SALES OF TOLL AND OTHER RENTS.

Halpatota Ferry Rent, 1928-29.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Government Agent for the Southern Province will receive sealed tenders for the purchase of the under-mentioned Toll Rent of the Southern Province from October 1, 1928, to September 30, 1929.

2. The tenders which must be in sealed envelopes superscribed "Tender for Toll Rents," will be received at the Galle Kachcheri until 2 P.M. on Monday, July 30, 1928, when they will be opened, and all persons making tender will be required to be present, or to satisfy the Government Agent by some duly accredited agents that the tender is bona fide. The Government Agent reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all tenders, and of selling the rent by public auction on the same day if no satisfactory tender is received.

3. The person whose tender is selected by the Government Agent for submission to the Hon. the Controller of Revenue will be required to deposit at once one-tenth of the purchase amount in cash; and, should the tender be accepted by the Controller of Revenue, to furnish approved security for one-half of the whole purchase amount, or in cash for one-third of the whole purchase amount, within thirty days of the date of the receipt by him of the notification of the acceptance of his offer.

4. If security be given in cash, the amount deposited on the day of sale shall be allowed to count as part of the four months' rent which the purchaser has to deposit as security. If, however, security be given in land, the cash deposit shall be retained as security additional to the landed property mortgaged with the Government Agent, and shall be hypothecated with it.

5. He will further be required to deposit money to pay the fees of the Crown Counsel for examining and giving his opinion on the title deeds of the properties tendered by him as security, and for examining and settling the security bond, and the expenses of appraising the properties and of registering the security bond.

6. He will be further required to exhibit a red light on both sides of the toll bar visible at a distance of 100 yards.

7. All title deeds tendered as security should be accompanied by a certificate obtained from the Registrar of Lands that the lands to which they relate are unencumbered. This certificate must be obtained at the cost of the party offering the security.

8. It is expected to open the Halpatota bridge which is now under construction for traffic by about March, 1929, and in the event of the opening of the bridge for traffic or

for any other reasonable cause, the Government Agent reserves to himself the right to discontinue the ferry service, and terminate the rent at any time on giving a month's notice to the renter. No rent, calculated proportionately, shall be payable from the date of discontinuance of the service.

9. It is further notified that from the vehicular traffic allowed on the ferry omnibuses and lorries are excluded. Further information can be obtained on application to the Government Agent.

TODDY RENT SALE CONDITIONS, 1928-29.

(All Provinces except the Northern and Eastern Provinces.)

THE following conditions for the sale of toddy rents for the period from October 1, 1928, to September 30, 1929, in the case of all Provinces, except the Northern and Eastern Provinces, have been approved by His Excellency the Governor under section 18 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," and are hereby published for general information:—

Stamp of 50 cents.

The conditions on which the exclusive privilege of selling fermented toddy by retail within the ———, from ———, 192—, to ———, 192—, is sold are, in addition to the general conditions applicable to all Excise licences, and to those which will be published in the *Government Gazette* in due course, as follows:—

1. The Government Agent shall have power, in his discretion, to refuse to accept any bid or tender, subject to which power the highest bidder or tenderer shall be the grantee of the privilege, and shall conform to and perform all the conditions under which the privilege is sold.

1A. (i.) Where toddy rents are sold by tender the Government Agent may, if he considers it necessary, direct that a deposit of a sum not exceeding Rs. 50 should accompany the tender.

Such deposits shall be liable to forfeiture should the successful tenderer fail to sign the conditions immediately he is declared the purchaser.

The deposits of unsuccessful tenderers will be refunded after the sale is concluded.

(ii.) No person is permitted to send in more than one tender for any one tavern.

2. (a) The grantee shall, immediately on being declared the grantee, sign the conditions of sale and pay to the Government Agent a sum equivalent to two months' rent of the privilege as a security deposit, which amount shall be liable to forfeiture, in whole or in part at the discretion of the Government Agent, for breach of any of the conditions; and such forfeiture shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by the conditions for such breach. The grantee shall within fourteen days of the sale of the privilege above described enter into a bond with the Government Agent in form Excise T 23 for the full amount for which he has purchased the said privilege, and he shall specially hypothecate by such bond the said security deposit.

(b) If the highest bid or tender under condition 1 exceeds the sum of Rs. 2,000, the grantee shall at the same time execute, if so required by the Government Agent, in the form sanctioned by law, a power of attorney to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the recovery of any moneys due in respect of this privilege, and shall also furnish to the Government Agent within fifteen days of the date of execution of such power of attorney, a duly certified copy thereof for filing in the District Court under section 32 of the Civil Procedure Code.

(c) The grantee shall, on signing the conditions of sale, elect, and under his hand signify a post office to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with the above said privilege shall be addressed under registered post; and all such notices or processes as aforesaid so addressed to the post office so elected and posted in due course shall be considered as good and effectual to all intents and purposes as if the same were served personally.

3. The grantee shall pay to the Government Agent the purchase money or rent in ——— equal monthly instalments, and also any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from him. The first instalment of the purchase money or rent shall be considered due and payable on ———, 192—, and the remainder on the last day of each succeeding month. Interest at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum shall be payable on all arrears.

4. No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be considered as duly made unless the grantee shall produce a Kachcheri receipt therefor; and no money which, for his own convenience, the grantee may think fit to leave in the hands of the shroff or any other officer of the Kachcheri shall be considered as money paid under this contract.

5. If an instalment or part of the instalment of the purchase money or rent, or any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from the grantee remains unpaid after the same shall have become due and payable, the Government Agent shall have power, after fifteen days' notice to the grantee of his intention to do so, without further process of law, to cancel the licence or licences issued to the grantee, and to resell the privilege at the risk and loss of the grantee. The notice referred to may be given in such manner as the Government Agent may direct.

6. The grantee shall, at least ten days before the date on which his privilege to sell fermented toddy commences to run, furnish to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Excise an application on the prescribed form showing the numbers and situations of the trees which he proposes to tap for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at each tavern and the situations and numbers of collecting stations for toddy which he proposes to establish, and no tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn for this purpose except under cover of a licence setting forth the numbers and situations of the trees, the name of the drawer, the name of the owner or possessor of the trees so applied for, and the tavern for which the fermented toddy is intended. The Superintendent of Excise or Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall have power, subject to appeal to the Excise Commissioner, to refuse any application to tap trees for any tavern if such application is, in his opinion, open to serious objection.

6A. (i.) When transport is by lorry, cart, or railway the toddy renter must establish collecting stations on the main road in places approved by the Circle Officer.

(ii.) The renter must maintain an Account Book in form Excise "D 20" at each collecting station showing the amount received from each tapper.

(iii.) The renter must show in T 22 Register kept in the tavern the amount received from each collecting station designated by number and name.

(iv.) The renter must cause the morning yield of all trees to be lowered before 8.30 a.m. and the afternoon yield to be lowered before 4.30 p.m. daily, and removed to the proper collecting station at once. He must not allow toddy to be kept in any place except the collecting station after 10 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. respectively.

(v.) The renter must have all the morning toddy at the collecting stations delivered at the tavern before 11 a.m. and all the afternoon toddy before 6 p.m.

(vi.) All accounts at the collecting stations and taverns shall be maintained in either English, Sinhalese, or Tamil.

7. No tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn therefrom for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at a tavern unless such tree shall first have been marked for this purpose in a manner prescribed by the Excise Commissioner; nor shall toddy be transported to the tavern except under cover of a pass granted by the Superintendent of Excise or the Assistant Superintendent of Excise. Such pass shall set forth the name of the person who transports the toddy, and shall be issued to the grantee, who shall hand it to the person who transports the toddy. *Separate passes must be issued for transport by pingo carriers from the tree topes to the collecting station, and by cart, lorry, or other vehicle from the collecting station to the tavern.*

(a) Any renter wishing to make vinegar from toddy shall obtain a vinegar licence from the Government Agent. Provided that the Government Agent may issue licences to non-renters on terms and subject to conditions duly approved by Government.

(b) The holder of a vinegar licence shall store such vinegar in premises approved by the *Government Agent*, and shall keep a true account of all toddy converted into vinegar and of all sales of vinegar in the form proscribed by the Excise Commissioner.

(c) *Such vinegar store shall be opened at the request of any Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector, and the renter must produce the accounts therein maintained whenever called upon.*

8. The grantee, if he taps the trees and draws the toddy himself, or if he delegates the work to another person such person shall, at the time of tapping the trees or drawing the toddy, invariably carry the licence on his person, and shall produce it forthwith on the demand of any Excise Officer or Village Headman.

9. The grantee shall have no concern or interest, direct or indirect, in the sale of arrack, or in the purchase of any privilege for the sale of arrack, within the area of his rent.

10. Except under the written authority of the Assistant Commissioner of Excise, no toddy, except toddy drawn from trees licensed and marked for a particular tavern, shall be kept, offered for sale, or sold in that tavern.

11. The minimum selling price of toddy per gallon shall be for Northern and Eastern Provinces 54 cents, for the distillery area 60 cents, and for other provinces 96 cents, and in proportion for any smaller quantity.

12. The Government Agent shall not be bound to find a site for any tavern in the event of the grantee not being able to procure a site. No tavern shall be opened at any place except with the approval of the Government Agent.

13. The purchaser shall, within ten days from the date on which the privilege commences to run, or within such extended time as the Government Agent may grant, apply to the Government Agent and obtain licence or licences for the sale by retail of fermented toddy at the taverns within the area covered by the privilege.

14. (a) The grantee shall have no claim to a remission if the Government Agent or his Assistant shall find it necessary to order the taverns upon any road to be closed for a limited period during the march of troops, or upon the plea of losses arising from any cause whatever.

(b) On days of polling concerning taverns the Government Agent or his Assistant shall order the closure of all taverns in the area in which polls are held, and the grantee shall have no claim to a remission on this account.

15. (a) No bids will be accepted from any person who is a habitual criminal as defined by Ordinance No. 32 of 1914.

(b) The purchaser shall, whenever called upon to do so by the Government Agent, satisfy him that he is not a habitual criminal within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

16. The tavern within the area of the exclusive privilege granted under the foregoing conditions shall open at _____ A.M., and close at _____ P.M., and no toddy shall be sold at such tavern between the hour of closing and opening.

17. The renter may not employ as tavern keeper, manager, tope manager, or collecting station manager any habitual criminal or notorious illicit seller, and must forthwith cease to employ any person who is not approved by the Assistant Superintendent of Excise or from whom approval is at any time withdrawn.

18. In the case of taverns where "Off" sales are prohibited no toddy shall be sold under this exclusive privilege for the purpose of removal from the tavern, and no toddy sold in the tavern shall be removed from it except under cover of a special permit granted by the Government Agent.

Sale of Toddy Rents by Public Auction.

NOTICE is hereby given that the privilege of selling fermented toddy by retail in the areas specified in the schedule hereof for the period of twelve months from October 1, 1928, to September 30, 1929, will be put up for sale by public auction on the following conditions:—

The conditions on which the exclusive privilege of selling fermented toddy by retail within the under-mentioned areas from October 1, 1928, to September 30, 1929, is sold, are, in addition to the general conditions applicable to all Excise licences, and to those which will be published in the *Government Gazette* in due course, as follows:—

1. The Government Agent shall have power, in his discretion, to refuse to accept any bid or tender, subject to which power the highest bidder or tenderer shall be the grantee of the privilege, and shall conform to and perform all the conditions under which the privilege is sold.

1A. (i.) Where toddy rents are sold by tender the Government Agent may, if he considers it necessary, direct that a deposit of a sum not exceeding Rs. 50 should accompany the tender.

Such deposits shall be liable to forfeiture should the successful tenderer fail to sign the conditions immediately he is declared the purchaser.

The deposits of unsuccessful tenderers will be refunded after the sale is concluded.

(ii.) No person is permitted to send in more than one tender for any one tavern.

2. (a) The grantee shall, immediately on being declared the grantee, sign the conditions of sale and pay to the Government Agent a sum equivalent to two months' rent of the privilege as a security deposit, which amount shall be liable to forfeiture, in whole or in part at the discretion of the Government Agent, for breach of any of the conditions; and such forfeiture shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by the conditions for such breach. The grantee shall within fourteen days of the sale of the privilege above described enter into a bond with the Government Agent in form Excise T 23 for the full amount for which he has purchased the said privilege, and he shall specially hypothecate by such bond the said security deposit.

(b) If the highest bid or tender under condition 1 exceeds the sum of Rs. 2,000, the grantee shall at the same time execute, if so required by the Government Agent, in the form sanctioned by law, a power of attorney to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the recovery of any moneys due in respect of this privilege, and shall also furnish to the Government Agent within fifteen days of the date of execution of such power of attorney, a duly certified copy thereof for filing in the District Court under section 32 of the Civil Procedure Code.

(c) The grantee shall, on signing the conditions of sale, elect, and under his hand signify a post office to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with the above said privilege shall be addressed under registered post; and all such notices or processes as aforesaid so addressed to the post office so elected and posted in due course shall be considered as good and effectual to all intents and purposes as if the same were served personally.

3. The grantee shall pay to the Government Agent the purchase money or rent in ——— equal monthly instalments, and also any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from him. The first instalment of the purchase money or rent shall be considered due and payable on ———, 192—, and the remainder on the last day of each succeeding month. Interest at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum shall be payable on all arrears.

4. No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be considered as duly made unless the grantee shall produce a Kachcheri receipt therefor; and no money which, for his own convenience, the grantee may think fit to leave in the hands of the shroff or any other officer of the Kachcheri shall be considered as money paid under this contract.

5. If an instalment or part of the instalment of the purchase money or rent, or any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from the grantee remains unpaid after the same shall have become due and payable, the Government Agent shall have power, after fifteen days' notice to the grantee of his intention to do so, without further process of law, to cancel the licence or licences issued to the grantee, and to resell the privilege at the risk and loss of the grantee. The notice referred to may be given in such manner as the Government Agent may direct.

6. The grantee shall, at least ten days before the date on which his privilege to sell fermented toddy commences to run furnish to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Excise an application on the prescribed form showing the numbers and situations of the trees which he proposes to tap for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at each tavern and the situations and numbers of collecting stations for toddy which he proposes to establish, and no tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn for this purpose except under cover of a licence setting forth the numbers and situations of the trees, the name of the drawer, the name of the owner or possessor of the trees so applied for, and the tavern for which the fermented toddy is intended. The Superintendent of Excise or Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall have power, subject to appeal to the Excise Commissioner, to refuse any application to tap trees for any tavern if such application is in his opinion open to serious objection.

6A. (i.) When transport is by lorry, cart, or railway the toddy renter must establish collecting stations on the main road in places approved by the Circle Officer.

(ii.) The renter must maintain an Account Book in form Excise "D 20" at each collecting station showing the amount received from each tapper.

(iii.) The renter must show in T 22 Register kept in the tavern the amount received from each collecting station designated by number and name.

(iv.) The renter must cause the morning yield of all trees to be lowered before 8.30 a.m. and the afternoon yield to be lowered before 4.30 p.m. daily, and removed to the proper collecting station at once. He must not allow toddy to be kept in any place except the collecting station after 10 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. respectively.

(v.) The renter must have all the morning toddy at the collecting stations delivered at the tavern before 11 a.m. and all the afternoon toddy before 6 p.m.

(vi.) All accounts at the collecting stations and taverns shall be maintained in either English, Sinhalese, or Tamil.

7. No tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn therefrom for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at a tavern unless such tree shall first have been marked for this purpose in a manner prescribed by the Excise Commissioner; nor shall toddy be transported to the tavern except under cover of a pass granted by the Superintendent of Excise or the Assistant Superintendent of Excise. Such pass shall set forth the name of the person who transports the toddy, and shall be issued to the grantee, who shall hand it to the person who transports the toddy. Separate passes must be issued for transport by pingo carriers from the tree tops to the collecting station, and by cart, lorry, or other vehicle from the collecting station to the tavern.

(a) Any renter wishing to make vinegar from toddy shall obtain a vinegar licence from the Government Agent. Provided that the Government Agent may issue licences to non-renters on terms and subject to conditions duly approved by Government.

(b) The holder of a vinegar licence shall store such vinegar in premises approved by the Government Agent, and shall keep a true account of all toddy converted into vinegar and of all sales of vinegar in the form prescribed by the Excise Commissioner.

(c) Such vinegar store shall be opened at the request of any Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector, and the renter must produce the accounts therein maintained whenever called upon.

8. The grantee, if he taps the trees and draws the toddy himself, or if he delegates the work to another person such person shall, at the time of tapping the trees or drawing the toddy, invariably carry the licence on his person, and shall produce it forthwith on the demand of any Excise Officer or Village Headman.

9. The grantee shall have no concern or interest, direct or indirect, in the sale of arrack, or in the purchase of any privilege for the sale of arrack, within the area of his rent.

10. Except under the written authority of the Assistant Commissioner of Excise, no toddy, except toddy drawn from trees licensed and marked for a particular tavern, shall be kept, offered for sale, or sold in that tavern.

11. The minimum selling price of toddy per gallon shall be for Northern and Eastern Provinces 54 cents, for the distillery area 60 cents, and for other provinces 96 cents, and in proportion for any smaller quantity.

12. The Government Agent shall not be bound to find a site for any tavern in the event of the grantee not being able to procure a site. No tavern shall be opened at any place except with the approval of the Government Agent.

13. The purchaser shall, within ten days from the date on which the privilege commences to run, or within such extended time as the Government Agent may grant, apply to the Government Agent and obtain licence or licences for the sale by retail of fermented toddy at the taverns within the area covered by the privilege.

14. (a) The grantee shall have no claim to a remission if the Government Agent or his Assistant shall find it necessary to order the taverns upon any road to be closed for a limited period during the march of troops, or upon the plea of losses arising from any cause whatever.

(b) On days of polling concerning taverns the Government Agent or his Assistant shall order the closure of all taverns in the area in which polls are held, and the grantee shall have no claim to a remission on this account.

15. (a) No bids will be accepted from any person who is a habitual criminal as defined by Ordinance No. 32 of 1914.

(b) The purchaser shall, whenever called upon to do so by the Government Agent, satisfy him that he is not a habitual criminal within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

16. The tavern within the area of the exclusive privilege granted under the foregoing conditions shall open at ———— A.M., and close at ———— P.M., and no toddy shall be sold at such tavern between the hour of closing and that of opening.

17. The renter may not employ as tavern keeper, manager, tope manager, or collecting station manager any habitual criminal or notorious illicit seller, and must forthwith cease to employ any person who is not approved by the Assistant Superintendent of Excise or from whom approval is at any time withdrawn.

18. In the case of taverns where "Off" sales are prohibited no toddy shall be sold under this exclusive privilege for the purpose of removal from the tavern, and no toddy sold in the tavern shall be removed from it except under cover of a special permit granted by the Government Agent.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, May 12, 1928, at 1.15 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated May 7, 1928.

Present :—Mr. L. W. C. Schrader, Chairman ; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe ; Mr. F. W. Sproule ; Mr. S. H. Dahanayake ; and Dr. F. R. Alles.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 21, 1928, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayake asked the following questions, and the Chairman answered *seriatim* :—

(1) How many registered and unregistered dairies are there in the town of Galle ? Who are the proprietors of the registered and unregistered dairies ? A.—A list of registered dairies within Municipal limits, and their owners, is tabled. I do not know of any unregistered dairies within Municipal limits.

(a) Will the Chairman be pleased to inform this Council the number of milking cows in each dairy and the average number of bottles each dairy can supply ? A.—I am unable to give the information to-day ; but if the member wishes to have it, it will be furnished to him in due course.

(b) Are these dairies supplying buffalo milk ? If so, how many of them are there in the town ? A.—One dairy supplies buffalo milk.

(c) Is the Chairman aware that cow milk adulterated with either buffalo milk, coconut milk, young coconut water, or imported tin milk is sold in the town ? A.—Adulterated milk is known to be sold in the town. Whenever the vendors are found out they are prosecuted.

(d) Can the Chairman inform this Council whether the Medical Officer of Health visits and examines the cows in the dairies ? If so, how many times a month ? A.—The Medical Officer of Health visits registered dairies from time to time, and inspects the cows found there. In most cases the cows are sent out to graze after being milked in the morning.

(e) If the Medical Officer of Health has examined the cows has he applied the tuberculin test in doing so ? A.—The tuberculin test has not been applied, nor is this treatment provided for in the by-laws.

(f) Is the Chairman aware that the sale of adulterated milk is known to the responsible officers of this Council ? A.—Yes ; and I am satisfied that steps are being taken to check it.

(g) What steps will the Chairman take to guarantee a good supply of milk to the residents of the town ? A.—The Chairman cannot guarantee a good supply of milk to the town.

(h) Will the Chairman consider to establish a Municipal dairy which is becoming absolutely essential owing to the impure milk supply of the town ? A.—I do not consider that the establishment of a Municipal dairy is essential. It is a matter for private enterprise.

(2) Is the Chairman aware that again there are complaints from the residents of the town owing to the defective supply of coir dust and the unclean buckets ? A.—There have been a few complaints re an inadequate supply of coir dust, which were attended to. Complaints of this nature if addressed to the Medical Officer of Health will receive prompt attention.

(3) What steps will the Chairman take to keep the drains of the Bazaar and China Garden clean ? A.—These drains are cleaned daily, and they will remain clean if householders do not throw or sweep refuse into them. The only remedy is prosecution where there is evidence.

(a) Is the Chairman aware that the drains in this area have no gradient, and that filth accumulates to the annoyance of the residents within that area ? A.—Some drains are badly graded ; but the nuisance will not be great if they are not used as receptacles for the householders' refuse.

(4) Who owns the pavements on the two sides of the Ephraums Co-operative building in Lighthouse street ? A.—The pavement belongs to Messrs. A. R. Ephraums Co-operative Co. ; but it is open to the public.

(a) In putting up this building have the owners adhered to the regulations laid down in the Housing Ordinance inasmuch as allowing a reservation for the roads on three sides and a 10-foot space at the back ? A.—So far as I am aware the requirements of the Housing Ordinance have been complied with. The Council approved of the plan of the building by resolution 5 (11) of May 10, 1924.

(b) Did the Council allow Mr. V. D. S. Fernando in rebuilding his house at the end of Lighthouse street to build up to the road without leaving a reservation for the road ? A.—This house, being one of a row of buildings, was rebuilt on the original site in terms of the resolution of Council of March 14, 1908.

(c) Did the Council allow the same person to build his garage attached to his house in Kaluwolla near the market without leaving a reservation for the road ? A.—Government had acquired the land between the house and the road for the widening of Mahamodera road. It would have caused hardship to the owner to have insisted on a further road reservation under the circumstances.

(d) Is the Chairman aware that the same person has built stores on Government land behind the National Drapery Store in the Bazaar, and that he has now converted such stores to boutiques, five or six in number, and has rented out such boutiques ? A.—Yes.

(e) Is the Chairman aware that these stores, now boutiques, are built abutting on two public roads, and that no reservation is left for the roads ? A.—It is not a new erection. The existing building was converted into boutiques, therefore no road reservation was required.

(f) Is the Chairman aware that owing to these boutiques the junction has become a dangerous corner for motor and other traffic? A.—The conversion of the store into boutiques has not made the corner more dangerous.

(g) Will the Chairman take steps to have these stores (now boutiques) pulled down? A.—No.

(5) Is the Chairman aware that Mr. S. D. Charles has taken the lease of a block of land in the Bazaar facing Dickson road and has built a garage and a wall, and that owing to which the junction there has become a dangerous corner, and there has been several motor accidents? A.—The wall is not a new erection, but the garage is. The wall is over 25 years old. The building of the garage within the premises does not make the corner more dangerous.

(a) Will the Chairman take steps to have this space cleared? A.—No.

(6) Is the Chairman aware that the same person, Mr. S. D. Charles, has taken the lease of the block of land in Talbot Town, opposite the Britannia Picture Palace, and has built a house which is now rented out? A.—I understand that this house has existed for about 25 years.

(a) Is the Chairman aware that this block of land ought to have been kept vacant to admit air and light to the two houses on both sides? A.—This question does not arise.

(b) Will the Chairman take steps to have this space cleared and kept vacant? A.—No.

(7) Will the Chairman inform this Council whether the houses occupied by Messrs. P. B. Toussaint and D. I. Durham were built in compliance with the Housing Ordinance inasmuch as allowing space of 10 feet at the back and reservation for public road? A.—These buildings do comply with the requirements of the Housing Ordinance.

(a) Is it the fact that part of the house occupied by Mr. Durham is on the railway tunnel? If so, does it not endanger life? A.—No.

(8) Is the Chairman aware that one Albert has been allowed to put up a garage in Talbot Town without having a reservation for the cross road? A.—As the road reservation was provided between the building and the road it fronts no reservation was provided on the side road.

(9) Is it the fact that the Chairman has disallowed the application of Mr. Zainul Abdeen to build store house on the same cross road? A.—Yes.

(a) Is it not the fact that several applications to build houses have been disallowed and that there is dissatisfaction as to the way that the ratepayers are treated? The wealthier men are given opportunities which are denied to the less fortunate? A.—All applications which are not in conformity with the Housing Ordinance are refused. The statement at the end of the question is not in order.

(10) Will the Chairman prohibit motor vehicles being driven through the esplanade? A.—I am not aware that motor vehicles are driven through the esplanade.

(a) Will the Chairman be pleased to set apart space for parking motor vehicles in the esplanade? A.—There is not sufficient occasion for it.

(11) Is the Chairman aware that the flesh of dead animals (cattle and goats) are sold at the meat market in Galle? A.—I am aware that none but the flesh of dead animals is sold in the market; never of the living.

(a) Has the Chairman seen the article on putrid food in Galle in the 'Daily News' of May 7, 1928? A.—No. Fresh meat is brought in daily, and sometimes twice a day. The Medical Officer of Health reports that he visits the markets daily, and has never found putrid meat. No complaints as to putrid meat have ever been brought to my notice.

(b) Is it not high time that the Council should adopt ways and means of ensuring a better supply of meat at the market as done in Kandy and Colombo? A.—The supply of meat is considered good and adequate.

(12) Is the Chairman aware that the tar barrels put along the side of the roads to be newly tarred are running waste? A.—Three barrels of tar, out of 100, were damaged in transport, and leaked a little when they were unloaded. Nothing of it, however, will be wasted.

(a) Will the Chairman request the Superintendent of Works to attend to the tarring immediately? A.—I cannot give him directions for a particular date for the tarring, as a dry surface and no interference by rain is necessary.

(13) Is the Chairman aware that there is great dissatisfaction among the conservancy coolies owing to the dismissal of Charo who was the first signatory to a petition against the Health Manager? A.—I am not aware that there is any dissatisfaction among the conservancy coolies. Many of them admitted having had nothing to do with the petition, although their names are included in the list. None of them signed the petition in the presence of the petition drawer. Charo alone went to him and gave him his instructions. My own opinion is that the allegations were entirely unfounded.

(a) Is the Chairman aware that the conservancy coolies are contemplating to strike owing to the dismissal of Charo which they consider a great injustice? A.—No. Charo was not dismissed for presenting the petition, but on definite charges of neglect of duty, insubordination, and a bad record. Such questions as these two are detrimental to the interests of discipline.

(14) How many days was the Medical Officer of Health on leave in the year 1927, and for the few months of this year? A.—The Medical Officer of Health had 35 days' leave in 1927, and 20½ days' in 1928, including casual leave.

(a) Who was acting for the Medical Officer of Health during his absence? A.—Dr. A. H. D. S. de Silva acted as Medical Officer of Health.

(b) To whom is the acting officer responsible, to the Council or to the permanent Medical Officer? A.—He is responsible to the Chairman.

(15) Is the Chairman aware that the Municipal Councils' Draft Ordinance is in the hands of the Government Printer, and that the delay in submitting a scheme of constitutional reforms of this Council can deprive this town of any reforms? A.—I have no information. If any reforms of the Municipal constitution are embodied the Draft Ordinance will give Members of Council the opportunity of considering them and putting forward their proposals. I am not aware of any reason why the drafting of an amending Ordinance should deprive this town of any reforms.

(a) If such is our fate will it not be the greatest victory for the reactionaries of this town for which the Chairman is mainly responsible? A.—This is a hypothetical question and states an opinion, which is not in order.

(b) Is this indifference on the part of the Chairman due to his having no permanent interest in the welfare of the citizens of the town, or to his want of time in attending to Municipal matters in not summoning more than one Committee meeting for the last 6 months? A.—This question contains an expression of opinion, and is therefore not in order.

3. Letter No. G. 2,964 of May 10, 1928, from the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, requesting the Council to reconsider their decision of April 21, 1928, and to increase the grant to the Galle Police Band to Rs. 100 per mensem.

Mr. C. E. de Vos moved—That the Council's contribution to the Galle Police Band be increased to Rs. 100 per mensem, on condition a monthly moonlight concert is given. Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded.—Carried.
