SIR,—WITH reference to my predecessor's Circular Despatch of the 6th of May, 1924, I have the honour to inform you that note has been taken by the Belgian Government of the accession of the territory under your Government to the Convention between the United Kingdom and Belgium respecting Legal Proceedings in Civil and Commercial matters, and that the Convention will accordingly apply to that territory as from the 23rd of August, 1925.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 17, 1925.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 154 (12 Burghers, 92 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 22 Moors, 8 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1925, viz., 256,049) was 31.4, as against 28.7 in the preceding week, 28.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 129 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 21 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.3, as against 27.1 in the previous week, 31.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 129 total deaths, 21 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Maradana North, 2 each in Kotahena South and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 16 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Maradana North, as in the previous week and against 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Sixteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 14 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta North, as against 3 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Cholera* were registered at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta North, as against nil in the previous week.

5. Seven deaths each were registered from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Debility*, 3 from *Enteritis*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, 1 each from *Worms*, *Tetanus*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 50 from *Other Causes*.

6. Eleven cases of *Measles*, 7 of *Chickenpox*, and 4 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 10, 12, and 5, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported either this week or in the previous week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 81.4°, against 80.5° in the preceding week and 80.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.877 in., against 29.859 in. in the preceding week and 29.913 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.09 in., against 4.41 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on September 19, 1925, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated September 15, 1925.

*Present* :—Hon. Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Hon. Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Mr. P. M. Bingham; Dr. R. F. La Brooy; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; and Mr. S. A. Wijayatilleke.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 15, 1925, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

6. Estimate for repairs to steps in Katukelle Lake road, Rs. 132.—Resolved that the estimate be adopted. A sum of Rs. 80 was also voted for an additional standpost for Katukelle lake road.

"Improvements in electric resistance welding."

*Abstract.*—In electric resistance welding the welding current is caused to fluctuate between a maximum and minimum value by means of two windings, *f*, *a*, adapted for constant relative rotation in one direction, one winding being in series and the other being in shunt with the welding transformer *e*. If desired the series winding may be arranged on the stator *b* and the shunt winding on the rotor *g*. An additional shunt winding may be arranged at 90° to the winding *f* so as to operate only when the windings *f*, *a* are at right angles to one another.

The claims are:—

1. A method of electric resistance welding wherein the welding current is fluctuated between maximum and minimum values without breaking the welding or supply circuit, with the distinguishing feature that two windings, one of which is in series with a welding transformer or transformers, whilst the other is in shunt therewith, are adapted to be constantly rotated in one direction relatively one to the other.

2. In an electric resistance welding system according to claim 1 wherein an induction regulator is interposed between the source of supply of alternating current and the welding transformer or transformers, said regulator having a stator winding in series with the welding transformer or transformers and a rotor winding in shunt with the first winding.

3. In electric resistance welding according to claim 2, the provision of an additional short circuit winding arranged at 90° in relation to the shunt winding, said short circuit winding being so arranged that it only comes into operation when the shunt and series winding are in a position at right angles to one another.

4. The method and apparatus for fluctuating the welding current in electric resistance welding between a maximum and minimum value without breaking the welding or supply circuit substantially as described in connection with the accompanying drawing.

"Improved lining for pipes and method of applying same."

*Abstract.*—In the process of lining metal pipes with a hydrocarbon or the like by means of centrifugal action, granite chips or the like are mixed with the hydrocarbon and the mixture or the pipe or both heated and the pipe rapidly rotated so that a layer of nearly pure hydrocarbon is left on the inner exposed surface.

The claims are:—

1. In the lining of metal pipes with a hydrocarbon or the like material by means of centrifugal action, mixing with the hydrocarbon or the mixture of hydrocarbons used a proportion of reinforcing material such as granite chips or the like, substantially as and for the purpose described.

2. The method of lining metal pipes with the mixture of hydrocarbon and reinforcing material specified in the preceding claim wherein either the pipe or the lining mixture to be subsequently introduced into the pipe, or both, are first heated to a suitable temperature, whereupon the lining material is introduced into the pipe whilst the latter is subjected to rapid rotation in order to spread the lining material uniformly over the inner surface of the pipe, subsequently cooling the pipe whilst the rotary motion is continued and continuing the rotary motion until the lining has set, substantially as described.

3. In the method of lining pipes as claimed in claim 2, rotating the pipe at such a speed and for so long that the reinforcing material is forced by centrifugal action to the outside of the lining whilst the inner exposed surface of the lining assumes a glossy surface of pure hydrocarbon, substantially as described.

4. A lining for metal pipes consisting of a mixture of hydrocarbons and a reinforcing material, applied to the pipe in the manner set forth and claimed in the preceding claims and for the purpose described.

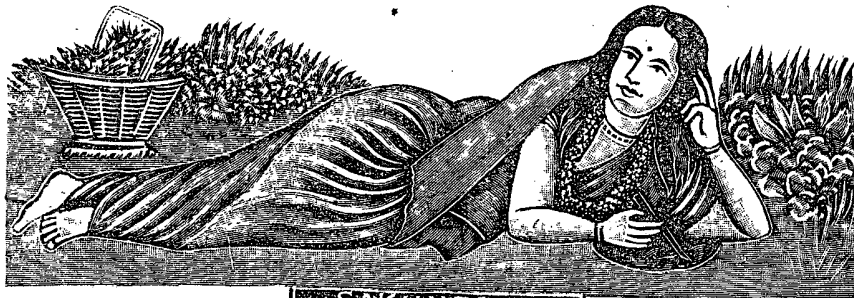

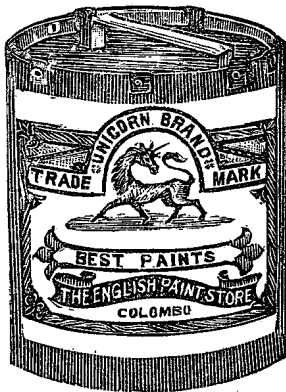
