**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1928.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 35 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 419 (341 General, 4 Kandyan, and 74 Muslim), as against 485 in the preceding month and 642 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 199 (151 General and 48 Muslim), as against 204 in the preceding month and 311 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,939 (1,016 males and 923 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 36·60 per 1,000 of the population, as against 35·33 in the preceding month, 30·92 in the corresponding month of last year, and 30·51 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The rate ranged from 14·90 in Ambalangoda to 137·03 in Lunugala. There were 1,706 births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 32·20, as against 30·40 in the preceding month and 27·99 in the corresponding month of last year.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 820 (441 males and 379 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 37·79, as against 33·99 in the preceding month, 28·81 in the corresponding month of last year, and 28·26 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah wards, ranged from 11·84 in Kollupitiya to 39·29 in Maradana East. There were 693 births of children whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 31·94, as against 28·72 in the preceding month and 25·05 in the corresponding month of last year.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,841 (1,002 males and 839 females). The number was equivalent to an annual rate of 34·75, as against 35·05 in the preceding month and 27·40 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 1,353 deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 27·62, as against 27·54 in the preceding month, 22·27 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·37 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The standardized death rate ranged from 154·46 in Lunugala to 9·56 in Hatton-Dikoya.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 660 (357 males and 303 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·42, as against 29·12 in the preceding month and 24·45 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 505 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 26·80, as against 25·47 in the preceding month, 22·85 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·65 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The death rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah wards, ranged from 30·37 in New Bazaar to 8·53 in Kollupitiya.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 143 (81 males and 62 females), as against 165 in the previous month and 135 in the corresponding month of last year.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 394, and corresponded to a rate of 207 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended September, 1928. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 203, as against 204 in the preceding month, 196 in the corresponding month of last year, and 214 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. There were 349 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 205, as against 209 in the preceding month and 195 in the corresponding month of last year.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year amounted to 135, and corresponded to a rate of 178 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended September, 1928. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 165, as against 181 in the preceding month, 168 in the corresponding month of last year, and 210 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. There were 118 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 170, as against 183 in the preceding month and 186 in the corresponding month of last year.

Causes of Deaths.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 13 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Debility* (of children under one year), caused 8 per cent. ; *Phthisis*, *Convulsions*, and *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, each 6 per cent. ; *Senility* and *Dysentery*, each 5 per cent. ; *Worms*, 4 per cent. ; *Diarrhoea*, *Anchylostomiasis*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Enteritis*, and *Bronchitis*, each 3 per cent. ; *Prematurity*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, *Accidents* and *Negligence*, *Enteric Fever*, *Influenza*, and *Paralysis*, each 2 per cent. ; and *Heart Disease*, *Undefined Accidents of Childbirth*, *Cancer*, and *Cerebral Haemorrhage*, each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo too the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 13 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Debility* (of children under one year), caused 8 per cent. ; *Phthisis*, 7 per cent. ; *Worms* and *Senility*, each 5 per cent. ; *Enteritis* and *Convulsions*, each 4 per cent. ; *Dysentery*, *Diarrhoea*, *Influenza*, and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, each 3 per cent. ; *Puerperal Septicaemia*, *Bronchitis*, *Cancer*, *Heart Disease*, *Enteric Fever*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Paralysis*, *Anchylostomiasis*, *Undefined Accidents of Childbirth*, and *Prematurity*, each 2 per cent. ; and *Accidents* and *Negligence*, *Cerebral Haemorrhage*, and *Diseases of the Respiratory System* (other than *Bronchitis* and *Pneumonia*), each 1 per cent.

12. One death from *Plague* of a Sinhalese male was registered in Colombo, as against 1 in the previous month and 2 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Measles*, of which 107 cases were reported (55 in Colombo, 15 in Nuwara Eliya, 13 in Galle) ; *Phthisis* followed with 87 cases (70 in Colombo) ; *Chickenpox* 80 (45 in Colombo, 15 in Kandy) ; *Enteric Fever* 39 (17 in Colombo) ; *Dysentery* 33 (19 in Ambalangoda) ; *Continued Fever* 19 (14 in Colombo) ; *Mumps* 7 (3 in Nuwara Eliya, 2 in Moratuwa) ; *Acute Diarrhoea* 3 (in Colombo) ; *Plague* 2 (in Colombo) ; *Diphtheria* 2 (1 each in Colombo and Kandy) ; and *Whooping Cough* 2 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (17·06 in.) In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 8·15 in. in Ratnapura to 0·06 in. in Puttalam. Colombo recorded 1·44 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 85·8° in Trincomalee to 59·7° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 82·5° in Colombo.
