reasonable times by the Chairman or any person authorized by him.
3. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause the walls of every room forming part of the bakery to be limewashed twice a year in the months of June and December; the ceiling to be limewashed four times a year in the months of March, June, September, and December; the woodwork to be limewashed or, if oilpainted to be washed with hot water and soap at least twice a year in the months of June and December and at any other time if so ordered by the Chairman in writing.
4. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause the floor and the tiled or cemented portions of the walls and the tops of the tables to be washed every day at such hour as shall be specified in the licence. He shall cause every part of the bakery, its surroundings, drains, furniture, utensils, and equipment used in the making of bread to be kept in good repair, clean and free from effluvia arising from any drain, latrine, cesspit, or other nuisance on the licensed premises. He shall cause all trade and domestic refuse to be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle, which shall be removed from the bakery and cleared once a day. The receptacle shall always be kept covered except when refuse is being actually placed therein.
5. Every licensee of a bakery shall use for the manufacture of bread good and wholesome flour, water, and other materials. He shall store the flour on a platform placed at least 3 feet above the ground, so constructed as to provide no harbour for rats. He shall keep the space beneath the platform clean and free from all obstructions.
6. Every licensee of a bakery shall provide a sanitary dust bin, and at least two spittoons to be kept on the licensed premises. He shall keep the spittoons so as to be easily accessible to those engaged in the manufacture of bread, but shall not keep them in the kneading room.
7. Every licensee of a bakery shall keep the bakery free from rats and shall cause all rat holes to be filled up with broken glass and shall plaster them with cement as soon as found.
8. No person shall on any pretext whatsoever keep any animal or bird in a bakery.

9. No person shall spit within the bakery except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

10. (a) No person suffering from or who has recently suffered from any infectious, contagious, or loathsome disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall enter the licensed premises, or take part in the manufacture or sale of any bread therein, or engaged in the transport of any bread therefrom.

(b) Every licensee of a bakery who knowingly permits any person to contravene the provisions of regulation 10 (a) shall be guilty of an offence.

11. No licensee of a bakery shall store or keep or allow to be stored or kept in the room where bread is kept or prepared for packing or in which the materials for making bread are stored any furniture, clothes, sleeping mats, or any articles other than those used in the manufacture of bread.

12. No licensee of a bakery shall use or allow to be used as a sleeping place any place in the same floor as the bakery or forming part of the same building, unless such place is effectually separated from the place, where bread is packed or prepared for packing or in which the materials therefor are stored, by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling and unless such sleeping place is provided with an external window, the area of which when open shall not be less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space.

13. All persons employed in the preparation and making of bread shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of making bread and shall wear white aprons covering the chest and body and a white cap or turban.

14. Every licensee of a bakery shall provide clean water, clean towels, nail brush, and soap, and keep them so as to be easily accessible to those engaged in the manufacture of bread.

15. Every licensee of a bakery shall provide the licensed premises with an ample supply of potable water.

16. No licensee of a bakery shall expose or cause to be exposed for sale in the licensed premises any bread unless such bread is kept in clean properly constructed glass cases free from flies, dust, and vermin.

17. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause all bread, except fancy bread, rolls, biscuits, or confectionery, to be stamped with figures denoting one or the other of the following weights, viz:—

$\frac{1}{4}$ lb., $\frac{1}{2}$ lb., 1 lb., 2 lb., or 4 lb.

He shall not sell or expose for sale any bread, except fancy bread, rolls, biscuits, or confectionery, which shall not have one of the aforesaid weights stamped on it or which shall be found to weigh less than the weight stamped thereon.

18. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause to be fixed in a conspicuous place in the licensed premises a beam and scales with standard weights, and if required by the purchasers shall weigh any bread sold or exposed for sale in the said premises.

19. No licensee of a bakery shall allow any person to transport bread from his bakery for sale unless such person is in possession of a card of registration signed by the Chairman and by the licensee of a bakery.

20. No licensee of a bakery shall allow any bread to be transported from his licensed premises for sale except in a closed vehicle or a closed basket, tin, or other suitable receptacle. The licensee shall examine such vehicle, basket, tin, or other receptacle, and shall satisfy himself that it is thoroughly clean and wholesome before he allows such transport.

RULES made by the proprietors within the Irrigation District of Hambantota, for the Kahanda Modera area, comprising the following tracts:—(1) Roteduwa, (2) Mahaduwa, (3) Galawala Danketiya, (4) Medakumbura palata (except Medakumbura), and (5) Gedaraduwa palata under the Urubokka Scheme of the Hambantota District, in the Southern Province, under section 11 of “The Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917,” and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in terms of section 19 of the said Ordinance.

RULES.

1. The Kahanda Modera, that is the mouth of the Kahanda Kalapuwa, shall be cut when there is too much water in the kalapuwa for successful cultivation of the fields under the modera.

2. The times at which the modera is to be cut shall be determined by the Modera Arachchi and proclaimed by beat of tom-tom. When any dispute arises as to the cutting, the final decision shall rest with the Assistant Government Agent.

3. The Modera Arachchi shall be appointed by the Assistant Government Agent under section 20 (a) of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917.

4. The Modera Arachchi shall divide the work to be done among the proprietors of the lands to be benefitted in proportion to the shares owned.

5. Any proprietor or cultivator failing or delaying to contribute his proper share of labour when called upon by the Modera Arachchi shall be liable to the penalties provided for in section 29 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917 for a breach of rules.

6. These rules are applicable, in addition to the Village Tank rules dated October 12, 1900, published in *Government Gazette* No. 5,728 of October 19, 1900, and Urubokka-oya Cultivation rules dated November 21, 1910, published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,413 of December 2, 1910.

NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for cutting earth and loading into ballast trains at Enderamulla Quarry at $6\frac{3}{4}$ miles from Colombo, between Hunupitiya and Ragama stations, and for unloading this earth from the train and spreading it to the requirements of the Engineer at the site of the new Carriage Workshops at Ratmalana near Mount Lavinia.

2. It is expected that about 12 trains a week will be run, each conveying from 120 to 180 cubic yards of earth, but the number of trains and of wagons on the trains cannot be guaranteed.

The total number of trains required is estimated at approximately 600, but this number may be varied, accord-

ing to requirements. One month's notice will be given to the contractor before the train ceases.

3. The tender should quote separate rates for cutting soft earth, average cabook and hard cabook, these rates to include loading into wagons on the adjoining siding. Separate rates should be quoted for unloading and spreading up to a distance of 10 feet from the wagon, and any extra sums per cubic yard for distances greater than 10 feet should be specified.

4. The contractor will be required to maintain a sufficient labour force to load the train at the quarry in one hour, and at Ratmalana to unload it ready for despatch in $\frac{3}{4}$ hour. Penalties will be inflicted for any delays in loading or

unloading at the rate of Rs. 30 per hour for delays to trains and for failure to load full quantities at the rate of the value of the shortage of any wagons short loaded.

Temporary cadjan cooly lines, 10 at Enderamulla and 10 at Ratmalana, are available for the contractor's labour force, but the contractor will have to maintain these lines and to provide any additional accommodation he may require on an adjacent site, which will be loaned to him free for the time being by the Railway Department.

5. Further particulars can be obtained at the quarry at Enderamulla and at Ratmalana by arrangement with the Engineer, Way and Works, Captain's Garden, McCallum road.

6. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Cutting, Loading, and Unloading Earth Train from Enderamulla" on the left hand corner of envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on October 12, 1926.

7. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application to the General Manager of the Railway, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tender may be considered informal and be rejected. Tenders must be made in duplicate.

8. A deposit of Rs. 25 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline to enter into a contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

9. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

10. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of the security will be Rs. 1,000. All other necessary information can be ascertained upon application at the Office of the General Manager of the Railway.

11. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

12. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 18, 1926.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 145 (5 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 15 Moors, 5 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1926, viz., 258,905) was 29.2, as against 27.6 in the preceding week, 24.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 142 (2 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 13 Moors, 8 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.6, as against 27.4 in the previous week, 30.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 142 total deaths, 22 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena North, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Fort, Kotahena South, and Maradana North, as against 16 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Maradana hospital and Wellawatta South, as against 3 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 11 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Wellawatta South, as against 10 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident). The same number was registered in the previous week, against 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. Ten deaths each were registered from *Diarrhoea* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 9 each from *Enteritis* and *Debility*, 3 each from *Dysentery* and *Tetanus*, 2 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 1 from *Worms*, and 60 from *Other Causes*.

5. Eleven cases of *Enteric Fever*, 10 of *Chickenpox*, 7 of *Measles*, and 2 of *Smallpox* were reported during the week, as against 5, 10, 6, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported either this week or in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.3°, as in the preceding week, against 80.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.823 in., against 29.842 in. in the preceding week, and 29.886 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.96 in., against 2.68 in. in the preceding week, and 0.26 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
