- 2. The applicant for the renewal of an old licence will take or send it to the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent together with the fee due, which may be remitted either by cash, cheque, money order, or postal order. In return he will receive a fresh licence in the prescribed form.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

Establishment and Regulation of Public Markets.

1. Whenever it shall be determined to establish a public market the Council shall give not less than ten days' notice of the time when the same will be opened, and such notice shall be published by beat of tom-tom.

Opening of public markets.

2. After any public market shall have been established and opened no person shall without a licence granted by the Council publicly expose for sale any meat, poultry, fresh fish, fresh fruit, or vegetables in any place within the limits of the Council other than the public market or a private market established under section 148 of the Ordinance No. 11 of 1920, and it shall be lawful for the Secretary or an Inspector of the Council to seize any such meat, poultry, fresh fish, fresh fruit, and vegetables exposed or hawked about for sale contrary to the provisions of this by-law and to remove the same to the office of the Council to be disposed of as may be ordered by the Chairman or the Magistrate.

Sale of goods prohibited in any other place than the public market without

3. All licences referred to in the last preceding by-law shall be in the form in Schedule A annexed and shall be in force for the period mentioned therein and no longer, which period shall not be more than twelve months or less than one month.

Form of licence to sell elsewhere than in market.

Such licences shall be paid for in advance at a rate not exceeding Fifty cents (50 cts.) for each month. Provided that it shall be lawful for the Council at any time to cancel any such licence or

Table of fees.

A table of the rents, tolls, and fees leviable at each market shall be printed in English and Tamil and placed in a conspicuous place at each market, and itshall be unlawful for any person to demand or receive higher sums than those authorized by such notice.

Recovery of rents.

5. The several rents, tolls, and fees payable in respect of a public market shall be paid in advance from time to time on demand to the Council or their lessee or other person authorized by the Council or their lessee to receive the same.

Recovery by distress.

If any person liable to the payment of any rent, toll, or fee authorized as aforesaid does not pay the same when demanded, the Council or any person authorized by the Council to collect the same may levy the same by seizure and sale of all or any of the articles in the market belonging to or in the possession or custody of the person liable to pay such toll, rent, or fee.

> Occupation of stalls without licence.

7. No person shall hold, use, or occupy any stall in a public market without a licence, which licence shall be in the form in Schedule B annexed; nor shall he contravene any of the conditions of such licence.

Assignment of spaces in the market buildings or grounds.

Fresh fish only to be

sold in the fish market.

Meat, fish, cooked food,

&c., not to be sold in the vegetable market.

(a) The Council or the Chairman shall have the right to assign particular portions of a market building or grounds for exposing thereon of particular classes of goods and no trader shall have the right to introduce into any such portion, for the purpose of trade, any article which does not belong to the particular class.

(b) No portion of a market building or grounds except such as is assigned by the Council or Chairman for occupation for trade shall be occupied by any trader.

(c) The Council or the Chairman may order that when there is available space in a market building for occupation subject to the provisions made in the foregoing by laws, no space outside the building shall be occupied, except with special sanction.

9. No person shall sell or expose for sale in any fish market or stall any provisions or things other than fresh fish.

10. No person shall sell or expose for sale in any vegetable or fruit market or stall any meat or fish, whether fresh or salted, or any cooked food or any articles other than fresh fruit and vegetables.

11. No occupant of a stall shall enclose in any way any portion of a market or erect any awning or screen or fixture of any kind, nor shall he leave any goods in any market between the

hours of 9 P.M. and 6 A.M. without having first obtained the sanction of the Chairman. Every occupant of a stall or seat in any market shall keep such stall or seat clean and

free from filth or rubbish.

No person suffering from or who has recently suffered from any infectious, contagious, or loathsome disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall occupy any stall, seat, or place in any public market, or expose for sale thereat any provisions whatsoever.

Occupants not to enclose market or to have goods in it during the night. Occupant to keep stall

clean.

13. No person using or occupying any public market shall-

Certain acts forbidden.

(a) Behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about such market.

(b) Carry on any cooking in such market.

(c) Remain in or loiter about such market after the place is closed for business at 9 P.M.

without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself.

(d) Damage, or in anywise deface, any portion of the buildings, stalls, lamps, or any property of the Council in or about such market or defile or pollute in any way the water provided for use in such market.

14. It shall be lawful for the Secretary or an Inspector of the Council, upon the seizure by him as unwholesome or unfit for human food of any meat, poultry, fish, game, flesh, vegetable, fruit, or other article of food introduced into or exposed for sale within the limits of the

Seizure of meat. &c.

Hours during which market, shall be open.

Market keeper or lessee to preserve order within limits of the market.

Council may prohibit sale of certain fish or fruit.

Butchers not to keep any meat except in a public market.

Carts not to remain within market premises for a longer period than is necessary.

Receptacles.

No meat not slaughtered at a slaughter-house to be brought into market.

Stalls to be kept open to public.

Seizure of stray dogs in the market.

Seizure of poultry.

Punishment for breach of by laws.

Jaffna Urban District Council, to convey the same to the Health Officer, or, in his absence, or it there be no such officer, to the Chairman or the Magistrate; and if it appear to such Health Officer, Chairman or Magistrate that such meat, poultry, fish, vegetable, fruit, or other provisions are unfit for human food, he shall order the same to be destroyed or to be so disposed of as to prevent it being exposed for sale or used for such food.

- 15. All public markets shall be opened daily from 6 A.M. to 9 P.M., and it shall be the duty of the Council to make provision for the proper lighting of the market.
- 16. It shall be the duty of the market-keeper or of the lessee of the market to maintain order within the limits of the market, and every person who shall obstruct or resist any person appointed by the Council to superintend any public market or to collect the rents, tolls, or fees, or to enforce order or cleanliness therein whilst in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.
- 17. Whenever it shall appear to the Council that the use or consumption by the public of any particular kind of fish is injurious or that during the prevalence of any epidemic the use or consumption of any particular kind of fruit or vegetable is hurtful, it shall be lawful for the Council, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer, by beat of tom-tom or other sufficient notice, to prohibit for such time as to the Council shall appear necessary the sale of any such fish, fruit, or vegetable in any market or other place within the limits of the Council, and after such notice to cause the same whether exposed for sale or not, to be seized and destroyed in such manner as the Council or Chairman may direct.
- 18. No licensed butcher shall sell or keep for sale any meat or any portion of a slaughtered animal except in a public market and in the stall rented by him or in any place specially licensed as provided in by-law No. 2.
- 19. No cart or vehicle shall remain within any market premises for a longer period than is necessary for loading or unloading.
- 20. Every person holding a licence for a stall in a public market shall keep on or near such stall a receptacle to be approved by the Chairman in which such person shall deposit all rubbish and refuse matter.
- 21. No person shall throw any rubbish, refuse, bones, skins of animals, or other such thing in or upon any public market or its premises except into a receptacle provided for such purpose.
- 22. Except as herein provided no carcase of any animal (or any portion thereof) not slaughtered at the public slaughter-house provided by the Council shall be brought into a public or private market or to any place specially licensed as provided in by-law No. 2 of these by-laws or sold or exposed for sale in any public or private market or in such specially licensed place. The provisions of this by-law shall not apply to frozen meat, game, or fish imported into the Island.
- 23. If any person having a licence to hold or occupy a stall in any public market shall wilfully neglect or refuse to serve the public without being able to assign a satisfactory reason during two consecutive days, it shall be lawful for the Chairman to suspend or revoke any such licence.
- 24. Any dog found straying in a public market unaccompanied by its owner may be seized by any person authorized by the Chairman to seize dogs straying therein. Such dog may be released on payment by any person claiming it of any tax due in respect of such dog, and of a further sum of fifty cents, or if the dog shall have been seized during the night, of a further sum of one rupee, in addition to the tax. If the dog be unclaimed, it shall be sent to the Council pound to be disposed of in the manner hereinafter provided for other animals.
- 25. All poultry and animals other than dogs found straying in a public market or the market premises shall be seized by any person authorized by the Chairman to seize the same, and shall, if claimed within six hours from the time of seizure, be delivered over to the owner thereof upon payment of twenty-five cents in respect of each fowl or animal so seized. If the same be not claimed within such time they shall be detained in the pound, and if not claimed within twelve hours of the seizure shall be sold, and out of the proceeds the Council shall be entitled to make a charge of one rupee, and the surplus, if any, shall be paid to the owner.
- 26. Any person committing a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 (rupees fifty), and in the case of a continuing offence to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 (rupees twenty-five) for every day during which the offence was committed after conviction or after written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

It shall not be lawful for any person to erect, re-erect, or add to any hut or house within the limits of the Local Board of Batticaloa, except under the following conditions:—

The following clear air space shall be left around any hut or house which is erected or re-erected, or around any hut or house which is added to with respect to such addition, and no portion of the walls of such building, and not more than 2 feet 6 inches of the projecting eaves of such building shall come within such space:—

- (1) On the side of any road or street 25 feet to the centre of such road or street.
- (2) Behind such space up to 50 feet to any other hut or house except a kitchen, bathing place, or latrine, as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected, re-erected, or added to.
- (3) To the side such space up to 15 feet to the nearest building as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected, re-erected, or added to.

Provided that the Chairman may in his discretion, relax the operation of this rule in any special case, but he shall not do so unless he is satisfied that (1) no detriment is caused thereby to the sanitary condition or amenities of the house or hut to be erected, re-erected, or added to, or of any other neighbouring house or hut used or intended to be used as a human dwelling place, and (2) that the future alignment, widening or development of any road or street, or the convenience of the public using such road or street will not be interfered with by such relaxation of the rule.

2. The lessor will provide the refreshment cars, including furniture, stoves, and fixtures, and the lessee will provide all other equipment such as linen, plate, crockery, glass, cutlery, fuel, cooking utensils, &c. All eatables, especially to Hindu passengers must be served on aluminium or brass vessels, instead of using chinaware for the purpose. '
3. The lessor or the Ceylon Government will not be

liable for any accident or injury to any of the servants or

employees of the lessee.

The lessor or the Ceylon Government will not be liable for any damage to the linen, plate, crockery, glass, cutlery, cooking utensils, &c., which are the property of the lessee, unless such damage has, in the opinion of the lessor, whose decision on the matter shall be final, been caused by the wilful negligence of the lessor or the servants employed under him.
5. The lessee will be liable for any damage to the

up and not used as foundation for the stacks.

(5) In the event of a dispute between the Railway and the Forest Department as to deductions on account of bad stacking the wood is liable to be removed to the nearest Railway Depôt and re-stacked, the measurement then obtained will be accepted as final for purposes of payment.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

- 22. (1) The following species shall not be felled unless stamped by a Forest Officer:
 - (a) Promising seed bearers and sound and healthy saplings of satin, palu, milla, ranai, halmilla, ebony, kon, ehela, kolon, and other superior species and valuable re growth.
 - (b) All trees under 12 in, in girth unless otherwise ordered by the Divisional Forest Officer.
- (2) The following species shall be felled and converted into firewood:
 - (a) All inferior species above 12 in. in girth (6 in. above ground) unless otherwise ordered by the Divisional Forest Officer.

- (b) All crooked and unsound trees of the superior species stamped by a Forest Officer with due regard to a uniform distribution of standards not less than 50 and not exceeding 100 to an acre.
- (3) Natural undergrowth to be left undisturbed except in portions where the Divisional Forest Officer orders it to be removed. Brushwood should be spread evenly over the area in which completed block and before a new block is entered. When the whole area is completed brushwood must also be spread over the cart tracks. No brushwood, however, should be spread within 10 ft. of any standard.

Brushwood in felling area of Service A should be cut and

heaped in lines 10 feet apart.

There will be no restrictions about earting inside the 5-acre blocks. Except in service A where carts must not enter the blocks.

Coppicing of stumps will not be done.

A percentage of the standards to be left standing on the area will be marked beforehand by the Forest Department, and the balance marked as the contract progresses according to sylvicultural requirements. The number of such standards to be retained will be between 50 and 100 per acre.

All trees of the approved species of 6 feet girth and over at 4 feet 3 inches from the ground will be felled by the contractor and stamped on reaching an inspection depôt. A list of the trees to be felled will be supplied to the contractor..

(b) All large unsound trees of valuable species standing in the area will be felled by the contractor at Rs. 2 per tree. If any sleepers or scantlings can be sawn from this material they will be paid for at the contract rate per sleeper and per cubic foot of scantlings, otherwise such trees will be left felled in the forest.

(c) Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 feet by 10 inches by 5 inches, and narrow gauge sleepers are to be 5 feet by 10 inches by 5 inches or 5 feet by 9 inches by 41 inches. quantity and sizes of the scantlings will be determined later. The sizes in any case will not exceed the sizes of the sleepers in respect of the cross section measurements.

(f) Sleepers and scantlings should be rectangular in form, and sawn perfectly parallel on all sides. On no account will squaring of logs for sleepers or scantlings with an adze

or axe be allowed.

(g) Sleepers and scantlings should be invariably placed under shade immediately they are sawn until they can be transported to the delivery depôt where they shall be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by a Forest Officer. Similarly, the logs should also be placed under shade at the delivery depôt and kept off the ground; depôts will be kept clear of undergrowth and weeds by the contractor at his expense.

(h) Rejected logs, sleepers, and scantlings will not be paid for and will lapse to Government as well as all refuse wood in the area of operation. The contractor shall have

VITAL STATISTICS.

Puttalam, October 2, 1926.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 2, 1926.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 155 (7 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 28 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1926, viz., 258,905) was 31·2, as against 29·4 in the preceding week, 20·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 127 (2 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 77 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 25 Moors, 1 Malay, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25 6, as against 24 4 in the previous week, 24 0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30 3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 127 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 19 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. Seventeen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 8 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

- 2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana East, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 11 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.
- (b) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, I each in Fort, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, as against 4 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Two deaths from Influenza were registered, I each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, as against 6 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), as against 5 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Nine deaths were registered from Diarrhoa, 8 each from Infantile Convulsions and Debility, 6 from Dysentery, 5 from Enteritis, 2 each from Worms, Tetanus, and Puerperal Septicaemia, and 48 from Other Causes.
- 5. Ten cases of Chickenpox, 9 of Measles, 3 each of Smallpox and Enteric Fever were reported during the week, as against 8, 9, 3, and 7, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of Plague was reported either this week or in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.8°, against 81.2° in the preceding week, and 80.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.796 in., against 29.882 in. in the preceding week, and 29.872 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.81 in., against 2.00 in. in the preceding week, and 9.58 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
