MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend the Law relating to Indian Labourers.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Indian Labour Ordinance, No. of 1926, and shall be read and construed as one with Ordinance No. 11 of 1865, Ordinance No. 13 of 1889, and the Labour Ordinance, No. 1 of 1923.

CHAPTER I.

Standard Wages.

Interpretation.

- 2 (1) In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Standard rates of wages" means the rates proper in cash or kind for an able-bodied unskilled male labourer above the age of sixteen years, for an able-bodied unskilled female labourer above the age of fifteen years, or for an able-bodied child of either sex for time work or for piece work;

"Labourer" means a labourer as defined by section 3 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889;

Employer includes any person who enters into an agreement with any labourer and the duly authorized agent or manager of such person;

"Controller" means the Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour.

(2) Should any question arise as to whether a labourer is able-bodied or not, it shall be determined by the Controller, and such determination shall be final.

3 No labourer shall be bound to work at piece work without his consent.

4 No employer shall knowingly employ for work on estates any child below the age of ten years, or knowingly permit such child to be employed.

5 (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor by notification in the Gazette to appoint for any revenue district a Wages Board composed of any number of members, not less than three and not exceeding five, none of whom shall be members of the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour.

(2) Each such appointment shall be for a period not exceeding three years.

(3) Any member shall be eligible for reappointment.

(4) Any member who leaves Ceylon for a period exceeding six months shall *ipso facto* cease to be a member. Any member who is absent on three consecutive occasions from meetings of a Wages Board shall *ipso facto* cease to be a member.

(5) Any member may resign by notice in writing given to the Colonial Secretary.

(6) The members of each Wages Board shall elect annually one of their number to be Chairman for the period ending on the next following 31st day of December. But if the members of any Wages Board at any time fail to appoint a Chairman within a reasonable time, the appointment may be made by the Governor.

In the absence of the Chairman from a meeting of a Wages Board, the members present may elect one of their number to act as Chairman,

Labourer not bound to work at piece work. Child labour.

Appointment of Wages Board.

- (7) At a meeting of any Wages Board the Chairman of such meeting shall be entitled to vote, and in case of equality of votes shall have a second or casting vote.
- (8) At any Wages Board meeting, three members shall be a quorum.
- 6 (1) The Governor may, if he thinks it expedient, establish one Wages Board for two or more revenue districts, and thereupon such Board shall be the Wages Board for the combined revenue districts, or the Governor may establish a Wages Board for portions of one, two, or more revenue districts, and thereupon such Board shall be the Wages Board for the area so combined.
- (2) The Governor may from time to time alter the boundaries of the area over which any Wages Board has jurisdiction.
- (3) For the purpose of this chapter, an estate shall be deemed to be subject to the jurisdiction of that Wages Board within whose area the whole of the estate is situated, or within whose area is that part of the estate where the person resident on and in chief control of the labourers working on the estate has his estate office or other place of management.
- 7 (1) Subject to the provisions of this chapter, each Wages Board shall, from time to time as occasion may require, fix standard rates of wages for time work performed on estates within its jurisdiction, and may also, if it thinks fit, and shall, when so required by the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour, fix standard rates of wages for piece work performed on such estates.
- (2) A Wages Board may, if it thinks fit, fix different standard rates for labourers working in different localities within its jurisdiction, and may fix different rates for different classes of labourers.
- (3) A Wages Board may cancel or vary from time to time any standard rates of wages fixed by it under this chapter and, with the consent of the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour, may cancel or vary from time to time any standard rate of wages fixed by the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour under this chapter.
- (4) The Chairman of a Wages Board shall inform the Chairman of the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour of each decision of the Wages Board fixing, cancelling, or varying a standard rate of wages, and the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour may confirm, vary, or cancel every such decision.
- 8 (1) If the Wages Board fails to fix any standard rates of wages for time work or piece work within two months after being required so to do by the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour, it shall be lawful for the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour to fix such rates.
- (2) The Board of Indian Immigrant Labour may from time to time of its own motion cancel or vary any standard rate of wages fixed by a Wages Board or by itself under this chapter.
- 9 (1) A standard rate of wages or a cancellation or variation of a standard rate of wages shall not take effect until it has been approved by the Governor in Executive Council and published in the Gazette, but when so published shall be binding on all employers, and shall take effect from a date (being not less than one month from the date of publication) to be fixed by the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour and to be published in the Gazette:
- (2) A notification in the Gazette to the effect that any standard rate of wages has been fixed, varied, or cancelled under this chapter shall be judicially noted, and shall be conclusive proof of the fact and of the date on which the standard rate of wages or variation or cancellation takes effect.
- 10 (1) Any person who employs or pays a labourer to whom a standard rate of wages fixed under this chapter is applicable at a rate of wages less favourable to the labourer than the standard rate shall on summary conviction by a Police Magistrate be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees for each offence.

Extent of jurisdiction of Wages Board.

Wages Board to fix standard rates of wages.

Powers of the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour over standard rates.

Approval of rates by Governor in Executive Council, and publication in Gazette.

Penalty for failure to pay standard rates. (2) In any proceedings under this section, it shall lie on the defendant to prove that the rate of wages at which any labourer was employed or paid was not less favourable to the labourer than the standard rate applicable to that labourer.

Inspection of records.

- 11 (1) For the purpose of administering this chapter, the Controller shall have power at all reasonable times, with or without notice, to enter upon any premises on which labourers work and to inspect all records connected with the engagement, registration, payment, and discharge of such labourers (including any forms III. in Schedule C to Ordinance No. 13 of 1889), and to make all such inquiries as may be necessary to ascertain the rates at which wages have been paid to such labourers.
- (2) It shall be the duty of every employer to have and keep at an office on the estate every form III. in Schedule C to Ordinance No. 13 of 1889 delivered to him by a labourer and also proper records of the wages paid to labourers, and any employer who fails to do so, or, when requested so to do by the Controller, fails to produce any such form or records or to answer any question relating to any such form or records or to the wages paid by the employer, shall on summary conviction by a Police Magistrate be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees.
- (3) Any agent appointed under section 8 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1923 and any officer authorized by him in writing shall have the same powers of inspection and making inquiries as are conferred on the Controller by this section.
- 12 No prosecution under this chapter shall be instituted except by or with the written consent of the Controller.
- 13 In each of the two immediately preceding sections, "Controller" includes any officer of his department of or above the rank of inspector who is generally or specially authorized in writing by the Controller to act for the purposes of such section.
- 14 If any person contravenes any provision of this chapter, then, if no other penalty is imposed by the chapter, he shall, on summary conviction by a Police Magistrate, be liable for each offence to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees.

Sanction of Controller to prosecutions. Meaning of "Controller" in sections 11 and 12.

CHAPTER II.

Amendments of Ordinance No. 11 of 1865 and Ordinance No. 13 of 1889.

Wages to be paid not later than tenth day of each month.

- 15 (1) Sub-section (1) of section 6 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889 is hereby amended so as to read as follows, viz.:
 - 6 (1) It shall be the duty of every employer to pay all wages agreed upon or earned by the labourers in his employment in any month on or before the tenth day of the following month.
- (2) Sub-section (5) of section 6 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889 is amended by the deletion of paragraph (b), and shall hereafter read as follows, viz.:
 - (5) The wages of a labourer shall not be deemed to have been duly paid as required by this section unless the full amount thereof, subject only to the deductions allowed by sub-section (4), has been paid directly to the labourer himself.
- (3) In sub-section (1) of section 21 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889, the words "Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour" shall be substituted for the words "Government Agent of the Province."
- (4) Sub-section (2) of the said section 21 is hereby amended so as to read as follows, viz.:
 - (2) Every such declaration shall be forwarded so as to reach the Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour not later than the fifteenth day of the month following the month on which such wages were earned.

- 16 The following shall be substituted for section 16 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889, viz.:
 - 16 The Governor may, by Notification published in the Gazette, specify what returns regarding the numbers and conditions of labourers shall be made by employers, periodically or otherwise, and to what public officer such returns shall be made. It shall be the duty of every employer to comply with the provisions of such Notification.

17 The following shall be substituted for section 24 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889, viz.:

- 24 (1) The Emigration Commissioner or other officer authorized by the Governor shall, when a labourer leaves Mandapam Camp for Ceylon, fill in the "Personal Particulars" and "Immigration Certificate" on Form III. in Schedule C, and send the form to the labourer's employer in Ceylon, who shall preserve the form until the labourer returns to India or is discharged.
- (2) Whenever a labourer desires to return to India, his employer shall cause to be filled in the "Identification Certificate" and also, if they have not been previously filled in, the "Personal Particulars" on Form III. in Schedule C, and shall deliver the form to the labourer.
- (3) Whenever a labourer quits the service of an employer, having given or received the notice or warning required by law, the employer shall cause to be filled in the "Discharge Certificate" and also, if they have not been previously filled in, the "Personal Particulars" on Form III. in Schedule C, and shall deliver the form to the labourer.
- (4) An employer who refuses or neglects to comply with any of the provisions of this section shall on conviction by a Police Magistrate be liable for each offence to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.
- 18 The following shall be substituted for section 30 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889, viz.:
 - 30 The Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour or any officer generally or specially authorized by him in writing may institute proceedings in respect of any offence against Ordinances No. 11 of 1865, No. 1 of 1923, or this Ordinance.
- 19 The following forms shall be substituted for Forms II. and III. in Schedule C to Ordinance No. 13 of 1889, viz.:

Repeals.

20 (1) Section 22 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1865 is hereby repealed.

(2) In sub-section (1) of section 22 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889 the following words shall be repealed, viz.:

Every employer shall, within three months from the commencement of this Ordinance, forward to the Government Agent of the Province a copy of such register certified under his hand to be correct. Any employer who fails to forward a copy of the register certified as aforesaid within the appointed time shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine which may extend to twenty rupees, and to a further fine not exceeding five rupees for every day during which such default shall continue.

- (3) Sections 16, 18, 19, and 25 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889 and Schedule B to that Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- (4) Forms IV. and V. in Schedule C to Ordinance No. 13 of 1889 are hereby repealed.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

This Ordinance has been drafted in conformity with the views of the Government of India.

- 2. Chapter I. of the Ordinance makes provision for the introduction of standard rates of wages for Indian labourers.
- 3. A Wages Board will be appointed by the Governor for each district consisting of not less than three or more than five members.
- 4. It will be the duty of each Wages Board to fix the standard rate of wages for labourers doing time work on estates within its district. A Board may, also, and, if required by the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour, is bound to, fix standard rates for piece work. Different rates may be fixed for different estates and for different classes of labourers.
- 5. If a Wages Board fails to fix standard rates of wages within two months after being required to do so by the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour, the latter Board may itself fix such rates.
- 6. Rates of wages fixed by a Wages Board may be varied or cancelled by the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour.
- 7. A standard rate of wages will not be effective until it has been approved by the Governor in Executive Council and published in the Gazette. It will take effect from a date (not less than one month after publication) to be fixed by the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour.
- 8. An employer who employs or pays a labourer at less than the standard rate will be liable to a fine of five hundred rupees for each offence.
- 9. No prosecution for an offence in connection with a standard rate of wages may be instituted except by or with the consent of the Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour or an authorized officer of his department.
- 10. Chapter II. affects various other amendments to Ordinance No. 11 of 1865 and Ordinance No. 13 of 1889.
- 11. The effect of section 15 is that for the future wages must be paid not later than the tenth day of each month.
- 12. Sections 16 and 17 introduce a new and simplified system of labour registration forms.
- 13. Section 22 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1865, which provides for the punishment of kanganies or other agents fraudulently disposing of advances, is repealed, the offence being adequately dealt with by the Ceylon Penal Code.

> An Ordinance to amend the Rubber Restriction Ordinance, No. 24 of 1922.

> E it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

This Ordinance may be cited as the Rubber Restriction of 1926. Ordinance, No.

Amendment of section 5 of the principal Ordinance.

- 2 (1) In sub-section (2) of section 5 of the principal Ordinance, the word "eight" shall be substituted for the word "seven."
- (2) The following shall be added at the end of paragraph (b) of sub-section (3) of section 5 of the principal Ordinance,

Provided that the Controller, if a member of the Board, shall not take any part in the hearing or decision of any appeal to the Board.

Amendment of section 14 and schedule of the principal Ordinance.

- 3 (1) In sub-section (2) of section 14 of the principal Ordinance, the words and figures "export duties on rubber of Re. 1.50 per 100 lb. and Rs. 2.50 per 100 lb." shall be substituted for the words "export duty on rubber."
- (2) In paragraph 1 of the schedule to the principal Ordinance, the words and figure "per lb. 4" shall be substituted for the words and figures "per lb. $2\frac{1}{2}$."
- (3) The following shall be added at the end of paragraph 1 of the schedule to the principal Ordinance, viz.:

Provided that a duty of 2½ cents per lb. only shall be leviable on rubber held by shippers otherwise than in their capacity as owners of estates or estate agents as at the lst day of July, 1926, and paid for on or before that date.

- (4) In Example (a) in paragraph 2 of the schedule to the principal Ordinance, the words and figure "the duty of 4 cents per pound "shall be substituted for the words and figures the duty of $2\frac{1}{2}$ cents per pound."
- 4 The following new section shall be added after section 28
 - of the principal Ordinance, viz.: All rules made by the Governor in Executive Council

under section 20 or section 28 shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be laid before the Legislative Council, and may, at any of the next following three meetings, be rescinded by resolution of the Legislative Council, but without prejudice to anything already done thereunder, and if not so rescinded shall be deemed to be valid.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

Section 2 (1) of this Ordinance increases the number of members of the Rubber Restriction Board from seven to eight in consequence of the recommendation contained in paragraph XII. of the report of the Select Committee on Rubber Restriction (Sessional Paper XIV.—1925). These members are in addition to the President and Vice-President.

Rules to be laid before $\mathbf{Legislative}$ Council.

- 2. Section 2 (2) gives effect to the recommendation contained in paragraph XII. of the report of the Select Committee that the Controller shall not take part in the hearing or decision of any appeal to the Board.
- 3. Section 3 will enable the additional export duty on rubber of Re. 1·50 per 100 lb. imposed by the resolution of Legislative Council of July 21, 1926, to be assessed by the Rubber Controller. At present the Rubber Controller can only assess the original duty of Rs. 2·50 per 100 lb., the new duty being assessed by the Customs authorities. It is obviously more convenient for all parties that the whole duty should be assessed by the Rubber Controller and certified by him on the export licence.
- 4. Section 4 gives effect to paragraph X. of the report by requiring all rules made under the Rubber Restriction Ordinance to be laid on the table of the Legislative Council.
