**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1926.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The number of marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 346 (298 General, 3 Kandyan, and 45 Muslim), as against 348 in the preceding month and 336 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 137 (102 General and 35 Muslim), as against 127 in the preceding month and 119 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,845 (956 males and 889 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 35·62 per 1,000 of the population, as against 32·19 in the previous month, 29·59 in the corresponding month of last year, and 28·70 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The rate ranged from 13·18 in Nawalapitiya to 65·23 in Kalmunai. There were 1,701 births of children, whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 32·84, as against 29·80 in the preceding month.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 631 (328 males and 303 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 29·65, as against 29·11 in the preceding month, 25·37 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·16 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 11·11 in Kollupitiya to 25·54 in Slave Island. There were 562 births of children, whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 26·41, as against 25·79 in the preceding month.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,630 (906 males and 724 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 31·47, as against 34·82 in the preceding month. There were 1,235 deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 25·79, as against 28·73 in the preceding month, 24·18 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·02 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The standardized death-rate ranged from 110·28 in Hatton-Dikoya to 12·11 in Tangalla.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 549 (312 males and 237 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 25·80, as against 30·65 in the preceding month. There were 429 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 23·21, as against 28·91 in the preceding month, 27·41 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·23 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. The death-rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 21·28 in Slave Island to 4·99 in San Sebastian.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 136 (73 males and 63 females), as against 113 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 351 and corresponded to a rate of 202 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended September, 1926. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 190, as against 244 in the preceding month, 210 in the corresponding month of last year, and 222 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. There were 325 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 191, as against 244 in the preceding month.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 112, and corresponded to a rate of 176 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended September, 1926. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 178, as against 253 in the preceding month, 213 in the corresponding month of last year, and 221 the average for the corresponding months since 1916. There were 103 deaths of children under one year, whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 183, as against 256 in the preceding month.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 13 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Convulsions* caused 7 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year) and *Phthisis*, each 6 per cent.; *Enteritis* and *Diarrhoea*, each 5 per cent.; *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Dysentery*, and *Anchylostomiasis*, each 4 per cent.; *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, 3 per cent.; *Prematurity*, *Bronchitis*, *Enteric Fever*, *Influenza*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, each 2 per cent.

11. In Colombo too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 11 per cent. of the total deaths. *Phthisis* caused 8 per cent.; *Convulsions*, 7 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year) and *Enteritis*, each 5 per cent.; *Diarrhoea*, *Influenza*, and *Bronchitis*, each 4 per cent.; *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* and *Dysentery*, each 3 per cent.; *Enteric Fever*, *Prematurity*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia* and *Anchylostomiasis*, each 2 per cent.; *Tetanus*, *Cancer*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, each 1 per cent.

12. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 102 cases were reported (83 in Colombo, 7 in Galle); *Enteric Fever* followed with 72 (29 in Colombo, 16 in Galle); *Chicken-pox* 58 (40 in Colombo, 11 in Jaffna); *Measles* 39 (34 in Colombo); *Continued Fever* 33 (26 in Colombo); *Dysentery* 29 (10 in Panadura, 9 in Moratuwa); *Smallpox* 7 (in Colombo); *Mumps* 5 (3 in Colombo, 2 in Matale); *Diphtheria* 3 (in Colombo); *Whooping Cough* 3 (2 in Kalutara, 1 in Colombo).

Meteorology.

13. *Rainfall.*—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (31·02 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 17·98 in. in Ratnapura to 1·19 in. in Kalmunai. Colombo recorded 9·43 in.

14. *Mean Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 84·8° in Mannar and Trincomalee to 61·2° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 81·6° in Colombo.
