VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 27, 1928.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 211 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 138 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1928, viz., 264,713) was 41.7, as against 35.2 in the preceding week, 36.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 153 (5 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 22 Moors, 8 Malays, and 8 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.2, as against 28.2 in the previous week, 22.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 153 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 22.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana North, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 22 in the previous week and 19 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, as against 6 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana hospital, and Maradana South. The number registered during the previous week as also the weekly average for last year was 3.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta South, as against 10 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), as against nil in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in St. Paul's, as against nil in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. One death from *Measles* and *Broncho Pneumonia* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

6. Twelve deaths from *Debility* were registered, 8 each from *Enteritis* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 4 from *Worms*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 1 each from *Tetanus*, *Homicide*, and *Accidents*, and 64 from *Other Causes*.

7. Fifteen cases of *Measles*, 8 of *Chickenpox*, 4 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 21, 13, 6, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.7°, against 78.8° in the preceding week and 80.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.905 in., against 29.875 in. in the preceding week and 29.928 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4.76 in., against 10.54 in. in the preceding week and 4.89 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

REVISED specification showing lands found to be capable of irrigation by Medagam-oya Anicut, the names of proprietors, and the contributions payable in respect of each land. 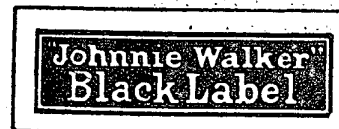

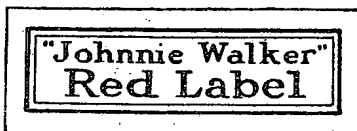

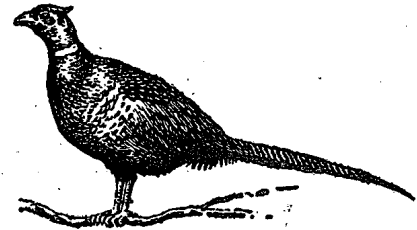
