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DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to provide for the Establishment of a Tea Research Institute and for the Incorporation of the Board of Management thereof.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Tea Research Ordinance, 1925.

Short title.

2 An institute, styled "The Tea Research Institute of Ceylon," shall be established in Ceylon for the purpose of research into and investigation of all problems and matters relating to tea and the provision of information relating to the same.

Establishment of Tea Research Institute.

3 (1) The institute shall be under the control and management of a Board to be styled "The Board of the Tea Research Institute of Ceylon," in this Ordinance called the Board.

Incorporation of Board.

(2) The Board shall be a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seal and may sue and be sued in all courts by the name of "The Board of the Tea Research Institute of Ceylon."

(3) The Board may acquire and hold property, movable and immovable, and may sell, transfer, lease, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of the same, contract and do all things necessary for or incidental to the purposes of its constitution.

4 The headquarters of the Board shall be in the Victoria Commemoration Buildings, Kandy.

Headquarters of the Board.

Constitution of the Board.	<p>5 (1) The following persons shall be members of the Board :—</p> <p>(a) Ex-officio Members— The Director of Agriculture. The Colonial Treasurer, or nominee. The Chairman of the Planters' Association of Ceylon. The Chairman of the Ceylon Estates Proprietary Association.</p> <p>(b) Nominated members— Three members nominated by the General Committee of the Planters' Association of Ceylon. Three members nominated by the Ceylon Estates Proprietary Association. One member nominated by the Low-country Products Association of Ceylon.</p> <p>(2) Nominated members shall hold office for three years, but may be renominated from time to time.</p>
Vacation of membership through absence.	<p>6 Any member nominated under section 5 (1) (b) who is absent without reasonable cause from three ordinary consecutive meetings of the Board may, by resolution of the Board passed at any ordinary meeting of which notice has been duly given, be held to have vacated his office.</p>
Death or resignation of member.	<p>7 Upon the death, resignation, or the termination or vacation of office of any member of the Board, a new member may be nominated in accordance with the provisions of section 5.</p>
Acting appointments.	<p>8 If any nominated member shall be unable or unwilling to act or shall be absent from Ceylon, the body which nominated him may appoint any other person to be a nominated member during the inability or unwillingness of such first mentioned member to act or during his absence from Ceylon.</p>
Chairman.	<p>9 (1) The Board shall elect its own chairman. (2) In the absence of the Chairman from any meeting of the Board, a chairman for such meeting shall be chosen by the members present.</p>
Meetings and quorum.	<p>10 (1) The Chairman shall at any time summon a meeting upon receipt of a requisition signed by two members of the Board calling upon him to do so. (2) Five members shall form a quorum. All questions shall be decided by a majority of members voting. In the case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote. Matters may be decided by the circulation of papers on which members of the Board may record their votes.</p>
Provision for annual income.	<p>11 In order to provide an annual income for the Board, there shall be charged, levied, and paid, in addition to the export duty charged under Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, an export duty of ten cents per one hundred pounds of tea exported and so in proportion for any less weight, the proceeds of which shall be paid over monthly to the Board by the Principal Collector of Customs, no part thereof being credited to general revenue.</p>
General powers.	<p>12 (1) The Board shall have full power and authority generally to govern, direct, and decide all matters connected with the appointment of officers of the institute and the administration of the affairs and the accomplishment of the objects and purposes thereof. (2) All moneys raised for the general purposes and objects of the institute shall be paid to the Board and shall be applied by the Board in its discretion to the accomplishment of such objects and purposes.</p>
Accounts.	<p>13 Within one month after each 31st December the Board shall cause to be prepared a statement of the receipts and disbursements during the previous year, and the same shall be subject to such audit and published in such manner as the Governor may direct.</p>

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

REPRESENTATIVES of the tea industry, after discussions between the Ceylon Planters' Association, the Ceylon Estates Proprietary Association, the Low-country Products Association, and the Ceylon Association in London, have decided, in order to insure the industry's welfare and progress, that it is essential to establish a Tea Research Institute for the purpose of providing scientific research into the agricultural and factory problems which face that industry. A referendum of those controlling the industry has been taken. Seventeen thousand acres did not reply. Of those who did reply 97·7 per cent. voted in favour of the scheme.

The industry is proposing to provide the funds necessary for this Research Institute, and this Ordinance gives effect to its establishment and to the incorporation of its Board of Management.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend the Youthful Offenders Ordinance, 1886, so as to provide for the Establishment of Industrial Institutions.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Youthful Offenders (Industrial Institutions) Ordinance, No. of 19 , and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor shall by proclamation in the " Government Gazette " appoint.

Short title and commencement.

2 The following sections shall be added to the principal Ordinance :

Addition of new sections to the principal Ordinance. Establishment of industrial institutions.

52. (1) For the purpose of this Ordinance, the Governor in Executive Council may—

- (a) Establish or certify industrial institutions, that is to say, places in which young offenders, whilst detained, may be given such industrial training and other instructions and be subjected to such disciplinary and moral influences as will conduce to their reformation and the prevention of crime ;
- (b) Constitute visiting committees for the purpose of such institutions ;
- (c) Make regulations for the rule and management of such institutions and for the constitution of their visiting committees, and for the classification, treatment, employment, and control of persons sent to such institutions in pursuance of this Ordinance, and for the temporary detention of persons so sent and of persons whose cases are awaiting consideration.

(2) Subject to any adaptations, alterations, and exceptions made by such regulations, the Prisons Ordinance, 1887 (including the penal provisions thereof), and the rules made thereunder shall apply in the case of every institution as if it were a prison.

53. Where a male person is convicted before any criminal court, of an offence punishable with fine or imprisonment, and it appears to the court—

Power of court to pass sentence of detention in industrial institution.

- (a) That the person is not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-one years of age ;
- (b) By reason of his criminal habits or tendencies or association with persons of bad character, it is expedient that he should be subject to detention for such term and under such instruction and discipline as appear most conducive to his reformation and the repression of crime ;

it shall be lawful for the court, in lieu of passing a sentence of fine or imprisonment, to pass a sentence of detention under penal discipline in an industrial institution established or certified under this Ordinance for a term of not less than one nor more than three years :

Provided that no such sentence shall be passed if the same is objected to by the parent or guardian of the offender, and provided that before passing such sentence the court shall consider any report or representations which may be made to it, by or on behalf of the visiting committee of such institution, as to the suitability of the case for treatment in the institution, and shall be satisfied that the character, state of health, and mental condition of the offender and the other circumstances of the case are such that the offender is likely to profit by such instruction and discipline as aforesaid.

Application to inmates of reformatory or certified industrial school.

54. Where a male youthful offender sentenced to detention in a reformatory or a certified industrial school shall escape from such school or commit any other offence against the law of the Colony, which would subject him either to imprisonment or to any further detention in any such school, the court may, subject to the proviso contained in the preceding section, if he is within the limits of age within which persons may be detained in an industrial institution, in lieu of sentencing him to imprisonment or to such further detention in such reformatory or industrial school, sentence him to be detained in an industrial institution for a term not less than one year or more than three years, and in every such case the sentence shall supersede the sentence of detention in the reformatory or industrial school.

Power to transfer from prison or reformatory or industrial school to industrial institution.

55. The Governor may, subject to the proviso contained in section 53, if satisfied that a male person undergoing imprisonment or detention in a reformatory or certified industrial school in consequence of a sentence passed either before or after the commencement of this Ordinance, being within the limits of age within which persons may be detained in an industrial institution, might with advantage be detained in such an institution, authorize his transfer from the prison or from the reformatory or industrial school in which he is detained to an industrial institution there to serve the whole or any part of the unexpired residue of his sentence, and whilst detained in, or placed out on licence from, such an institution, this Ordinance shall apply to him as if he had been originally sentenced to detention in an industrial institution.

Power to release on licence.

56. (1) The Governor may at any time after the expiration of six months from the commencement of the term of detention, if satisfied that there is a reasonable probability that the offender will abstain from crime and lead a useful and industrial life, by licence permit him to be discharged from the industrial institution on condition that he be placed under the supervision or authority of any committee or person named in the licence and approved by the Governor, who may be willing to take charge of the case.

(2) A licence under this section shall be in force until the term for which the offender shall be sentenced to detention has expired, unless sooner revoked or forfeited.

(3) A licence under this section may be revoked at any time, and where a licence has been revoked the person to whom the licence related shall return to the industrial institution, and if he fails to do so he may be apprehended without warrant and taken to the institution.

(4) If a person absent from an industrial institution under such a licence escapes from the supervision of the committee or person in whose charge he is placed, or commits any breach of the conditions contained in the licence, he shall be considered thereby to have forfeited his licence.

(5) A Police Magistrate having jurisdiction in the place where the industrial institution from which a person has been placed out on licence is situate, or where such a person is found, may on information that the licence has been forfeited under this section issue a warrant for his apprehension, and he shall, on apprehension, be brought before a

Police Magistrate who, if satisfied that the licence has been forfeited, may order him to be remitted to the industrial institution, and may commit him to any prison within the jurisdiction of the court until he can conveniently be removed to the institution.

(6) The time during which a person is absent from an industrial institution under such a licence shall be treated as part of the time of his detention in the institution :

Provided that where that person fails to return to the institution on the licence being forfeited or revoked, the time which elapses after his failure so to return shall be excluded from the time during which he is to be detained in the institution.

(7) A licence under this section shall be in such form and under such conditions as may be authorized by the Governor.

57. (1) Every person sentenced to detention in an industrial institution shall, on the expiration of the term of his sentence, remain for a further period of six months under the supervision of a visiting committee.

(2) A visiting committee may grant to any person under their supervision a licence in accordance with the last foregoing section, and may revoke any such licence and recall the person to an industrial institution, and any person so recalled may be detained in an industrial institution for a period not exceeding three months, and may at any time be again placed out on licence :

Provided that a person shall not be so recalled unless the visiting committee are of opinion that the recall is necessary for his protection, and they shall again place him out on licence as soon as possible and at latest within three months after the recall, and that a person so recalled shall not in any case be detained after the expiration of the said period of six months.

(3) A licence granted to a person before the expiration of his sentence of detention in an industrial institution shall, on his becoming liable to be under supervision in accordance with this section, continue in force after the expiration of that term, and may be revoked in manner provided by the last foregoing section.

(4) The Governor may at any time order that a person under supervision under this section shall cease to be under such supervision.

58. Where a person detained in an industrial institution is reported to the Governor by the visiting committee for such institution to be incorrigible, or to be exercising a bad influence on the other inmates of the institution, the Governor may commute the unexpired residue of the term of detention to such term of imprisonment of either description, as the Governor may determine, but in no case exceeding such unexpired residue.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

THE authorities of the Salvation Army having approached the Government for financial assistance in founding a reformatory for youths on land which has been gifted to them for the purpose, the matter was placed before the Finance Committee for the consideration of a proposed vote. The Finance Committee postponed final consideration till legislation was prepared making it lawful to commit youths to such a reformatory "only with the consent of their parents and guardians."

2. This Bill, which is based upon Part I. of the Prevention of Crime Act, 1908, and which adds certain new sections to the Youthful Offenders Ordinance, 1886, has been designed to meet the requirements indicated.

3. The industrial institutions contemplated in this Bill are institutions in which young offenders may be given such industrial training and other instructions and be subjected to such disciplinary and moral influences as will conduce to their reformation and the prevention of crime.

4. Section 52 authorizes the Governor in Executive Council to establish or certify industrial institutions and to constitute visiting committees for the purpose of such institutions. It also authorizes the Governor in Executive Council to make regulations for the management of the institutions.

5. Under the Youthful Offenders Ordinance, 1886, the term "youthful offender" is limited to a person above the age of seven and under the age of sixteen years. Section 53 of this Bill enables a court in lieu of passing a sentence of fine or imprisonment on a male offender, who is not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-one years of age, to pass a sentence of detention in an industrial institution for a term not less than one year nor more than three years; provided that no such sentence shall be passed if the same is objected to by the parent or guardian of the offender.

6. Provision has been made for the transfer of offenders from a prison or reformatory or certified industrial school (within the meaning of the principal Ordinance) to an industrial institution.

7. Other provisions relate to release on licence and supervision after the expiration of sentences. They are self-explanatory and require no pointed comments.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

**An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 5 of 1891 intituled
"An Ordinance to incorporate the Public Service
Mutual Provident Association."**

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Service Mutual Provident Association Ordinance, No. of 1925.

Substitution of new section for section 1 of the principal Ordinance.

Public Service Mutual Provident Association incorporated.

2 Section 1 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following shall be inserted in lieu thereof :

1. From and after the passing of this Ordinance, the Assistant Controller of Revenue or such other public officer of similar standing as the Governor may be pleased to appoint instead of him, the Chief Clerk of the Secretariat, the Chief Clerk of the Audit Office, and such and so many persons as now are members of the said association, or shall hereafter be admitted members of the corporation hereby constituted, whose names shall be inscribed in the register mentioned in section 11, shall be and become a corporation with continuance for ever under the name of "The Public Service Mutual Provident Association" (hereinafter referred to as the corporation), and by that name shall and may sue and be sued in all courts, and shall have full power and authority to have and to use a common seal, and change and alter the same at their will and pleasure.

3 Sub-section (1) of section 3 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following shall be inserted in lieu thereof :

Substitution of new sub-section for sub-section (1) of section 3 of the principal Ordinance.

Committee of management.

3. (1) The affairs of the corporation shall, subject to the rules made as hereinafter provided, be administered by a committee of management consisting of—

- (a) The officer for the time being lawfully acting as Assistant Controller of Revenue, or such other public officer of similar standing as the Governor may be pleased to appoint instead of him ;
- (b) The officer for the time being lawfully acting as Chief Clerk of the Secretariat ;
- (c) The officer for the time being lawfully acting as Chief Clerk of the Audit Office ; and
- (d) Seven members of the corporation to be elected once a year at the annual general meeting, subject to the proviso that if in service they should be officers stationed in Colombo.

4 Section 5 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following shall be inserted in lieu thereof :

Substitution of new section for section 5 of the principal Ordinance.
President.

5. (1) The officer for the time being lawfully acting as Assistant Controller of Revenue, or such other public officer of similar standing as the Governor may be pleased to appoint instead of him, shall be President of the said corporation and committee, and in case of his absence at any meeting a Chairman for the occasion shall be chosen by the members present.

(2) Such President shall receive such remuneration from the funds of the corporation as the Governor may from time to time direct, provided that such remuneration shall not exceed the sum of two hundred rupees per month or proportionately for any part of a month.

5 Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following shall be inserted in lieu thereof :

Substitution of new section for section 6 of the principal Ordinance.

Joint Secretary and Treasurer.

6. The committee of management shall select an officer of the Public Service with the approval of Government to act in the joint office of Secretary and Treasurer to the corporation, and the officer so appointed shall be duly seconded by Government on such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon from time to time between the Government and the said committee, and he shall furnish security in such amount and in such manner as the said committee may from time to time direct.

6 Section 7 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following shall be inserted in lieu thereof :

Substitution of new section for section 7 of the principal Ordinance.

Duties of Joint Secretary and Treasurer.

7. The Joint Secretary and Treasurer shall receive and keep account of all the moneys and funds belonging to the corporation, and shall pay all claims, loans, advances, and expenses authorized by the committee of management. He shall also prepare and submit monthly to the said committee an account of the transactions of the corporation, and generally carry on the affairs of the corporation under the direction of its President.

7 Section 10 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following shall be inserted in lieu thereof :

Substitution of new section for section 10 of the principal Ordinance.

Vacancies how filled.

10. On the death, resignation, transfer from Colombo (if in service), or absence from the Island of any member of the committee of management not being the President or one of the two Chief Clerks of the offices mentioned in section 4 above, or in the event of such member of the committee of management ceasing to be a member of the corporation under the rules made as hereinafter provided, it shall be lawful for the remaining members of the committee of management to elect any member of the corporation as his successor, and the member so elected shall continue in office until the annual general meeting of the corporation next following his election. Provided that the member so elected, if in service, shall be stationed in Colombo.

Amendment of section 11 (3) of the principal Ordinance.

8 Sub-section (3) of section 11 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph at the end thereof :

(d) Such other information as may be required by the committee of management from time to time.

Amendment of section 15 (1) of the principal Ordinance.

9 Sub-section (1) of section 15 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the words "The Secretary" in line 1 thereof and substituting therefor the words "The Joint Secretary and Treasurer."

Substitution of new sub-section for sub-section (1) of section 16 of the principal Ordinance.

10 Sub-section (1) of section 16 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following shall be inserted in lieu thereof :

16. (1) An annual general meeting of the members of the corporation shall be held not later than the 30th day of September in each year, when there shall be submitted a balance sheet, a statement of assets and liabilities, and an account of receipts and disbursements during the twelve months ending the 30th day of June preceding, all of which shall be prepared by the Joint Secretary and Treasurer and duly audited.

Insertion of new section 20A in the principal Ordinance.

11 The following section shall be inserted as section 20A of the principal Ordinance :

Funds of the corporation how operated on.

20 A. The funds of the corporation shall be placed in the name of the corporation in one or more banks to be approved by the Governor in Executive Council, and such funds may be operated on in the due course of the corporation's business by any two of the following :

- (a) The President ;
- (b) The officer for the time being lawfully acting as Chief Clerk of the Secretariat ;
- (c) The officer for the time being lawfully acting as Chief Clerk of the Audit Office ;
- (d) The officer for the time being acting as Joint Secretary and Treasurer of the corporation.

Substitution of new section for section 23 of the principal Ordinance.

12 Section 23 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following shall be inserted in lieu thereof :

Seal of corporation how affixed.

23. The seal of the corporation shall not be affixed to any instrument whatsoever, except in the presence of any two of the four officers mentioned in section 20 A, who shall sign their names to the instrument in token of their presence, and such signing shall be independent of the signing of any person as a witness.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

THE object of this Bill is to give effect to certain alterations in the principal Ordinance recommended by the Public Service Mutual Provident Association and which are deemed to be necessary to its continued success.

2. The new provisions in sections 1, 3, and 5 of the principal Ordinance are intended to enable the Governor to appoint an officer other than the Assistant Controller of Revenue, should occasion arise, to be one of the officers of the association. Provision is also made for the remuneration of the President for his services subject to a maximum rate of Rs. 200 per mensem.

3. As the present arrangements under which the part-time services of the Chief Clerks of the Colonial Secretary's Office and Audit Office are obtained in the capacities of Secretary and Treasurer is inadequate and unsatisfactory, section 5 of this Bill provides for the selection by the committee of management of an officer of the Public Service with the approval of Government to act in the joint office of Secretary and Treasurer.

4. The other changes embodied in the Bill are not of importance. They are changes in organization which experience has shown to be desirable.
