WHEREAS the Municipal Council of Colombo has, under the provisions of sections 109 (1) and 110 (12) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, made the by-laws set out in the schedule hereto:

Know Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 109 (3), and subject to the provisions of section 109 (4) of the said Ordinance, do hereby confirm and proclaim the said by-laws:

#### SCHEDULE.

##### *By-laws regarding the Tax on Vehicles and Animals.*

1. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Colombo Municipal Council.  
“Ordinance” means the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.

2. The returns required to be furnished under section 134 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person supposed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in a schedule which shall be supplied by the Council and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such schedule is addressed.

3. If any person, after having filled up and returned such schedule, shall acquire, keep, or use any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish such information as aforesaid shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

4. Subject to the provisions of section 132 of the Ordinance, any person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 2 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year succeeding that in which such schedule is furnished; and any person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 3 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

5. Any person who, having furnished the schedule required by by-law 2 or the written notice required by by-law 3, claims to be exempt from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

6. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 132 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the thirty-first day of March in every year in respect of all vehicles kept or used within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo and in respect of the animals, if any, employed in drawing them, whether such vehicles have or have not been licensed under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916.

7. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate as specified in the schedule hereto with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the registers of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued.

Provided, however, that the owner or person in charge of any vehicle in respect of which a licence has been issued by the Chairman under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, shall not be required to affix a plate as required by this by-law.

8. Should any vehicle licensed under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, by a "proper authority" other than the Chairman be kept or used within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo, the owner of such vehicle shall, subject to the provisions of section 132 of the Ordinance, be liable to pay the tax prescribed in Schedule D of the Ordinance, in respect of such vehicle and, in respect of the animal, if any, employed in drawing it and shall further affix to such vehicle the plate prescribed by these by-laws.

9. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo, the owner or person in charge of any such vehicle in respect of which the prescribed plate should have been so affixed shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten rupees.

10. Any Municipal Inspector or Police Officer may detain any vehicle kept or used within the Municipality to which the prescribed plate is not duly affixed in accordance with these by-laws, and in such case shall forthwith bring the owner or person in charge of such vehicle before the Municipal Magistrate.

The colour and shape of the plates shall be determined by the Chairman.

11. Chapter IV. of the by-laws of the Municipal Council of Colombo published in *Gazette* No. 6,980 of October 20, 1905, and the five by-laws relating to the collection of annual taxes on carts and hackeries and published in *Gazette* No. 6,389 of July 1, 1910, are hereby rescinded.

## "THE CATTLE ORDINANCE, 1898."

K 1244/28

**R**ULES framed under sections 4 and 5 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1898 regarding the sale or transfer of cattle published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 6,062 of July 7, 1905, and now reprinted for general information.

## RULES REFERRED TO.

1. It shall not be lawful to transfer any head of cattle except upon a certificate in the Form A in the schedule annexed to Ordinance No. 10 of 1898, issued and signed by an officer authorized by the Government Agent to issue such certificates for the district in which the animal is transferred.

2. It shall not be lawful to acquire a head of cattle from any person in any way, except by inheritance, unless the recipient receives with the animal the certificate alluded to in clause 1.

3. The Government Agent shall appoint certain officers authorized to issue certificates subject to the regulations hereinafter laid down. Books of certificates in the authorized form shall be issued to all such officers. Such books to be in duplicate, the original to be kept and returned to the Kacheheri when the book is finished, or on demand by the Government Agent; the duplicate to be given to the purchaser or donee.

4. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to appoint also a limited number of special officers, not lower in rank than a Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar, to issue certificates, and to relieve them from the necessity of complying with such of the regulations with reference to the issue of certificates as may appear to the Government Agent to be desirable.

5. It shall be an offence for any one who has not been duly authorized to issue a certificate, or for any one to alter, add to, deface, destroy, or in any way tamper with a certificate.

6. If a head of cattle acquired on a certificate dies, is lost, or disappears, it shall be the duty of the owner to return the certificate either to an officer appointed to issue certificates for the district or to the Kacheheri, such return to be made within ten days of the animal's death or one month of its loss or disappearance. When cattle are slaughtered within the limits of a Municipality or Local Board, the certificate must be given to the slaughter-house keeper; if without such limits, to such person as may be nominated by the Government Agent.

7. All certificates now in the possession of private persons, for which they have not got cattle, must within three months from the date of the publication of these rules be returned to the Kacheheri or an officer authorized to issue certificates as described above. After that date it shall be an offence for any one to possess a cattle certificate for which he has not got the corresponding head of cattle.

8. Within six months of the passing of these rules it shall be the duty of all persons who are in possession of acquired cattle (that is, not born in the owner's possession or obtained by inheritance) for which the owners hold no certificates to produce them before an officer appointed by the Government Agent, who, if satisfied that the animal has been lawfully acquired, shall issue a certificate, and if not satisfied shall refer the matter for final decision to the Government Agent, who shall order either that a certificate shall issue or that the animal shall be sold by auction and the proceeds paid to the Communal or Local Board funds, if a Gansabhawa or Local Board has jurisdiction over the district where the animal has been kept, or to the credit of Government if there is no Gansabhawa or Local Board.

9. It shall be the duty of all headmen to seize all stray cattle, those with altered or defaced brandmarks, and cattle (other than those born in the owner's possession or obtained by inheritance) that may be reasonably supposed to have been acquired without a proper certificate, and to produce them before the President of the Gansabhawa, if there is one having jurisdiction over the district, or before the Chief Headman, if there is no Gansabhawa. Such President or Chief Headman shall inquire into the title of any one who claims the animal, and if satisfied that it has been lawfully obtained, shall issue a certificate; if not so satisfied, shall refer the matter to the Government Agent, whose decision shall be final. If the Government Agent is not satisfied that the claimant has established his title, the animal shall be sold, and the proceeds dealt with as laid down in rule 8.

10. When an animal is sold as directed in the foregoing rules by the President of a Village Tribunal or a Chief Headman, a special brand selected by the Government Agent shall be put on the animal, and a certificate signed by the President or a Chief Headman, as the Government Agent may direct, shall be issued to the purchaser.

11. When cattle are imported it shall be the duty of the importer to obtain from an officer appointed by the Government Agent a certificate for each animal imported. Such certificate shall be issued on payment of a fee of 25 cents, and shall be in the Form A annexed to Ordinance No. 10 of 1898. In filling in the certificate the words "imported animal" should be entered under column 2 instead of the name and residence of the seller or donor. Under column 9, instead of the signature of the seller or donor the date of landing and the port where landed should be entered.

12. Duplicates of certificates certified to be correct by the Government Agent or his Assistant shall have the validity of the certificates themselves, and shall be issued only to the persons to whom the originals were issued, or their representatives, on proving satisfactorily that the originals were lost or stolen.

13. The following are the regulations to be observed by headmen in issuing certificates:—

(1) No cattle certificate shall be executed by any headman in any case—

- (a) In which the animal is not produced before him.
- (b) In which the vendor and vendee, or donor and donee, with their witnesses, are not before him.
- (c) In which the owner is a minor or a person of unsound mind. (In every such case the parties shall be referred to the chief headman of the district.)
- (d) In which he has any reasonable doubt that the vendor is the *bona fide* owner; if he is not satisfied, the matter shall be referred to the President or Chairman of the Village Committee of his district for adjudication, and such officer if satisfied shall issue a certificate. In districts in which there is no President or Chairman of Committee, the matter shall be referred to the Mudaliyar or Chief Headman of the headman's division. Sales of cattle belonging to the headmen who issues certificates shall be made on vouchers executed by the adjoining headman.
- (e) In which the certificate in favour of the seller is not produced for the animal (unless it has been born in the seller's possession or acquired by him by inheritance).
- (f) In which the description and brandmarks of the animal do not agree with the certificate produced.
- (g) In which the vendor produces no certificate, and is not a resident of the district for which the officer has been authorized to issue certificates.

(2) The previous sale certificate, on the strength of which a sale is effected, shall be surrendered to the executing headman, and shall be attached by him to the counterfoil of the certificate issued.

(3) Before issue of sale certificates for animals acquired by inheritance the headman must satisfy himself by personal inquiry that the animals have been so inherited, and must enter in the certificate and counterfoil the name of the deceased owner and his relationship to the vendor.

(4) When an owner wishes to remove an animal born in his possession or acquired by inheritance, in order to sell it at some place beyond the jurisdiction of the officer appointed to issue certificates for the district, he shall obtain from such officer an ordinary sale certificate in Form A in the schedule attached to Ordinance No. 10 of 1898, in which the following alterations shall be made:—

Under column 2 shall be entered "removed for sale by owner."

Under column 3 the name and residence of the owner shall be entered.

The signature of the owner shall be taken both under column 9 and under column 10.

(5) More than one head of cattle shall not be transferred on one certificate, except in the case of a cow with an unbranded calf below the age of twelve months. In such case the colour, age, sex, and other distinguishing marks on the calf should be inserted in the certificate.

#### Permits of Removal.

14. It shall not be lawful for any one to remove an acquired animal (that is, an animal not born in the owner's possession or obtained by inheritance) to any place beyond the jurisdiction of the officer appointed by the Government Agent to issue certificates for the district in which the animal is kept, unless the person so removing has with him the certificate issued to the owner of the animal. If the animal does not belong to the person so removing, he must have in addition a written pass signed by the owner, stating where the animal is going to and for what purpose it is being removed.

15. If the animal be a pinfold one (that is, born in the owner's possession or obtained by inheritance), the person removing the animal shall have with him either a permit for removal in Form B in schedule annexed to Ordinance No. 10 of 1898, or a certificate similar to that described in rule 13 (4).

IT is hereby notified that permission, under section 3 of "The Elephant Kraal Regulation Ordinance, No. 1 of 1912," has been granted by His Excellency the Governor to the Ratemahatmayas of the Kurunegala District and the Kachcheri Mudaliyar, Kurunegala, to hold an elephant kraal in March next at Nelunpatwewa in Wannihatpattu of the Kurunegala District. The general public will not be admitted within a radius of four miles from the stockade until the elephants have been driven into the stockade, but a strictly limited number of tickets to view the kraal before the elephants are driven in will be available for issue to persons other than officials connected with the kraal. BY-LAWS, under section 25 (1) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920," made by the Education District Committee of the Batticaloa Revenue District, approved by the Board of Education, and confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council.

## BY-LAWS.

1. *Definitions.*—

The terms "boy," "girl," and "child" shall mean a boy, or a girl, or a child residing in the area described in the Schedule A hereto.

The term "attendance" shall mean an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an attendance register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "Code" shall mean the Code for Assisted Schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The term "District Committee" means the Education District Committee for the Revenue District of Batticaloa, including the town of Batticaloa and various Sanitary Board towns.

The term "school" shall mean any school recognized by the Director of Education and shall include the schools specified in Schedule B hereto.

The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the meaning as in sub-sections 25 (2) and (3) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920."

2. The Committee shall meet ordinarily at the Batticaloa Kachcheri once every two months, on such dates as the Committee shall decide upon.

3. A record of the proceedings of meetings shall be kept in a book and copies of such records circulated among members immediately after the meeting.

4. The Batticaloa District, including the Local Board town of Batticaloa and the Sanitary Board towns of Kattankudi, Kalmunai, Eravur, and Sammanturai, is an area within which efficient provision has been made for elementary education by means of schools situated within the said area.

5. *Children to attend School.*—The parent of every boy of not less than six nor more than twelve years of age, and the parent of every girl of not less than six nor more than ten years of age shall cause such boy or girl to attend school unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. Provided in the case of girls that their attendance shall not be compulsory unless a separate female teacher is provided; further that no boy under eight and no girl shall be compelled to attend school where the distance from his or her residence to the school along the shortest route exceeds 1 mile, and no boy over eight shall be compelled to attend school where the distance exceeds 2 miles. Provided also that this rule shall not apply to Muslim girls except in the villages of Eravur, Sainthamaruthu, Nindoor, and Pottuvil. And provided always that when a boy between ten and twelve years of age being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Rural Education District Committee, Batticaloa, has received a certificate from the Inspector of Schools that he has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic the examination prescribed for the Fourth Standard or at the discretion of the Education District Committee in special cases of poverty the Third Standard prescribed by the Code for all grades of vernacular schools, he shall not be required to attend school.

6. *The Time of Attendance.*—The time during which every child shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be opened for the instruction of children of similar age.

7. *Religion.*—Nothing in these by-laws—

(a) Shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the time when religious instruction is given as provided by section 15 (2) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920."

(b) Shall make it conditional for any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which its parent belongs.

8. Every parent who shall not observe or shall neglect or violate these by-laws or any of them shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for each offence, and to an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day in the case of a continuing offence, and such fine shall be recovered without the option of imprisonment.

9. In vernacular schools children shall not be detained for instruction for longer periods than the following:—

Up to Standard IV.	..	5 hours
Standards V.-VIII.	..	7 hours

Provided that the hours devoted to instruction shall in no case exceed 5 hours per day. The hour at which school work should commence may be left to the discretion of the Manager or Head Master, but no school should open earlier than 8 A.M. or later than 10 A.M. The school time table should be approved by the Inspector of Schools.

10. No vernacular school shall, except with the permission of the Divisional or District Inspector of Schools, be kept open for school work on more than 5 days a week or less than 180 days a year.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 1st day of November, 1928, and called the Ceylon (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1928, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, has been pleased further to amend the Principal Order :

And whereas it is provided in the said Order in Council bearing date the 1st day of November, 1928, that such Order in Council shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall come into operation on the date of such publication :

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 19th day of December, 1923, and known as the Ceylon (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1923 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"), provision was made for the constitution of a Legislative Council in and for the Island of Ceylon :

And whereas His Majesty reserved to Himself, His Heirs, and Successors, power, with the advice of His or Their Privy Council, to revoke, alter or amend the Principal Order as to Him or Them should seem fit :

And whereas the Principal Order was amended by an Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of March, 1924, and known as the Ceylon (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1924 :

And whereas it is necessary to indemnify and relieve the Editor of the Sinhalese Etymological Dictionary from such penal consequences as he may have incurred or suffered by sitting or voting in the Council as an Elected Member thereof between the 24th day of January, 1924, and the coming into operation of this Order in Council after his seat became, or is alleged to have become, vacant on the ground hereinafter appearing, or as he might hereafter incur or suffer for a like reason :

And whereas it is therefore expedient to amend the Principal Order as hereinafter is set forth :

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows :—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Ceylon (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1928." It shall be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* and shall come into operation on the date of such publication.

II. No action, prosecution or legal proceeding whatsoever under the provisions of Article XVI. of the Principal Order or otherwise, shall be brought, instituted or maintained—

(a) for the recovery of any penalty incurred, or alleged to have been incurred, under the said Article, whether for the amount prescribed therein, or not ; or

(b) for the recovery of any damages, the enforcement of any forfeiture or penal consequences or the declaration of any vacancy or incapacity—

against the Editor of the Sinhalese Etymological Dictionary for or on account of or in respect of his having sat or voted in the Council as an Elected Member thereof at any time between the 24th day of January, 1924, and the date of the coming into operation of this Order in Council after his seat became, or is alleged to have become, vacant by reason of his having any direct or indirect pecuniary interest in any contract with the Government of the Island for or on account of the Public Service, or of his having accepted a public office under the Crown in the Island, within the meaning of Article XVII. of the Principal Order ; and if any such action, prosecution or legal proceeding has been, or shall hereafter be, brought or instituted, it shall be dismissed and made void, subject to such order as to costs as the Court may think fit to make.

III. Article XVII. (1) of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso :—

"Provided that nothing in this Article shall be construed so as to render vacant the seat of any Elected Member of the Council on the ground that by reason of his being or becoming an Editor of the Sinhalese Etymological Dictionary he has, or may have, any such pecuniary interest in any contract with the Government of this Island as aforesaid, or has accepted any public office under the Crown in this Island within the meaning of this Article."

IV. His Majesty hereby reserves to Himself, His Heirs, and Successors, power, with the advice of His or Their Privy Council, to revoke, alter or amend this Order as to Him or Them shall seem fit.

**S**CHEDULES of rates are hereby invited for additions and improvements to Warehouse No. 2, Kalutara North.

2. 5. The tendered rates must be entered in ink, and any alterations must bear the initials of the tenderer and witnesses.

6. Before tender forms can be issued the intending contractor must deposit a sum of Rs. 25 either at the General Treasury or at the local Kacheheri. The receipt must be handed to the District Engineer, Kalutara. The deposit will be refunded to all *bona fide* tenderers after the agreement has been signed by the successful tenderer. ## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 8, 1928.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 228 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 148 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 36 Moors, 4 Malays, and 9 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1928, viz., 264,713) was 45.0, as against 44.4 in the preceding week, 40.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 170 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 99 Sinhalese, 42 Tamils, 16 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.6, as against 32.4 in the previous week, 31.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 170 total deaths, 45 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 21.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Twenty-four deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals including 5 deaths of non-residents; 5 in Slave Island, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 21 in the previous week, and 19 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in St. Paul's, 2 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar, and 1 in Kotahena North. The number registered during the preceding week was also 10, and the weekly average for last year was 6.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals and 1 in Maradana South, as against 6 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 14 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Wellawatta North. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 1.

5. Thirteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 10 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 9 from *Enteritis*, 8 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 each from *Dysentery* and *Worms*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 1 each from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, *Suicide*, and *Accident*, and 68 from *Other Causes*.

6. Fifty-six cases of *Measles*, 8 of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 33, 13, 10, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 79.5°, against 79.6° in the preceding week and 81.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.886 in., against 29.903 in. in the preceding week and 29.620 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.85 in. against 5.94 in. in the preceding week, and 1.03 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

2. Officers should be made subject to the following conditions by letter, preferably under sealed and registered cover, addressed to the Divisional Forest Officer concerned and posted, or handed over personally, not later than midday on Friday, February 15, 1929, the envelope being marked on the left hand top corner "Officer for Purchase of Timber, &c.," and signed by tenderer.

3. Lump sums offers should be made for each item in the schedule and be written both in words and figures. Offers may be made for more than one item in the same letter, but should be quoted for each item separately.

4. In the case of offers which in the aggregate exceed Rs. 20, tenderers shall remit Rs. 5 either with their offers or within two days of their offers to the Divisional Forest Officer of the division concerned. This sum will be returned if their offers are rejected. The purchaser will be given credit for the amount in the final payment for the timber.

5. The species, measurements, cubic contents, &c., of the material appearing in the schedule are to be regarded as only approximate, and intending tenders are presumed to have inspected the timber before they make their offers and they should bring to the notice of the Divisional Forest Officer any serious discrepancies which they may notice. ## Sale of Ebony.

**A**N auction sale of the under-mentioned ebony will be held at the Central Timber Depot, Kew road, Slave Island, Colombo, on Saturday, January 19, 1929, at 10 A.M., subject to the following conditions:—

1. The timber will be put up in lots to suit buyers at a rate per lot, and no advance of less than Re. 1 per lot will be accepted.

2. The highest bid will be accepted, subject to the approval or disapproval of the Conservator of Forests. The highest bidder will be required by the officer conducting the sale to sign the sale book kept for the purpose directly a lot has been knocked down to him.

3. Payment of 25 per cent. of the successful bids to be made at time of sale, if so required.

4. Buyers will be allowed to have the logs weighed at the depot premises, if so required, the cost of reweighing to be borne by such buyers. If any difference is found between the depot weight and the weight ascertained after reweighing, a certificate will be issued by this Department showing the actual weight at the time of reweighing provided the buyers require such certificate for export purposes. But no allowance will be made for any shortage when making payment, the logs being sold by auction at a rate per lot and not per ton.

5. No timber shall be removed before payment of the full price bid, and all timber sold must be removed from the depot

within ten days of date of notification of acceptance by the Conservator of Forests of such bid, and will be at the risk of the purchasers until removed.

6. Should any person to whom a lot is knocked down refuse to take it over at the full price bid, or refuse or fail to sign the sale book and pay 25 per cent. of his bid when so required, or refuse or fail to pay the full purchase amount or balance thereof, as the case may be and to remove the timber within the time specified in clause 5 above, the lot will again be put up for auction, and the original purchaser or bidder will be held liable for any loss to Government owing to a lower price being realized at the resale, while, if an enhanced price is realized at such resale, he shall, however, have no claim to the profit, which shall accrue to Government.

7. Agents bidding for others will be required to produce a written authority from the firm or persons for whom they bid, such authority will be retained by the Assistant Conservator of Forests, and will hold good only at the particular sale at which it is produced.

8. The description of the logs appearing in the remarks column of the following list is entered merely for the guidance of the intending purchasers, who, as usual, should satisfy themselves as to its correctness before purchasing the logs.

## MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, November 7, 1928, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated October 31, 1928.

*Present* :—Mr. H. E. Newnham, M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Lieut.-Colonel C. D. Myles, O.B.E., M.B., R.A.M.C.; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. J. S. Collett; Dr. R. G. Jayetileke; and Mr. F. Dadabhoy; J.P.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 3, 1928, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of October 3, 1928, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal asked the Chairman the following questions :—(1) Whether the Chairman is now aware that 9 deaths were reported of persons who had partaken of meals served in a Pettah eating-house on September 24? (2) Whether the statement attributed to the Chairman that "He knew nothing of the affair (Pettah Poisoning Case) neither had he read what the local newspapers published about it" appearing in the issue of "The Daily News" of October 8, is correct? (3) If so, when the Chairman was first informed of it and by whom? (4) Is it a practice that references pertaining to the administration of the City in the newspapers have to be brought to the notice of the Chairman? If so, by whom? If not, will the Chairman consider the desirability of introducing such a practice. If it is the practice, was it observed in this case and when? (5) Does not the Chairman think it is conducive to the loss of confidence in the administration that an unusual incident of this nature had not come within the knowledge of Chief Executive Officer of the City Council until his attention was drawn to it by a newspaper reporter fourteen days later? (6) Whether the eating-house in question has been located? If so, when? (7) Is it a place for which a licence has been obtained? If not, has any action been taken? (8) How many times has the Ward Inspector visited this eating-house for the year before the deaths were reported? How many times after? (9) Has any action been taken by the Ward Inspector since these deaths were reported, and if so, what? If not, why not? (10) How many visits were paid to this eating-house by the Food Inspector before these deaths were reported? How many after? (11) Have either of the Inspectors submitted reports on the subject? (12) Has there been any difficulty in locating the eating-house in question as stated by the Acting Medical Officer of Health in an interview granted to a representative of "The Morning Leader" on October 8, which appears in the issue of that paper on October 9? (13) When did the Medical Officer of Health's Department first locate the eating-house in question? (14) Has the Microbiologist submitted a report? If so, when? (15) Does the Chairman propose publishing this report and when? (16) Does not the Chairman think the publication of a statement immediately on receipt of the report of the Microbiologist would have allayed public feeling? (17) Whether the Chairman would consider the desirability of making more frequent use of the Press table to inform the public of action taken by the Council in matters affecting public interest?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) The Chairman is aware of 8 deaths that took place after meals taken in the Pettah on different dates. (2) The statement was true at the time the Chairman made it. (3) The Chairman has no record of this. (4) No; but the daily papers are submitted to the Chairman daily and he reads them as and when he has the time and opportunity. (5) The suggestion in the question is incorrect. Apart from that, the Chairman thinks it desirable that the rate-payers should share the confidence he himself reposes in the Medical Officer of Health and the Public Health Department to deal with cases like the one in question—a confidence which was proved in this case to be fully justified. (6) Yes, on September 29, the day after information of the occurrence was first received. (7) It is a licensed eating-house. (8) 12 before, and 8 after up till October 30. (9) Yes; he inspected it in detail with the Second Assistant Medical Officer of Health. It was cleaned and limewashed. All old utensils were removed and many of them were destroyed with the consent of the owner. (10) The Food Inspector is absent on sick leave and the Acting Food Inspector, who took charge on August 28, had not visited this eating-house before the deaths were reported. He paid 5 visits since up to October 30. (11) No written reports have been submitted by either. (12) Yes. (13) It was provisionally located on September 29, and its identity confirmed on about October 9. (14) Yes, on October 18. (15) No; it is too technical to be of general interest. (16) No. (17) Yes.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah asked the Chairman the following question :—In view of the large quantity of patent medicines and preserved foodstuffs (animal and vegetable) imported into this country, does the Chairman consider the introduction of a "Food and Drugs Act" urgently needed? If so, will the Chairman take the necessary steps to press the Government to introduce a "Food and Drugs Bill" at an early date?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) Yes; and in this respect the Chairman's opinion coincides with the opinion of every Chairman since at least 1912 in which year Government informed the then Chairman that "it is proposed shortly to introduce before Council an Ordinance to make better provision for the sale of food and drugs in a pure state." (2) A bill was drafted in the same year, but not introduced. The Chairman, on inquiry, was informed in 1917 that the draft Ordinance cannot be proceeded with.

The late Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Marshall Philip, repeatedly represented to the Chairman, and the Chairman repeatedly represented to the Government the urgent need of such a bill, if Ceylon was to be saved "the immediate risk of being the dumping ground for inferior foodstuffs and drugs which the laws of other countries made unsaleable." In October, 1920, Government stated that the Hon. the Attorney-General was drafting the required Ordinance, but in December, 1920, Government stated that it could not proceed with the bill owing to the unsatisfactory financial position. Subsequent representations received a similar reply, until in May, 1925, the present Chairman reviewed the subject in a letter to Government and again urged the introduction of the bill. To this there has been received no reply.

Having failed in this object, the Chairman directed his efforts to secure the prohibition of the importation of skimmed milk under the Customs Ordinance, and in September, 1925, with the approval of Council, addressed Government on the subject. This prohibition was gazetted in September, 1927. The Chairman has now applied himself again to the main issue of 1912.

4. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C., be renominated a member of the Advisory Committee for the Colombo Municipal area under the Excise Notification No. 181, framed under "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," for a period of three years commencing on October 1, 1928. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike moved—In view of the fact that the Government Committee appointed to inquire into taxation is reported to have recommended the introduction of a betting tax, this Council requests the Government to permit the tax, as far as Colombo is concerned, to accrue to the revenue of the Municipality. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.—Carried.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 6 to 12 (inclusive) on the agenda. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing and the Special Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee :—

*Extract from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of October 17, 1928.*

(2) To consider further representations from the Director of Electrical Undertakings in regard to overhead mains. Before considering this question the Members of the Committees went with the Director of Electrical Undertakings to inspect overhead wires put up at Jawatta road, and the safety devices used there as an illustration of the proposals.

At the resumed meeting, Mr. J. S. Pitkeathly explained the combined underground and overhead systems proposed, and the advantages accruing therefrom. He also explained the difference in the cost, both in the initial expenditure and in the maintenance and supply of current if all the mains were placed underground. He also described the advantages to be derived with regard to the facility of repairs in the case of an overhead system. Mr. Pitkeathly was very emphatic in his opinion that the danger from overhead wires would be negligible. Mr. Pitkeathly answered several questions put to him by the Members and then retired with his officers. Recommended that the Council should not give any general approval to overhead wires, but should deal with the matter section by section, after seeing the detailed plans of each section.

*Resolution.*

With regard to above item No. 2, Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy spoke to the recommendation, opposing the general use of overhead cables.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike supported the general use of overhead cables and opposed the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees. He moved that the recommendation of the Works and Finance Committees of September 19, 1928, be adopted, namely "that general approval be given to the proposal to erect overhead mains and apparatus for the distribution of electrical energy in Colombo, subject to the specific approval of the Council in regard to whether the mains are to be overhead or underground when the detailed plans are submitted before the work is begun in any individual street. This approval is to be on the understanding that adequate safety devices are provided." The Chairman seconded.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal opposed the motion.

The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, moved as an amendment—That the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees of October 17, 1928, be approved, namely, "That the Council should not give any general approval to overhead wires, but should deal with the matter section by section, after seeing the detailed plans of each section." Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy seconded.—Carried.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of October 23, 1928.*

(2) To consider the reference from the Council on October 3, 1928, regarding applicants for promotions and appointments.—Recommended that the following Standing Orders be adopted :—(a) When vacancies are to be filled a notice will be either published in the Press or circulated to all Departments stating the qualifications required for the post, either by the Council, or by the Committees, or by the Chairman, and the date by which applications will be received, and by whom. The Head of the Department will then schedule the applications and forward them with his comments to the Chairman. If the appointment is to be made by the Chairman, the Head of the Department will state the three applicants whom he selects as most suitable in the order of their suitability. (b) If the appointment is to be made by the Council, the Head of the Department will select after such interviews, as he deems necessary, the six to ten applicants whom he considers the most suitable, and will forward their names, with the schedule, in alphabetical order to the Chairman, who will submit them to the relative Committees intimating to the selected applicants the time of the meeting in case the Committees desire to interview them. (c) Further representation from applicants after the time specified in the notice calling for applications will not be considered, except such as are made personally at the Committee Meeting.

*N.B.*—Any member of the Committees has, of course, the right to call for the attendance of any other candidate not among those selected as above.

(5) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated October 12, 1928, suggesting that Chapter VIII., by-law 24 (4) (b), be amended by substituting "Rs. 30" for "17.50."—Recommended.

(7) To consider—(a) The resignation tendered by Dr. M. C. Barclay, Assistant Medical Officer of Health (Child Welfare), with effect from October 31, 1928; (b) a report of the Medical Officer of Health dated August 25, 1928; (c) memorandum thereon of the Chairman.—Recommended—(a) That the resignation of Dr. M. C. Barclay be accepted with effect from October 31, 1928; (b) that she be not required to refund the cost of her passage to Ceylon; (c) that the cost of her return passage to India be not paid by the Council. That a "Medical Officer-in-Charge" of Maternity and Child Welfare be advertised for in Ceylon and India.

*Resolutions.*

With regard to item No. 7 (corresponding to item No. 12 of the extracts from the minutes of the Sanitation Committee of October 24, 1928), the Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees be adopted, subject to the deletion of part (b), and the substitution therefor of the following :—(b) That the Council reserves its right to claim a refund of her passage from India, pending the settlement of the question of Dr. Barclay's other claims. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of October 22, 1928.*

(4) To consider a letter dated October 18, 1928, from Mr. N. R. Blande, M.M.C., requesting that the exercising or training of horses on the Galle Face Green be prohibited.—Recommended that the exercising or training of horses on the Galle Face Green between the Centre road and the Galle Face Drive be prohibited.



(5) To consider—(a) A petition presented through Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, M.M.C., in Council, on September 5, 1928, from the stall-holders of the Kachcheri road vegetable market ; (b) a report of the Municipal Treasurer ; (c) a memorandum thereon of the Chairman.—Recommended that the petitioners be informed that the Council is unable to provide an alternative space at present.

(7) To consider the question of the provision of cheap medical aid to Municipal officers.—Recommended—(I) (a) That the Municipal Officers, their families, and Municipal pensioners should have free medical attendance at the Municipal dispensaries and be given such drugs as are stocked at cost price ; (b) that arrangements cannot be made for the dispensary medical officers to extend this concession to domiciliary visit. (2) (a) That bacteriological examination at the Municipal laboratory be free of charge to Municipal officers, their families, and pensioners ; (b) that their inoculations with (1) anti-tetanus serum, (2) anti-typhoid serum be given free, but that in the case of other inoculations, the inoculation only be given free and that the cost of serum be charged. (3) (a) That inquiries be made from Government whether the same or similar concessions as are allowed to Government officers of the subordinate staff can be extended to Municipal officers or pensioners for treatment at the General Hospital, for example, in the Skinner's Ward, when a Municipal medical officer considers that the case is one for treatment at the General Hospital ; (b) that Government be also asked whether free treatment can be accorded to Municipal officers at the Eye Hospital and Dental Institute. ; (4) that any Municipal officer, when in the opinion of a medical board, has contracted diseases in the discharge of his duties be provided with free treatment, when necessary, at the General or Infectious Diseases Hospitals.

(9) To consider letter No. 165, dated August 24, 1928, from the Medical Officer of Health, recommending that the following infectious diseases, viz., (1) pneumonia, (2) dysentery (bacillary and amoebic), and (3) whooping cough, be added to the present list of notifiable diseases specified in section 205 (1) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.—Recommended that whooping-cough and dysentery be made notifiable, and that a further report be obtained regarding pneumonia.

(11) To consider—(a) A report of the City Microbiologist, regarding the equipment and fitting of the extended laboratory and requesting that a sum of Rs. 5,500 be provided in the 1929 budget ; (b) a memorandum thereon of the Municipal Treasurer.—Recommended that a sum of Rs. 5,500 be included in the Budget.

(12) To consider—(a) The resignation tendered by Dr. M. C. Barclay, Assistant Medical Officer of Health (Child Welfare), with effect from October 31, 1928 ; (b) a report of the Medical Officer of Health dated August 25, 1928 ; (c) a memorandum thereon of the Chairman.—Recommended—(a) That the resignation of Dr. M. C. Barclay be accepted with effect from October 31, 1928 ; (b) that she be not required to refund the cost of her passage to Ceylon ; and (c) that the cost of her return passage to India be paid by the Council. That a " Medical Officer-in-Charge " of Maternity and Child Welfare be advertised for in Ceylon and India.

#### Resolutions.

With regard to item No. 4, it was resolved that the consideration of the matter be deferred to next meeting.

With regard to item No. 5, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved that the matter be deferred and referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration. The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 9, Dr. S. Muttiah moved that whooping cough and dysentery be made notifiable, but not pneumonia. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Sanitation Committee be adopted. Lieut.-Colonel C. D. Myles seconded.

Dr. R. G. Jayetileke supported the amendment. Dr. E. V. Ratnam spoke against the amendment.—The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

With regard to item No. 12, *vide* resolution of Council of these minutes in connection with the recommendation of item No. 7 of the extracts from the minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of October 23, 1928.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

#### Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of October 23, 1928.

(2) To recommend the following by-law made under section 18 of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, for the area comprised within the administrative limits of the Municipal Council of Colombo :—“ The rider of a solo pedal cycle shall not carry any other person on such cycle when it is in motion. For the purposes of this by-law the person who, for the time being, is propelling a solo pedal cycle with his feet or is otherwise in effective control thereof shall be deemed to be the rider thereof.”—Recommended.

(3) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated September 27, 1928, regarding painting of advertisements on the surface of roads in the City and inquiring “ Shall we, under section 110 (6) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, pass the following by-law ? ” —“ No unauthorized person shall mark on the surface of any public street, any lines, words, letters, or drawings, or any design.”—Recommended.

(5) To consider—(a) Letter dated October 9, 1928, from the Colombo and Water Co., Ltd., stating that the Directors have decided to make a fresh offer—of Rs. 3 per 1,000 cubic feet for all supplies to Municipal buildings, and for street lighting the rates are to be based on a rate of Rs. 2 per 1,000 cubic feet below that charged to the ordinary consumer under (a) of the first part of the schedule—for a period of 5 years from January 1, 1929, and inquiring whether the Council will agree to a contract for the above period ; (b) the comments of the Municipal Engineer and the Municipal Treasurer.—Recommended.

(6) To consider the proposed amendment to regulation 1 of the regulations regarding the parking of cars at the Galle Face green sanctioned by Council on August 8, 1928. The amendments are shown in italics—(1) No motor car shall be parked on *that portion of the Galle Face green lying between the Galle Face Centre road and the Galle Face Drive*, except on the space between the Galle Face Centre road and the white line on the green.—Recommended.

(7) To consider a letter, dated October 18, 1928, from Mr. N. R. Blande, M.M.C., requesting that the exercising or training of horses on the Galle Face green be prohibited.—Recommended that horses be prohibited from using the Galle Face green between the Centre road and the Galle Face Drive.

(8) To consider a schedule of taxes and fees proposed to be levied for 1929.—Recommended (*vide* annexure A).

(11) To consider an application from the Secretary, Ceylon Agency, Imperial War Graves Commission, for the free grant of two graves in the Buddhist section of the Kanatta cemetery, and also for the maintenance of these two graves, as per agreement, dated March 15, 1928.—Recommended.

(12) To consider seeking the authority of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under section 153 (1) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, to sell outright, the following properties, vested in the Council, the owners having been given more than six months' notice to obtain a retransfer, in terms of the Council's resolution of August 4, 1926 :—

#### Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding the Housing and Town Improvement of October 31, 1928.

(2) To consider the resolution of Council of July 4, 1928, on the motion of Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaransike, M.M.C. :—  
 "In view of the serious situation created, and the great hardship caused, by the housing problem in Colombo, particularly by the increase in house rents, this Council refers the matter to the Housing and Town Improvement Committee for consideration of, and report on, a possible solution of the problem on the following lines :—(f) The desirability of imposing some sort of rent control, pending the materialization of one or more of the above schemes."—(f) Recommended :—  
 (i.) That Government be requested to introduce a Rent Restriction Bill for Colombo; (ii.) That to assist the Government Mr. E. J. Samarawickreme, K.C., be asked to draft a bill on the following lines :—(a) The standard rent be fixed as the rent paid on January 1, 1928; (b) The Ordinance should apply to premises used for residential purposes whose rent did not exceed Rs. 150 a month on January 1, 1928, or the assessment of which did not exceed Rs. 1,500 a year for 1928; (c) The Ordinance should be worked through the Court presided over by the Municipal Magistrate; (d) Appeal from the decisions of the Magistrate should be to the Court of Requests; (e) The duration of the Ordinance should be five years, and it should then lapse unless reintroduced.

#### Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do resume. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

## ANNEXURE C.

## Colombo Municipal Council.

## Passage Scheme.

1. Leave passages may be granted to officers of the higher staff of the Permanent Establishment, whose domicile is outside Ceylon, proceeding on leave out of the Island.

2. The wife and children (including unmarried dependent daughters, but not sons over eighteen years of age) may also be granted passages whether travelling with the officer or not. Provided that the passages so granted, including the officer's own passage, shall not be more than five full passages in all.

3. In the case of an officer or his family proceeding on leave before the expiration of four years' resident service from date of last return from leave, he will be required to bear a proportion of the cost of the passage based on the number of months he is short of the above-mentioned period.

Provided that in the case of an officer requesting passages for his wife and/or family before he himself proceeds on leave, the Council will bear the proportion of the cost of such passages from the date of his last return from leave up to the date of the departure of his wife and/or family. On the officer proceeding on leave himself a further proportion up to that date will be borne by the Council.

4. The wife and children of an officer—

- (a) returning after condemnation by a Medical Board ;  
(b) dying in the service

may be granted passages.

5. In the case of officers proceeding on leave preparatory to retirement, free single passages will be given after a qualifying period of service of two years from date of return from last leave.

6. Study passages may be granted to officers on the higher staff of the Permanent Establishment, to enable them to acquire professional qualifications by a course of study in the United Kingdom or elsewhere. Officers who are granted this privilege by the Council will not be entitled to free railway tickets for themselves during a period of four years from the date of their return from leave.

7. First class passages will be provided for officers whose salary is Rs. 9,000 a year or over. Second class passages will be provided for all other officers.

8. The expressions first class and second class refer to passage by non-mail steamer. Second class by mail steamer will be regarded as equivalent to first class by non-mail. The Chairman shall from time to time fix an amount which shall be deemed to be the cost of a Council passage in either class.

9. An officer or his family—

- (a) travelling by other than the cheapest route ;  
(b) using other than the cheapest accommodation

may receive assistance not exceeding the cost of a Council passage.

10. Leave passages will ordinarily be granted only to the officer's home or to the home of his wife. The destination to which passages may be granted to officers proceeding to the United Kingdom will be London, and in the case of other countries, such port as the Chairman may decide.

11. The extra cost of providing two single passages instead of a return passage must be borne by the officer concerned.

12. All passages must be booked through the Municipal Treasurer, except in the case of officers who elect to travel on steamship lines with which the Council has no agreement. In these cases officers will submit the tickets or receipts for inspection by the Treasurer.

13. The "cost of a passage" means the actual sum paid or the sum fixed under paragraph nine—whichever is less.

14. All applications for passages must be made to the Treasurer in the prescribed form supported by necessary documents.

15. No application for an officer's own leave passage can be considered until the leave has been sanctioned.

16. Officers applying for study passages will be required to state the course of study which they intend to pursue and on their return will be required to produce to the Chairman a certificate from the Head of their Department that such course of study was followed with satisfactory results.

17. The unused portion of any ticket must be surrendered to the Treasurer.

The motion of the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando was put to the meeting and lost.

Dr. R. G. Jayetilleke moved that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. F. Dada-bhoj seconded.—Carried.

On the suggestion of Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy, the press was requested to publish only the resolution arrived at.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider item No. 7 of the above extracts. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

## Council in Committee.

The Chairman detailed the facts connected with the transaction.

The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando stated that the Council should purchase the tramways, but before doing so Government should be approached with a view to a loan being raised for the purpose at a low rate of interest.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike supported the recommendation of the Standing Committees. Mr. M. L. M. Royal supported the suggestion of the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando.

Mr. N. R. Blande and Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy spoke to the recommendation of the Standing Committees. The Chairman detailed considerations for and against the proposal.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved, that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted with the addition of the following words:—"In view of the fact that the Tramway Company have refused to give any figures on which the Council can base an estimate of the value of the undertaking" the motion to read as follows:—

In view of the fact that the Tramway Company have refused to give any figures on which the Council can base an estimate of the value of the undertaking, the Council do not give notice to the Tramway Company to exercise their option to purchase the Tramway Company in 1929.

Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy seconded.—Carried unanimously.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on October 20, 1928, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated October 17, 1928.

*Present* :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. Geo E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Dr. F. Keyt; Mr. E. H. van der Straaten; Mr. A. V. Perera.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on September 15, 1928, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1927 to September 30, 1928, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for September.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of September.
- (e) The reservoir readings for September.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Report by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during September.

Before the business of the day was proceeded with, Mr. Ratwatte moved—That a vote of condolence with Mr. George E. de Silva and the other members of the family be passed on the loss sustained by them through the death of their mother. Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.—The vote was passed, all Members standing.

4. Petitions :—Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake presented—(1) Petition from the Assistant Physician and Attendant at the Ayurvedic Dispensary for increased of pay.

(2) Petition from K. Mohideen Adumaie asking for a rice depôt at the Market grounds.

(3) Petition from N. M. Moosa Naina asking for permission to build a rice depôt on the Market grounds.

(4) Petition from Overseer Phillips asking for an increase of pay.

Mr. A. V. Perera presented—(5) Petition from N. M. Moosa Naina complaining about not receiving a permit to build at premises No. 86A, Brownrigg street.

(6) Petition from N. Abdul Majeed of Deyannawela asking that the licences of the mutton stalls Nos. 71 and 72 be transferred in his favour.

(7) Letter from Advocate LaBrooy *re* the seizure of dogs wearing collars and Municipal Badges.

(8) Petition from S. N. Abdul Majeed *re* malpractices in connection with the import of Indian goats.

5. Correspondence :—(1) Letter No. W 513/28 of September 18, 1928, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary authorizing the Municipal Council to widen certain corners in Lady MacCarthy's road.—Read.

(2) Letter No. W 501/28 of September 20, 1928, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary authorising the Municipal Council to widen the narrow portions of Lady MacCarthy's road shown in preliminary plan No. 8,353.—Read.

(3) Letter No. W 567/28 of September 25, 1928, intimating that authority has been issued to the Surveyor-General for the survey of the land required for a Transformer Sub-Station at Peradeniya.—Read.

(4) Letter No. X 1248 of October 9, from the Government Agent, Central Province, requesting the Council to nominate an unofficial member of the Council as a representative in the Excise Advisory Committee for the period October 1, 1928, to September 30, 1931. Mr. Wijayatilake proposed that Mr. de Silva be nominated. Mr. Ismail seconded.—Carried.

(5) Letter No. L 303/28 of October 1, 1928, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, stating that the lease of the site required for the erection of a shed for the bier provided by the Kandy Sri Sucharithabhiwardana Society can be granted at a rental of Rs. 12 per annum subject to the approval of the Government Agent.

It was agreed that enquiry be made whether the rent could be reduced to a merely nominal figure since the land is to be used to house a bier which has been provided by private philanthropy.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva asked—Will the Chairman be pleased to state what steps have been taken to establish a cemetery at Mavilmada?

The Chairman replied as follows :—I have provisionally selected a site and the matter was down for discussion at to-day's meeting of the Finance Committee.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake asked—Will the Chairman be pleased to state—(1) If there is a catalogue of books at the Municipal Library? (2) If so, will the Chairman take steps to have copies of same printed so as to make same available for members of the library at cost price? (3) If there is no catalogue ready, will the Chairman see that a catalogue is prepared and printed at an early date? (4) Is the Chairman aware that the septic tank at Mulgampola is not in proper working order? (5) If so, what steps have been taken to prevent the place becoming a nuisance to the residents of the locality?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) A list of books is found in the library. (2) A classified catalogue was prepared by the Accountant outside his office hours for all sections, other than the Reference Department. He reports that he has not been able to devote any time on the catalogue within the past few months owing to pressure of office work, and he would do so as soon as he could spare the time for it. (3) The catalogue will be printed as soon as it is completed. (4) I was aware that this septic tank, as well as the one below the lake spill, is not working satisfactorily. (5) Mr. Brian Dyer, the Sanitary Engineer attached to the Department of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, has examined these two septic tanks at my request. Samples of the effluent are being sent to Colombo for analysis, and when the result is known, it will be possible to take further steps.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Perera asked—(1) Is it the fact that demands are being made from persons applying for building permits, to donate by deed, extends varying from 5 to 10 feet in breadth along the road frontage of the land sought to be built upon, before such building permits are allowed? (2) If so, will the Chairman please state by what authority or under what law such demands are made? (3) If such demands are made without lawful authority, does not the Chairman consider such demands a species of blackmail, and will the Chairman kindly direct the officers concerned to desist from making illegal demands? (4) Is it the fact that when applications for building permits are made, permits are not issued until after the lapse of several months? (5) In view of the grave inconvenience caused by the shortage of houses in Kandy, will the Chairman kindly see that in future the building permit is issued within a week or 10 days at the most, of the receipt of the application for such permit, provided the plan conforms to the building regulations.

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) This is so. (2) The demand is not made under the authority of any law. (3) We have a right to forbid the building of a house on an existing road, which is less than 20 feet wide, in terms of section 18 (1) (a) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915. Where a person desires to build on a road which appears likely to be widened in the future, but which is at present less than 20 feet wide, I have called upon the intending builder, as consideration for permission to build, to give up a strip along his boundary representing the difference between the width of the road and 20 feet, or half the difference if there is building land on the opposite side of the road. The principle of permitting exceptions to the law in return for a *Quid pro quo* is recognized in Town Planning operations. A somewhat similar principle, too, is indicated in section 106 (2) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915 according to which a wall may be built within 20 feet of the road provided the builder agrees to forego compensation for its acquisition in the future. I do not think, therefore, that the procedure followed by me is a violent departure from existing principles. (4) Certainly, permits have been delayed when the original plans have not been in order and correspondence has resulted in consequence. I do not think there has been undue delay where the original plans have been in order, but if the honourable member has any specific cases to adduce, I shall be glad to go into them. (5) I will certainly do all I can to expedite these permits.

8A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Usoof Ismail asked—What step does the Chairman intend taking regarding the removal of the telephone overhead wires which interfere with the erection of new lamp posts along Ward street.

The Chairman read a letter from the Municipal Electrical Engineer explaining that steps would be taken to have the necessary alterations made by the Telegraph Department.

9. With the leave of the Council, Mr. Perera moved—That this Council considers that the Board of Improvement now serves no useful purpose and that the Board of Improvement should be immediately abolished and its powers be vested in the Council. Mr. de Silva seconded and it was carried by 5 votes, the Chairman, Mr. Ratwatte, Dr. Hay, and Dr. Keyt having refrained from voting.

10. To sanction estimate for Rs. 5,078·74 for building an all iron garage with four compartments for the Municipal Council lorries.

Resolved to convert two rooms at the Katugastota Granary as an experiment to house the lorries.

11. To sanction estimate for Rs. 150 for guard rails for bridge over Meda-ela at the Katukele Model Tenements.

Resolved that the estimate be sanctioned.

12. Papers *re* additional vote of Rs. 2,215·25 required for the maintenance of water works.

Resolved that the vote be allowed.

13. To write off the following irrecoverable sums in respect of rates on vacant houses and on properties acquired by the Council for Back lanes as recommended by the Finance Committee:—2nd quarter, 1926, Rs. 443·24; 3rd quarter, 1926, Rs. 414·68; 4th quarter, 1926, Rs. 165·84; 1st quarter, 1927, Rs. 143·04.

Resolved that the sums be accordingly written off.

14. Papers *re* the proposed lease of Municipal land, about half an acre in extent, near the abandoned quarry in Gregory road.

Resolved that the lease be auctioned for 25 years at an upset rental of Rs. 60 per annum with the option of renewal for a further 25 years, with the liberty to increase the rental if so desired.

15. Papers *re* the lease of the right to collect daily rents from the market spaces in 1929.

Resolved that (1) the right to collect the rents of the vegetable market be sold by auction with a reserve price; (2) the rents of the spaces inside the market be collected departmentally; (3) sites be marked out in area C for 50 booths and the right to occupy be auctioned. The lessee to put up booths of an approved type.

16. To obtain a vote of Rs. 7,907·02 to meet the expenditure in connection with the chloronome.

Resolved that the vote be allowed.

17. Papers *re* house allowance to the Superintendent of Municipal Works recommended by the Finance Committee at their Meeting of July 28, 1928.

Resolved that the matter be deferred for consideration with the Budget.

18. To confirm Mr. P. de Lanerolle in his appointment as Shorthand Writer and Typist.

Resolved that Mr. Lanerolle be confirmed.

19. To sanction the appointment of an officer on salary attached to Grade III. of the Municipal Service to succeed Mr. I. S. W. Wijeratnam, the retiring Recordkeeper.

Resolved that sanction be allowed.

20. To sanction the expenditure of Rs. 28 for erecting additional electric light at the Dharma lines.

Resolved that the expenditure be sanctioned.

21. Papers *re* the proposed overhead service main from Katugastota road to a point close to the elephants' bathing place.

Resolved that the estimate for Rs. 700 for overhead mains be passed.

22. Rules relating to the supply of electric current to consumers.

Resolved that the rules be approved.

23. Papers *re* application for increase of salary from William Singho of the Electricity Department and the Chairman's memorandum thereon.

Resolved that the matter be left in the hands of the Chairman.

Improvements in Cinema Projection Screens.

*Abstract.*—A close texture fabric screen is painted on the back with lead paint or coated with a transparent backing. A transparent adhesive is placed on the front and covered with either plano-convex lenses, plane side down, or concavo-convex lenses. Adhesive is then added to embed the whole and give a smooth flat surface.

The claims are:—

1. A cinema or like projection screen comprising a base on the front of which are secured by a transparent and colourless adhesive a number of convex lenses with the convex sides projecting from the screen, and completely embedded in the adhesive.
2. A cinema or like projection screen as claimed in claim 1, wherein the lenses are plano-convex.
3. A cinema or like projection screen as claimed in claim 1, wherein the lenses are concavo-convex.
4. A cinema or like projection screen as claimed in claim 1, wherein the surface of the adhesive is provided with a third top coating of the transparent adhesive.
5. A cinema or like projection screen constructed and arranged substantially as described and for the purposes stated.

Process for treating rubber latex and product.

*Abstract.*—An acid rubber is formed by incorporating with the latex an easily hydrolyzable salt of a fixed acid and a volatile base and the latex dried. Ammonium phosphate, citrate, and oxalate are mentioned.

The claims are:—

1. Process for treating rubber latex characterized by incorporating with the latex an easily hydrolyzable compound of a fixed acid, and a volatile base and manufacturing rubber from the latex by evaporation methods.

2. Process in accordance with claim 1, characterized in that the compound used is an ammonium salt of a fixed acid.
  3. Process in accordance with claim 1, characterized in that the compound is used in quantity sufficient to give a rubber whose water extract has a pH less than 7.
  4. A dried all-solids-content latex rubber whose water extract has a pH less than 7.
  5. A rubber derived from dried all-solids-content latex and containing as a drying decomposition product an acid in quantity sufficient to give a water extract with a pH less than 7, said rubber having substantially the same milling properties as pale crepe or smoked sheet rubber.
  6. The entire dried product of latex incorporated with ammonia and phosphoric acid.

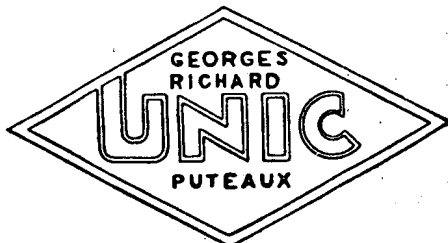
