A PROCLAMATION.

H. J. STANLEY.

WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," as amended by section 2 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1924, it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Southern Circuit, two times at least in each year at Galle, and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint, such sessions commencing at Galle on April 25 and September 15 in every year.

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Tangalla, a place included within the said Southern Circuit :

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Tangalla, in the said Southern Circuit on or about Monday, November 12, 1928.

AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 20.—Between sub-clauses (iii.) and (iv.) introduce new sub-clause as follows:—

(iii.) (a) No male teacher who is 60 years of age and no female teacher who is 55 years of age, nor any teacher who is in receipt of a pension under any of the rules of the School Teachers' Pension Ordinance, No. 6 of 1927, shall be employed on the staff of a school without the permission of the Director.

Clause 33.—Add as an additional sentence: When the average attendance is less than 15 a school may receive a proportionate grant if, in the opinion of the Director, the proportion which the average attendance in the school bears to the total number of children of school-going age in the school area justifies the payment of such grant.

Add the following clause after clause 45:—

Clause 45 (a).—(a) Full grant towards the salaries of eligible teachers will be paid only if the following rules have been observed. Grant will not be paid in case of absence in excess of the leave approved by these rules.

Teachers are entitled to vacation leave during the usual vacation of their school or college but not at any other time of the year except—

(i.) Where leave is required owing to private reasons of the gravest urgency when casual leave on full pay may, at the discretion of the Manager, be allowed for periods of not more than six days at a time up to a maximum of fourteen days in the school year.

(ii.) In cases of serious illness during term time necessitating leave beyond the period provided for above, when, if the Director is satisfied that the concession is deserved, full pay leave may be granted for a period not exceeding six weeks in respect of any school year provided that arrangements approved by the Inspector are made for the absent teacher's work without additional expense to the school.

(b) Except as provided for in (i.) and (ii.) above, leave granted on account of illness during term time shall be on half pay, and leave granted for any other purpose shall be on no pay. In the case of no pay leave the Department will pay grant for an approved substitute according to his qualifications.

(c) (i.) All applications for leave on account of illness must be supported by a medical certificate to the satisfaction of the Manager; otherwise the leave will be on no pay;

(ii.) In cases where teachers are summoned as witnesses in criminal or Crown cases or have to serve on the jury or attend a military camp of exercise or are required to attend an official inquiry, such absence will be regarded as on duty and full pay allowed. In all applications for leave of absence on such grounds the summons or order requiring the teacher's presence should be attached;

(iii.) Applications for leave on private business must, as a rule, reach the Manager at least ten days before the date from which the leave is asked for;

(iv.) When teachers attend Court in civil cases instituted by or against them, leave will be on no pay.

(d) The Manager shall give in his annual returns particulars of no pay leave granted to teachers during the previous year, stating whether or not a substitute has been appointed to succeed him. Where such a substitute is appointed, his name and qualifications, the number of days in which he acted, the salary to which he was entitled, and the amount actually paid should be stated.

Clause 47.—In line 9 after "employed" add "and in the case of an orphan who is studying for the Vernacular School-leaving Certificate Examination or the Entrance Examination to a training school with a view to becoming a teacher."

Clause 49 (a).—Delete.

Clause 62.—Insert as second sentence: In special cases a period of service in recognized schools, not exceeding two years, may be counted towards these three years.

Clause 63.—Insert as second sentence: In special cases a period of service in recognized schools, not exceeding two years, may be counted towards these five years.

Clause 65.—Insert as second sentence: In special cases a period of service in recognized schools, not exceeding two years, may be counted towards these five years.

In paragraph 2 alter "for three successive years" to "for a prescribed period not exceeding three years."

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 29, 1928.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 211 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 114 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 41 Moors, 5 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1928, viz., 264,713) was 41.7, as against 35.9 in the preceding week, 31.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 154 (10 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 22 Moors, 6 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.4, as against 28.0 in the previous week, 24.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 154 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's and 1 each in Maradana East, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 23 in the previous week, and 19 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Slave Island. The number registered during the previous week as also the weekly average for last year was 6.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 1 each in Maradana East and Wellawatta North as against 2 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North and 1 each in San Sebastian and Kollupitiya; as against 10 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 in Maradana South, as against 1 in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths from *Debility* were registered; 7 from *Diarrhoea*, 6 each from *Enteritis* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 each from *Dysentery* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*; 4 from *Worms*, 2 each from *Suicide* and *Accidents*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 64 from *Other Causes*.

5. Fourteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 13 of *Measles* and 3 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 8, 7, and 6 respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported either this week or in the preceding week.

State of Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.3°, against 82.6° in the preceding week and 81.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.883 in., against 29.888 in. in the preceding week, and 29.905 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.87 in. against 0.29 in. in the preceding week, and 1.41 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

5A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake asked—Will the Chairman be pleased to inform when his report regarding the improvements to the market and the market grounds will be ready.

The Chairman replied as follows:—I am of opinion, and the Medical Officer of Health agrees with me, that any alterations to the existing market, to bring it into accordance with the most modern practice, would be so costly as not to be worth while in view of the possibility of removal of the beef, mutton, and fish stalls within a comparatively short time.

As regards the lay out of the market site in general, I was hoping the Government Architect would have visited Kandy by now in connection with the proposed model tenements when I should have discussed the matter with him. I have given the matter some consideration, but have put it aside for the present as outside the range of practical consideration until we know the extent of our liabilities for the new water scheme and town drainage.

It was also resolved to consider in due course the conditions under which the market grounds will be leased for 1929.

5B. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake moved—That in view of the urgent necessity felt in the crowded areas of the town for playgrounds and open spaces to be used as children's parks, the Medical Officer of Health be asked to prepare, in co-operation with the member of each ward, a list of Municipal and Crown lands which can be converted to such use.—Mr. Ismail seconded.—Carried.

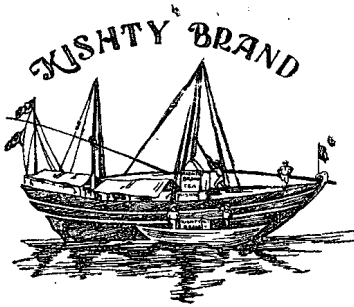

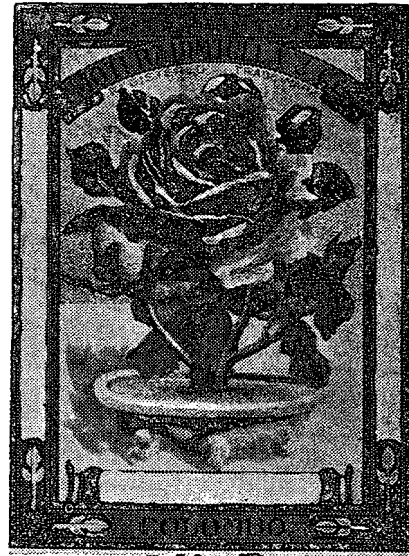
