(b) All crossing timbers and all sleepers shall be cut from well matured trees of the true species of timber named in paragraph 3, felled in the proper season when the sap is not in circulation.

- (c) All crossing timbers and sleepers may be sawn or hewn, and shall be good, sound, strong timber free from heartwood, sapwood, dryrot, and knot holes; shall be cut square, out of winding and straight, except that hewn sleepers may have camber to the extent of ½ an inch. They shall not be cut on full quarter and shall be cut with an allowance of 1 inch in width and 1 inch in thickness to allow for shrinkage, and no further allowance shall be made, but will allow slight variation in cutting; sound gum veins; gum pockets up to 6 inches by 3 inch; surface sun shakes; end shakes up to 6 inches, a few pin holes but not in groups; sap or vane not to exceed 2 inches on either face and not to come under rail seat; also sound and firm knots up to 2 inches in diameter

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 13, 1928.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 174 (13 Burghers, 101 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 22 Moors, 3 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1928, viz., 264,713) was 34.4, as against 37.3 in the preceding week, 34.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 148 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 24 Moors, 10 Malays, and 6 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.2, as against 29.8 in the previous week, 24.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths .-- Of the 148 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 17.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 3 each in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and Slave Island, 2 in Maradana East and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana South, as against 22 in the previous week and 19 the weekly average

(b) Twelve deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Kotahena North, and I each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 6 in the previous week

and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana hospital, and Maradana North, as against nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from Phthisis were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in San Sebastian, and I each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 10 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Two deaths from Enteric Fever were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident). I death returned as probably due to Enteric Fever was registered during the preceding week, and the weekly average for last year was 2.

Sixteen deaths from Debility were registered, 10 from Enteritis, 6 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 from Diarrhoea, 3 from Worms, 2 each from Dysentery, Tetanus, Puerperal Septicaemia, and Accidents, and 59 from Other Causes.

5. Fifteen cases of Measles, 11 of Chickenpox, and 7 of Enteric Fever (3 in Port) were reported during the week, as against 14, 16, and 8, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.4°, against 80.7° in the preceding week and 80.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.891 in., against 29.871 in. in the preceding week, and 29.928 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.73 in., against 2.90 in. in the preceding week, and 0.03 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Sale of Satinwood.

A N auction sale of the under-mentioned satinwood will be held at the Central Timber Depôt, Kew road, Slave Island, Colombo, on Saturday, November 24, 1928, at 10 A.M., subject to the following conditions:—

- 1. The timber will be put up in lots to suit buyers at a rate per cubic foot, and no advance of less than 25 cents per cubic foot will be accepted.
- 2. The highest bid will be accepted, subject to the approval or disapproval of the Conservator of Forests. The highest bidder will be required by the officer conducting the sale to sign the sale book kept for the purpose directly a lot has been knocked down to him.
- 3. Payment of 25 per cent. of the successful bid to be made at time of sale, if so required.
- 4. Depôt measurements must be accepted, but previous to date of auction any prospective bidder is at liberty to check the measurements recorded in the notice and to represent any differences promptly.
- 5. No timber shall be removed before payment of the full price bid, and all timber sold must be removed from the depôt within ten days of date of notification of acceptance by the Conservator of Forests of such bid, and will be at the risk of the purchasers until removed.
- 6. Should any person to whom a lot is knocked down refuse to take it over at the full price bid, or refuse or fail to sign the sale book and pay 25 per cent. of his bid when so required, or refuse or fail to pay the full purchase amount or balance thereof, as the case may be, and to remove the timber within the time specified in clause 5 above, the lot will again be put up for

auction, and the original purchaser or bidder will be held liable for any loss to Government owing to a lower price being realized at the resale, while if an enhanced price is realized at such resale, he shall, however, have no claim to the profit, which shall accrue to Government.

- 7. Flowered logs, if not so advertised, shall be excluded from the lots advertised in the list, and shall be put up separately, at the discretion of the Assistant Conservator of Forests, after consulting the wishes of prospective purchasers.
- 8. Agents bidding for others will be required to produce a written authority from the firm or person for whom they bid, such authority will be retained by the Assistant Conservator of Forests, and will hold good only at the particular sale at which it is produced.
- 9. Fractions of a cubic foot less than '5 will be ignored, and anything over will be counted as one cubic foot in calculation of value of each log.
- 10. The description of the logs appearing in the remarks column of the following list is entered merely for the guidance of the intending purchasers who, as usual, should satisfy themselves as to its correctness before purchasing the logs.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hallon Wednesday, September 5, 1928, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated August 29, 1928.

Present:—Mr. H. E. Newnham, M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. A. H. F. Clarke; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. C. R. Lundie; Mr. T. C. Dyhall; Mr. J. S. Collett; Dr. R. G. Jayetileke; and Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.

1. The Miniutes of the General Meeting of August 8, 1928, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of August 8, 1928, be confirmed.

- 2. Pursuant to notice, the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando presented a petition from Mr. S. L. A. Ghaffur regarding the outright sale of premises No. 1,059/97, Old Urugodawatta, and moved that it be placed before the Law and Finance Committees for consideration and report. The Chairman seconded.—Carried.
- 3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal presented a petition from stall holders of Kachcheri road vegetable market and moved that it be placed before the Sanitation Committee for consideration and report. The Chairman seconded.—Carried.
- 4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey asked the Chairman the following questions:—Will the Chairman be pleased to state—(1) Whether tde mandate for acquisition of land from the three Hindu Temple premises in Wellawatta Ward, for widening of Galle road, has been received? (2) Whether the present Trustees of the three Temples, through their lawyers, have consented to the acquisition of the land? (3) If (1) and (2) are answered in the affirmative, whether the Chairman will take steps to have the acquisition of the said land carried out at once in view of the fact: (a) That the Chairman made a statement at the General Meeting of the Council in August to the effect that there may be opposition by the Temple Authorities to the acquisition of their land and that, therefore, the trace for the widening of the Galle road may have to be altered? (b) That the tenure of office of the present Trustees, who have consented to the acquisition, expires at the end of this year?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) and (2) the answer is in the affirmative. (3) The Chairman does not propose to proceed at once with the acquisition of these properties owing to the other important work of the Assessor which has already of necessity gone into arrears owing to the heavy acquisitions on which he has been engaged this year. There are some 500 objections to Wellawatta assessments still outstanding and the objectors naturally complain of the delay. It is also most desirable to complete the revision this year of Kotahena Ward and also of the Pettah Ward, which was due last year, but held over owing to the scrapping of the Wellawatta revision.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal asked the Chairman the following question:—Is the Chairman aware that the Chamber of Commerce is of opinion that copra should not be included in the list of commodities, which come under the description of dangerous trades and that this opinion is supported by the Medical Officer of Health as well as the Superintendent of the Fire Brigade? Will the Chairman, therefore, place this matter for the consideration of the Housing and Town Improvement Committee with a view so delete copra from the list of dangerous and offensive trades?

The Chairman replied as follows:—A complete reply cannot be given to the first part of this question as drafted without a long explanatory precis of the history of the matter. The more immediately relevant facts are as follows:—On the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees the Council on May 6, 1925, added the storing of copra to the dangerous trades under the zoning by-laws. On April 23, 1926, the Building Committee recommended that it should be retained and Council on May 5, 1926, referred the matter to the Sanitation Committee who recommended that it should be retained and Council on June 2, 1926, agreed. This appeared to result in hardship to one firm and the Building Committee on February 3, 1927, conferred with the representatives of those interested in the trade and consulted the Chamber of Commerce and the then Medical Officer of Health and the Superintendent, Fire Biggade, on various aspects of the question. Finally they recommended that the storing of copra should be retained on the list of dangerous trades and on April 6, 1927, the Council agreed. There the matter remains and the alleged hardship to one firm was met by the alteration of another by-law. The matter has, therefore, been very fully considered by Committees and by Council, and Council in 3½ years as 3 times specifically decided to retain the storing of copra as a dangerous trade. In the absence of any evidence that the present by-law is definitely harmful the Chairman is not prepared to take the initiative in suggesting to the Committee that it request Council to alter its threefold decision.

6. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey moved—That this Council do reduce the assessment rate on properties from 20 per cent. to 18 per cent. as from January 1, 1929.

The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded pro forma for purpose of discussion.

Mr. F. Dadabhoy, the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, and the Chairman opposed the motion.

Dr. E. A. Coorey replied.

The motion was put to the meeting and lost.

- Dr. E. A. Coorey called for a division and the Council divided as follows:—Ayes: (1) Dr. E. A. Coorey. Noes: (1) The Chairman, (2) the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, (3) Dr. E. V. Ratnam, (4) the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, (5) Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy, (6) Mr. A. H. F. Clarke, (7) Mr. G. W. Dodds, (8) Mr. N. R. Blande, (9) Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, (10) Dr. S. Muttiah, (11) Mr. C. R. Lundie, (12) Mr. T. C. Dyball, (13) Mr. J. S. Collett, (14) Dr. R. G. Jayetileke, and (15) Mr. F. Dadabhoy.
- 7. The following motion stood in the name of the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando:—(1) With reference to the recommendation of the Donoughmore Commission that Municipal Councils should be under the control of the Local Administration Department and be supervised by a Minister, assisted by a Committee, this Council is strongly of opinion that the Municipal Council of Colombo should be independent of the said Department or Minister. (2) This Council does not agree with the view expressed by Government that the amendment of the Municipal Constitution should await the creation of such a department, with a staff of Engineers, Medical Officers, and Accountants, in view of the fact that the Council possesses a most efficient staff of technical officers who do not and will not require the assistance of any supervisory officers to be appointed by Government. (3) This Council is of opinion that the qualifications for electors and members should be the same as those recommended for the State Council, with the proviso that those eligible for membership should be resident

within the Municipal town. (4) This Council is of opinion that with a view to having a loyal and contended service, officers of the existing Council should be given the right after the reforms to retire on proportionate pension with compensation for loss of career. (5) This Council is of opinion that the Constitution of the Colombo Municipality should be dealt with in a separate bill, which should be introduced at the earliest possible opportunity.

The Hon. Mr. C H. Z. Fernando moved for permission to defer the consideration of his motion to the next meeting.

The permission having been granted, the consideration of the motion was deferred.

To submit, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the Financial Year 1927.

The Chairman moved that in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the Financial Year 1927 be, as usual, submitted to His Excellency the Governor. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 9 to 15

(inclusive) on the agenda.

(3) Supplemental provision of Rs. 9,000 for above Improvements.—Recommended (a) (1), (2), and (3) and (c) (1),

(2), and (3) and that supplemental provision of Rs. 9,000 be provided.

(18) To consider (a) the quotation received from the Delta Metal Co., Ltd. (through the Council's Agents), fo the supply of Delta metal tubes and ingots.—(a) Considered. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Engineer thatubes and 8 cwt. of Delta metal ingots be purchased at a cost of £180, C.I.F., Colombo.

Note:—The cost will be charged to Advance Account, Stores, and debited to votes as and when used.—(b) Recom

mended.


