**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1928.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 35 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under section 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 546 (464 General, 2 Kandyan, and 80 Muslim), as against 419 in the preceding month and 404 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 243 (200 General and 43 Muslim), as against 199 in the preceding month and 158 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,999 (1,037 males and 962 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 36·52 per 1,000 of the population, as against 36·60 in the preceding month, 35·23 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31·67 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The rate, exclusive of Lunugala where no births were registered, ranged from 13·86 in Chilaw to 93·70 in Hambantota. There were 1,779 births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 32·50, as against 32·20 in the preceding month and 31·49 in the corresponding month of last year.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 820 (434 males and 386 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 36·57, as against 37·79 in the preceding month, 32·83 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·67 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 14·67 in Kollupitiya to 36·87 in Slave Island. There were 709 births of children whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 31·62, as against 31·94 in the preceding month and 28·20 in the corresponding month of last year.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,847 (977 males and 870 females). The number was equivalent to an annual rate of 33·74, as against 34·75 in the preceding month and 29·24 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 1,342 deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 26·51, as against 27·62 in the preceding month, 22·87 in the corresponding month of last year, and 30·91 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The standardized death rate ranged from 124·56 in Lunugala to 13·26 in Vavuniya.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 662 (342 males and 320 females) and were equivalent to an annual rate of 29·53, as against 30·42 in the preceding month and 25·68 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 508 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 26·09, as against 26·80 in the preceding month, 22·32 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·08 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. The death rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 23·31 in Kotahena North to 6·88 in Kollupitiya.

7. The still births registered during the month numbered 163 (86 males and 77 females), as against 143 in the preceding month and 162 in the corresponding month of last year.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 385, and corresponded to a rate of 195 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended October, 1928. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 193, as against 203 in the preceding month, 172 in the corresponding month of last year, and 222 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. There were 334 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 188, as against 205 in the preceding month and 175 in the corresponding month of last year.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year amounted to 147, and corresponded to a rate of 186 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended October, 1928. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 179, as against 165 in the preceding month, 167 in the corresponding month of last year, and 225 the average for the corresponding months since 1918. There were 127 deaths of children under one year whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 179, as against 170 in the preceding month and 167 in the corresponding month of last year.

Causes of Deaths.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 13 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Convulsions* caused 7 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year), *Dysentery*, *Senility*, and *Phtisis*, each 6 per cent.; *Anchylostomiasis*, 5 per cent.; *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Worms*, *Enteritis*, and *Prematurity*, each 4 per cent.; *Diarrhoea* and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, each 3 per cent.; *Influenza*, *Heart Disease*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, *Bronchitis*, and *Paralysis*, each 2 per cent.; and *Enteric Fever*, *Accidents* and *Negligence*, *Accidents of Childbirth*, and *Diabetes*, each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 12 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Debility* (of children under one year) and *Phtisis*, each caused 8 per cent.; *Senility*, 7 per cent.; *Convulsions*, 6 per cent.; *Enteritis*, *Influenza*, and *Heart Disease*, each 5 per cent.; *Dysentery* and *Worms*, each 3 per cent.; *Anchylostomiasis*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Paralysis*, *Prematurity*, *Bronchitis*, *Diarrhoea*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*; and *Enteric Fever*, each 2 per cent.; and *Accidents* and *Negligence*, *Diabetes*, and *Accidents of Childbirth*, each 1 per cent.

12. Three deaths from *Plague* (2 males in Jaffna and 1 female in Colombo), were registered, as against 1 in the previous month, and 3 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Measles*, of which 133 cases were reported (82 in Colombo, 20 in Galle, 10 in Nuwara Eliya). *Chickenpox* followed with 95 cases (54 in Colombo, 10 in Nuwara Eliya); *Phtisis* 83 (69 in Colombo); *Enteric Fever* 45 (25 in Colombo, 6 in Panadura); *Dysentery* 31 (8 in Kegalle, 7 in Moratuwa, 5 in Kalutara); *Continued Fever* 20 (10 in Colombo, 8 in Galle); *Mumps* 7 (4 in Nuwara Eliya); *Acute Diarrhoea* 5 (4 in Galle); *Whooping Cough* 5 (3 in Colombo); *Plague* 4 (3 in Jaffna and 1 in Colombo); and *Leprosy* 1 (in Ambalangoda).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (46.97 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 28.29 in. in Ratnapura to 3.83 in. in Kalmunai. Colombo recorded 24.70 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 83.2° in Mannar to 59.6° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 79.8° in Colombo.
