**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE  
MONTH OF MAY, 1926.**

**REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.**

This report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

**Marriages.**

2. The marriages of residents in the proclaimed towns numbered 396 (315 General, 5 Kandyan, and 76 Muslim), as against 245 in the preceding month and 310 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 155 (115 General and 40 Muslim), as against 101 in the preceding month and 111 in the corresponding month of last year.

**Births.**

3. The births registered numbered 1,587 (811 males and 776 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 29·65 per 1,000 of the population, as against 32·45 in the preceding month, 31·72 in the corresponding month of last year, and 28·98 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The rate ranged from 7·28 in Kalpitiya to 76·66 in Kalmunai. There were 1,436 births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 26·83, as against 29·73 in the preceding month.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 519 (259 males and 260 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 23·60 per 1,000, as against 27·54 in the preceding month, 28·33 in the corresponding month of last year, and 24·35 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 5·80 in San Sebastian to 32·31 in Maradana East. There were 444 births of children whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 20·19, as against 24·39 in the preceding month.

**Deaths.**

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,581 (834 males and 747 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 29·54 per 1,000 of the population, as against 32·26 in the preceding month. There were 1,152 deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 23·28, as against 25·83 in the preceding month, 25·78 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·98 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The standardized death-rate ranged from 59·07 in Mullaittivu to 10·46 in Kegalla.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 542 (275 males and 267 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 24·65, as against 26·69 in the preceding month. There were 428 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 22·41, as against 24·08 in the preceding month, 28·06 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·25 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The death-rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 31·01 in Maradana East to 7·02 in Wellawatta North.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 115 (58 males and 57 females), as against 128 in the preceding month.

**Infant Mortality.**

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 348 and corresponded to a rate of 200 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended May, 1926. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 219, as against 196 in the preceding month, 211 in the corresponding month of last year, and 223 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. There were 318 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 221, as against 199 in the preceding month.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 104 and corresponded to a rate of 166 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended May, 1926. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 200, as against 186 in the preceding month, 231 in the corresponding month of last year, and 236 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. There were 98 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 221, as against 202 in the preceding month.

**Causes of Death.**

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 15 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Convulsions* caused 10 per cent.; *Phtisis*, 7 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year), 5 per cent.; *Enteritis* and *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, each 4 per cent.; *Diarrhoea*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Anchylostomiasis*, *Dysentery*, and *Prematurity*, each 3 per cent.; *Puerperal Septicaemia*, *Bronchitis*, and *Enteric Fever*, each 2 per cent.; *Cancer* and *Influenza*, each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 12 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Convulsions* caused 10 per cent.; *Phtisis*, 9 per cent.; *Enteritis*, 4 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year), *Bronchitis*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, and *Influenza*, each 3 per cent.; *Enteric Fever*, *Dysentery*, *Cancer*, *Prematurity*, *Anchylostomiasis*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, and *Diarrhoea*, each 2 per cent.; *Tetanus* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, each 1 per cent.

12. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phtisis*, of which 115 cases were reported (95 in Colombo). *Chickenpox* followed with 101 (80 in Colombo, 7 in Moratuwa); *Measles* 47 (39 in Colombo); *Continued Fever* 20 (13 in Colombo); *Smallpox* 20 (19 in Galle and 1 in Colombo); *Enteric Fever* 19 (12 in Colombo); *Dysentery* 8 (in Kurunegala); *Mumps* 6 (5 in Colombo); *Diphtheria* 2 (in Panadure); *Whooping Cough* 2 (in Colombo); *Cholera* 1 (in Jaffna).

**Meteorology.**

13. *Rainfall*.—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (50·10 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 34·10 in. in Ratnapura to 1·88 in. in Jaffna; Colombo recorded 25·95 in.

14. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 85·8° in Mannar and Trincomalee to 63·4° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 82·4° in Colombo.
