VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 7, 1928.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 146 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 87 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1928, viz., 263,249) was 29·0, as against 34·0 in the preceding week, 29·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 104 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 14 Moors, 1 Malay, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 20·7, as against 26·0 in the previous week, 27·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 104 total deaths, 18 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Deaths.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 4 in New Bazaar, 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 18 in the previous week and 19 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 11 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered in Slave Island. The number registered in the previous week was also 2, and the weekly average for last year was 3.

2. Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 6 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No death from *Enteric Fever* was registered within the city.

4. Ten deaths were registered from *Debility*, 4 from *Accidents*, 3 each from *Enteritis* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Dysentery*, *Tetanus*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 43 from *Other Causes*.

5. Forty-two cases of *Chickenpox*, 3 of *Enteric Fever* (1 in Port), and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 81, 6, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported during the week, 4 cases were reported during the preceding week.

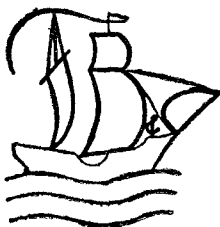

Improvements in and relating to automatic couplers for railway vehicles.

Abstract.—An automatic coupler comprises a coupling head, having a coupling hook and a guiding means for the coupling link of the opposing coupler, for directing the said link of the coupling hook. Means are provided for disengaging from the side or other suitable position engaged couplers. Coupling means of a non-automatic nature may be combined when necessary with the parts of the automatic coupler.

The claims are:—

1. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles comprising a coupler head in connection with the draw bar or the like, a coupling hook pivotally mounted in the said head, a coupling link mounted upon the same pivotal means as the coupling hook, and guiding means associated with the coupler head for guiding the coupling link of the opposing coupler to the coupling hook, for the purposes set forth.

2. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles comprising a forked coupler head in connection with the draw bar or the like, a heavy coupling hook pivotally mounted between the arms of the fork of the said head, the hook being closed at the top and with the opening and point directed downwards, a U-shaped coupling link mounted upon the same pivotal means as the coupling hook so that one arm of the U comes on each side of the hook, the engaging part of the link projecting beyond the ends of the forked coupler head, and guiding means located between the arms of the fork of the coupler head for guiding the coupling link of the opposing coupler to the coupling hook for the purposes set forth.

3. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claim 1 or 2, in which means are provided in connection with the coupling hook for moving the coupling hook from the engaged to the disengaged position, the said means being operable from the side of the vehicle or from any other suitable position.

4. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claim 3, in which the coupling link is also provided with means adapted to cause the said link to be raised when the coupling hook is raised.

5. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claim 1 or 2, in which the means for guiding the coupling link of one head into position to be engaged by the coupling hook of the other head leads to means to support the coupled link from downward movement with respect to the head, for the purposes set forth.

6. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in the preceding claims, in which the coupler head is formed with buffing or like surfaces adapted to contact with similar surfaces on the opposing head, when the parts are in coupled relation, for the purposes set forth.

7. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claim 6, in which the coupler head is forked and in which the forked arms are flared and divergent and have outwardly extending flanges, the outermost surfaces forming substantially portions of the surfaces of spheres or cylinders, with their centres towards the vehicle, for the purposes set forth.

8. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in the preceding claims in which the coupling links on their upper surfaces are formed with bevelled projections to cause the link which comes on the upper side when the vehicles are moved together, to be directed upwards to come to rest upon the coupling hook of the other head, for the purposes set forth.

9. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claims 2 and 3, in which the heavy coupling hook is provided with a downwardly and rearwardly extending arm having at the end a substantially horizontal portion and in which a thrust link or member is provided adapted to be moved between two extreme positions by suitable operating means located at the side of the vehicle or otherwise, the thrust link being so arranged that in one extreme position it is clear of the downwardly and rearwardly extending arm, and when moving from this position to the other position, so disposed that it comes into contact with and moves the downwardly extending arm to raise the heavy coupling hook from the engaged to the disengaged position, for the purposes set forth.

10. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claim 9, in which the thrust link or member is operated from a lever carried by a spindle or shaft extending across the vehicle and adapted to be actuated by a lever or levers hand wheel or the like, for the purposes set forth.

11. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claims 9 and 10, in which the thrust lever is formed or provided at the free end with a head which when the coupling hook is in the lower position comes above but does not contact with the horizontal portion of the downwardly extending arm, the horizontal portion being of sufficient extent to maintain the relation of the parts between the limits of movement of the draw bar, for the purposes set forth.

12. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claims 10 or 11, in which the parts are so disposed that when the coupling hook is fully raised by the action of the thrust link or member, the joint between the thrust link and its actuating lever has passed the dead centre represented by the line joining the centre of rotation of the actuating shaft and the point of contact of the thrust head with the downwardly extending member of the coupling hook substantially as and for the purposes set forth.

13. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claims 9, 10, 11, or 12, in which the arms of the U-shaped coupling link are provided on the underside with downwardly extending portions, and in which the head at the end of the thrust link is of such size and so disposed that it is adapted to come into engagement with these downwardly extending portions to raise the link simultaneously with the raising of the coupling hook, substantially as described.

14. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claims 9, 10, 11, 12, or 13, in which stop means are provided in conjunction with the means for raising and lowering the coupling hook, for the purposes set forth.

15. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in the preceding claims in which the guiding means carried by the coupler head for guiding the coupling link of the opposing head to the position of engagement is formed as a flange or web connecting the lower portions of the forked arms of the coupler head, substantially as herein described.

16. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in claim 15 in which a recess is provided in the upper end of the guiding means for the reception of the pointed end of the heavy coupling hook when in the lower or engaging position.

17. An automatic coupler for railway vehicles as claimed in the preceding claims in which the guiding means in one coupler head for directing the coupling link of the other head to the engaging position, is formed with or has combined therewith means by which the coupler may be attached to non-automatic coupling means, substantially as set forth.

18. Automatic couplers for railway vehicles constructed, operating and arranged substantially as herein described or substantially as herein described and shown on the accompanying drawings.

Improvements in or relating to bituminous emulsions.

Abstract.—Molten or liquid bitumen is treated in a colloid-mill with one-half to two per cent. of fatty acid and a dilute aqueous solution of alkali.

The claims are:—

1. A modified form of the process described in specification Nos. 202,021 and 202,235, characterized in that the emulsion is prepared in an apparatus of the colloid-mill type thus enabling a lower proportion ($\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.—2 per cent.) of emulsifying agent to be employed.

2. A process for producing an aqueous bituminous emulsion which comprises the treatment in a colloid-mill of a mixture of molten or liquid bituminous material, a proportion in the region of $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.—2 per cent. of an emulsifying agent comprising fatty acid and a dilute aqueous solution of alkali, with or without further water.

3. A process according to claim 2, wherein the molten or liquid bitumen, the emulsifying agent and the alkali (with or without further water) are run in separately to the mill.

4. A process according to claim 2, wherein the molten or liquid bitumen, the emulsifying agent and the alkali (with or without further water) are first mixed together and this mixture then run into the mill.

5. A process according to claim 2, wherein the molten or liquid bitumen is first treated in the mill with a dilute solution of alkali (supplied to the mill either in admixture with the bitumen or separately therefrom), the emulsifying agent aforesaid (with or without further alkali) being thereafter incorporated and the resulting mixture then treated in the mill.

6. A process for producing an aqueous bituminous emulsion substantially as herein described.

7. Bituminous emulsions when prepared by the special processes according to any one of the foregoing claims.

The claims are :—

1. In a method for the production of cold the use of activated carbon as an absorbing agent in combination with an alcohol as refrigerant.

2. A method for the production of cold having the features claimed in claim 1, characterized by the fact that the refrigerating fluid is methyl alcohol (CH_3OH).

3. A method for the production of cold having the features claimed in claim 1, characterized by the fact that the refrigerating fluid is ethyl alcohol ($\text{C}_2\text{H}_5\text{OH}$).

Improved process and apparatus for withering tea.

Abstract.—The leaf is contained in a rotating cage within a cylinder through which the drying air passes. The cage may be provided with internal projections whereby the leaf is raised and is then allowed to fall freely through the drying air. The axis of rotation may be inclined so as to allow the tea to travel.

The claims are :—

1. A manner of drying and/or withering tea leaf in the process of manufacture of tea, which consists in causing the green leaf to travel longitudinally through a tubular rotating withering apparatus in which the leaf is continuously turned over and over and raised and caused to fall freely as it travels slowly through the same, and is subjected to a draught of air for drying and withering purposes as it passes through the apparatus.

2. A manner of or process for withering tea leaf according to claim 1, in which the tea as it travels through the revolving tubular apparatus is lifted by shelves, scoops, internal ribs or other lifting elements, which lift the leaf to the upper half of the tube, drum or rotating container, and which thereupon allow the leaf to slide off the said lifting means freely to fall again to the bottom of the apparatus, the said operation being repeated continuously as the leaf passes from end to end of the apparatus.

3. A manner of or process for withering tea leaf according to claim 1 or 2 according to which the leaf is made to travel through the apparatus wholly, mainly or partly owing to the action of the draught of drying air upon the freely falling leaf.

4. A manner of or process for withering tea leaf according to any of the preceding claims, in which the leaf is made to travel at a desired speed through the apparatus, the speed being adjusted owing either to the inclination of the longitudinal axis of the apparatus, or owing to the coned shape of the apparatus, or owing to the shape or angle of the lifting means tending to cause the leaf to slip off in the desired direction of travel in falling, or, alternatively, to be forced to travel or to slip off in the opposite direction to that of the ultimate travels of the leaf in order to retard the speed of passage through the apparatus.

5. In a process of withering tea leaf according to any of the preceding claims, a manner of causing the tea to be transferred from one revolving tubular section of the apparatus to another section, which consists in causing the leaf which approaches the end of the earlier section to be lifted and, instead of falling freely to the bottom of the rotating apparatus, to be caught by a fixed chute or inclined tray or equivalent arranged inside the rotating section but below the axis of the same, said chute, tray or equivalent being so arranged that it projects from the one section into the next section and the slope thereof being such that the leaf falling thereon will slide down out of the one section and be delivered into the next section.

6. Apparatus for withering tea leaf by a process according to any of the preceding claims, which comprises a tubular cage or the equivalent adapted to rotate about its approximately horizontal longitudinal axis having a canvas, hessian cloth, wire netting, or other suitable envelope for retaining the leaf therein, means inside the tubular cage or the like for lifting the leaf as the apparatus revolves to a height above the centre of the same and causing the leaf freely to fall therefrom, and means for supplying a draught of air to pass through the tubular cage or equivalent.

7. Apparatus for withering tea leaf according to claim 6, comprising a tubular cage adapted to rotate through which the leaf is caused to travel, said cage being enclosed in an air-tight casing and means being provided for causing a current of air to pass through the cage.

8. Apparatus for withering tea according to claim 6 or 7, comprising a cage mounted upon spiders or frames fixed to a rotatable line shaft, with means to cause said shaft and the cage to rotate.

9. Apparatus for withering tea according to claims 6, 7, or 8, comprising a rotatable cage for the passage of the leaf therethrough provided with internal projecting ribs, scoops, shelves, projections or the like adapted to engage the leaf, and, as the cage rotates, to lift the leaf and, to allow it to slide off and freely to fall again and again therefrom when said ribs, projections or the equivalent, due to the rotation, are carried in turn to the upper side of the cage.

10. Apparatus according to any of the claims 6 to 9, the axis of rotation of the revolving cylinder, drum, or tubular cage being inclined to the horizontal or suitably sloped to cause the leaf to travel longitudinally therethrough at a desired pace whilst being subjected therein, whilst continually being turned over, and whilst freely falling therein, to a current of air for withering purposes.

11. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims 6 to 10 wherein the said cage or revolving drum is slightly coned for the purpose of encouraging the travel therethrough of the leaf in a desired direction for the purposes explained.

12. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims in which retarding means are introduced or provided, for example, partitions or baffles, or an upward inclination given to the axis, or the coned revolving part, so set that the travel of leaf may be checked or reduced to a desired speed.

13. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims 6 to 12, in which the leaf is made to pass in turn through two or more revolving tubular cages, drums or the like and wherein the leaf is transferred from the revolving section through which it has passed into the next revolving section by means of a fixed chute or tray, which is fixed so as to enter the lower part of the earlier section and to intercept and catch the leaf raised by the scoops, shelves, or the equivalent lifting means therein, which leaf falling on to said chutes or tray is caused to slide down the same, it having a suitable shape and inclination for the said purpose, and to be delivered into the mouth of the next following revolving section to pass through the same in turn.

14. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims 6 to 13, made in sections rotatable in a tunnel or the like, with internal projecting fixed ribs or flanges projecting into the space between sections and adapted to support the leaf passing from one section to the next, and/or to locally reduce the sectional area of the tunnel to concentrate the draught at such point to assist the leaf from one section to the next.

15. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims 6 to 14 made in sections, in which each or any of the sections is provided with an internally projecting flange at its discharging end as or for the purposes explained.

16. A manner or process of withering tea or apparatus therefor, constructed, arranged, or adapted to function substantially as described or substantially as described and illustrated.

Apparatus for making a spumous mass of cementitious material.

Abstract.—A mixture of hydraulic cement and water is admitted, together with a frothing flotation agent in small proportions, into a cylinder having at its base an inlet for compressed air, and above this inlet a rapidly rotating disc of perforated metal for breaking up the air into bubbles of uniform size.

The claims are :—

1. Apparatus for making a spumous mass from a mixture of cement, water and a frothing flotation agent, with or without an inert filler, such as sand, comprising a tank or container to receive the mixture, an air inlet near the bottom of said tank or container, and a device in the tank or container adapted to break up the air into bubbles of substantially uniform size and to distribute the bubbles in the mixture.

2. Apparatus according to claim 1, in which the bubble-forming device is adapted to be rapidly rotated.

3. Apparatus according to claim 2, in which the device is foraminous, and is preferably in the form of a disc or cylinder of screening or perforated sheet metal.

4. The improved apparatus for making a spumous mass of cementitious material, having its parts constructed, arranged, and adapted to operate substantially as hereinbefore described, for the purpose specified.

Apparatus for making a spumous mass of cementitious material.

Abstract.—In an apparatus as described in specification 2,297, a skeleton cage is driven in one direction, and has alternate perforated plates to those on a shaft driven in the opposite direction.

The claims are :—

1. Apparatus for making a spumous mass from a mixture of cement, water and frothing flotation agent, with or without an inert filler, such as sand, comprising a tank or container to receive the mixture, an inlet for supplying air to the tank or container, and members in the tank or container adapted to be oppositely rotated to break up the air into bubbles adapted to be coated or encased by the cement mixture.

2. Apparatus according to claim 1, in which the bubble-forming members are foraminous, and are preferably in the form of plates or discs of screening or perforated sheet metal.

3. Apparatus according to claim 2, in which a rotary shaft in the tank carries part of the plates, the other plates being carried by a second shaft adapted to rotate oppositely to the first shaft, and the plates on the one shaft alternating with those on the other shaft.

4. Apparatus according to claim 3, in which a skeleton cage is fixed to one of the shafts and some of the plates are fixed to said cage, the other plates being fixed to the other shaft.

5. The improved apparatus for making a spumous mass of cementitious material, having its parts constructed, arranged, and adapted to operate substantially as hereinbefore described, for the purpose specified.

Method of making cellular cementitious product.

Abstract.—The product obtained with the apparatus described in specifications 2,297 and 2,298 is passed into a similar machine containing a similar mixture, the speed of rotation here being adjusted so as to form larger bubbles, whereby the small bubbles adhere to and surround the large bubbles.

The claims are :—

1. A method of making a cellular cementitious product containing cells of larger size surrounded by cells of smaller size, which comprises forming a spumous mass of cement shells or bubbles of relatively small size, forming a second mass of similar shells or bubbles of larger size, and admixing the two masses, preferably during the formation of the latter.

2. A method according to claim 1, in which the masses are formed by agitating and aerating a slurry of cementitious material in the presence of a frothing flotation reagent.

3. A method according to claim 1 or 2, in which the bubbles in each mass are of substantially uniform size, and the masses are combined in such manner that the larger bubbles are surrounded by adherent smaller bubbles.

4. The improved method of making a cellular cementitious product substantially as hereinbefore described, for the purpose specified.

Apparatus for making a cellular cement product.

Abstract.—The apparatus described in specification 2,297 is modified to consist of an inner fixed horizontal or vertical cylinder and an outer fixed cylinder; between the two rotates a perforated cylinder to break up the air into uniform bubbles. In a modification two oppositely rotating perforated cylinders are used. In a second modification a vertical rotating frame carries alternate perforated discs and the inner cylinder rotates in the opposite direction and carries the second set of discs. In a third modification the top and bottom ends of the cylinder terminate in frustro-conical portions, the upper of which has a cylindrical extension.

The claims are:—

1. Apparatus for making a cellular cement product, comprising a tank or container having an annular compartment, means for supplying cement pulp and a frothing flotation reagent to said compartment, means for supplying air to the mixture, and a rotary agitating device adapted to agitate the mixture of pulp and air with substantial uniformity.
2. Apparatus according to claim 1, in which the annular compartment is defined by concentric shells.
3. Apparatus according to claim 1 or 2, in which the agitating device comprises a foraminous element such as a cage or a series of plates, with which, if desired, a second, similar element, adapted to rotate reversely to the first element co-operates.
4. Apparatus according to claim 3, in which the inner shell is rotatable and carries a series of foraminous plates, and a cage or frame carries a second series of foraminous plates alternating with those plates on the inner shell.
5. The improved apparatus for making a cellular cement product having its parts constructed, arranged, and adapted to operate substantially as hereinbefore described, for the purpose specified.
