#### GOVERNMENT CLERICAL EXAMINATION, 1927.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter Class II. of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service will take place annually in August. The next examination will commence on August 23, 1927.

- 2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Education, bearing a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and in the prescribed form (Schedule A), which can be obtained at the Education Office on application. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to have been born on or after August 1, 1904, but not later than July 31, 1910, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,\* to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application. Affidavits will not be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration from the register of past births, the certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which the candidate is known, the parent or guardian should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 7 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1900. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination. This examination is confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in the Island.
- 3. Candidates who are not in Government Service will not be admitted to the examination unless they have previously passed either—

(a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or higher examinations of the University of

- (b) The Cambridge Junior or the English School-Leaving Certificate Examination and either (i.) the Examination for the Commercial Certificates of the Government Technical Schools or of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce or (ii.) the Examination for the London Chamber of Commerce Junior Certificate in English, Arithmetic, and either Bookkeeping or Shorthand and Typewriting.
- 4. A candidate who gives notice of withdrawal to the Education Office fifteen days before the date of commencement of the examination will have the value of stamps affixed to his entry form refunded to him. In cases where a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission, a refund of four-fifths the value of the stamps will be made. In no other case will a refund be made, but a candidate prevented by illness from taking up the examination for which he has entered will be permitted to re-enter for either of the two following examinations without further fee, provided notice of withdrawal accompanied by the entry form and a medical certificate from a qualified medical officer be sent to the Director of Education not later than the last day of the examination, and provided further that the regulations are complied with in other respects.
- 5. Clerks in Government Service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments), from whatever funds they may be paid, who have completed three years' service, and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination, irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments.
- 6. Clerks in Government Service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments) if within the age prescribed in paragraph 2 above will be admitted, without fee, even though they have not completed three years' service under Government.

7. Candidates in Government Service who are not eligible under paragraphs 5 and 6 may enter for the Examination under the conditions laid down in paragraphs 2 and 3.

- 8. Applications should reach the Director of Education not later than 2 r.m. on June 6, 1927. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.
- 9. The Director of Education will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.
- 10. The examination will be held at Colombo only, under the supervision of the Director of Education, in the places which will be notified to the candidates in due course. Heads of Departments are required to grant leave to present themselves at the examination, to officers of their Departments whose applications to present themselves for examination have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education.
- 11. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for general competition will be thirty.
- 12. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.
- 13. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule B of this notice. The examination will be held in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, Arithmetic, and English Language and Composition. The papers of any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting and Spelling or half those allowed for Arithmetic or for English Language and Composition will not be considered for the second part of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule B. Credit will not be given for any paper in which a candidate scores less than 25 per cent. of the maximum marks. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

<sup>\*</sup> If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted school, the certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted school which he has attended.

- 14. Clerks admitted under paragraph 5, who fail to secure places in the general competition under conditions in paragraph 13, will be allowed to compete amongst themselves for ten appointments, if in the first part of this examination they obtain a minimum of 66 per cent. in Handwriting and Spelling, and 33 per cent. in Arithmetic, and English Language and Composition.
- 15. The Government does not undertake to provide the successful candidates with posts immediately, but they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

"THE COLOMBO GRAVING DOCK AND PATENT SLIP ORDINANCE, 1908."

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers in him vested by section 4 of the above-named Ordinance, has been pleased to make the following rules for regulating the management and use of the Graving Dock by ships belonging to His Majesty's Navy, and the same are published for general information.

#### CHARGES.

1. (1) (a) Actual out of pocket expenses on labour, fuel, stores, special shores, and other temporary fittings required for the sole use of the ships belonging to His Majesty's Navy being docked will be charged from 24 hours previous to the time when the caisson is placed in position after the vessel has entered the Dock until 12 hours after she has cleared the Dry Dock entrance on leaving (except in the case of a battleship, when the additional time necessary for putting the side docking keel blocks in position and removing same will be charged), the added hours before and after the entrance and departure of the vessel from the Dock being for preparation and restoration of Dock equipment and machinery.

(b) One three-hundred-and-sixty-fifth part (1/365) of the value of all ropes and gear (as defined in the list attached) purchased for use at the Dock in the preceding year to be charged for each day of 24 hours or part thereof in the period of docking above named during the current year.

(c) Rupees Forty-five (Rs. 45) to be charged for fair wear and tear of machinery for each day or portion of a day

in the period of docking above named.

(d) Vessels moored alongside the Graving Dock guide pier to be charged at the rate of 11 cents per ton for every day of 24 hours or part of 24 hours, the charge to cover the usual privileges hitherto accorded to men-of-war (use of bathrooms, privies, &c.) which may be available, but not to be reduced in case these facilities should be removed owing to the construction of new works or improvements. The charge is to be limited to a minimum of Rs. 15 and a maximum of Rs. 50 for every day of 24 hours or part of 24 hours.

(e) In addition to the foregoing charges in (d), a fixed berthing charge of Rs. 25 per diem will be levied on each vessel

berthed alongside the Graving Dock guide i ier for a longer period than eight hours.

(2) For the purpose of calculation of charges only, the words "ships belonging to His Majesty's Navy" include His Majesty's ships, Royal Fleet auxiliaries flying the blue ensign with the Admiralty badge, troop ships belonging to the Imperial Government, hospital ships belonging to the Imperial Government, but not ships on Government charter.

(3) All charges based on tonnage shall be calculated on the gross tonnage of each vessel.

#### Time of Occupation.

2. The period of a vessel's occupation shall count from the time the caisson was placed in position after her entering till she has cleared the Dry Dock entrance when leaving. It is to be clearly understood, with reference to the times stated, that within those limits no work, such as pumping, is done and charged to the Admiralty which is clearly in connection with the docking or undocking of some other vessel.

#### GOVERNMENT WILL NOT UNDERTAKE WORK.

3. The Dock Superintendent will not undertake the work of cleaning, painting, or repairing vessels. The Naval Authorities may employ any licensed contractor, or carry out the work with their own artificers if they think fit. Only contractors holding a licence from the Government are permitted to undertake work in the Dock.

#### PRIORITY TO HIS MAJESTY'S SHIPS.

4. Ships belonging to His Majesty's Navy shall have priority over all other vessels to enter the Dock and make use of the appliances attached thereto, other vessels having been already regulated notwithstanding.

#### APPLICATION FOR USE OF THE DOCK.

5. Applications for the use of the Dock should be made as long as possible before the date of docking, to the Dock Superintendent, on forms which may be obtained at his office for the purpose (Form A). The require of Rs. 500 (referred to in Form A) does not, however, apply to ships belonging to His Majesty's Navy. The requirement of a deposit

#### REQUIREMENTS BEFORE DOCKING.

- 6. Prior to the time regulated for the admission of any vessel into the Dock, the following arrangements must be carried out on board the vessel and order taken with reference thereto, viz.:-
  - (a) Suitable hawsers and heaving lines must be in readiness on each side fore and aft, and a gantline rove for masthead pendants.

(b) The vessel must be upright and as nearly as possible on an even keel, and the bilges must be perfectly dry fore and aft, and kept so. All side and stern ports should be shut.

(c) The ballast tanks must either be pressed full with their doors properly secured, or pumped quite dry with their doors off ready for inspection, if so required by the Dock Superintendent.

(d) All the vessel's water-closets and latrines must be thoroughly cleaned and securely fastened up before the vessel enters the Dock, and no use whatever shall be made of them while the vessel is in the Dock.

(e) If so required by the Dock Superintendent, the awnings shall be furled.

(f) If so required under the provisions of the Plague Regulations, the vessel shall be furnigated before being docked.

#### DOCKING PLAN.

The Commander of a warship, on making application for the use of the Dock, should forward a docking plan to the Dock Superintendent showing the style and construction of the ship's bottom, and the manner in which it is desired she should be shored.

#### VESSELS SAFELY DOCKED.

8. When any vessel shall be declared by the Docking Master to have been properly and safely placed upon the blocks, the Commander or his representative shall forthwith satisfy himself thereof, and if he shall have made no objection thereto at the time in writing to the Docking Master, the vessel shall be considered to have been properly and safely docked.

#### VESSEL'S CREW TO GIVE ASSISTANCE.

9. It is understood that the vessel's crew shall render every assistance when docking and undocking.

#### SHORES AND BLOCKS TO BE SUPPLIED.

10. Shores and blocks shall be supplied as required.

#### SHIFTING OF WEIGHTS.

11. No weights, such as guns, ballast, or coal shall be shifted or taken on board a vessel during the time she is in Dock, and no claim for any damage which may be done owing to the breach of this rule shall lie against the Dock Authorities or the Government.

#### No Work during Docking.

12. No outboard work shall be done on a vessel while entering or leaving the Dock.

#### No Rubbish to be thrown into the Dock.

13. Rubbish shall not be thrown into the Dock, or deposited on the quays, in the sheds, or in any other part of the Dock enclosure, but shall be removed to such places as are set apart for its reception.

#### DOCKING.

14. It shall be the duty of the Master Attendant to bring vessels up to the Dock into such a position that the docking lines for heaving the vessels into the Dock are fast on board, and when vessels are leaving the Dock to take charge of them as soon as the vessels clear the entrance to the Dock. All further operations connected with the docking and undocking of vessels shall be carried out under the direction of the Docking Master.

#### WORKING DAYS.

15. Work may be carried on on a warship in the Dock on every day of the year. Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday are dies non as far as the Dock employés are concerned. If work is done in connection with the docking, undocking, or repair of any warship necessitating the presence of the Dock Staff upon any dies non, the extra allowances so incurred, as well as the time worked, will be included in the docking expenses.

#### WORKING HOURS.

16. The working hours for the Government Staff at the Dock are from 6.30 to 11 A.M. and from 12 to 4.30 P.M. Any overtime worked by the Dock Staff in connection with a vessel in Dock will be charged against the ship.

#### Anchors to be inboard.

17. No warship shall come into the Dock with any of her anchors hanging over her bows.

#### NO PERSON TO INTERFERE WITH THE SUPERINTENDENT OR HIS SUBORDINATES.

18. No person other than those duly authorized by and acting under the orders of the Dock Superintendent shall interfere with the moving of the caisson, or with the opening or shutting of the sluices, capstans, iron gratings, or working of the pumping engines of the Dock.

#### NOTICE OF UNDOCKING.

Provided that the Chairman may in his discretion, relax the operation of this rule in any special case, but he shall not do so unless he is satisfied that (1) no detriment is caused thereby to the sanitary condition or amenities of the house or hut to be erected, re-erected, or added to, or of any other neighbouring house or hut used or intended to be used as a human dwelling place, and (2) that the future alignment, widening or development of any road or street, or the convenience of the public using such road or street will not be interfered with by such relaxation of the rule.

#### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 9, 1926.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 169 (2 Europeans, 16 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 22 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1926, viz., 258,905) was 34.0, as against 31.2 in the preceding week, 28.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 147 (3 Burghers, 93 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 18 Moors, 6 Malays, and Y Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.6, as against 25.6 in the previous week, 27.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 147 total deaths, 27 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. Sixteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Maradana North, as against 17 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

- 2. (a) Eleven deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North, and I each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 12 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.
- (b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana South, as against 2 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) One death from Bronchitis was registered in Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), as against 3 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Five deaths from Enteric Fever were registered in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), as against 3 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Thirteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 8 from Debility, 6 from Enteritis, 5 from Puerperal Septicaemia, 3 from Dysentery, 2 each from Diarrhoea and Tetanus, 1 from Worms, and 68 from Other Causes.
- 5. Nine cases of Chickenpox, 7 of Enteric Fever, and 2 of Measles were reported during the week, as against 10, 3, and 9, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of Smallpox or Plague was reported this week, but 3 of Smallpox were reported during the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·3°, against 82·8° in the preceding week, and 80·5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean astmospheric pressure was 29·822 in., against 29·796 in. in the preceding week, 29·859 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·65 in. against 0.81 in. in the preceding week, and 4.41 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

# MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

## MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, September 1, 1926, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 25, 1926.

Present:—Mr. H. E. Newnham, C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias, M.B.E., J.P.; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Mr. R. L. Pereira; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. A. J. Wickwar; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Dr. G. Thornton; Mr. J. S. Collett; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; and Mr. T. R. Mitchell.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of August 4, 1926, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of August 4, 1926, be confirmed.

Pursuant to notice Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman the following question: --Will the Chairman be pleased to take steps to secure powers for this Council to control the height and character of walls, fences, hedges, and to restrict the erection of new buildings at corners or bends on highways, where it is necessary for the safety of road users that an adequate sight line should be secured, as is done in England under the Roads Improvement Act of 1925?

The Chairman repiled as follows:—The Chairman and the Council appear already to have reasonably adequate powers in regard to boundary walls and fences under by-law 46 Chapter VIII., and in regard to other buildings under sections 18 (4) and 29 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915. Experience tends to show that to secure further legal powers would be a very lengthy task and to secure more drastic powers would be an impossible aspiration.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey asked the Chairman the following questions:—(1) What the extent is of the land partitioned off for the Kirillapone cemetery and what is the amount paid per acre for acquisition? (2) What portion of this is low land? (3) At what depth of this low land water is found? (4) Of the money voted and spent for doing up the cemetery what amount has been spent for the boundary wall and what amount for the filling? (5) What portion of the land has been already filled up and to what height? (5) What has been the cost per acre? (6) To what total height the Municipal Engineer thinks the low land has to be filled to enable a grave to be dug without meeting water? (7) What length of time is required for the filled up portion to settle down and what extra filling has to be done to make allowance for this settling down?

The Chairman replied as follows:--

(1) About 24 acres 3 roods and 27 perches. The average cost was Rs. 3,000 an acre.

(3) The depth at which water is found varies, but it is normally found at about 2 or 3 feet below the old ground level.

(4) Reference is requested to the reply containing this information given at the last meeting of Council.
(5) Nearly 4 acres have been filled to varying heights. The cost has been about Rs. 6,450 per acre.

(6) To a height of from 13 to 14 feet above mean sea level under normal weather conditions.

- (7) With this soil it is considered that one wet season is sufficient to settle the filling and that this will take place before the completion of the job. The estimate recently submitted provides for completing this filling and no extra filling will be required thereafter.
- 4. The following motion stood in the name of the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando:—That this Council as representing the citizens of Colombo, do draw the attention of Government to the lack of proper Police supervision, especially in the north of Colombo, as evinced by the commission of several acts of violence on public thoroughfares and to request that the Government do take immediate steps to remedy the existing state of affairs.

  With the permission of the Council the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando withdrew the above motion.

The following motion stood in the name of the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader: -That this Council recommend to the Chairman that a licence be issued to store copra temporarily in premises No. 34, Second Cross street, Pettah, Colombo.

The Chairman ruled the above motion out of order.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader thereupon asked the permission of Council to move the following motion:-This Council is of opinion that the Chairman has power under the amended by-law No. 4 and by-law No. 10 to issue a licence to store copra outside the offensive and dangerous trade areas, and that the Chairman was wrong in refusing to issue a licence to store copra outside the orients to the day of the store copra in premises No. 34, Second Cross street, Pettah, on the ground that he had no power.

Permission having been granted, the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved the motion. Dr. E. V. Ratnam

seconded pro forma.

Mr. R. L. Pereira moved as an amendment that this matter be referred to the Law and the Building Committees. The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

The amendment was accepted by the mover of the motion put to the meeting as an original motion and carried. Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 6 to 11 (inclusive) on the L. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:

O. E. Pieries be accepted as follows: Rs. 6.50 per cube for transport of rubble from Biyagama to Ferguson's road, and Rs. 2.25 per ton for material from Ferguson's road to Biyagama.—(b) Recommended.

(35) To consider—(a) An application from Mr. B. B. Fernando for water service to his premises No. 418, Galle road, Wellawatta.—(a) Considered; (b) a plan and an estimate of Rs. 1,750 from the Waterworks Engineer for laying a 3-inch diameter water main for a distance of 220 yards in the lane. The lane being a private lane the application will have to be dealt with under Ordinance No. 9 of 1916. The proportion of cost payable by the applicant is Rs. 1,648.82, and he has applied to pay the amount by monthly instalments of Rs. 50, with interest at 6 per cent. a year on balances outstanding, which conforms with section 14A (5) of the aforesaid Ordinance.

and sanctioned votes will be debited as and when the stores are used.—(b) Recommended.

# MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, September 11, 1926, at 1 15 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated September 6, 1926.

Present:—Mr. L. W. C. Schrader, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E.; Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C.; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe; Dr. E. P. Aserappa; and Mr. W. W. Morgan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of August 21, 1926, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. G. D. Goonewardene, M.B.E. asked—(I) What will it cost to get a cube of earth for

filling up the esplanade, delivered at the spot? (2) What will be the cost of spreading same?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The Superintendent of Works reports that the cost per cube of earth, delivered at the esplanade from the quarry at Talbot Town, will be Rs. 2·50, (2) the cost of spreading the earth forming surface to required levels, and rolling, cents 25 per cube. Supervision, or profit, cents 25 per cube.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. I. Durham moved.—That this Council learns with regret Government's recent decision not to broaden that piece of the Galle-Matara main road running through the Galle Bazaar, and hopes that Government may yet revise their decision and take in hand this important and badly needed improvement.

Mr. J. E. Perera seconded, and Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe supported the motion.

The Chairman spoke against the motion, and moved the following amendment:—That while sympathizing with the object of the motion the Council is of opinion that it is inadvisable to press the matter at the present moment when the annual Budget has been passed, and the application for a grant for waterworks is awaiting sanction; and that it is of opinion that the matter may be deferred and reintroduced next year as an application for sectional treatment of a definite extent spread over a series of years.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E., seconded the amendment.
Mr. C. E. de Vos, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe, and the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar supported the amendment.

Mr. D. I. Durham replied.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That this Council desires to place on record its great appreciation of the services of the Medical Officer of Health and the Ward Inspectors, in combating the recent outbreak of smallpox in Galle, and preventing it from spreading outside the limits of the locality in which it originated. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M. B. E., and Mr. D. W. Subasinghe supported the motion.
Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved as an amendment, that, after the words "Ins

"and the Medical Officer who was in charge of the Infectious Diseases Hospital."

The mover accepted the amendment.

The motion as amended was put to the Meeting and carried unanimously.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved—(1) That the Public Works Department be requested to pay more consideration to the maintenance and upkeep of the trunk road through the town of Galle in keeping with modern conditions and suitable to meet the heavy through traffic on this road.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E. seconded, and referred to the defective drainage along the Kaluwella portion of the road, between the Kaluwella market and the Jail.

The Provincail Engineer stated that there had been a shortage of road metal owing to the extra requirements for widening the Mahamodera section of the road. He assured the Council that the matter was having his personal attention, and that the work would be finished in about 6 weeks. The tarring was nearly finished.

The mover expressed his satisfaction, and with the leave of Council withdrew the motion.

(2.) That a Special Committee be appointed to report on the sufficiency or otherwise of the salaries of the clerical staff and Sanitary Inspectors of this Council, and if insufficient to submit a revised scheme of salaries more in keeping with the increased cost of living. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.

The following were elected to form the Special Committee :-Mr. C. E. de Vos, Mr. J. E. Perera, and Mr. C. L.

Wickramasinghe.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M. B. E. moved—(i.) With reference to the answers to my questions at the Meeting held on the 21st ultimo, that the vouchers for the clearing of Keppu-ela in 1925 and 1926, with the diaries of the Superintendent of Works and his Assistant making reference to their work, be tabled. The motion was complied with.

(ii.) That the matter of improving the esplanade be brought up and considered and directions given to carry out

the work.

With the permission of Council the mover added the following to his motion:—" And that the sum of Rs. 1,000 voted be applied for that purpose.'

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.—Carried.

The work to be carried out by the Superintendent of Works.

To consider the report of the Special Committee appointed on April 24, 1926, to revise the time table for the distribution of water at night—Resolved that the report be adopted.

8. To consider the report of the Special Committee appointed on April 24, 1926, to examine the questions incidental to the Electric Lighting Scheme, and matters which may be referred to them from time to time by the Council.

Resolved that Council do go into Committee to consider the report. Council in Committee recommended (1) that the offer of the Director of Public Works to run (a) a restricted scheme, from October 1, 1926, at an approximate cost of Rs. 450 per mensem; (b) the scheme proper, for the first six months under P. W. D. supervision at an approximate monthly cost of Rs. 2,070.06 be accepted.

(2) That the office of clerk of the Electricity Department with a salary of Rs. 540 to Rs. 1,000 per annum with annual

increments of Rs. 36 be created.

(3) The building of a store and office for the Superintendent on a site close to the power house.
(4) That the power house be connected to the telephone exchange.

(5) That liquid fuel be procured locally, at current rates, and lubricating oil from the Campbell Gas Engine Co., x. That a vote of Rs. 2,000 be taken for 800 gallons oil to be ordered at once.

. Halifax.

- (6) That, to encourage probable consumers to connect up with the supply mains at an early date, free services, up to Rs. 30 be given on installations of not less than five lights, up to the end of the first six months after the completion of the scheme.
- (7) That pending the installation of meters, current for lighting only may be supplied at the temporary flat rates recommended by the Special Committee.

(8) That all trees overhanging the electric mains be cut down, compensation, if claimed, being paid to the owners

without prejudice to existing rights.

The Chairman moved that the Council do resume, and that the recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M. B. E. seconded.—Carried.
