#### SCHEDULE.

1. The following by-law shall be inserted after by-law 4 in Chapter XIV. of the by-laws of the Municipal Council of Colombo proclaimed in Government Gazette No. 6,080 of October 20, 1905:—

4A. No person shall sell, offer, hawk about, or expose for sale any milk, which contains less than the standard of cow's milk, to wit, 12 per cent. of milk solids, including not less than 3.5 per cent. of milk fat; provided, however, that when buffalo milk is sold as such it shall contain not less than 16 per cent. of milk solids, including not less than 7 per cent. of milk fat.

2. By-law 6 of Chapter XIV. as proclaimed in Government Gazette No. 6,389 of July 1, 1910, is amended by the substitution of the words "City Analyst" for the words "qualified Analyst" wherever the latter words occur in the said by-law.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. No person shall camp in any place in which he has been prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent, Puttalam, from camping, and any person refusing to move his camp when ordered to do so shall be guilty of an offence.

No person shall ease himself within the limits of the camping ground, except at the place provided for the

purpose.

No person shall deposit liquid or solid refuse or rubbish elsewhere than in the pits provided for the purpose. Every person in charge of cart bulls shall cause the droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided for the purpose and shall keep the place occupied by the bulls reasonably clean at all times.

#### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO. -Meetings.

The Committee shall meet, ordinarily at the Urban Education District Committee Office, Matale, every last Friday at 3.30 P.M. of every alternate or second month, or on such dates as the Committee shall decide upon.

The Chairman may at any time summon a meeting of the Committee, and on a requisition signed by any three members he shall summon a meeting of the Committee. The requisition shall state the object for which the meeting is required to be summoned.

Notice of the business to be transacted at meetings, whether ordinary or special, shall be served on each member at least three days—exclusive of Sundays and Public holidays—before each meeting.

The Chairman shall preside at each meeting, but in his absence from any meeting the members of the Committee present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting. 5. The Chairman, or in his absence the member presiding, shall maintain order, and his decision on all points of

order in dispute shall be final and conclusive.

A record of the proceedings of meetings shall be kept in a book and copies of such record circulated among members immediately after the meeting.

#### II.—Education of Children.

7. Definitions.—In these by laws the following terms shall have the meanings assigned to them unless there be something repugnant in the subject or context :-

The term "boy," "girl," and "child" shall mean a boy or a girl or a child residing in the area described in

the Schedule A hereto.

The term "parent" includes a guardian and any person who has the legal or actual custody of a child.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "Code" means the Code for Assisted Schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The term "District Committee" means the Urban Education District Committee for the Urban District Council limits of Matale.

The term "school" shall mean an elementary school recognized as such by the Director of Education and shall include the schools specified in the Schdeule B hereto and any that may hereafter be established

and certified by the Director of Education to provide adequate and suitable education.

The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the same meaning as in section 25, sub-sections (2) and (3), of "The Education Ordinance," No. 1 of 1920.

Children to attend School.—The parent of every boy not less than 6 nor more than 14 years of age, and the parent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, or in the case of Muslim and Tamil girls not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age shall cause such boy or girl to attend school unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. that, in the case of girls, their attendance shall not be compulsory unless a separate female teacher is provided. further that no boy under 8 years of age and no girl shall be compelled to attend a school more than 3 mile distant from his or her residence, and that no boy over 8 years of age shall be compelled to attend a school more than 2 miles distant from his residence.

And provided always that when a child between 10 and 14 years of age, being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Urban Education District Committee, has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he or she has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic the Fourth Standard prescribed by the Code for the time being, he or she shall not be required to attend a school.

9. Time of Attendance.—The time during which every child shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children of similar age.

10. Religion.—Provided always that nothing in these by-laws-

(a) Shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the time when religious instruction is given, as provided by section 15 (2) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920."

(b) Shall make it conditional for any child on being admitted into a school that he shall attend any Sunday school or any place of religious worship or receive any instruction in religious subjects.

(c) Shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which its parent belongs.

11. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of children from the age of 6 to 14 resident within the limits of the Urban District Council, it shall be lawful for the Committee to cause schedules to be served on householders within the said area requiring each of them to fill or furnish information for the purpose of filling up of the said schedule with the name, nationality, sex, and age of every child in his or her house, together with the names of the child's parents and the name and situation of any school which the child attends and to return the said schedule with full particulars of all the information required within a period of 21 days from the date of service of such schedule.

12. Every parent who shall not observe, or shall neglect or violate these by laws or any of them shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for each offence, and an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day

in the case of a continuing offence.

13. No elementary school shall be kept open for the purpose of giving instruction to pupils for more than 6 hours a day including intervals for meals, &c. The hour at which the school work should commence may be left to the discretion of the Managers or Head Masters, but no school should open earlier than 8 A.M. or later than 10 A.M. The school time table should be approved by the Inspector of Schools.

14. No elementary school shall, except with the permission of the Divisional or District Inspector of Schools.

be kept open for school work on more than 5 days a week or on less than 200 days a year.

The area described in Schedule A hereto is declared to be an area within which efficient provision has been made for elementary education in terms of section 25 (1) (c) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920."

16. The by-laws published in Ceylon Government Gazette No. 7,496 of November 6, 1925, by notification dated November 5, 1925, are hereby repealed.

#### "THE CEYLON RAILWAYS ORDINANCE, 1902."

T 145/28

ULE made by His Excellency the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council under section 5 of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902."

The rules relating to the conveyance of traffic by soods trains published by notification dated February 25, 1926, in the Supplement to Government Gazette No. 7,514 of February 26, 1926, and notification dated April 22, 1927, in Government Gazette No. 7,578 of same date and mentioned in the first column of the schedule to this rule, shall be amended in the manner shown in the second column of that schedule:—

RULE, REFERRED, TO.

Rule.

Nature of Amendment.

Goods rule 37 The following shall be substituted for Goods rule 37:-

> 37. Conveyance of Petrol in Packages.—(a) "Petrol" includes all dangerous petroleum used for the propulsion of motor vehicles.

> (b) Petrol will be accepted for conveyance by goods or mixed trains at twelfth class rate on actual weight or at tenth class rate as for 4 tons whichever is lower, and subject to the regulations governing the transport of explosives (vide rule 41), in receptacles not attached to motor vehicles, of 2-, 4-, or 5-gallon capacity under the following condititions:-

(1) Receptacles of 2 gallon capacity must be substantially constructed of tinned or galvanized sheet iron or steel, strictly in accordance with the sample approved by and deposited with the General Manager of the Railway, and they must be packed either singly or in pairs or fours in substantially constructed and sealed wooden cases of such a size as will exactly accommodate either one, two, or four receptacles of 2 gallon capacity as above defined. The thickness of the wood must not be less than half an inch, and the general pattern of the cases must be approved by the General Manager of the Railway.

(2) Receptacles of 4 gallon capacity must be constructed of tin plate, in accordance with the sample approved by and deposited with the General Manager of the Railway; they shall also be packed in cases, in the manner and of the description set out in the preceding clause  $(\bar{b})$  (1), and shall in all respects conform to the requirements of the said clause.

(3) Receptacles of 5-gallon capacity must be constructed of galvanized iron or steel, strictly in accordance with the sample approved by and deposited with the General Manager of the Railway, and will be conveyed unpacked.

(4) The 2- and 5-gallon receptacles referred to in clauses (b)(1) and (b) (3) above containing petrol must be supplied with well made filling holes secured by well fitting screw plugs of a pattern similar to those fitted to the sample receptacle deposited with the General Manager of the Railway. The 4-gallon receptacles referred to in clause (b) (2) above containing petrol must have the filling holes hermetically closed and further protected by a screw cap, as provided by the sample deposited with the General Manager of the Railway. Under no circumstances will these receptacles when empty be accepted for transport by train.

(5) All receptacles must have an air space equal to one-tenth of the capacity of the receptacle for expansion of the petrol, and they must be gas-tight, and so substantially constructed and secured as not to be liable, except under circumstances of gross negligence or extraordinary accident, to be broken or become defective, leaky, or insecure in transit.

(6) Damaged receptacles will not be accepted for transport.(7) The nature of the contents and also the words "highly inflammable" must be distinctly marked on the 5-gallon receptacles to be conveyed unpacked, and on the wooden cases, in which the 2- and 4-gallon receptacles are transported.

(c) In addition to the receptacles specified in sub-clause (b), receptacles of capacity in excess of 5 gallons and not exceeding 65 gallons will be accepted for conveyance by goods or mixed trains unpacked, provided they are in accordance with the samples approved by and deposited with the General Manager of the Railway.

(d) No petrol will be accepted for conveyance by goods or mixed trains unless the consignment is accompanied by a declaration from the consignor in the following terms, viz. :-

I hereby declare that the petrol herewith consigned by me is in every respect in accordance with the regulations of the railway governing the transport of petrol by goods or mixed trains as printed on the back of this declaration.

(e) Return empty vessels in which petrol has been conveyed by railway at goods rates (other than those referred to as prohibited in clause (b) (4) above) will be charged at seventh class rate in small lots and at 25 cents per wagon per mile in wagon loads in terms of rule 32. The screw plugs of the empty vessels must be securely fastened.

37A, Goods rule clause (a)

The following shall be substituted for clause (a) of Goods rule 37A:

Conveyance of Petrol (Dangerous Petroleum) in Tank Wagons.—(a) Petrol in tank wagons of a design approved by the General Manager of the Railway will be conveyed at goods rates by goods or mixed trains on specified days.

Goods rule 39

The following shall be substituted for Goods rule 39:

- 39. Compressed ammonia gas or liquefied anhydrous ammonia, compressed atmospheric air, compressed or liquefied carbonic acid gas (carbon dioxide), compressed coal gas, compressed hydrogen, compressed or liquefied nitrous oxide, compressed oxygen, compressed or liquefied sulphurous acid gas (sulphur dioxide), will be accepted at Colombo Goods Station and Wharf on Tuesdays and Thursdays (unless specially provided for below) for conveyance at owner's risk by goods or mixed trains in iron-covered wagons at thirteenth class rates subject to the following conditions:
- (a) These gases must be packed in cylinders made of wrought iron or mild steel of the best quality, which must comply in all respects with the specifications given below. The cylinders must not exceed 8 feet in length and 10 inches in diameter.

(b) Cylinders must be separately and securely packed in strong wooden boxes or in a covering made of closely plaited 1 inch (circumference) hemp or coir, except that-

(1) Several small cylinders not exceeding 24 inches in length and 4 inches in diameter may be packed in one box, provided that each cylinder is contained in a separate compartment or separately encased in closely plaited I inch (circumference) hemp or coir. Each box must not contain more than 25 small cylinders, and the gress weight of each box and contents must not exceed 1 cwt. 2 qr.

(2) Small cylinders not exceeding 12 inches in length and 3 inches in diameter containing nitrous oxide may be packed in wickerwork baskets containing two such cylinders in separate compartments

(c) Cylinders containing compressed atmospheric air, coal gas, hydrogen, or oxygen must not be

charged to a greater pressure than 1,800 lb. per square inch.

(d) No cylinder may contain per pound of water capacity more than  $\frac{2}{3}$  lb. of carbon dioxide (carbonic acid gas),  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. of anhydrous ammonia,  $\frac{3}{4}$  lb. of nitrous oxide, or  $\frac{11}{4}$  lb. of sulphur dioxide (sulphurous acid gas), respectively:

(e) In the case of cylinders for anhydrous ammonia, the greatest pressure of gas must be assumed at 1,000 lb. per square inch, and at that pressure the stress in the metal must not exceed 6 tons per square inch for wrought iron or 7 tons per square inch for steel.

(f) Cylinders containing compressed gases must be carefully handled, and must not be placed

near a fire, or exposed to other source of heat.

(g) Compressed ammonia gas or liquefied anhydrous ammonia, compressed atmospheric air, compressed or liquefied carbonic acid gas, compressed hydrogen, and compressed oxygen may be accepted up to a maximum of two cylinders for conveyance in the rear brake van of goods trains on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, on sections of the railway where purely goods trains are scheduled to run, and conveyed in the rear brake vans of such trains, subject to a limit of two cylinders per van, provided that no other dangerous goods are loaded therein. The cylinders must be placed as far as possible from other packages in the brake van.

(h) Returned empty cylinders will bec onveyed at seventh class rate in accordance with the

conditions stated in rule 32 of the goods regulations.

(i.) No consignment of compressed gas in cylinders will be accepted for carriage by rail unless the consignor has signed a certificate in the form specified below, which must accompany the consignment, and each package is clearly marked with the name of the contents thereof.

Specifications referred to in sub-clause (a):-

Cylinders for Conveyance of Compressed Gas.

(a) Lap-welded Wrought Iron.—Greatest working pressure 120 atmospheres, or 1,800 lb. per square inch.

Stress due to working pressure not to exceed 6½ tons per square inch. Proof pressure in hydraulic test, after annealing, 224 atmospheres, or 3,360 lb. per square inch.

Permanent stretch in hydraulic test not to exceed 10 per cent. of the elastic stretch.

One cylinder in 50 to be subjected to a statical bending test, and to stand crushing nearly flat between two rounded knife edges without cracking.

(b) Lap-welded or Seamless Steel.—Greatest working pressure 120 atmospheres, or 1,800 lb. per

Stress due to working pressure not to exceed 7½ tons per square men in lap-welded, or 8 tons per square inch in seamless cylinders.

Carbon in steel not to exceed 0.25 per cent. or iron to be less than 99 per cent

Tenacity of steel to be not less than 26 or more than 33 tons per square inch. Ultimate elongation to be not less than 1 2 inches in 8 inches. Test bar to be cut from finished annealed cylinders.

Proof pressure in hydraulic test, after annealing, 224 atmospheres, or 3,360 lb. per square inch.

Permanent stretch shown by water jacket not to exceed 10 per cent. of elastic stretch.

One cylinder in 50 to be subjected to a statical bending test, and to stand crushing nearly flat between rounded knife edges without cracking.

(c) Regulations applicable to Lap-welded Wrought Iron Cylinders and to Lap-welded or Seamless Steel Cylinders.—Cylinders to be marked with a rotation number, a manufacturer's or owner's mark, an annealing mark with date, and a test mak with date. The marks to be permanent and easily visible.

Testing to be repeated at least every two years, and annealing at least every four years.

A record to be kept of all tests.

Cylinders which fail in testing to be destroyed or rendered useless.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor has, under the provisions of section 24 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," been pleased to direct that the following shall be the general conditions applicable to all Excise licences on and after July 13, 1928, from which date the general conditions applicable to all Excise licences appearing in Excise Notification No. 160 dated April 20, 1927, will be cancelled.

#### General Conditions applicable to all Excise Licences.

1. Sales at taverns (whether country liquor or foreign liquor) must be conducted in a suitable building of which the whole or part must be set aside for exclusive use as a tavern. If there are means of communication between the tavern and an adjoining dwelling house, they must be kept permanently closed. In the case of all taverns there shall be no possible means of ingress or egress except by the front door. In the case of taverns in Municipalities, Local Board towns, or towns brought under the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, No. 18 of 1892, and of "The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920," the tavern premises shall have no doors except into the main street. The interior of the tavern shall be sufficiently lighted by day and by night, and the tavern shall not be used as a place of residence, save by the vendor or a caretaker.\*

No alterations or additions shall be made to any tavern building, nor shall any wall, fence, or other enclosure be

erected without the approval of the Government Agent.

2. A signboard must be affixed to the front of each licensed distillery, brewery, wholesale warehouse, arrack renter's storehouse, bottling warehouse, or tavern (including beer and porter), showing the number and nature of the licence, the name of the licensee, and, in the case of country liquor taverns, the current rate of sale. These particulars must be legibly painted in English or the local vernacular. The licence and a printed copy of these conditions must be hung up in a conspicuous place within all licensed premises. In the case of taverns, the licence must show the names of the salesmen.

3. (1) The possession upon any licensed premises of any liquor or intoxicating drug, except that to which the licence relates, or of any essence or substance used or capable of being used for colouring or flavouring liquor, is prohibited, provided that this shall not apply to harmless substances kept or used in distilleries to flavour or colour liquor, if such

are approved by the Excise Commissioner.

(2) All liquor and intoxicating drugs sold or kept for sale shall be of good quality and unadulterated. Nothing shall be added to them, either to increase their intoxicating power or for any other purpose, provided that this shall not apply to harmless substances kept or used in distilleries to flavour or colour liquor, if such are approved by the Excise Commissioner.

(3) No licensee or renter and his tavern-keeper shall sell any liquor at a price higher than the current rate appearing

on the signboard.

4. All officers authorized to inspect licensed premises (vide condition 21 infra) are authorized to detain any liquor or in oxicating drug reasonably suspected to be unfit for consumption or use, or which they may believe to have been tampered with, and all licensees shall give all such officers all such facilities and assistance as they may require for the exercise of their powers.

5. The names of all persons proposed to be employed in godowns, warehouses, taverns or bars shall be furnished to the Assistant Commissioner of Excise, who will grant a permit authorizing the employment of such proposed persons as are approved by him, and the permit shall be exihibited in the licensed premises in which they are employed. Persons not so authorized shall not be employed. It shall be competent for the Assistant Commissioner of Excise at any time to revoke the authority.

5. (a) The sale or transport of liquor or intoxicating drugs by the following persons is prohibited:—

(i.) Those suffering from leprosy or any infectious or contagious disease.

(ii.) Those under the age of sixteen.

6. The rules regarding the hours of opening and closing places licensed for the sale of liquor are as follows:---

Toddy Taverns.—Toddy taverns shall remain open between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 r.m., and shall be kept-closed at all other hours, provided that the Government Agent may, after consulting the Advisory Committee, restrict the hours during which any particular tavern shall remain open by fixing a later hour of opening, an earlier hour of closing, or by directing that the tavern shall be kept closed for certain hours between the opening and the closing hour. The Government Agent may, after consulting the Advisory Committee, fix the opening hour of toddy taverns as early as 7 a.m., where local circumstances are found to require it, and may, in towns and, for special reasons, outside towns, extend the hour of closing any tavern therein situated to such hour as he may fix, not being later than the closing hour of arrack taverns in the same area, and shall enter such hours of opening and closing in the licence. No sale shall take place between the time at which the tavern is required to be closed at night and the time fixed for opening.

Arrack Taverns.—Arrack taverns shall remain open between the hours of 8 A.M. and 6.30 P.M., and shall be kept closed at all other hours. The Government Agent may, after consulting the Advisory Committee, either extend the hour of closing of any such taverns in towns and, for special reasons, outside towns, to such hour as he may fix, not being later than the closing hour of such taverns in April, 1917, and in no case later than 9 P.M., or restrict the hours during which a tavern shall remain open by directing that the tavern shall be kept closed for certain hours between the opening and the closing hours. The hours during which a tavern may remain open shall be entered in the licence. No sale shall take

place except during such hours.

Places licensed for the Sale of Foreign Liquor.—The hours for opening and closing will be noted on the licence by the Government Agent, provided, however, that in cases for which Excise Notification No. 76 published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 6,953 of June 28, 1918, has prescribed hours, such prescription of hours shall hold good. No sale of liquor shall take place between the hour at which the premises are required to be closed and the hour fixed for opening. Taverns (including places licensed for the sale of beer and porter only) and bars shall remain closed between the hours fixed for closing and the hour fixed for opening. The closing hour of foreign liquor taverns (including places licensed for the sale of beer and porter only) shall not be later than the closing hour of arrack taverns in the same area.

<sup>\*</sup> In taverns which are clearly of a superior character private bars may be sparingly allowed by the Government Agent under a special licence to be granted by him, free of fee; provided that the interior of the bar is wholly visible from the doorway, and that the entrance to it is either through the main door of the shop, or through a separate door clearly labelled or provided with a proper signboard to show its nature.

The licensing authority may, however, in special cases authorize licensed premises, other than taverns and places licensed for the sale of beer and porter, to be kept open to such later hour as may be fixed by him, provided that no liquor

shall be sold between the hours of closing and opening appearing in the liquor licence.

7. No drunkenness, disorder, or gaming shall be permitted in taverns and other licensed premises. licensed to sell liquor and every keeper of any licensed premises shall refuse to admit to, and shall turn out of, the premises in respect of which the licence is granted any person who is drunk, violent, quarrelsome, or disorderly, and any person whose presence on the premises would subject him to a penalty under any Ordinance for the time being in force.

8. No robbers, thieves, habitual criminals, or disorderly or riotous persons or reputed prostitutes shall be harboured in any licensed premises. Intimation of their resort thereto shall be given to the nearest Magistrate or Police Officer by

the licensee.

9. No person shall be harboured in any licensed premises between the hours of closing and opening such premises,

and no constable shall be harboured in such premises during his time of duty.

10. Taverns situated on or adjacent to the line of march must be closed, if the Government Agent so orders, while a regiment or detachment of European or Ceylonese soldiers is passing, or is encamped in the vicinity; and if the Government Agent so orders, any licensed premises must be temporarily closed in times of religious excitement, or when a disturbance exists or is apprehended. Every Excise licensee shall of his own motion close his licensed premises when there is a riot or disturbance in the neighbourhood.

(a) The Government Agent may order, at his discretion, the closure of all or any licensed premises on days 10.

of polling.

of polling.

11. The right is reserved to the Government Agent to grant "Occasional licences" for the sale of liquor on the occurrence of fairs, festivals, &c. Such licences shall ordinarily be granted to the tavern-keepers who usually supply the locality, or to the representative of the renter. Their period shall not exceed ten days, and the fees to be paid therefor shall be fixed at the discretion of the officer issuing the licences.

12. No liquor shall be sold or given-

- (a) Except at licensed premises specially approved by the Naval Commander-in-Chief or Senior Naval Officer or the Officer Commanding the Troops in the Colony or the Officer Commanding the Station or Camp, and then only in respect to such liquors as shall be approved by the same authority in consultation with the Excise authorities and specified in the licence-
  - To sailors in the Royal Navy, soldiers, and the members of their families; or

(2) To any other person living in barracks.

- (b) Whilst on duty to any-
  - (1) Member of the Police Force or Officer of the Excise Department; or

(2) Railway servant; or

- (c) To a woman for consumption within the premises of a tavern.
- (d) In any circumstances to any-
  - (1) Person under sixteen years of age; or

(2) Insane person; or

(3) Person known or believed to be intoxicated.

No privilege of manufacture, supply, or sale, or any interest therein shall be sold, transferred, or sub-rented without the Government Agent's previous permission; nor, if the Government Agent so orders, shall any agent be appointed for the management of any such privilege without his previous approval.

Taverns must be kept open, unless their temporary closure is authorized under condition 10 supra, and such supply of liquor as the Government Agent may consider sufficient to meet local requirements must be maintained therein. Taverns not opened by dates to be fixed by the Government Agent shall be liable to be resold at the risk of the licensees.

15. No liquor shall be sold in taverns except for cash. All licensees shall, subject to any special condition limiting

the quantity that may be sold, be bound to supply liquor on demand and on tender of cash to any person entitled to demand it.

16. No liquor or intoxicating drug shall be sold either below the minimum or above the maximum prices fixed for sale of the same in accordance with the law for the time being in force.

17. No liquor or intoxicating drug in excess of the quantity prescribed for possession without a licence shall be permitted to be removed by any person at any one time from any licensed premises without a valid permit; nor shall liquor or intoxicating drugs be sold at godowns or warehouse in quantities less than the minima prescribed.

18. True accounts of transactions shall be maintained from day to day in ink in forms approved by the Excise Commissioner, and shall be kept in the licensed premises. Such accounts shall be correctly and promptly totalled at the end of each month. The accounts and passes shall be in printed books, which may be obtained from any Kachcheri on payment of cost price, or on production of receipts for the payment of the cost price into a Government Treasury. Passes for liquor or intoxicating drugs received and the counterfoils of passes issued must be carefully filed in the licensed premises.

The signing of blank passes for subsequent issue is prohibited. The counterfoils of passes and, in the case of foreign liquor licences, the invoices for all receipts of liquor shall be preserved by the licensee for one year after the period covered by the licence, and shall be produced when called for by an officer not below the rank of Inspector of the Excise

The licensee shall, within three days of the expiry of the licence by surrender, cancellation, lapse of time, or any other cause, deliver to the Assistant Superintendent of the Circle in which the licensed premises were situated, all books of accounts kept under the provisions of this condition as well as the inspection note book mentioned in General Condition No. 22.

19. Such returns and information as may be required by the Excise Commissioner or by the Government Agent

from time to time shall be furnished by holders of licences.

When any weights, measures, or instruments have been prescribed for use in any licensed premises, only such weights, measures, and instruments as have been prescribed shall be possessed or used on such premises, and they shall be tested and stamped by the stamping establishment of the district, if the Government Agent shall so direct. The possession or use of weights or measures that are incorrect on any licensed premises will render the licensee liable to punishment.

The officers authorized to inspect licensed premises are-

(1) Any officer of the Revenue Department of rank not lower than a Ratemahatmaya, Mudaliyar, Muhandiram, or officer of like rank;
(2) Any officer of the Excise Department of rank not lower than Inspector; and an early a

(3) Any person appointed under section 7 (c) to perform the acts and duties mentioned in sections 32, 34, and 45 (a). (Vide Excise Notification No. 68.)

These officers are empowered to enter and examine the premises, to test weights and measures in use, and the liquor and intoxicating drugs in the possession of the licensees, to remove samples of the same, free of charge, after duly sealing them in presence of the licensees, for purposes of chemical analysis where there is reason to test quality or strength, and to call for and check the accounts kept in the licensed premises, and to do any other acts which may be necessary to carry out the duty of ensuring the observance by the licensee of the provisions of the Excise Ordinance and of the conditiona attaching to the licence. In regard to taverns (including premises licensed for the sale of beer and porter only) such officers are further empowered to examine any private documents or books within the premises, and, if any offence is disclosed thereby to seize and remove such documents or books. All licensees shall give to all such officers all such facilities and assistance as they may require for the exercise of their powers. Nothing in this condition shall be interpreted as depriving Police Officers of any powers vested in them by law, and no claim shall lie for compensation for the value of such samples.

22. An inspection notebook with the pages numbered consecutively shall be kept by the licensee in the licensed premises for the entry in it by Inspecting Officers of their remarks, and be handed over to the Superintendent or Assistant

Superintendent of Excise, or any officer authorized by him to receive it, on a receipt being given therefor.

23. Licensees are bound to report to the Government Agent all instances which come to their knowledge of persons employed by them in the manufacture, transport, or sale of liquor and intoxicating drugs committing breaches of the Excise laws, and to comply with the Government Agent's orders respecting the continued employment of such persons. No persons who have been convicted under the Ceylon Penal Code or under "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," shall be employed in the transport or sale of liquor and intoxicating drugs without the Government Agent's previous permission. 24. Pecuniary dealings of any kind whatever by licensees with officials of the Excise Department are absolutely prohibited.

25. All licensed premises, and all vessels, measures, and other articles used for the storage or sale of liquor therein,

shall be kept scrupulously clean.

26. All licensees shall be bound by any additional general rules that may be prescribed under the Excise law, and if so required by the Government Agent or any officer authorized by him, to deliver up their licences for amendment or for the issue of fresh ones.

27. The possession (save under and in accordance with the law applicable to unlicensed persons) or sale by any licensee of any excisable article elsewhere than at the premises to which his licence refers is prohibited.

28. In no case shall an arrack or toddy renter or a licensee of a foreign liquor tavern, either personally or by an

agent, transport from his tavern any quantity of liquor that may have been sold without a special permit from the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent.

29. All vessels at arrack renters' storehouse, arrack taverns, toddy taverns, and beer and porter shops used for

storing or for transport of liquor shall have their correct capacities marked in terms of gallons, and be provided with

accurate dip-rods to ascertain the correct quantities they hold.

Dip-rods for casks and other receptacles, shall be kept in the licensed premises and renters shall provide duplicate keys of each cask, which shall remain in the custody of the Assistant Superintendent of Excise.

"THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, 1927."

postage stamps and stamped stationery.

3. There shall be three classes of licences, A, B, and C. The class of licence to be issued to any applicant shall be left to the discretion of the Postmaster-General.

No commission shall be payable to holders of licences of Class A. Commission at the rate of

(a) 1 per cent to a holder of a licence of Class B;

(b)  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent to a holder of a licence of Class C;

shall be granted on purchase by him of 9-cent postage stamps, or of stamps of a lower denomination, or of stamped stationery, of a total value of Rs. 50 at any one time from a post office. Provided, however, that the maximum amount of commission allowed during any week to a holder of a licence of Class B shall be Rs. 5 and the maximum amount of commission allowed during any month to a holder of a licence of Class C shall be Rs. 5.

All persons authorized to sell stamps and stamped stationery shall sell them to the public at the following

#### PILGRIMAGE TO THE DEWUNDERA DEWALE.

Rules made under Pilgrimages Ordinance, No. 13 of 1896.

1. The duration of the stay at Dondra of pilgrims to the Dewundera Dewale shall be restricted to a period of twelve days, namely, July 30 to August 10, 1928. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the

period herein prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

In the event of any disease of a contagious, infectious, or epidemic nature breaking out at Dondra or in its vicinity before or during the pilgrimage or at any other place in the Southern Province, from which, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, it is likely to be conveyed to Dondra during the pilgrimage, it shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent to prohibit the pilgrimage or to declare the pilgrimage at an end, and to direct all visitors to leave Dondra at once, and return to their homes, and to prescribe the routes by which they shall travel. Any person disobeying the order of the Assistant Government Agent shall be guilty of an offence.

3. Any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, and not forthwith reporting the same to the Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence to the senior officer of Police present at Dondra, and any person

abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be guilty of an offence.

4. Any person selling meat, fish, or fresh vegetables at Dondra during the continuance of the pilgrimage in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board, and any person selling meat, food, or drink of any kind condemned as unwholesome by a Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence by the Mudaliyar or senior officer of Police present at Dondra, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the erection of proper latrine accommodation on a site, and of a type approved by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board sufficient to last during the continuance of the pilgrimage, for which purpose he shall forward plans and specifications for the approval of the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman, Sanitary Board, at least ten days before the pilgrimage commences. He shall further be responsible for the supply of coir dust, or sand, and disinfectants of a quality approved by the Assistant Government Agent, and for the proper conservancy and cleaning of the latrines at least twice a day during the continuance of the pilgrimage. In the event of the proprietor or lessee contravening any of the provisions of this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Any person who shall during the pilgrimage use any other place for the offices of nature than that set apart for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Sanitary Board or the proprietor or lessee of the grounds used in

connection with the pilgrimage, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the collection and removal of all straw, rubbish, cattle dung, or any kind of litter at least once every day during the continuance of the pilgrimage, and such rubbish and litter shall be burned or buried at a place approved by the Assistant Government Agent or the Chairman of the Sanitary Board. Any proprietor or lessee failing to carry out or to cause to be carried out the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

8. No booth or other building for the purpose of the pilgrimage shall be erected at Dondra within a space of 12 feet from the side drain of the main road from Matara to Tangalla, and no stall-holder, vendor, or betel-seller shall expose any article for sale within such space. Any person contravening this regulation shall be guilty of an offence:

9. No booth or other building shall be erected at Dondra on such portion of the ground as may be reserved by the Assistant Government Agent, Matara, for the accommodation of visitors or vehicles. Any person contravening the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

#### VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 7, 1928.

-The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 178 (3 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 102 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 25 Moors, 9 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1928, viz., 263,249) was 35.4, as against 32.4 in the preceding week, 26.9 in the corresponding week of last year and 32.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 143 (3 Burghers, 75 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 25 Moors, 1 Malay, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 28 4, as against 32 6 in the previous week, 29 3 in the corresponding

week of last year and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 143 total deaths, 27 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 18.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-three deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 13 in Maradana hospitals; including 5 deaths of non-residents, two each in San Sebastian and Kotahena North, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 31 in the preceding week and 19 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twelve deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, and I each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta South, as against 14 in the

preceding week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from Bronchitis were registered, I each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana hospital, and Maradana North, as against 4 in the preceding week and 3 the weekly average for last year. 2. (a) Ten deaths from Phthisis were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals, including 3 of non-residents, 2 in Kotahona South, and one each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 17 in the preceding

week and 11 the weekly average for last year. (b) Two deaths from Phthisis of residents of Colombo Town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama,

during the week. 3. Two deaths from Enteric Fever including 1 of a non-resident were registered in Maradana hospitals, same as the number in the previous week and the weekly average for last year.

4. Thirteen deaths from Debility were registered, 10 from Enteritis, 7 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 from Diarrhoea: 3 each from Dysentery and Tetanus, 2 each from Worms, Puerperal Septicaemia, and Accidents, and 44 from Other Causes which include 3 cases of judicial hanging.

(a) One death from Cholera occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, the deceased was stated to be a resident of Colombo harbour.

5. Thirty-three cases of Chickenpox, 12 of Measles, 3 of Enteric Fever, and 1 case of Cholera were reported during

the week, as against 19, 1, 2, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.6°, against 82.7° in the preceding week and 80.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.788 in., against 29.796 in. in the preceding week and 29 857 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4 87 in., against 1 37 in. in the preceding week, and 1 43 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

#### ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF LUNUVA TRUSTEES, LIMITED.

Is agreed as follows:

the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

(b) The sub-headings in these Articles shall not be deemed to be part of or affect the construction of these presents.

2. Power to alter the Regulations.—The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.

3. None of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or be lent on the security of shares of the Company.

#### INTERPRETATION.

4. Interpretation Clause.—In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context:-

Company.—The word "Company" means "Lunuva Trustees, Limited," incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The Ordinance.—The "Ordinance" means and includes "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinances, 1861 to 1919,"

and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

Special Resolution.—"Special resolution" has the meaning assigned thereto by the Ordinance.

Extraordinary Resolution.—"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number

and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present at any meeting of the Company of which notice specifying an intention to propose such resolution as an extraordinary resolution has been duly given.

These Presents.—"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

\*Capital.—"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the

Company.

-" Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

Shareholder.—" Shareholder" means a Shareholder of the Company.

Presence or Present.—With regard to a Shareholder "presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by proxy or by attorney duly authorized.

\*Directors.\*—" Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors

assembled at a Board.

Board.—"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board Meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

\*Dividend.\*—"Dividend." includes bonus.

\*Persons.\*—"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated

by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

Office.—"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

Seal.—"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

Month.—"Month" means a calendar month.

In Writing and Written.—"In writing" and "written" include printing, lithography, and other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form.

Singular and Plural Number.—Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and vice versa. Masculine and Feminine Gender.—Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine and

5. Subject to the preceding Article any words defined in the Ordinance shall, if not inconsistent with the subject or context, bear the same meaning in these presents.

#### BUSINESS.

6. Commencement of Business.—The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established or any one or more of them and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and notwithstanding that the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, they shall do so as soon as in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

Issue and Allotment.—The shares, except where otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of

premium as they may consider proper.

10. Commission and Brokerage for placing Shares, &c.—The Directors may at any time pay a commission to any person for subscribing or agreeing to subscribe (whether absolutely or conditionally) for any shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company, or procuring or agreeing to procure subscriptions (whether absolute or conditional) for any shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company. Such commission may, if thought fit, be paid in fully paid shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company. The Directors may also pay such brokerage as may be lawful.

11. Payment of Amount of Shares by Instalments.—If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or

part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company

by the holder of the share.

12. Acceptance.—Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Directors from time to time direct.

13. Payment.—Payment for shares shall be made in such manner as the Directors shall from time to time determine and direct.

14. Trusts or any Interest in Share other than that of Registered Holder not recognized.—The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except an absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof.

#### INCREASE OF CAPITAL.

15. Increase of Capital by Creation of New Shares.—The Company in General Meeting may, by special resolution from time to time, increase the capital by creation of new shares of such amount per share and in the aggregate, and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

Issue of new Shares.—The new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto, as the special resolution creating the same or in default the Board shall direct. The Directors shall have power to add to such new shares such an

amount of premium as they may consider proper.

Same as Original Capital.—Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the provisions herein contained with reference to the payments of calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise.

#### REDUCTION OF CAPITAL AND SUBDIVISION OR CONSOLIDATION OF SHARES.

Reduction of Capital and Subdivision or Consolidation of Shares.—The Company in General Meeting may, by special resolution, reduce the capital in such manner as such special resolution shall direct, and may, by special resolution, subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company or any of them.

#### SHARE CERTIFICATES.

19. Certificates how issued.—Every Shareholder shall be entitled to one certificate for all the shares registered in his name, or to several certificates, each for one or more of such shares. Every certificate shall specify the distinctive number of the share in respect of which it is issued, and the amount paid thereon.

20. Certificates to be under Seal of Company.—The certificates of shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company.

Renewal of Certificate.—If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then upon production thereof to the Directors. they may order the same to be cancelled, and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof shall be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents together with the amount of any costs and expenses which the Company has incurred in connection with the matter shall be payable for such new certificate.

#### TRANSFER OF SHARES.

Exercise of Rights,—No person shall exercise any right of a Shareholder until his name shall have been entered in the register of Shareholders, and he shall have paid all calls and other moneys for the time being payable on every share. in the Company held by him.

Transfer of Shares.—Subject to the restriction of these Articles, any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares by instrument in writing. No transfer of shares shall be made without the previous sanction in writing of the

Directors.

- 24. No Transfer to Minor or Person of Unsound Mind.—No transfer of shares shall be made to a minor or person of unsound mind.
- Register of Transfers.—The Company shall keep a book or books, to be called "The Register of Transfers," in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.
- 26. Instrument of Transfer.—The instrument of transfer of any share shall be signed both by the transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register in respect thereof.

27. Board may decline to register Transfers.—The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion,

decline to register any transfer of shares.

28. Not bound to state Reason.—In no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the

Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declination shall be absolute.

29. Registration of Transfer.—Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Rs. 2.50, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid; and the reupon the Directors subject to the powers vested in them by Articles 27, 28, and 30, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

Directors may authorize Registration of Transferees.—The Directors may by such means as they shall deem. expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors

for that purpose.

31. Directors not bound to inquire as to Validity of Transfer.—In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but, if at all, upon the transferee only.

32. Transfer Books when to be closed.—The transfer books may be closed during the fourteen days immediately

preceding each Ordinary General Meeting, including the First Ordinary General Meeting; also when a dividend is declared, for the three days next ensuing the meeting; also at such other times as the Directors may decide, not exceeding in

whole twnety-one days in any one year.

#### TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

Title to Shares of Deceased Holder.—The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to shares of such Shareholder.

#### Borrowing Powers.

34. Power to Borrow.—The Directors may from time to time at their discretion borrow or secure the payment of any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company.

#### MEETINGS.

35. First General Meeting.—The First General Meeting of the Company shall be held at such time, not being more. than twelve months after the registration of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

36. Subsequent General Meetings.—Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time

and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is prescribed, at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors.

Ordinary and Extraordinary General Meetings.—The General Meetings mentioned in the two last preceding clauses shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

Extraordinary General Meetings.—The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General 38.

Meeting. Any General Meeting (whether ordinary or extraordinary) convened by the Directors, unless the time thereof shall have been fixed by the Company in General Meeting, may be postponed by the Directors by notice in writing, and the meeting shall subject to any further postponement or adjournment be held at the postponed date for the purpose of transacting the business covered by the original notice.

40. Seven days' notice of Meeting to be given.—Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given either by advertisement in the Ceylon Government Gazette, or by notice sent by post, or otherwise served as hereinafter provided, but an accidental omission to give such notice to any Shareholder shall not invalidate

the proceedings at any General Meeting.

41. Business requiring and not requiring Notification.—Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and consider the profit and loss account (if any), the balance sheet of the Company, the reports of the Directors and Auditors, to elect Directors, Auditors, and other officers in place of those retiring, to fix the remuneration of the Directors and Auditors, to sanction and declare dividends, and to transact any business which under these presents ought to be transacted at an Ordinary General Meeting, and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatever of which special mention shall have been made in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was  ${\bf c}$ onvened.

Notice of other Business to be given.—With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Article, as to the business 42. which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice

or notices upon which it was convened.

43. Quorum to be Present.—No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or the election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present in person at the commencement of the business two or more persons being Shareholders entitled to vote, or persons being proxies

or attorneys of Shareholders entitled to vote.

44. If a Quorum not present, Meeting to be dissolved or adjourned; Adjourned Meeting to transact Business. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, the required number of persons shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and no notice of such adjournment need be given, and, if at such adjourned meeting a quorum be not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

45. Chairman of Directors or a Director to be Chairman of General Meeting; in case of their Absence or Refusal, a Shareholder may act.—The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; but if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

46. Business confined to Election of Chairman while Chair vacant.—No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting except the election of a Chairman whilst the chair is vacant.

47. Chairman with Consent may adjourn Meeting.—The Chairman, with the consent of the meeting, may adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice shall

Minutes of General Meetings .- Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so

entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

#### VOTING AT MEETINGS.

Votes.—At any meeting every resolution shall in the first instance be decided by a show of hands. In case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder, and unless a poll be immediately demanded by the Chairman or in writing by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

Poll.—If a poll be duly demanded, the same shall be taken in such manner, and at such time and place as the Chairman shall direct, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business

other than the question on which a poll has been demanded. The demand for a poll may be withdrawn.

51. Poll how taken.—If at any meeting a poll be demanded by the Chairman or by a notice in writing signed by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, which notice shall be delivered during the meeting to the Chairman, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided, and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been taken shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

52. No Poll on Election of Chairman or on Question of Adjournment.—No poll shall be demanded on the election

of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

53. Voting in Person or by Proxy or Attorney.—Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney

duly authorized.

54. Number of Votes to which Shareholder entitled.—On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person or by attorney duly authorized shall have one vote only. In case of a poll every Shareholder present in person or by proxy or attorney shall have one vote for every one share held by him.

Non-Shareholder not to be appointed Proxy; but Attorney though not Shareholder may vote. - No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a Shareholder of the Company, but the attorney of a Shareholder, even though not himself

a Shareholder of the Company, may represent and vote for his principal at any meeting of the Company.



56. Instrument of Proxy to be in Writing.—Every instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney duly authorized in writing, or if such appointor is a corporation under the common seal, or under the hand of some attorney duly authorized in writing in that behalf.

57. When Instrument of Proxy to be deposited.—The instrument appointing a proxy, with the letter or power of attorney (if any) under which it is signed, shall be deposited at the office at least forty-eight hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting, as the case may be, at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote; otherwise the person so named shall not be entitled to vote in respect thereof. No instrument appointing a proxy shall be valid after the expiration of twelve months from the date of its execution.

When Power of Attorney to be deposited .- The power of attorney under which a person proposes to vote shall be deposited at the office for registration in the books of the Company at least forty-eight hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting, as the case may be, at which the person named in such power of attorney

proposes to vote, otherwise the person so named shall not be entitled to vote in respect thereof.

59. Form of Instrument of Proxy.—Every instrument of proxy, whether for a specified meeting or otherwise, shall, as nearly as circumstances will admit, be in the form or to the effect following:—

60. Objection to Validity of Vote to be made at the Meeting or Poll.—No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) except at the meeting or poll at which such vote shall be tendered, and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

61. No Shareholder to be prevented from Voting by being Personally interested in Result.-No Shareholder shall be

prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

#### DIRECTORS.

62. Number of Directors.—The number of Directors shall never be less than four nor more than six. In the event of the number of Directors in Ceylon ever being reduced to one, such remaining Director shall immediately cause to be convened an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Shareholders for the purpose of filling up one or more of the vacancies; but, in the event of a quorum of Shareholders not attending such meeting, the remaining Director shall himself appoint a Director to fill one of the vacancies. Any Director so appointed shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting of the Company. Until such appointment the remaining Director shall not act except for the purpose of appointing another, and if necessary enabling him to be placed on the register of Shareholders.

63. Qualification of Directors.—It shall not be necessary for a Director to hold any qualification.

64. Remuneration of Directors.—The Directors shall be entitled to be repaid all travelling, hotel, and other expenses

properly incurred by them in or with a view to the performance of their duties as Directors including their expense of travelling to and from Board Meetings, but shall be entitled to no remuneration for their services as Directors.

65. Appointment of First Directors and Duration of their Office.—The first Directors shall be Herbert George Parton Maddocks of Colombo, John William Thompson of Colombo, Angus Edward Ogilvy of Hopton Group, Passara, and John

Craig of Unugalla Group, Badulla.

66. Appointment of Successors to Directors.—The General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation, shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent Ordinary General Meeting. No person, not being a retiring Director, shall, unless recommended by the Directors for election, be eligible for election to the office of Director at any General Meeting, unless he or some other Shareholder intending to propose him, has at least seven clear days before the meeting, deposited, at the office a notice in writing under his hand sign fying his candidature for the appointment or the intention of such Shareholder to propose him.

67. Board may fill up Vacancies.—The Board shall have power at any time and from time to time before the First

Ordinary General Meeting to supply any vacancies in their number arising from death, resignation, or otherwise.

68. Duration of Office of Director appointed to Vacancy.—Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors subsequent to the First Ordinary General Meeting may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

69. To retire Annually.—At the First Ordinary General Meeting and at the Ordinary General Meeting in every

year the whole of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office.

70. Retiring Directors eligible for Re-election.—Each of the retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

71. Number of Directors how Increased or Reduced.—The Company may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also determine in what rotation such increased or reduced number shall go out of office.

72. If Election not made, Retiring Directors to continue.—If at any meeting at which an election of Directors ought to take place, the places of all the Directors are not filled up, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place and if at the adjourned meeting the places of all the Directors are not filled up all the Directors or such of them as have not had their places filled up shall be deemed to have been re-elected at the adjourned

Resignation of Directors.—A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary, or by depositing the same at the office, or by tendering his written resignation

at a meeting of the Directors.

74. A Director shall be capable of contracting and participating in the profits of any contract with the Company in the same manner as if he were not a Director, subject nevertheless to the following provisions, namely: (1) Before the contract is entered into, or so soon thereafter as he becomes interested therein, he shall disclose in writing to the Board his interest in the contract, and (2) after he has become interested, he shall not vote in respect of the contract or any matter arising threout, and if he do so vote his vote shall not be counted.

When Office of Director to be vacated.—The office of Director shall, ipso facto, be vacated—

(a) If he resign his office by writing under his hand left at the office.

(b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent or suspend payment or file a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compound with his creditors.

(c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he become incapable of acting.

(d) If he cease to ordinarily reside in Ceylon or be absent from Ceylon for a period of six consecutive months. Provided that until an entry of his office having been so vacated be made in the minutes of the Board, his acts as a Director shall be as effectual as if his office were not vacated. . 76. How Directors removed and Successors appointed.—The Company may, by an extraordinary resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

#### INDEMNITY.

77. The Directors, Managing Director, Managers, Agents, Auditors, Secretaries, and other officers or servants for the time being of the Company, and the Trustees (if any) for the time being acting in relation to any of the affairs of the Company, and every of them, and every of their heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified and secured harmless out of the assets and profits of the Company from and against all actions, costs, charges, losses, damages, and expenses which they or any of them, their or any of their heirs, executors, or administrators shall or may incur or sustain by or by reason of any contract entered into or any act done, concurred in, or omitted in or about the execution of their duty or supposed duty in their respective offices or trusts, except such (if any) as they shall incur or sustain by or through their own wilful act, neglect, or default respectively, and none of them shall be answerable for the acts, receipts, neglects, or defaults of the other or others of them, or for joining in any receipt for the sake of conformity, or for any bankers or other persons with whom any moneys or effects belonging to the Company shall or may be lodged or deposited for safe custody, or for any bankers, brokers, or other persons into whose hands any property or money of the Company may come, or for any defect of title of the Company to any property purchased, or for insufficiency or deficiency of or defect of title of the Company to any security upon which any moneys of or belonging to the Company shall be placed out or invested, or for any loss, misfortune, or damage resulting from any such cause as aforesaid, or which may happen in the execution of their respective offices or trusts, or in relation thereto, except the same shall happen by or through their own wilful neglect or default respectively.

78. No Contribution to be required from Directors beyond Amount, if any, unpaid on their Shares.—No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in

respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

#### Powers of Directors.

79. To manage Business of Company and pay Preliminary Expenses, &c.—The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors, either by themselves or through a Managing Director, or with the assistance of an Agent or Agents, and Secretary or Secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors for such period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors may pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in connection with the placing of the shares of the Company, and in and about the valuation, purchase, or acquisition of any shares, stocks, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, obligations, securities, and any other property which the Company is authorized to acquire and in and about the investment of moneys, and in or about the working and business of the The Directors shall have power to make and they may make such regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper.

80. To appoint Proctors and Attorneys.—The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the busienss of the Company, on such terms as

they may consider proper, and from time to time to revoke such appointment.

81. To open Banking Accounts and operate thereon, &c.—The Directors shall have power to open on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

82. To sell and dispose of Company's Property, &c.—If shall be lawful for the Directors if authorized so to do

by an extraordinary resolution of the Shareholders in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, lands, and effects of the Company or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or person, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or a special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

83. General Powers.—The Directors shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedinet; and in addition to the powers and authorities by the Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, clerks, assistants, artizans, and workers, and generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by the Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by the Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the Ordinance and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may, from time to time, be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulation made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made. The generality of the powers conferred by any article in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any article conferring any special or expressed power.

84. Special Powers.—In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice to, the general powers conferred

or implied in the last preceding article, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared

that the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say):

(1) To institute, conduct, defend, compound, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or legal proceedings by or against the Company, or its officers or otherwise concerning the affairs of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due and of any claims and demands by or against the Company

(2) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform the

awards.

(3) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges, for money payable to the Company and for claims and demands of the Company.

(4) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents with power to accept

the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, inspector, or any similar office.

(5) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, subject to the provisions of Article 3 hereof, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to tiem to vary or release such investments.

(6) From time to time to provide for the management of the affairs of the Company abroad in such manner as they think fit, and to establish any local boards or agencies for managing any of the affairs of the Company abroad and to appoint any persons to be members of such local board or any managers

or agents and to fix their remuneration.

(7) From time to time and at any time to delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon or elsewhere, all or any of the powers hereby made exercisable by the Directors, except those relating to shares and any others as to which special provisions inconsistent with such delegation are herein contained; and they shall have power to fix the remuneration of and at any time to remove such Director or other person or company and to annul or vary any such delegation. They shall not, however, be entitled to delegate any powers of borrowing or charging the property of the Company to any agent of the Company or other person except by instrument in writing, which shall specifically state the extent to which such powers may be used by the person or persons to whom they are so delegated, and compliance therewith shall be a condition precedent to the exercise of these powers.

#### PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

85. Meeting of Directors.—The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business; until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

A Director may summon Meetings of Directors.—A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

Who is to preside at Meetings of Board.—The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors, the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

88. Questions at Meetings how decided.—Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be

decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote in addition

to his vote as a Director.

89. Acts of Board valid notwithstanding Informal Appointment.—The acts of the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy therein or defect in the appointment of any Director be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if every person had been duly appointed provided the same be done before the discovery of the defect.

90. Resolution in uriting by all the Directors as valid as if passed at a Meeting of Directors.—A resolution in writing signed in approval by all the Directors for the time being resident in Ceylon shall be as vaild und effectual as if it had been

passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted provided that not fewer than four Directors shall sign it.

91. Minutes of Precedings of the Company and the Directors to be recorded.—The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of the following matters, videlice:—

(a) Of all appointments of officers made by the Directors.

(b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors.
(c) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings.

(d) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors.

(e) Of all orders made by the Directors.

(f) Of the use of the Company's seal.

92. Signature of Minutes of proceedings and effect thereof.—All such minutes shall be signed by the person or one of the persons who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting or the Board Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person or one of the persons who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting or Board Meeting respectively; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting or Board Meeting respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be prima facie evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and the regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

#### COMPANY'S SEAL.

93. The use of the Seal.—The seal of the Company shall not be used or affixed to any deed certificate of shares or other instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors or of one Director and the Secretaries of the Company, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized Manager, Attorney, or Agent of the said firm, signing the firm name or the firm name per procurationem or signing for and on behalf of the said firm as such Secretaries, and in the event of a company whether domiciled or incorporated in the Island of Ceylon or elsewhere being the Secretaries, being signified by a Director or the Secretary or the duly authorized attorney of such company signing for and on behalf of such company as Secretaries. The sealing shall not be attested by one person in the dual capacity of Director and representative of the Secretaries. Any instrument sealed with the seal of the Company and signed by two or more Directors. or by one Director and the Secretaries of the Company shall be presumed to be duly executed.

#### ACCOUNTS.

94. What Accounts to be kept.—The Secretaries for the time being or, if there be no Secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such receipt and expenditure take place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs,

and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company; and the accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the office as the Directors think fit.

95. Accounts how and when open to Inspection.—The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations the accounts and books of the Company or any of them shall be opened to the inspection of the Shareholders; and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by the Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

96. Profit and Loss Account and Balance Sheet to be furnished to General Meeting.—At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a profit and loss account and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company for the period since the preceding account and balance sheet or in the case of the first account and balance sheet since the incorporation of the Company made up to a date not more than six months before such meeting.

- 97. Report to accompany Statement.—Every such account and balance sheet shall be accompanied by a report of the Directors as to the state and condition of the Company, and as to the amount which they recommend to be paid out of the profits by way of dividend to the Shareholders, and the account, balance sheet, and report shall be signed by the Directors.
- 98. Copy of Balance Sheet to be sent to Shareholders.—A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

#### DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

- 99. Division of Profits.—Subject to the rights of holders of shares issued upon special conditions and to any arrangement that may be made by the Company to the contrary and subject as to shares not fully paid up to any special arrangement made as regards money paid in advance of calls and subject to the provisions of these presents as to reserve fund, the profits of the Company shall be divisible among the Shareholders in proportion to the capital paid or credited as paid on the shares held by them respectively.
- 100. Declaration of Dividends.—The Company in General Meeting may declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders according to their rights and interests in the profits and may fix the time for payment. Provided always that if shares shall have been issued during the course of a financial year, the holder thereof shall subject to any arrangement made by the Directors to the contrary only be entitled to have paid to him in respect of dividends on such shares, a proportionate part of the dividends for such financial year calculated on the proportionate part of the year from the date on which such shares were allotted treating such dividends as earned rateably over the whole year. No dividend shall be payable out of the capital of the Company and the declaration of the Board as to the amount available for dividend shall be conclusive. No dividend shall exceed the amount recommended from time to time by the Board, but the Company in General Meeting may declare a smaller dividend.
- 101. Interim Dividend.—The Directors may, also if they think fit, from time to time and at any time, without the sanction of a General Meeting, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year.
- shares, they may set aside out of the profits of the Company, such sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and may invest the same in such securities as they shall think fit (subject to the provisions of Article 3 hereof) or place the same on fixed deposit in any bank or banks, and may from time to time deal with, vary, or realize such securities and dispose of all or any part thereof for the benefit of the Company. The Directors may divide the reserve fund into such special funds as they think fit, with full power to employ the assets constituting the reserve fund in the business of the Company, and that without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets, and the Directors may also carry forward any profits which they may deem it not prudent to divide.
- 103. Application thereof.—The Directors may from time to time apply such portions as they think fit of the reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for the payment of accumulated dividends due on preference shares or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company or for repairing or maintaining or extending the buildings and premises or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purpose of the Company which they may from time to time deem expedient.

#### Audit.

- 104. Accounts to be Audited.—The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the profit and loss account and balance sheet ascertained by one or more auditor or auditors.
- 105. Qualification of Auditor.—No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but an Auditor shall not be debarred from acting as a Professional Accountant in doing any special work for the Company which the Directors may deem necessary, It shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or Officer of the Company shall, during his continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.
- 106. Appointment and Retirement of Auditor.—The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor of the Company and fix his remuneration; all future Auditors, except as is hereinafter mentioned, shall be appointed at the Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and shall hold their office only until the next Ordinary General Meeting after their respective appointments, or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.
  - 107. Retiring Auditor eligible or Re-election.—Retiring Auditor shall be eligible for re-election.
- 108. Remuneration of Auditors.—The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.
- 109. Casual Vacancy in Number of Auditors how filled up.—If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor shall not be supplied at any Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur, the Directors shall (subject to the approval of the next Ordinary General Meeting) fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person who shall hold the office until such meeting.
- 110. Duty of Auditor.—Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the profit and loss account and balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto and to report thereon to the meeting generally or specially as he may think fit.
- 111. Company's Accounts to be open to Auditors for Audit.—All accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company shall at all times be open to the Auditors for the purpose of audit.

#### Notices.

- 112. Notices how Authenticated.—Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Secretaries, or other persons appointed by the Board to do so.
- 113. Shareholders to register Address.—Every Shareholder shall furnish the Company with an address in Ceylon, which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.
- 114. Service of Notices.—A notice may be served by the Company upon any Shareholder, either personally or by sending it through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to such Shareholder at his registered address or place of abode; and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served for all purposes, notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed be dead, unless his executors or administrators shall have given to the Directors, or to the Secretaries of the Company, their own or some other address in Ceylon.
- 115. Date and Proof of Service.—Any notice if served by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which the letter containing the same would in ordinary course of post have been delivered at its address, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into a post box or posted at a post office, and the entry in the Company's books of the leaving or sending by post of any notice at or to such address shall be sufficient evidence thereof, and no further evidence shall be necessary.

Non-resident Shareholders must register Address in Ceylon.—Every Shareholder resident out of Ceylon shell name and register in the books of the Company an address within Ceylon at which all notices shall be served upon his and all notices served at such address shall be deemed to be well served. #### ARBITRATION.

118. EVIDENCE.

120. expressly entitle such shares to participate in such surplus assets.

122. Payments in Specie, and vesting in Trustees, Right of Contributory to Dissent, &c.—If the Company shall be wound up, the liquidator, whether voluntary or official, may with the sanction of an extraordinary resolution, divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may, with their sanction, vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator, with like sanction, shall think fit, and if thought expedient any such division may be otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the Shareholders of the Company, and in particular any class may be given preferential or special rights or may be excluded altogether or in part, and the liquidator shall be entitled to sell all or any of the assets of the Company in consideration of or in exchange for shares, ordinary, fully paid, part paid, or preference in the purchasing company, but in ease any division otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories shall be determined on or any sale made of any or all of the assets of the Company in exchange for shares in the purchasing company either ordinary, fully paid or part paid, or preference, any contributory who would be prejudiced thereby shall have a right to dissent as if such determination were a special resolution passed pursuant to section 192 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act of 1908 in England, but for the purposes of an arbitration as in sub-section (6) of the said section, provided the provisions of the Ceylon Arbitration Ordinance, 1866, and/or of the Civil Procedure Code, 1889, shall apply in place of the English and Scottish Acts referred to in the said sub-section (6) of section 192 of the aforewritten Companies (Consolidation) Acts referred to in the said sub-section (6) of section 192 of the aforewritten Companies (Consolidation) and the said section 192, save as herein excepted, shall be deemed to be part and parcel of these present Articles.

#### NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE.

THE following Specifications have been accepted:—

Eric Charles Cameron.

Improvements in and relating to machinery for the manufacture or treatment of tea and the like.

Abstract.—In tea rolling machines a pencil is attached by levers to the part of a roller having vertical movement and makes a trace on a rotating sheet of paper driven by the roller. A worm wheel attached to the roller rotates and drives a spur wheel which actuates a lever and causes a pin to prick the paper and mark out equal intervals of time.

A second pin is attached by levers to a pendulum, so that when the roller rotates the pendulum does the same and the centrifugal force lowers the pin: when the roller stops, the pendulum falls and the pin prick the paper.

- 1. In machinery for the manufacture and treatment of tea, apparatus characterized by a pendulum mounted at the end of a horizontal arm fixed to a vertical hollow spindle which is caused to revolve when the said apparatus is attached to the principal moving part of a Tea Roller, and thereby operates, through suitable gear comprising for example, a worm and worm wheel and rocking arms and the like, two needles that prick dots in a card or the like, for the purpose of recording the performance of the said Tea Roller in respect of the period that it is kept working and the time when it is stopped substantially as described and illustrated.
- 2. In machinery for the manufacture and treatment of tea, apparatus as claimed in Claim 1 further provided with a lever and rocking arms or the like which are operated by connection with that part of a Tea Roller which moves when the pressure on the tea being rolled is changed and which cause a pencil to move with rectilinear motion on the aforesaid card or the like and to draw lines thereon for the purpose of recording changes of pressure on the tea in a Tea Roller and of indicating the degree of such changes of pressure, substantially as described and illustrated.
- Apparatus as claimed in the preceding claims, characterized and constructed and mounted substantially as described and illustrated, for the purpose of indicating and recording by a diagram of pricked dots and pencil lines the period during which a Tea Roller is kept at work and the times when it is stopped, the periods during which the pressure on the tea being rolled is maintained, and the times it is changed, as well as the degree of such changes of pressure.

Improvements in or relating to aerials and aerial systems for use in wireless telegraphy and telephony.

Abstract.—In Patent 2,148 the radiation from alternate half wave lengths was suppressed or annulled: in the present application it is cut down to about 30 per cent. of the current in the radiating elements instead of completely suppressing it.

The claims are :--

- 1. An improvement in or modification of the invention contained in the specification of Patent No. 2,148 of 1925, and consisting of an aerial for wireless transmission or reception, electrically long in comparison with the wave length employed, characterized in this that radiation from alternate half wave lengths is suppressed or reduced so as to be substantially less than the radiation from the other half wave lengths each for each.
- An aerial as claimed in Claim 1, characterized in that the radiation from alternative half wave lengths is suppressed so as to be not more than 35 per cent. of the radiation from the other half wave lengths each to each.
- 3. An aerial system comprising a plurality of aerials as claimed in either of Claims 1 or 2, coupled and/or connected together so that currents in any of the said aerials induce currents of the same phase and frequency in others of the said aerials.

21 3 14 1 12 Improved apparatus for treating or conditioning water intended for steam boilers or the like.

Abstract.—The ordinary laboratory water pump is adapted for the purpose described.

The claims are :-

- 1. A device for feeding chemical solution or the like to the water supply in a pipe, water column or the like for the purpose of treating or conditioning the said water to prevent or reduce the formation of scale, corrosion, foaming or priming in steam boilers, water heaters or the like, said device being operable by the flow of water and consisting of a bye pass or portion wherein a portion of the said flow passes from a channel of larger area into one of smaller area or through a restriction, and thereafter discharge through an orifice into a part or chamber of larger sectional area, causing thereby in flowing a reduction of pressure or partial vacuum adjacent to, or behind and outside the mouthpiece of, said orifice, a pipe or connection from the chemical tank or reservoir leading to said area of reduced pressure or partial vacuum, which reduction of pressure, or partial vacuum, or suction caused thereby, is utilized to cause the desired chemical to be sucked up and to mingle with the water discharging from the said orifice to be carried forward thereby to mingle later with the main stream.
- A device for supplying chemical solutions or the like to steam boilers, water heaters or the like for the purposes explained, which consists in providing a jet pump operable by the flow of water in the main supply, said jet pump having a connection led to it from the chemical solution tank, which connection leads said solution to the part of the passage in the vicinity of the jet where there is a reduced pressure or partial vacuum the arrangement being such that the solution will be sucked in and accelerated by the jet and delivered with the water from the jet to the boiler or boiler feed or the like.

- Apparatus for the purposes explained according to Claim 1 or 2 comprising a relatively small pipe fitted in the main flow of the pipe or water column and preferably provided with a bell-mouth, a restriction in said small pipe forming a jet in said pipe, a connection from the chemical solution tank or supply leading to the part beyond or adjacent to the jet, and a tail pipe for leading the combined flow of water and solution beck to meet, or discharge into, the main flow of the water supply.
  - 4. Apparatus according to Claim 3, in which the tail pipe is formed with kinks or sinuous waves therein.
- Apparatus according to Claim 3, in which the relatively small pipe leads out of, or branches from, the main supply pipe of the water column or the like, and the jet therein and connection to the chemical solution tank is at a point outside the said main supply pipe, and wherein the tail pipe either discharges into the discharge from the water column or is led back to join such main pipe at a point towards the discharge side thereof.
- Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims, in which the normal water level in the water column is at a higher level than the liquid level in the chemical supply tank, and a non-return valve is fitted in the connection from the said tank to the device for the purpose of preventing the water supply from flowing back into the chemical tank.
- Apparatus according to Claim 1, in which, in the main supply pipe for the water or in the water column itself, a restriction exists or is fitted, which restriction is so formed as to function like a jet pump to draw chemical solution from a chemical solution tank or supply to enter directly into the main flow of the water supply when the water is rapidly discharging therefrom.
- 8. Apparatus for the purposes explained, constructed, arranged or adapted to function substantially as described or substantially as described and illustrated.




