WHEREAS the Education District Committee of Matale have, in pursuance of section 25 (1) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920," made the by-laws in the Schedule 1 hereto for the area as set forth in the Schedule A hereto :

Now, know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council, in exercise of the power in Us vested by sub-section (5) of section 25 of the said Ordinance, do hereby confirm the said by-laws set forth in the Schedule 1 hereto :

And We do hereby proclaim and declare that the said by-laws shall come into operation from the date hereof.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Fifth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-five.

### SCHEDULE 1.

*By-laws made by the Education District Committee, Matale, under Section 25 (1) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920," for the Area described in Schedule A hereto. Approved by the Board of Education and confirmed by the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council.*

1. The Committee shall meet, ordinarily, at the Office of the Urban District Council, Matale, every first Friday at 3.30 P.M. on every alternate or second month, or on such dates as the Committee shall decide upon.
2. A record of the proceedings of meetings shall be kept in a book and copies of such record circulated among members immediately after the meeting.

3. The terms "boy," "girl," and "child" mean a boy or a girl or a child residing in the area described in the Schedule A hereto.

4. The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

5. The term "Code" means the Code for Assisted Schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

6. The term "District Committee" means the Education District Committee for the Urban District Council limits of Matale.

7. The term "school" shall mean an Elementary school recognized as such by the Director of Education and shall include the schools specified in the Schedule B hereto.

8. The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the same meaning as in sub-section 25 (2) and (3) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920."

9. *Children to attend School.*—The parent of every boy not less than 6 nor more than 14 years of age, and the parent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, or in the case of Muslim and Tamil girls not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age, shall cause such boy or girl to attend school unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. Provided that, in the case of girls, their attendance shall not be compulsory, unless a separate female teacher is provided. Provided further that no boy under 8 years of age and no girl shall be compelled to attend a school more than  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile distant from his or her residence, and that no boy over 8 years of age shall be compelled to attend a school more than 2 miles distant from his residence.

And provided always that when a child between 10 and 14 years of age, being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Education District Committee, has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he or she has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic the fourth standard prescribed by the Code for the time being, he or she shall not be required to attend school.

10. *Time of Attendance.*—The time during which every child shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children of similar age.

11. *Religion.*—Provided always that nothing in these by-laws—

(a) Shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the time when religious instruction is given, as provided by section 15 (2) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920."

(b) Shall make it conditional for any child on being admitted into a school that he shall attend any Sunday school or any place of religious worship or receive any instruction in religious subjects.

(c) Shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which its parent belongs.

12. The Chairman, Education District Committee, may, in his discretion, exempt any child of school-going age from attending school for such period as he thinks fit.

13. Every parent who shall not observe, or shall neglect or violate these by-laws or any of them, shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for each offence, and an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day in the case of a continuing offence.

14. No Elementary school shall be kept open for the purpose of giving instruction to pupils for more than 6 hours a day including intervals for meals, &c. The hour at which school work should commence may be left to the discretion of the Managers or Headmasters, but no school should open earlier than 8 A.M. or later than 10 A.M. The school Time Table should be approved by the Inspector of Schools.

15. No Elementary school shall, except with the permission of the Divisional or District Inspector of Schools, be kept open for school work on more than 5 days a week or on less than 200 days a year.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 31, 1925.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 152 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 19 Moors, 7 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1925, viz., 256,049) was 31·0, as against 27·9 in the preceding week, 26·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 121 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 62 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 25 Moors, and 1 Other). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 24·6, as against 31·4 in the previous week, 30·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·8 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 121 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. Nineteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 22 in the previous week, and 13 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta South, as against 12 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's and 1 in Maradana hospital, as against 2 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospital (of a non-resident) and Kollupitiya, as against 6 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 12 from *Debility*, 4 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Dysentery*, and *Enteritis*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 43 from *Other Causes*.

5. Twenty-two cases of *Measles*, 15 of *Chickenpox*, 6 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 11, 8, 6, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80·4°, against 80·5° in the preceding week, and 79·7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·920 in., against 29·941 in. in the preceding week, and 29·899 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·98 in., against 6·23 in. in the preceding week, and 7·65 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
