**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF JUNE, 1928.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 35 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The number of marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 613 (477 General, 5 Kandyan, and 131 Muslim), as against 582 in the preceding month and 493 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 294 (223 General and 71 Muslim), as against 250 in the preceding month and 207 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,689 (890 males and 799 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 31·88 per 1,000 of the population, as against 33·06 in the preceding month, 31·59 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·31 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The rate ranged from 7·53 in Kalpitiya to 60·73 in Tangalla. There were 1,465 births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 27·65, as against 29·37 in the preceding month and 28·13 in the corresponding month of last year.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 670 (375 males and 295 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·88, as against 31·98 in the preceding month, 28·49 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·35 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 11·37 in Kollupitiya to 27·06 in Wellawatta South. There were 557 births of children whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 25·67 as against 26·76 in the preceding month and 23·84 in the corresponding month of last year.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered numbered 1,822 (994 males and 828 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 34·39, as against 31·05 in the preceding month and 29·45 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 1,356 deaths of residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 27·68, as against 24·20 in the preceding month, 24·05 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·51 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The standardized death rate, exclusive of Lunugala, where it was 77·23, ranged from 51·51 in Anuradhapura to 9·38 in Kalmunai.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 751 (429 males and 322 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 34·61, as against 30·86 in the preceding month and 28·63 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 575 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 30·52, as against 27·01 in the preceding month, 25·69 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·24 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The death rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 27·96 in New Bazaar to 11·37 in Kollupitiya.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 122 (61 males and 61 females), as against 139 in the preceding month and 107 in the corresponding month of last year.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 424, and corresponded to a rate of 229 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended June, 1928. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 251, as against 185 in the preceding month, 203 in the corresponding month of last year, and 235 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. There were 383 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 261, as against 190 in the preceding month and 216 in the corresponding month of last year.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year amounted to 191, and corresponded to a rate of 264 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended June, 1928. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 285, as against 202 in the preceding month, 225 in the corresponding month of last year, and 252 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. There were 170 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 305, as against 215 in the preceding month and 246 in the corresponding month of last year.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 17 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Debility* (of children under one year) caused 7 per cent. ; *Convulsions, Malaria, and Malarial Cachexia*, and *Phthisis*, each 6 per cent. ; *Senility*, 5 per cent. ; *Enteritis* and *Dysentery*, each 4 per cent. ; *Influenza, Diarrhoea, Anchylostomiasis, Diseases due to Intestinal Parasites* (other than *Anchylostomiasis*), and *Bright's Disease and Nephritis*, each 3 per cent. ; *Prematurity, Bronchitis, Enteric Fever, and Accidents and Negligence*, each 2 per cent. ; *Tetanus, Paralysis, Heart Disease, and Puerperal Septicaemia*, each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 18 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Debility* (of children under one year) and *Phthisis* each caused 8 per cent. ; *Influenza*, 6 per cent. ; *Senility*, 5 per cent. ; *Convulsions* and *Enteritis*, each 4 per cent. ; *Bright's Disease and Nephritis*, 3 per cent. ; *Prematurity, Bronchitis, Malaria, and Malarial Cachexia, Diarrhoea, Dysentery, Anchylostomiasis, Heart Disease, and Accidents and Negligence*, each 2 per cent. ; *Tetanus, Enteric Fever, Diseases due to Intestinal Parasites* (other than *Anchylostomiasis*), *Cancer, Diabetes, Paralysis*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, each 1 per cent.

12. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered in Colombo during the month, as against 1 in the previous month and 3 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 205 cases were reported (88 in Mata'e, 75 in Colombo, 13 in Kandy). *Phthisis* followed with 98 (84 in Colombo) ; *Enteric Fever* 50 (21 in Galle, 17 in Colombo) ; *Measles* 39 (19 in Colombo, 10 in Gampola, 5 in Galle) ; *Mumps* 21 (14 in Moratuwa) ; *Continued Fever* 20 (11 in Colombo, 5 in Moratuwa) ; *Dysentery* 9 (3 in Kurunegala, 2 each in Moratuwa and Panadure) ; *Plague* 2 (in Colombo) ; *Diphtheria* 2 (1 each in Colombo and Kandy) ; and *Whooping Cough* 2 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (33.02 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 19.98 in. in Hatton to 0.08 in. in Trincomalee. No rainfall was recorded in Jaffna, Mannar, Mullaittivu, Vavuniya, Batticaloa, Kalmunai, Kalpitiya, and Anuradhapura. Colombo recorded 8.92 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 86.4° in Trincomalee to 61.2° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 81.9° in Colombo.
