### A PROCLAMATION.

HUGH CLIFFORD.

WHEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road which the railway may cross to be a "Minor Crossing" and whether such "Minor Crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare a certain portion of a road which the railway crosses to be a "Minor Crossing" for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and that such "Minor Crossing" be closed by gates:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby declare that the portion of the road which the Ceylon Government Railway crosses between the stations of Waga and Kosgama in the Western Province, which is set out in the schedule hereto, shall, from October 22, 1926, be a "Minor Crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance, and that such "Minor Crossing" be closed by gates.

*Toddy Taverns.*—Toddy taverns shall remain open between the hours of 8 A.M. and 6.30 P.M., and shall be kept closed at all other hours, provided that the Government Agent may after consulting the Advisory Committee restrict the hours during which any particular tavern shall remain open by fixing a later hour of opening, an earlier hour of closing, or by directing that the tavern shall be kept closed for certain hours between the opening and the closing hour. The Government Agent may, after consulting the Advisory Committee, fix the opening hour of toddy taverns as early as 7 A.M., where local circumstances are found to require it, and may, in towns, and, for special reasons, outside towns, extend the hour of closing any tavern therein situated to such hour as he may fix, not being later than the closing hour of arrack taverns in the same area, and shall enter such hours of opening and closing in the licence. ## BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. *Definitions.*—In these by-laws—

The terms "boy," "girl," and "child" mean respectively a boy or a girl or a child residing in the area described in the Schedule A hereto.

The term "parent" includes a guardian and any person who has legal or actual custody of a child.

The term "Code" means the Code for assisted schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an attendance register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "local authority" means the Kalutara Urban Education District Committee.

The term "School" means an elementary school recognized as such by the Director of Education and shall include the schools specified in Schedule B hereto.

The terms "adequate and suitable provisions for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the same meaning as in sub-sections (2) and (3) of section 25 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

The term "Inspector of Schools" means an Inspector or Inspectress of Schools appointed by Government, and includes an Assistant Inspector.

2. *Children bound to Attend School.*—The parent of every boy not less than 6 years old and not more than 14 years old and of every girl not less than 6 years and not more than 12 years old shall cause such boy or girl to attend school, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. In the case of Muslim children, a parent shall cause boys and girls not less than 8 years old and not more than 12 and 10 years old respectively to attend school. Provided that no boy under 8 and no girl shall be compelled to attend a school more than  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile distant from his or her residence and no boy over 8 shall be compelled to attend a school more than 2 miles distant from his residence.

3. *Time of Attendance.*—The time during which every boy or girl shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be opened for the instruction of children of similar age.

4. *Religion.*—Provided always that nothing in these by-laws (a) shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the hours when religious instruction is given as provided by sub-section (1) of section 15 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

(b) Shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which the child's parents belong.

5. And provided always that when a boy between 12 and 14 years of age and a girl between 10 and 12 years of age being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Urban Education District Committee of Kalutara has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he has passed the examination prescribed by the Code for the 4th Standard, he shall not be required to attend school.

6. Every parent who shall fail to provide the information necessary for the working of these by-laws or who shall not observe or shall neglect or violate these by-laws or any of them shall upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for each offence for the first offence and an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day in the case of a continuing offence. No parent shall be prosecuted unless his child is absent over one-fifth of the number of days during which the school shall be open that month.

7. No school shall be kept open for the purpose of giving instruction to pupils for more than six hours a day including intervals for meals, &c.

8. The hour at which school work should commence may be left to the discretion of the Manager, but no school should open earlier than 8 A.M., or later than 10 A.M. Provided that in the case of an Infant Department the hour of opening may be extended to 11 A.M.

9. No school, except with the permission of the Inspector of Schools, shall be kept open for regular school work on more than 5 days a week or less than 180 days a year.

*Note.*—The following are the portions of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920 referred to in the by-laws:—

*Section 25 (2).*—A parent shall be deemed to have made adequate and suitable provision for the education of his child:—

- (a) If he proves that his child is in regular attendance at an elementary school or at a school certified by the Director to provide adequate and suitable education; or
- (b) If he proves that he has made such other provision for his child's education as the Director or some officer of the Department authorized by him shall certify to be adequate and suitable; or
- (c) If he produces a certificate from the Director or some officer of the Department authorized by him recommending that the child shall be exempted from compulsory attendance.

*Section 25 (3)*—

- (a) No parent shall be convicted for not causing his child to attend school, if he proves to the satisfaction of the court that he had reasonable cause for not causing such child to attend.
- (b) A parent shall be deemed to have a reasonable excuse for not causing his child to attend school, if he proves that the child is prevented from attending by sickness or other unavoidable cause.

*Section 13.*—No applicant shall be refused admission into any assisted school on account of the religion, nationality, race, caste, or language of such applicant or of either of his parents.

*Section 14.*—Religious teaching shall not form part of the instruction to be given at any Government school, whether secondary or elementary, by any teacher; but any minister or teacher of religion authorized by the Director by writing under his hand may give religious instruction to the children of the religious denomination to which the minister belongs at such times and places as may be agreed upon between him and the Director.

*Section 15.*—(1) It shall not be required as a condition of any child being admitted into or continuing in an assisted school that he shall attend or abstain from attending any Sunday School or any place of religious worship, or that he shall attend any religious observance or any instruction in religious subjects in the school or elsewhere, from which observance or instruction he may be withdrawn by his parent or guardian, or that he shall attend the school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which the parent belongs.

(2) The time during which any religious observance is practised or religious instruction is given at any meeting of an assisted school shall be either at the beginning or the end, or at the beginning and the end of such meeting, and shall be inserted in a time table to be approved by the Director, and to be kept permanently and conspicuously affixed in every schoolroom, and any scholar may be withdrawn by his parent or guardian from such observance or instruction without forfeiting any of the other benefits of the school.

*Section 25, Sub-section (1) (a) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.*

1. The Committee shall meet at least once in every two months.
2. At least three days' notice shall be given to members of the Committee of its meeting.
3. The Chairman shall preserve order and shall decide on all points of order.
4. In the absence of the Chairman from any meeting the members of the meeting present shall elect their Chairman.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 16, 1926.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 200 (5 Europeans, 16 Burghers, 127 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 18 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1926, viz., 258,905) was 40·3, as against 34·0 in the preceding week, 31·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·9 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 147 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 85 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 16 Moors, 6 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·6, as in the previous week, against 26·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 147 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 21.

**Principal Causes of Deaths.**—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South and 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 11 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), and Maradana North, as against 1 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana East, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 16 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), as against 5, in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twelve deaths each were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, and *Debility*, 8 from *Dysentery*, 4 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 3 from *Enteritis*, 2 from *Worms*, and 60 from *Other Causes*.

5. Twenty-two cases of *Chickenpox*, 4 of *Measles*, 2 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Smallpox* were reported during the week, as against 9, 2, 7 and nil, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported either this week or in the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of-air was 81·9°, against 81·3° in the preceding week, and 81·4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·794 in., against 29·822 in., in the preceding week, and 29·877 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 5·04, in., against 3·65 in., in the preceding week, and 2·09 in., in the corresponding week of the previous year.

An Improved Automobile-brancard.

*Abstract.*—A foot plate resting on the floor of the car carries the supporting column. A hinge plate on the back seat is attached to the screw spindle in the supporting column : the spindle is adapted to rotate in the horizontal plane and by means of a fulcrum, also in a vertical plane. To the spindle is attached a framework bearing channel irons acting as rails for the litter which is provided with small wheels at one end. Suitable springs and a locking device for the litter are provided.

The claims are :—

1. Automobile-brancard, comprising a framing with spring device for resiliently supporting a sick-litter or the like, the said framing being carried by a base or foot-piece.
2. Automobile-brancard according to claim 1, in which the base or foot-piece is vertically adjustable.
3. Automobile-brancard according to claim 1 or 2, in which the base or foot-piece is provided with lateral supporting-means, such as one or more lateral supporting-arms or shackles, which at one end, which may be provided with a supporting-plate, are adapted to rest on a seat or the coachwork of the automobile.
4. Automobile-brancard according to claim 1, in which the framing is tiltably connected to the base or foot-piece and rotatable about a vertical axis.
5. Automobile-brancard according to claim 1, in which the spring device is so constructed, that a sick-litter or the like, suspended therefrom, is resiliently supported horizontally as well as vertically, preferably at the four corners.
6. Automobile-brancard according to claim 1, in which the framing is detachably connected to the base or foot-piece.
7. Automobile-brancard substantially as described with reference to figures 1 to 3 or figures 4 and 5 of the accompanying drawings.

Improvements in or relating to apparatus for raising liquids.

*Abstract.*—An ascension conduit dips into the lower level liquid ; at its top a partial vacuum is maintained by external means and air is admitted near its bottom by a device having its opening just above the free liquid level. The aerated water is sucked up the conduit, loses its air at the top and falls into a second conduit leading to a free higher level. Owing to the aeration of the first column, the second column, although shorter, is heavier and a syphon action is maintained.

The claims are :—

1. Liquid raising apparatus comprising an ascension conduit which dips into the water or other liquid to be raised, and the upper end of which enters a closed chamber where a continuous suction or partial vacuum is maintained by external means, a device for introducing air at atmospheric pressure into the lower end of the ascension conduit ; and another or descending conduit, the lower end of which discharges into the reservoir up to which the liquid is to be lifted, and the upper end of which is in direct communication with the liquid in the suction chamber, substantially as described.
2. Liquid raising apparatus according to claim 1, wherein the air at atmospheric pressure is introduced into the ascension conduit at a point just above the level of the liquid to be raised, for the purpose specified.
3. Liquid raising apparatus in accordance with either of the preceding claims, wherein the device for introducing the air at atmospheric pressure into the ascension conduit is carried by a float supported by the liquid to be raised, for the purpose specified.
4. Liquid raising apparatus in accordance with claim 3, wherein the device for introducing air at atmospheric pressure into the ascension conduit comprises a bent pipe of which one end projects into the lower end of the ascension conduit and the other end is connected to the float and communicates with the atmosphere.
5. Liquid raising apparatus in accordance with any of the preceding claims, wherein the ascension conduit is in the form of a pipe arranged centrally within an outer pipe of larger diameter, the annular space between the two pipes constituting the descending conduit, substantially as described.
6. Liquid raising apparatus constructed and arranged substantially as hereinbefore described with reference to the accompanying drawing, for the purposes specified.

A combination knife.

*Abstract.*—A triangular piece of metal is attached at right angles to a shaft. One apex is bent over at an angle and sharpened to form a cutting or paring knife ; a second apex is bent over, the point is removed, and the metal bent to form a gouge ; the third apex is rounded and sharpened to form a scraper, and the two adjacent sides of the triangle are also sharpened.

The claims are :—

1. A combination gauging, cutting, paring, and scraping implement comprising a handle and shaft, provided at one end with a somewhat triangular-shaped head with two apices bent over and made sharp, so as to form a kind of cutter and transversely curved gauge, respectively, and the other apex rounded off but not bent over, but made sharp at the lower edge and along the sides and adopted to serve as a scraper and cutter, substantially as described for the purpose specified.
2. A combination gauging, cutting, paring, and scraping implement which is constructed substantially as hereinbefore described with reference to the accompanying drawings for the purpose specified.

An improved process and manufacture of dry fish or Maldive fish and for the preservation of same.

*Abstract.*—Fish is sliced and steamed or boiled for about five minutes; it is then dipped into or rubbed with fish blood and coated with cold vegetable ash. It is next baked over an oven with a double pan and is finally exposed to the sun for about three days.

The claims are :—

In improvements in the process and manufacture of dry fish from fresh sea fish, the boiling of same in steam or otherwise to a certain stage, which depends on the kind of fish used, substantially as described.

2. In improvements to the process and manufacture of dry fish from fresh sea fish, the use of the fresh fish blood applied on it and wrapped up with a coating of vegetable ash and baked in an oven, substantially as described.

3. In the process and manufacture of dry fish from fresh sea fish, the drying of the fish under the heat of the sun after it has been well baked in the oven preserves the fish for a long period and prevents putrefaction, substantially as and for the purpose specified.
