Order made by the Judges of the Supreme Court for amending the Appellate Procedure (Privy Council) Order, 1921.

WE, the Honourable Sir Stanley Fisher, Kt., Chief Justice of the Island of Ceylon, and the Honourable Mr. Gualterus Stewart Schneider, K.C., Senior Puisne Justice of the Supreme Court of the Island of Ceylon, and the Honourable Mr. Thomas Forrest Garvin, K.C., Puisne Justice of the said Court, and the Honourable Mr. Llewelyn Chisholm Dalton, Pusine Justice of the said Court, and the Honourable Mr. Robert William Lyall-Grant, Puisne Justice of the said Court, and the Honourable Mr. Allan Drieberg, K.C., Puisne Justice of the said Court, in exercise of the powers given to Us by section 5 (1) of the Appeals (Privy Council) Ordinance, 1909, and of all other powers and authorities enabling Us in this behalf do hereby order and direct in manner following :

This Order may be cited as "The Appellate Procedure (Privy Council) Amendment Order, 1928," and shall 1. The Order may be clear as The Appendic Procedure (Privy Council) Amendment Order, 1928, and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, appoint.
 The following rule shall be inserted in the "The Appellate Procedure (Privy Council) Order, 1921," published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,198 of July 29, 1921, immediately after Rule 5 thereof, and shall be numbered

Rule 5 A:

5 A. If after reasonable exertion it is found that service of any notice cannot be duly effected upon a party personally or upon his proctor empowered to accept service thereof, it shall be competent for the Court, which may consist of a single Judge, on being satisfied by evidence adduced before it that reasonable exertion to effect service has been made and that service cannot be effected, to prescribe any other mode of service.

The service substituted by order of the Court shall be as effectual as if it had been made on the party personally or on his proctor.

Whenever service is substituted by order of the Court the Court shall fix such time for the appearance of the party as the case may require.

Code of Regulations for Government Schools.

THE following amendments to the Code of Regulations for Government schools, which have been passed by the Board of Education and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, are hereby published in accordance with section 10 (3) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

Clauses 15 to 28.-In lieu of clauses 15-28 substitute the following :---

Certificates (English).

15. Persons over 18 years of age who hold the English School-Uncertifileaving Certificate, and who undertake to enter for the Preliminary cated Examination for the English Teachers' Certificates may be appointed teachers. to teach in an elementary English school, and will be provisionally registered as uncertificated teachers for a period of three years.

16. Persons over 18 years of age who have passed (1) the Prelimi- Provisionally nary Examination for the English Teachers' Certificate, or (2) the certificated Cambridge Senior School Certificate Examination, including a pass in teachers. the section English Language and Literature, or (3) the University of London Matriculation Examination, or (4) any examination which the Director may hold to be equivalent to (2) or (3), will, on appoint-

ment to the staff of a school, be registered as Provisionally Certificated Teachers.

17. Third class certificates will be awarded to teachers over 20 years Third class of age, who have taught continuously for two years in an English certificated school, and have passed the Teachers' Certificate Examination. Such teachers. teachers will be registered as Certificated Teachers.

Third class certificated teachers under clause 17 will be awarded Second class a second class certificate after doing satisfactory work for three succes- certificated sive years in a Government or an assisted school. In special cases a teachers. period of service in recognized schools, not exceeding two years, may be counted towards these three years.

The Director will decide, on the endorsements made by the Inspector on the teachers' certificate after each annual inspection, whether the teacher's work has been satisfactory. A teacher must work for at least nine months in one school to obtain an endorsement.

19. Students who have completed a two-year course at the Gam. Gampaha paha Training School will, on passing the final examination, be awarded certificate a certificate. (trained)

20. Students who have completed a two-year course at the Second class Government Training College or at any other training institution in certificates Ceylon recognized by Government for the purpose, will, on passing (trained). the final examination of the Government Training College, be awarded a second class or a second class provisional certificate in accordance with their record of work during their course and their performance at the final examination, and will be registered as trained teachers.

This certificate will also be awarded to second class certificated teachers under clause 18 who have completed a one-year course at the Government Training College or at any other training institution in Ceylon recognized by Government for the purpose, and who have passed the prescribed examination at the end of the course.

21. Second class trained teachers under clause 20 will be awarded First class a first class certificate after doing satisfactory work for three successive certificates years in a Government or an assisted school. In special cases a period (trained). of service in recognized schools, not exceeding two years, may be counted towards these three years.

Second class provisional trained teachers under clause 20 will be awarded a second class certificate after doing satisfactory work for a prescribed period not exceeding three years in a Government or an assisted school, and may then qualify for a first class certificate as above.

The Director will decide, on the endorsements made by the Inspector on the teacher's certificate after each annual inspection, whether the teacher's work has been satisfactory. A teacher must work for at least nine months in one school to obtain an endorsement.

Applications for first class certificates shall in every case be accompanied by a report from the Inspector on the teacher's conduct and his success in maintaining discipline.

22. Graduates who have completed an approved course of training, Trained and trained teachers who have graduated will, on passing the final graduate examination, be registered as trained graduate teachers.

Second class certificated teachers under clause 26 will be 27. awarded a first class certificate after doing satisfactory work for five years from the date of the second class certificate in a Government or an Assisted Vernacular or Anglo-vernacular school. In special cases a period of service in recognized schools, not exceeding two years, may be counted towards these five years.

The Director will decide, on the endorsements made by the Inspector on the teacher's certificate after each annual inspection, whether the teacher's work has been satisfactory. A teacher must work for at least nine months in one school to obtain an endorsement.

28. Students who have completed a two-years' course in a Government or an Assisted Training School will, on passing the final examination, be awarded a second class or provisional second class certificate in accordance with their record of work during the course and their performance at the final examination, and will be registered as trained teachers

Second class certificated teachers under clause 26 who have completed at least seven years' service as teachers will also be eligible for registration as trained teachers after attending a special one-year course in a Government or an Assisted Training School and passing the prescribed examination.

Second class trained teachers under clause 28 will be awarded 28(A). a first class certificate after doing satisfactory work for five successive years in a Government or an Assisted Vernacular or Anglo-vernacular school. In special cases a period of service in recognized schools, not exceeding two years, may be counted towards these five years.

Second class provisional trained teachers under clause 28 will be awarded a second class certificate after doing satisfactory work for a prescribed period not exceeding three years in a Government or an Assisted Vernacular or Anglo-vernacular school, and may then qualify for a first class certificate as above.

The Director will decide, on the endorsements made by the Inspector on the teacher's certificate after each annual inspection, whether the teacher's work has been satisfactory. A teacher must work for at least nine months in one school to obtain an endorsement.

Applications for first class certificates shall in every case be accompanied by a report from the Inspector on the teacher's conduct and his success in maintaining discipline.

In cases of serious illness during term time necessitating leave beyond the period provided for above, when, if the Director is satisfied that the concession is deserved, full pay leave may be granted for a period not exceeding six weeks in respect of any school year provided that arrangements approved by the Inspector are made for the absent teacher's work without additional expense to the school.

(b) Except as provided for in (i.) and (ii.) above, leave granted on account of illness during term time shall be on half pay, and leave granted for any other purpose shall be on no pay. In the case of no pay leave the Department will pay grant for an approved substitute according to his qualifications.

(c) (i.) All applications for leave on account of illness must be supported by a medical certificate to the satisfaction of the Manager; otherwise the leave will be on no pay;

(ii.) In cases where teachers are summoned as witnesses in criminal or Crown cases or have to serve on the jury or attend a military camp of exercise or are required to attend an official inquiry, such absence will be regarded as on duty and full pay allowed. In all applications for leave of absence on such grounds the summons or order requiring the teacher's presence should be attached;

(iii.) Applications for leave on private business must, as a rule, reach the Manager at least ten days before the date from which the leave is asked for ;

(iv.) When teachers attend Court in civil cases instituted by or against them, leave will be on no pay.

(d) The Manager shall give in his annual returns particulars of no pay leave granted to teachers during the previous year, stating whether or not a substitute has been appointed to succeed him. Where such a substitute is appointed, his name and qualifications, the number of days in which he acted, the salary to which he was entitled, and the amount actually paid should be stated.

Nursing Sisters.

26 A. A European Sister or Matron, who has served not less than 3 years in the service of this Colony, and not less than 10 years in all in the public service or in a public hospital to which she received an appointment through the Overseas Nursing Association and who would not otherwise be entitled to a pension under these regulations, may be granted on her ultimate retirement a retiring allowance calculated at the rate of 8s. 4d. per amum for each month of her service under the Government of this Colony. For the purposes of this section such total service need not be continuous.

Provided that, except in the case of retirement on account of illness, no such retiring allowance shall be payable until the Nursing Sister or Matron reaches the age of 50; and provided further that the grant of such retiring allowance shall be dependent on the production to the satisfaction of the Secretary of State of certificates of satisfactory service in respect of each period of total qualifying service, and that the total retiring allowance drawn by the Nursing Sister or Matron shall not exceed the amount of pension which she would have drawn if her whole service had been on the pensionable establishment of this Colony.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to direct that the following new rule be incorporated in the Minutes on Pensions :---

31 A. In a case falling under rule 30 or rule 31 of this Minute where a non-pensionable officer or daily-paid employee is injured or killed, the Governor in Executive Council may, in lieu of the other benefits provided in these minutes, award compensation in accordance with the rates and principles set out in the schedule and table hereto subjoined provided that it shall appear to the Governor in Executive Council that the grant of such compensation in lieu of other benefits is in the interests of the beneficiary or beneficiaries concerned :---

THE SCHEDULE.

A.—Where permanent total disablement results from the injury—

- (1) In the case of an adult, a sum equal to forty-two months' wages or three thousand five hundred rupees, whichever is less; and
- (2) In the case of a minor, a sum equal to eighty-four months' wages or three thousand five hundred rupees, whichever is less.

B.-Where permanent partial disablement results from the injury-

- (1) In the case of an injury specified in the table, such percentage of the compensation which would have been payable in the case of permanent total disablement as is specified therein as being the percentage of the loss of earning capacity caused by that injury; and
- (2) In the case of an injury not specified in the table, such percentage of the compensation payable in the case of permanent total disablement as is proportionate to the loss of earning capacity permanently caused by the injury.

C.—Where death results from the injury—

- (1) In the case of an adult, a sum equal to thirty months' wages or two thousand five hundred rupees, whichever is less; and
- (2) In the case of a minor, two hundred rupees.

For the purpose of construing this schedule—

(a) "Adult" and "minor" shall mean respectively a person who is not and a person who is under the age of fifteen years.

(b) "Permanent total disablement" shall mean such disablement of a permanent nature as incapacitates an officer or employee for all work which he was capable of performing at the time of the accident resulting in such disablement : Provided that permanent total disablement shall be deemed to result from the permanent total loss of the sight of both eyes or from any combination of injuries specified in the table where the aggregate percentage of the loss of earning capacity, as specified in that table against those injuries, amounts to one hundred per cent.

(c) "Permanent partial disablement" shall mean such disablement of a permanent nature as reduces the earning capacity of the officer or employee in every employment which he was capable of undertaking at that time: Provided that every injury specified in the table shall be deemed to result in permanent partial disablement; and where more injuries than one are caused by the same accident, the amount of compensation payable for permanent partial disablement shall be aggregated, but not so in any case as to exceed the amount which would have been payable if permanent total disablement had resulted from the injuries.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 28, 1928.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 170 (3 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 30 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1928, viz., 263,249) was 33.8, as [against 30.6 in the preceding week, 25.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 154 (8 Burghers, 92 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 17 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 30 6, as against 29 6 in the previous week, 31 3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27 6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 154 total deaths, 27 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 41 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-six deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North. and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 18 in the previous week, and 19 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 in Maradana North, and 1 in New Bazaar as against 13 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Sixteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 10 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric fever* of a non-resident was registered in Maradana hospital, as against 2 in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.

4. Nine deaths from Enteritis were registered, 9 from Debility, 7 each from Dysentery and Infantile Convulsions, 5 from Accidents, 3 from Puerperal Septicaemia, 2 from Diarrhoea, 1 each from Worms and Tetanus, and 58 from Other Causes.

5. Thirty-three cases of *Chickenpox*, 11 of *Measles*, and 3 of *Enteric fever* were reported during the week, as against 14, 4, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $82 \cdot 1^{\circ}$, against $80 \cdot 9^{\circ}$ in the preceding week, and $80 \cdot 9^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29 \cdot 897$ in., against $29 \cdot 889$ in. in the preceding week, and $29 \cdot 844$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $0 \cdot 24$ in., against $0 \cdot 06$ in. in the preceding week, and $0 \cdot 19$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE LOTUS ICE AND COLD STORAGE COMPANY, LIMITED.

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THE regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall apply to this Company with the following additions and alterations :-

The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.

BUSINESS.

1. The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, as soon as in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

CAPITAL.

2. The nominal capital of the Company is One hundred thousand Rupees, divided into Ten thousand shares of Ten Rupees each.

3. The Directors may with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

SHARES.

4. The shares, except when otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they consider proper. Provided that such unissued shares, except when otherwise provided shall first be offered by the Directors to the Shareholders as nearly as possible in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by writing specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer. if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may at their discretion allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any lands, property, rights, or privileges being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such lands, property, rights, or privileges, or as remuneration for work done for or services rendered to the Company, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

5. Article 8 in Table C shall be read as :- Every Shareholder shall be entitled to a certificate or certificates

under the common seal of the Company specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid thereon. 6. The certificate of shares registered in the names of two or more persons not a firm shall be delivered to the person first named on the register.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

7. Subject to the restrictions contained in these Articles any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares by instrument in writing, and the first offer shall be made to the Company. 8. The Directors may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares

by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company or upon whose shares the Company have a lien, or otherwise, or in case of shares not fully paid up, or to any person not approved of by them, and in no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as 9. Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

10. Article 15 in Table C shall be read as :--- Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of cents fifty, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid; and thereupon the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holder, or in respect of any other debt, liability, or engagement whatsoever, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls which the Directors shall have resolved to make, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge

or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. 14. Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or 15. engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

16. A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors or of one Director and of the Secretary that the power of sale given by clause 14 has arisen and is exercisable by the Company under these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

BORROWING POWERS.

18. With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Directors shall be entitled to borrow such sum or sums of money and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

19. For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised or for any other purposes, the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls or may make, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

20. Any such securities may be issued, either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares or otherwise.

21. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

22. Article 32 in Table C shall be read as :- No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present in person at the commencement of the business eleven or more Shareholders entitled to vote, and eleven Shareholders shall form a quorum.

23. The power of demanding a poll may be exercised by the proxy or attorney of any Shareholder duly appointed in that behalf.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

24. Article 38 in Table C shall be read as :---If a poll is demanded in manner aforesaid, the same shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided; and in case of such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting. 25. No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by a show of hands, and in case there shall be an equality 26. of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney.

27. On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote only. Where a Shareholder is present by an attorney who is not a Shareholder, such attorney shall be entitled to vote for such Shareholder on a show of hands. In case of a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him. 28. Article 39 in Table C shall be read as :-Every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share he holds in

29. No person shall be entitled to hold a proxy who is not a Shareholder in the Company and entitled to vote, but this rule shall not apply to a power of attorney.

30. No person shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

DIRECTORS.

31. The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than five; but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least fifty fully or partly paid shares in the Company upon which all calls for the time being have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors.

32. As remuneration of their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding One thousand Five hundred Rupees annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but no such fee shall be paid to any Director until the Company reaches a dividend paying stage ; the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration granted for special or extra services hereinafter referred to, hor any extra remuneration to

the Managing Directors of the Company. 33. The first Directors shall be Messrs. W. A. Dep, N. Saravanamuttu, and J. A. Wijeyesinghe. The first Directors shall hold office till the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when they shall all retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Managing Director, or 34. Managing Directors, and or Agent, (or) Superintendent of the Company for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office, and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors, and (or) Agent, or Superintendent. It shall also be lawful for the Directors to appoint any person who is not a Director or Shareholder to act as Secretary, Agent, or Superintendent.

The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be conferred on any Manager of the Company.

If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money as they shall think fit.

35. Every Director or officer of the Company, and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expense incurred by him in or about the discharge of his duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer shall, nor shall the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses happen-ing to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default. 36. -Article 48 in Table C shall be read as :--The office of Director shall be vacated---

(a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Managing Director, Secretary, Agent, or Superintendent of the Company, or trustee for debenture holders.

(b) If he becomes insolvent.

(c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.

(d) If he is absent from Ceylon for a period of three consecutive months. But the above rules shall be subject to the following exceptions :—That no Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company, or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for the Company, or by reason of his being agent, or secretary, solicitor, or broker, or being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, solicitors, or brokers of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract, work, or business in which he may be personally interested, and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with such contract, work, or business, and if he does so vote without disclosing his interest, his vote shall not be counted, and he shall incur a penalty not exceeding Two hundred Rupees.

Powers of Directors.

37. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries, who shall attest the sealing thereaf. Such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, Director, secretary, attorney, or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or company as such secretaries. The sealing shall not be attested by one person in the dual capacity of Director and representative of Agents and Secretaries.

The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company any account or accounts 38. with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and prommiscry notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual 39. as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

AUDIT.

40. Article 77 in Table C shall be read as :- The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration. He or they shall hold office till the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company; all future Auditors, except as is hereinafter mentioned, shall be apointed at the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and shall hold office only until the First Ordinary General Meeting after their respective appointments, or otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.

41. Article 78 in Table C shall be read as :- The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.

42. Article 80 in Table C shall be read as :---If any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person or persons who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS.

The Directors may, if they think fit, from time to time and at any time, without the sanction of a General Meeting, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year, provided the Directors are satisfied that the nett profits of the Company will be sufficient to justify such interim dividend or bonus.

ARBITRATION.

44. Whenever any question or other matter whatsoever arises in dispute between the Company and any other company or person, the same may be referred by the Directors to arbitration.





REGULATIONS FOR THE JUNIOR AND SENIOR COMMERCIAL EDUCATION CERTIFICATE EXAMINATIONS OF THE LONDON CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, 1929.

(i.) Junior Grade A.—For separate single subject certificates.

Junior Grade B.—For the full Junior Commercial Education Certificates—a group of obligatory subjects and a second group of optional subjects.

(ii.) Senior Grade A.—For separate single subject certificates.

Senior Grade B.—For Senior Group Diploma—distinction in one principal subject and passes in two subsidiary subjects.

2. For the Junior Examination, candidates of any age are eligible. For the Senior Examination candidates must be over 16 years of age, unless they hold a Junior Certificate for the subject for which they enter.

Applications for entry forms should be made not later than November 20.

3. Entry forms duly filled in must be forwarded so as to reach the Director of Education not later than November 30, accompanied by a Bank receipt for the fees credited to his account in the *Chartered Bank of India*, &c., Colombo, at the rate of Rs. 3 per subject for the Junior Examination or Rs. 16 50 for the full Junior Certificate, and Rs. 5 per subject for the Senior Examination. A Junior or Senior candidate taking a Modern Foreign Language, French Shorthand, or Esperanto must pay an additional fee of Re. 1. Entry fees are not returnable.

In order to obtain a Full Junior Commercial Education Certificate, candidates are required to pass in-

Arithmetic, Bookkeeping or Commercial History, Commercial Geography, English, a Modern Foreign Language, and also in at least two other subjects in the Junior Stage, with the esception of Experanto and Handwriting. Handwriting may, however, be taken as an additional optional subject without further fee.

Candidates who enter for the Full Junior Commercial Education Certificate and who are unsuccessful in one or more subjects are awarded separate certificates for each of the subjects in which they satisfy the Examiner.

Note.—Commercial History is now an alternative to Bookkeeping as an obligatory subject. Either of these subjects may be taken as an optional.

SYLLABUSES OF SUBJECTS-JUNIOR EXAMINATION.

Arithmetic.—The practical application of Arithmetic to Percentages, Rates and Taxes, Profit and Loss, Simple Interest, Bankruptcies, and simple graphs of statistics, prices, &c. The Metric System.

Accuracy will be tested by examples in the simple rules, the use of contracted, prime factors, averages and statistics, mensuration of areas and simple volumes.

Bookkeeping.—General principles of Bookkeeping by Double Entry and knowledge of commercial terms. The use and order of the Subsidiary books and Ledgers in the system of Commercial Bookkeeping to enable a correct Trial Balance to be extracted.

Arithmetical accuracy and neatness, and the use of sectional ledgers, will ensure extra marks.

Erasure and untidiness will generally cause failure.

Note.—A student may pass if his work is sufficiently good, by using a general ledger only, but the use of sectional ledgers will earn additional marks.

Commercial Geography.—The Commercial and Industrial Geography of the British Empire. A thorough knowledge of maps showing (i.) the location of the chief cities, seaports, and producing centres, (ii.) the chief sea routes and railway lines, (iii.) the distribution of the most important raw materials, foodstuffs, and manufactured articles.

A precise acquaintance with the commerce and industry of the British Isles, including the main articles of trade between the British Isles and the various parts of the Empire. A knowledge of the major climatic and vegetation regions of the world as exemplified within the Empire and as a background for the understanding of the chief Imperial products.

Commercial History.—The outline of the History of the commercial and industrial development of England from the earliest times to the present, with special reference to :—(1) The Merchant Companies; (2) Exploration and Colonial Expansion; (3) Finance and Banking; (4) The Industrial Revolution; (5) Poor Law Problems; (6) The Present as the last link in a continuous historical chain of events.

Elementary Mathematics : ALGEBRA.—Easy simplifications of algebraical expressions. Interpretation of formulae. Simple equations. Simultaneous equations of the first degree. Quadratic equations. Problems involving such equations. Easy factors. Graphs of statistics and of simple algebraical equations. Use of four figure logarithm tables in simple problems.

GEOMETRY .--- The substance of Euclid, Books I. to III. Logical geometrical process of the theorems and problems will be accepted, whether Euclid's or not. Deductions. Simple loci. Applications of arithmetic and algebra to geometrical theorems and problems.

Note.—The use of logarithm tables is allowed.

Elements of Commerce.-The divisions of trade-manufacturer or producer, wholesale dealer, and retailer; development of the merchant business. Agents of production—labour and capital. Business organization and manage-ment—the functions of the various departments in a business house—the correlation of each department in the scheme of organization. The organization of the commercial side of the business of a manufacturer or producer, sole trader, business on consignment, commission, agency business, joint accounts. The wholesale trade, organization of wholesale warehouse, transactions in wholesale trade. The retail trade—retail transactions—multiple shop system—departmental stores, transactions in wholesale trade. The retail trade—retail transactions—inductive shop system—departmental stores, co-operative trading. Gross profits, net profits, buying and selling, costing, working expenses, advertising. Banking system—relation of banker to customer. The Bankers' Clearing House, the services of banks. Current and deposit accounts, transfer of money, supply of credit to customers, &c. The remittance of money—General Post Office services, cheques, bills of exchange, &c. The credit system. Forms of transport—carriers, canals, rivers, railways, motor, aerial, ships. Collection and delivery of goods. Warehousing of goods, functions, operations, bonded warehouses, transfer of ownership of warehoused goods. Organization of foreign trade—export and import trade, markets and exchanges, importation of raw produce and the marketing, transactions in the import and export trade. Financing of foreign trade.

English.—Dictation, Essay, Analysis, and simple Précis. Questions are set dealing with Direct and Indirect Speech, and testing the candidate's Vocabulary. Students are expected to be able to paraphrase a piece of English prose or verse and write efficiently a simple business letter. Questions will be set on general English Literature, but not more than 25 per cent. of the questions will be devoted to this section. There are no set books or periods, but a sufficiently wide choice of questions will be given to cover an elementary survey of English Literature generally. Handwriting is taken into account in the marking of papers.

Note.—In this subject candidates must satisfy the Examiner in English Reading and Conversation.

Esperanto.—The syllabus is similar to that of Modern Foreign Languages. (q.v.) **Handwriting.**—Copying a letter, a tabular statement or printed matter, &c. Copying and ruling up, where necessary, arithmetical examples, items of an invoice, a statement, a receipt, a telegram or other commercial form of document in general use, and the displaying of headings, or other matter by different sizes of writing. Addressing envelopes of various sizes, as a test of writing without lines, and of ability to write them correctly. Simple lettering with the pen, and without the use of the pencil.

The Committee does not encourage Script writing.

Note.--Special attention is called to this subject, and no pains should be spared in seeking to meet the requirements Note.—Special attention is called to this subject, and no pairs should be spared in seeking to meet the requirements of commercial houses with regard to handwriting. The old-fashioned copy book style of penmanship, thick in the down-strokes, almost invisible in the upstrokes, and abounding in flourishes should be avoided. The characteristics desired are simplicity, and uniformity of size, style, slope, and spacing. Each letter should, therefore, be clearly and accurately formed, so that its identity may be distinguished apart from its position in the word—the u's distinguished from the n's, &c.—and the turnings should be round and not angular. The slope should be slightly forward. Modern Foreign Languages.—(Danish, French, German, Italian, Norwegian, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish,

Swedish.)

(1) Translations from and into the foreign language with grammatical questions.

(2) A short essay or simple letter in the foreign language.

(3) Dictation in the foreign language.

(4) The candidates' ability to express themselves verbally will be tested by conversation in the foreign language. Candidates must pass in conversation as well as in the written portion of a language in order to obtain a certificate.

Foreign candidates taking the examination in their own language must satisfy the examiner in English. Shorthand.—Writing in Shorthand (any system), from passages dictated at the rate of 50, 60, 70, or 80 words per minute for a period of five minutes. Transcription of any one of the above passages for which the candidate is allowed time at the rate of 7 words per minute.

Spelling, punctuation, and neatness of writing in transcription will be taken into account in judging the candidate's work.

N.B.—Any one of the four speeds may be chosen by the candidate, but a speed of 80 words per minute is required for the full certificate.

Papers will be set in Shorthand in any Modern Foreign Language if a sufficient number of entries is received.

Typewriting.-Copying, in correct form, commercial letters and tabular statements from manuscript copy. Special attention must be paid to accuracy, correct spelling, syllabification, punctuation, and general intelligence. Candidates will be allowed to use any make of machine they choose. They should bring their own machines if possible;

The papers given will cover the ordinary range of subjects that fall within the province of the typist and correspondence clerk. Candidates will be allowed to use any make of machine they choose. They should bring their own machines if possible; otherwise they will be expected to wreatering on the machines provided. ypewrite on the machines provided, irrespective of male or model.

The conditions on which the exclusive privilege of selling fermented toddy by retail within the under-mentioned areas from October 1, 1928, to September 30, 1929, is sold, are, in addition to the general conditions applicable to all Excise licences, and to those which will be published in the *Government Gazette* in due course, as follows :----

1. The Government Agent shall have power, in his discretion, to refuse to accept any bid or tender, subject to which power the highest bidder or tenderer shall be the grantee of the privilege, and shall conform to and perform all the conditions under which the privilege is sold.

1a. (i.) A deposit of Rs. 50 should accompany the tender. Should any successful tenderer fail to fulfil the condition No. 2 (a) his deposit will be forfeited. Subject to the above rule, all deposits will be returned upon the completion of the sale.

(ii.) No person is permitted to send in more than one tender for any one tavern.

2. (a) The grantee shall, immediately on being declared the grantee, sign the conditions of sale and pay to the Government Agent a sum equivalent to two months' rent of the privilege as a security deposit, which amount shall be liable to forfeiture, in whole or in part at the discretion of the Government Agent, for breach of any of the conditions; and such forfeiture shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by the conditions for such breach. The grantee shall within fourteen days of the sale of the privilege abve described enter into a bond with the Government Agent in form Excise T 23 for the full amount for which he has purchased the said privilege, and he shall specially hypothecate by such bond the said security deposit.

(b) If the highest bid or tender under condition 1 exceeds the sum of Rs. 2,000, the grantee shall at the same time execute, if so required by the Government Agent, in the form sanctioned by law, a power of attorney to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the recovery of any moneys due in respect of this privilege, and shall also furnish to the Government Agent within fifteen days of the date of execution of such power of attorney, a duly certified copy thereof for filing in the District Court under section 32 of the Civil Procedure Code.

(c) The grantee shall, on signing the conditions of sale, elect, and under his hand signify a post office to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with the above said privilege shall be addressed under reigstered post; and all such notices or processes as aforesaid so addressed to the post office so elected and posted in due course shall be considered as good and effectual to all intents and purposes as if the same were served personally.

3. The grantee shall pay to the Government Agent the purchase money or rent in twelve equal monthly instalments, and also any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from him. The first instalment of the purchase money or rent shall be considered due and payable on 30th September, 1928, and the remainder on the last day of each succeeding month. Interest at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum shall be payable on all arrears.

4. No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be considered as duly made unless the grantee shall produce a Kachcheri receipt therefor; and no money which, for his own convenience, the grantee may think fit to leave in the hands of the shroff or any other officer of the Kachcheri shall be considered as money paid under this contract.

5. If an instalment or part of the instalment of the purchase money or rent, or any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from the grantee remains unpaid after the same shall have become due and payable, the Government Agent shall have power, after fifteen days' notice to the grantee of his intention to do so, without further process of law, to cancel the licence or licences issued to the grantee, and to resell the privilege at the risk and loss of the grantee. The notice referred to may be given in such manner as the Government Agent may direct.

6. The grantee shall, at least ten days before the date on which his privilege to sell fermented toddy commences to run furnish to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Excise an application on the prescribed form showing the numbers and situations of the trees which he proposes to tap for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at each tavern and the situations and numbers of collecting stations for toddy which he proposes to establish, and no tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn for this purpose except under cover of a licence setting forth the numbers and situations of the trees, the name of the drawer, the name of the owner or possessor of the trees so applied for, and the tavern for which the fermented toddy is intended. The Superintendent of Excise or Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall have power, subject to appeal to the Excise Commissioner, to refuse any application to tap trees for any tavern if such application is in his opinion open to serious objection.

6A. (i.) When transport is by lorry, cart, or railway the toddy renter must establish collecting stations on the main road in places approved by the Circle Officer.

(ii.) The renter must maintain an Account Book in form Excise " D 20" at each collecting station showing the amount received from each tapper.

(iii.) The renter must show in T 22 Register kept in the tavern the amount received from each collecting station designated by number and name.

(iv.) The renter must cause the morning yield of all trees to be lowered before 8.30 a.m. and the afternoon yield to be lowered before 4.30 p.m. daily, and removed to the proper collecting station at once. He must not allow toddy to be kept in any place except the collecting station after 10 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. respectively.

(v.) The renter must have all the morning toddy at the collecting stations delivered at the tavern before 11 a.m. and all the afternoon toddy before 6 p.m.

(vi.) All accounts at the collecting stations and taverns shall be maintained in either English, Sinhalese, or Tamil.

7. No tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn therefrom for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at a tavern, unless such tree shall first have been marked for this purpose in a manner prescribed by the Excise Commissioner; nor shall toddy be transported to the tavern except under cover of a pass granted by the Superintendent of Excise or the Assistant Superintendent of Excise. Such pass shall set forth the name of the person who transports the toddy, and shall be issued to the grantee, who shall hand it to the person who transports the toddy. Separate passes must be issued for transport by pingo carriers from the tree tops to the collecting station, and by cart, lorry, or other vehicle from the collecting station to the tavern.

(a) Any renter wishing to make vinegar from toddy shall obtain a vinegar licence from the Government Agent. Provided that the Government Agent may issue licences to non-renters on terms and subject to conditions duly approved by Government.

(b) The holder of a vinegar licence shall store such vinegar in premises approved by the Government Agent, and shall keep a true account of all toddy converted into vinegar and of all sales of vinegar in the form prescribed by the Excise Commissioner. ÷. . ' 11

(c) Such vinegar store shall be opened at the request of any Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector, and the renter must produce the accounts therein maintained whenever called upon.

The grantee, if he taps the trees and draws the toddy himself, or if he delegates the work to another person such person shall, at the time of tapping the trees or drawing the toddy, invariably carry the licence on his person, and shall produce it forthwith on the demand of any Excise Officer or Village Headman.

The grantee shall have no concern or interest, direct or indirect, in the sale of arrack, or in the purchase of any privilege for the sale of arrack, within the area of his rent.

Except under the written authority of the Assistant Commissioner of Excise, no toddy, except toddy drawn from trees licensed and marked for a particular tavern, shall be kept, offered for sale, or sold in that tavern.

11. The minimum selling price of toddy per gallon shall be for Northern and Eastern Provinces 54 cents, for the distillery area 60 cents, and for other provinces 96 cents, and in proportion for any smaller quantity.

The Government Agent shall not be bound to find a site for any tavern in the event of the grantee not being 12. able to procure a site: No tavern shall be opened at any place except with the approval of the Government Agent.

13. The purchaser shall; within ten days from the date on which the privilege commences to run, or within such extended time as the Government Agent may grant, apply to the Government Agent and obtain licence or licences for the sale by retail of fermented toddy at the taverns within the area covered by the privilege.

(a) The grantee shall have no claim to a remission if the Government Agent or his Assistant shall find it neces sary to order the taverns upon any road to be closed for a limited period during the march of troops, or upon the plea of losses arising from any cause whatever.

(b) On days of polling concerning taverns the Government Agent or his Assistant shall order the closure of all taverns in the area in which polls are held, and the grantee shall have no claim to a remission on this account.

(a) No bids, will be accepted from any person who is a habitual criminal as defined by Ordinance No. 32 of 1914.

In the case of taverns where "Off" sales are prohibited no toddy shall be sold under this exclusive privilege for the purpose of removal from the tavern, and no toddy sold in the tavern shall be removed from it except under cover of a special permit granted by the Government Agent.


