## GOVERNMENT CLERICAL EXAMINATION, 1929.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter Class II. of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service will be held commencing on April 16, 1929. This examination is confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in Ceylon.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Education, must bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and must be in the prescribed form (Schedule A). Forms can be obtained at the Education Office, and application for the same must be sent so as to reach that office by January 31. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to have been born on or after April 1, 1906, but not later than March 31, 1912, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,\* to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration from the register of past births, the certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which the candidate is known, (a) the parent or guardian in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 21 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895; and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Director of Education that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

3. Candidates other than those eligible under paragraph 5 must also furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed either—

- (a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or higher examinations of the University of London; or
- (b) The Cambridge Junior or the English School-Leaving Certificate Examination and either (i.) the Examination for the Commercial Certificates of the Government Technical Schools or of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce or (ii.) the Examination for the London Chamber of Commerce Junior Certificates in English, Arithmetic, and either Bookkeeping or Shorthand and Typewriting.

4. A candidate who gives notice of withdrawal to the Education Office fifteen days before the date of commencement of the examination will have the value of stamps affixed to his entry form refunded to him. In cases where a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission a refund of four-fifths the value of the stamps will be made. In no other case will a refund be made, but a candidate prevented by illness from taking up the examination for which he has entered will be permitted to re-enter for either of the two following examinations without further fee, provided notice of withdrawal accompanied by the entry form and a medical certificate from a qualified medical officer be sent to the Director of Education not later than the last day of the examination, and provided further that the regulations are complied with in other respects.

5. Clerks in Government Service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments), from whatever funds they may be paid, who shall have completed three years' service, before the date of the examination and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination, irrespective of age and without fee, and although they may not have passed the examination or examinations referred to in paragraph 3. Their applications (in the same form) for admission to the examination must be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments.

6. Clerks in Government Service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments) if within the age prescribed in paragraph 2 above will be admitted without fee, even though they have not completed three years' service under Government, but they must have passed the examination or examinations referred to in paragraph 3.

7. Candidates in Government Service who are not eligible under paragraphs 5 and 6 may enter for the examination under the conditions laid down in paragraphs 2 and 3.

8. Applications must reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on February 8, 1929. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

9. The Director of Education will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

10. The examination will be held at Colombo only in places which will be notified to the candidates in due course. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments whose applications have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education leave to present themselves for the examination.

11. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for general competition will be thirty.

12. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

13. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule B of this notice. The examination will be held in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, Arithmetic, and English Language and Composition. The papers of any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting and Spelling and half the marks allowed for Arithmetic and English Language and Composition will not be considered for the second part of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and

candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule B. Credit will not be given for any paper in which a candidate scores less than 25 per cent. of the maximum marks. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

14. Clerks admitted under paragraph 5, who fail to secure places in the general competition under conditions in paragraph 13, will be allowed to compete amongst themselves for ten appointments, if in the first part of this examination they obtain a minimum of 66 per cent. in Handwriting and Spelling, and 33 per cent. in Arithmetic and English Language and Composition.

## BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

## Schedule I.

1. *Definitions.*—The terms "boy," "girl," and "child" shall mean a boy, or a girl, or a child residing in the area described in Schedule A hereto.

The term "attendance" shall mean an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "Code" shall mean the Code for Assisted Schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The term "District Committee" means the Education District Committee for the Revenue District of Kalutara, excluding the areas of Kalutara and Panadure Urban District Councils.

The term "school" shall mean any school recognized by the Director of Education and shall include the schools specified in Schedule B hereto.

The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the same meaning as in sub-sections 25 (2) and (3) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920."

2. The Committee shall meet ordinarily at the Kalutara Kachcheri on such dates as the Committee shall decide upon.

3. A record of the proceedings of meetings shall be kept in a book, and copies of such records circulated among members immediately after the meeting.

4. *Children to attend School.*—The parent of every boy of not less than 6 nor more than 14 years of age, and the parent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, or in the cases of Muslim and Tamil girls of not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age, shall cause such boy or girl to attend school unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. Provided, in the case of girls, that their attendance shall not be compulsory, unless a separate female teacher is provided; further, that no boy under 8 and no girl shall be compelled to attend school where the distance from his or her residence to the school along the shortest route exceeds  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile, and no boy over 8 shall be compelled to attend school where the distance exceeds 2 miles.

And provided always that when a child between 10 and 14 years of age, being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Education District Committee, has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he or she has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic, the examination prescribed by the Code for the Fourth Standard he or she shall not be required to attend school.

5. *Time of Attendance.*—The time during which every child shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children of similar age.

6. *Religion.*—Nothing in these by-laws—

(a) Shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the time when religious instruction is given, as provided by section 15 (2) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920";

(b) Shall make it conditional for any child on being admitted into a school that he shall attend or abstain from attending any Sunday school or any place of religious worship or receive any instruction on religious subjects;

(c) Shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which its parent belongs.

7. Every parent who shall not observe, or shall neglect, or violate these by-laws or any of them, shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for each offence, and to an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day in the case of a continuing offence.

8. No elementary school shall be kept open for the purpose of giving instruction to pupils for more than 6 hours a day including intervals for meals, &c. The hour at which school work should commence may be left to the discretion of the Manager or the Head Teacher, but no school should open earlier than 8 A.M. or later than 10 A.M. The school timetable should be approved by the Inspector of Schools.

9. No elementary school shall, except with the permission of the Divisional or District Inspector of Schools, be kept open for school work on more than 5 days a week or less than 180 days a year.

10. The area described in Schedule A shall for the purpose of these rules be deemed to be an area within which efficient provision has been made in terms of section 25 (1) (c) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920."

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS.

(b) Only such trees as are marked and stamped by a Forest Officer for felling shall be felled by the contractor and logged into the longest possible lengths with saw alone, and all logs should be straight and sound throughout free from shakes, large or loose knots.

(c) The area to be worked is divided into blocks, and no felling will be permitted in more than one block at a time. Felling will not be permitted in the second block before the first block is completed and so on. The contractor shall not commence fellings in a fresh block without the written permission of the Range Forest Officer.

(d) Logs shall be trimmed before delivery at the final delivery depôt. Each end shall be sawn with a clean face at right angles to the axis of the tree. Payment will be made only on measurements taken after such operations.

(e) Rejected timber will not be paid for and will lapse to Government with all refuse wood in the area under operation. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejection.

(f) The contractor will be liable to fine of Rs. 20 for every tree not felled on or before May 31, 1929. He will also be liable to a similar fine for every log undelivered at the final delivery depôt by September 30, 1929.

(g) The contractor shall observe the provisions of by-law 9 (a) under section 18 of Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, which runs as follows:—

"It shall not be lawful to any person to do any of the following acts:—

"(a) To load a cart with timber or other substance of more than 20 feet in length without having one end thereof secured to another or sling cart."

(h) Nothing in this contract shall preclude the Divisional Forest Officer from taking action in accordance with the provisions of the Forest Ordinance (No. 16 of 1907) against the contractor for felling or allowing his coolies to fell any tree within or outside his area of contract which should not be felled in accordance with the conditions of the said contract or without the necessary permit prescribed by the said Ordinance.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 15, 1928.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 187 (4 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 103 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 27 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1928, viz., 264,713) was 36·9, as against 45·0 in the preceding week, 39·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 187 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 114 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 30 Moors, 2 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36·9, as against 33·6 in the previous week, 33·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·6 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 187 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 45 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Thirty-two deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 16 in Maradana hospitals, (including 10 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Maradana North, 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Maradana East, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 24 in the previous week and 19 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Kotahena North, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, as against 10 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 each in Maradana North and Maradana East, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, as against 10 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Nine deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents) and 1 in Slave Island, as against 1 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 in Pettah and the other in St. Paul's, as against 1 in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Fourteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 12 each from *Dysentery*, *Enteritis*, and *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Worms*, 1 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 56 from *Other Causes*.

6. Forty-one cases of *Measles*, 10 of *Chickenpox*, 9 of *Enteric Fever*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 56, 8, 5, and 1 respectively of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80·2°, against 79·5° in the preceding week and 81·1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·890 in., against 29·886 in. in the preceding week and 29·905 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·48 in., against 2·85 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

ADDITIONAL regulations made by the Municipal Council of Kandy, under section 23 of "The General Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, No. 9 of 1899," in continuation of the regulations published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* of March 2, 1917 :—

9. The following fees shall be paid for the proper upkeep of graves and memorials by persons who are desirous of having them maintained in a clean and orderly condition :—

- (1) For upkeep of a grave covered by marble memorial, Rs. 15 per annum.
- (2) For upkeep of a grave covered by other stone memorial, Rs. 12 per annum.
- (3) For upkeep of a grave uncovered by memorial, Rs. 6 per annum.

10. For work other than upkeep, special arrangements should be made with the Chairman of the Council.

11. The term "upkeep" shall include the regular cleaning of monuments and the keeping of graves free from weeds, but shall not include the repair of broken monuments.

12. Those persons who desire to provide for the proper upkeep of graves and monuments in perpetuity by a single payment may secure such upkeep on payment of a capital sum as hereunder stated :—

- (1) For the upkeep of a grave covered with marble memorial, Rs. 500.
- (2) For the upkeep of a grave covered with other stone memorial, Rs. 400.
- (3) For the upkeep of a grave uncovered by memorial, Rs. 200.

13. The annual payments mentioned in rule 9 shall in every case be paid in advance, and shall become due and payable on January 1 in each and every year.

14. Agreements in the following forms shall be executed by persons seeking the benefit of these additional regulations before the upkeep of graves and memorials is undertaken by the Council.

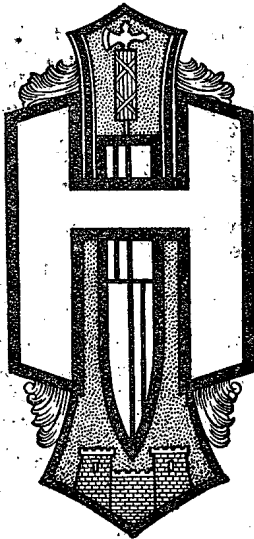

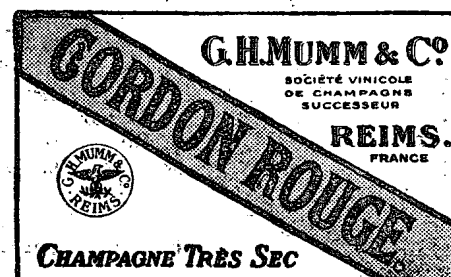
