KNOW Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 38 of "The Co-operative Societies Ordinance, No. 34 of 1921," do hereby remit—

- (a) The stamp duty with which, under any law for the time being in force, instruments executed or on behalf of "The Poonewa Co-operative Society," "The Madawachchiya Co-operative Society," and "Polpitiya Co-operative Society," or by an officer or member of the said societies and relating to the business of the said societies, are chargeable as from November 29, 1926;
- (b) Any fee payable under the law of registration for the time being in force in respect of the instruments aforesaid, provided, however, that such exemption may be withdrawn under sub-section (2) of the said section.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 18, 1926.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 182 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 109 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1926, viz., 258,905) was 36.7, as against 33.8 in the preceding week, 25.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 144 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 87 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 18 Moors, 4 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.9, as against 24.8 in the previous week, 30.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 144 total deaths 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. Nineteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 7 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Wellawatta North, as against 11 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana North, as against 10 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 5 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric fever* was registered at Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), as against 3 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered at Maradana South, as against nil in the previous week, and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Eighteen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 13 from *Debility*, 9 from *Dysentery*, 6 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 1 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 49 from *Other Causes*.

6. One death of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, from *Dysentery*.

7. Fourteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 3 of *Enteric Fever*, 2 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 10, 3, 3, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.1°, against 80.5° in the preceding week, and 80.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.839 in., against 29.871 in. in the preceding week, and 29.929 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.40 in., against 0.44 in. in the preceding week, and 0.64 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

 - (f) To enter into any arrangement or agreement with Government, or any authorities and obtain rights, concessions, and privileges.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF NUGATALAWA TEA COMPANY, LIMITED.

1. 5. The following new regulations shall be added after Regulation 46 of Table "C", namely :—

- (46a) A Director may with the consent of his co-directors be absent from the meetings of the Directors for such period or periods as he shall think fit.
- (46b) Each Director shall have the power with the consent of the majority of the Directors to appoint in writing any person whether a Shareholder of the Company or not to act as a Deputy Director in his place during his absence or inability to act as Director and at his discretion to remove such Deputy Director.

- (46f) The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered Company being the Secretaries being signified by a partner, or duly authorized Manager, Director, Secretary, Attorney, or Agent of the said firm or Company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or Company as such Secretaries.

- (64b) The Directors may, if they shall think fit, declare from time to time such interim dividends as in their opinion the position of the Company justifies.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, November 13, 1926, at 1.15 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated November 8, 1926.

Present :—Mr. L. W. C. Schrader, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E.; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe; Dr. E. P. Aserappa; and Mr. W. W. Morgan. Before the business of the day was taken up, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe called the attention of the Chairman to a report which had appeared in the issue of "The Ceylon Independent" of the 9th instant, to the effect that the names of twenty voters of the Kumbalwella division were struck off the list at the request of Mr. S. H. Dahanayake; and he asked the Chairman whether the report was correct.

The Chairman replied that the report was incorrect.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 9, 1926, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe asked the Chairman—(1) Is it the fact that of the engines installed for the generation of electricity only the small engine is functioning, and the two big ones are not worked? (2) (a) If so, since what day did the bigger engines cease to function, and what is the cause of their ceasing to work? (b) What is the delay in putting them into working order, and what steps have been taken to put them to right?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Yes; (2) (a) One engine broke a balance weight stud on October 4. On October 14 the other engine was stopped on receipt of instructions from makers, who wished to inspect; (b) The repairs have been carried out, and it is expected to run the engines on the completion of test.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe asked—(1) Why is a new house allowed to be built at Morris road, near the Hillside estate junction, along the road contrary to the settled policy of this Council which requires all houses to be built at least eight feet away from the road; (2) As this house when completed will create a dangerous blind corner, will the Chairman kindly stop its completion or take steps to prevent it being built on the present site?

The Chairman replied—(1) The building was put up without permission. The owner was prosecuted and fined. (2) A mandatory order for its demolition has been applied for.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked—(1) What is the delay in making the report and estimate for the Circular road drains asked for by me in July last? (2) Was a piece of land acquired in Talapitiya near the Kothuwa Palliya Cemetery for the purpose of constructing a public latrine. Why was the work delayed, will the Chairman take the necessary steps to have this latrine constructed without delay?

The Chairman replied—(1) The Provincial Engineer is of opinion that levels should be taken before any scheme for the drainage of Circular road could be formulated. The Superintendent of Works has not got the necessary instruments at present for taking levels. (2) No land has been acquired. The acquisition was delayed for want of funds. As the question has lain over for so long it is desirable that Council should decide afresh whether the latrine should be built in a residential quarter.

5. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. D. I. Durham:—"This Council suggests to the Public Works Department that the Campbell Engine Co., be asked to supply one of their own drivers for our electric light engines for a period of 2 or 3 months, during which time the engines would be under his control." With the permission of the Council, Mr. Durham amended it as follows:—"This Council inquires of the Director of Public Works whether it is not advisable to request the Campbell Engine Co., to supply one of their own drivers for the Galle electric light engines for a short period, during which time the engines would be under his control."

Mr. D. G. E. Goonewardene, M.B.E., seconded. Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe, and Mr. C. E. de Vos spoke to the motion. The Chairman and Mr. J. E. Perera spoke against the motion. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. E. de Vos moved:—"That it is desirable that a more suitable place should be found for the storage of dry-earth buckets than the one now in use in Hospital street." Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E., seconded. Mr. J. E. Perera supported the motion.

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved as an amendment:—"That night soil buckets be not stored inside the Fort, but be removed to the Municipal cart shed outside the Fort." Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded the amendment. The Chairman spoke against the amendment.

The mover withdrew his motion in favour of the amendment, which was put to the meeting and carried.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved:—"As the concession proposed to be granted to consumers of electric current of free services to the value of Rs. 30, favours only one section of the consumers, that the Special Committee appointed to consider electrical matters be requested to suggest a measure that all consumers might benefit equally from the concession." Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.—Carried.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved :—(1) That the estimate prepared by the Superintendent of Works of the probable cost of constructing the new proposed road from Kitulampitiya to Kumbalwella, be referred to the Provincial Engineer for the favour of examination and report. Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded.

Mr. W. W. Morgan remarked that it would be a waste of time for him to revise the estimate of the Superintendent of Works if that officer could not carry out the work at the revised rates.

The mover undertook to have a survey plan made, and with the permission of the Council, withdrew the motion.

(2) That the Superintendent of Works be requested to submit a scheme with an estimate of the probable cost for the removal—(i.) Of the dangerous blind corner where the Circular road meets Morris road ; and (ii.) of the dangerous bend in the Dangedera road near the spot where Mr. Ephraums met with an accident some time back. Mr. D. G. Goonewardene seconded.

The mover did not press the second part of the motion referring to the bend on Dangedera road.

The first part of the motion, referring to the blind corner on Morris road, was put to the meeting and carried.

9. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved :—(1) "That a licensed surveyor be employed to take levels along Circular road for the contemplated drains, if the Council does not possess the necessary instruments to have the work carried out by its officers." Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.

The Chairman suggested the clearing of the elas and deeping the outlet channels, in the first instance.

The mover agreed, and with the permission of the Council, withdrew the motion for the present.

(2) "That the Medical Officer of Health be given facilities regarding additional coolies whenever they are urgently required for carrying out efficient sanitation work and extending the dry-earth system in the town." Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded.—Carried.

10. Applications from the Asiatic Petroleum Co., to erect a petrol pump station on a site adjoining the Police Mortuary :—Mr. D. I. Durham, on behalf of the applicants, with the permission of the Council, withdrew the application for the present.

11. Abolition of the Poll Tax :—Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved that the Poll Tax be not collected in 1927, and that the offer of Government of a subsidy, as compensation in lieu of the revenue derived from the Poll Tax, be thankfully accepted. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

12. Maintenance of Hirimbura road between the Bazaar and the Galle-Baddegama road :—Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved that the Council is of opinion that at present no widening of the road is required ; and that Government be requested to take it over as it is. Mr. D. G. Goonewardene seconded.—Carried.

13. To consider an estimate of Rs. 3,000 for building an office and store for the Electricity Department.—Resolved (a) that the estimate of Rs. 3,000 be passed, and that tenders be invited for the erection of the building ; (b) that the Superintendent of Works be requested to select the site for the building, in consultation with the Provincial Engineer.

14. Contribution of a moiety of the cost of building a drain along the Colombo-Galle road, between the Kaluwella market and the Galle Jail. Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E. moved that a sum of Rs. 3,000 be voted. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

15. Estimate of the probable receipts and the proposed expenditure of the Municipality for the ensuing financial year.—Submitted.

16. Demolition of the refreshment stall standing on the site of the proposed new Law Courts.—Resolved that the materials of the building be sold as it stands.

17. To consider vouchers, amounting to Rs. 867.74, from the Assistant Electrical Engineer, on account labour, and materials used at the Power House, Galle, in connection with the restricted scheme of electric lighting during September and October.—Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved that the expenditure be paid, and that the Special Committee be asked to report on it. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Improvements in or relating to furnaces for supplying drying gases.

Abstract.—A vertical combustion chamber has its lower end closed by a fluid fuel burner. It is surrounded by an air jacket which communicates with the exhaust at the top. A blower injects air tangentially into the jacket and also by a bye pass into the burner. Means are provided for equalizing the pressure in the jacket and combustion chamber. The burner has a hollow rotatable shaft to the top of which is attached the oil discharge cup. The oil pipe is disposed inside the hollow shaft and terminates at the top in downwardly directed nozzles.

The claims are :—

1. A furnace for supplying high temperature drying gases comprising a combustion chamber, devices associated therewith for both indirectly and directly heating a gaseous medium (preferably air) supplied thereto, and means for supplying the medium to said device under pressure.
2. A furnace as claimed in claim 1, comprising a jacket surrounding the combustion chamber as the device for indirectly heating the drying gas, a common exhaust pipe leading from the chamber and jacket, and a damper or the like for at will directing the exhaust either to the outer air or to a drying apparatus.
3. A furnace as claimed in claim 1 or 2, comprising means for equalizing pressure in the jacket and combustion chamber.
4. A furnace as claimed in claim 1, 2, or 3, in which the device for directly heating the drying gas consists of a fluid fuel burner at the end of the combustion chamber opposite the exhaust passage.
5. A furnace as claimed in claim 3 or 4, comprising means for equalizing pressure in the combustion chamber and jacket by supplying air from the air supply means to the burner as well as to the jacket.
6. A furnace as claimed in claim 5, comprising regulators for controlling the supply of air from the air supply means to the burner, and from the jacket to the combustion chamber.
7. A furnace as claimed in any of claims 2-6, in which the air supply means consists of a pressure blower connected by a conduit tangentially to the jacket.
8. A furnace as claimed in claim 7, in which the tangential conduit for air under pressure is connected to the jacket at the end adjacent the burner.
9. A furnace for supplying high temperature drying gases comprising a vertical combustion chamber, an air heating chamber surrounding the same, means for supplying air under pressure to the air heating chamber, a common exhaust pipe communicating with the air heating chamber and combustion chamber, a branch leading from said pipe to the atmosphere, and a damper for at will directing the exhaust either to said branch pipe or to a drying apparatus.
10. In a furnace as claimed in any of claims 1-9, an oil burner comprising an air nozzle, an oil discharge cup disposed within said nozzle, a hollow rotatable shaft on which said oil cup is mounted, an oil discharge pipe extending upwardly into said cup and terminating in a downwardly directed discharge nozzle, and a sleeve surrounding said oil pipe and secured to the bottom of the oil cup.
11. In a furnace as claimed in any of claims 1-9, an oil burner comprising an air discharge nozzle, means for imparting a whirling movement to the air inside said nozzle an oil discharge cup centrally disposed in the nozzle, a hollow rotatable shaft secured to said cup, an oil pipe extending upwardly within said shaft and cup and terminating in downwardly directed symmetrically disposed nozzles, and a sleeve surrounding and spaced from the oil pipe and connected to the bottom of the oil cup.
12. The furnace for supplying high temperature drying gases as herein described and as illustrated in the accompanying drawings.

" Air-heater."

Abstract.—Hot gases from the furnace pass up vertical heating tubes behind the rear end, into a header from which they descend through a second group of tubes into a smoke box over the rear end, and escape through a chimney near the front of the furnace. Air is sucked by a fan through holes in the front wall of the casing surrounding the tubes and is, suitably deflected by baffle plates. Between the smoke box and the furnace is a space with doors which can be opened, so as to supply secondary air to the part of the casing surrounding the rear group of tubes, to prevent burning of the plates, and to allow of regulation of the temperature of the heated air.

The claims are :—

1. Air-heater comprising an underlying furnace and vertical heating tubes, which tubes are divided into two groups one group communicating at the lower side with the firing space and the other group with a smoke box to which chimney is connected, the said groups entering at the upper side into a common header or connecting casing, while the air to be heated is constrained to flow around the tubes, characterised by the fact that secondary air is adapted to enter into the jacket surrounding the tubes at the place where the heated air is discharged from the air-heater.

2. Air-heater according to claim 1, characterised by the fact that the space above the grate of the furnace is closed by fire-arch-plates and that between these fire-arch-plates and the bottom of the air-heater there is an open space, communicating at one side through controllable openings in the front plate of the furnace with the atmosphere and at the other side through one or more passages with the space within the jacket of the air-heater at the place where the heated air is discharged.

3. Air-heater according to claim 1 or 2 characterised by the fact that in the jacket of the air-heater at the place where the heated air is discharged controllable openings are provided through which cold air may be directly sucked in.

4. Air-heater of the type referred to substantially as described and as illustrated in fig. 1-4 of the accompanying drawings.
