FRANCE (EXTRADITION) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1928.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 13th day of July, 1928.

Whereas by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 and 34 Vict. c. 52) to 1906 (6 Edw. VII. c. 15), it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas by notes exchanged on September 21/ November 13, 1923, between H. M. Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and His Excellency the French Ambassador, the provisions of the Treaty between Her late Majesty and the President of the French Republic of August 14, 1876, and the Additional Convention of October 17, 1908, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, were extended to the territories of the Cameroons and Togoland, in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by the French Republic, the terms of which notes are as follows:-

> Foreign Office, S.W. 1. 21st September, 1923.

Your Excellency,

By notes exchanged between His Majesty's Ambassador at Paris and the French Government on August 16th/ October 15th, 1909, the provisions of the Extradition Treaty between Great Britain and France of August 14th, 1876, and the Additional Convention of October 17th, 1908, were extended to certain named British protectorates in Africa, the natives of those protectorates being for this purpose regarded as assimilated to British subjects.

- It now appears desirable to extend in like manner the provisions of the aforesaid treaties to the territories of the Cameroons, Togoland and Tanganyika, in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, and to the territories of the Cameroons and Togoland in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by the French Republic, the natives of those territories being regarded for this purpose as assimilated to British subjects and French subjects respectively.
- Majesty's Government would propose, if this course is agreeable to the French Government, that the present note and Your Excellency's reply

in a similar sense should serve to place on record the understanding arrived at between the two governments in the matter.

REGISTRATION.

In these rules, the following words and expressions shall have the following meaning:—

Appointment of Registrar of Finger Prints.

District Supervisor

- (1) "The Registrar of Finger Prints" (to be hereinafter called in these rules "The Registrar") shall mean the person appointed by the Inspector-General of Police to be in charge of the Finger Print Identification Office and the registration of criminals for the Island.
- (2) "The District Supervisor of Criminals" (to be hereinafter called in these rules "The District Supervisor") shall mean the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the
- district or where there is no gazetted officer the Senior Police Officer of the district.

 (3) "District" shall mean a revenue district, and division a police division within limits as
- fixed for the time being.

 (4) "To identify" shall mean to trace the identity or antecedents of a person by means of the finger print system.

 (5) "Crime" shall mean a crime as defined in Ordinance No. 2 of 1926.

 (6) "Criminal" shall mean a person convicted of a "crime."

 (7) "Re-convicted Criminal" shall mean a person convicted of a "crime" twice or oftener.

Records to be kept by Registrar.

- The Registrar shall keep-
 - (1) A register of criminals for the Island.
 - (2) A register of re-convicted criminals for the Island to be hereafter called the "Island Register.
 - register of persons sentenced to police supervision or on licence at large in the Island to be hereafter called the "Island Supervision Register."
 - (4) A finger print document of each convicted person containing finger prints, description, and particulars of conviction.
 - A nominal card for every name and *alias* of each convicted person. A register of finger impression slips received for search.

 - (7) A register of successful identification.

Each District Supervisor shall keep-

- (1) A register of re-convicted criminals in the district to be hereafter called the "District
- A register of all persons in the district sentenced to police supervision or on licence at large to be hereafter called the "District Supervision Register."

A Prison Discharge Book.

- A register of persons convicted and finger printed.
- (5) An Index Register of re-convicted criminals of the district.(6) Photograph Album of criminals.

Station Register.

Procedure on

second conviction

- There shall be kept at each police station, and by chief headman of a division in which there is no police station, a Re-convicted Criminals' Register, containing particulars of each re-convicted criminal living in the division. Ten pages will be allotted to each re-convicted criminal, of which four shall contain an extract from the District Register and six pages will be devoted to the history of the criminal, with notes as to his associates, movements (with necessary dates and places), property, means of livelihood, family, manner of life, habits, and anything which may serve to throw light on the career of the criminal. The officer in charge of the station or the chief headman will be responsible for the proper upkeep of this register.
- 5. When a person is a second time convicted of a crime and sentenced to a term of rigorous imprisonment and the conviction has not been set aside by the Supreme Court, such person shall be treated as a re-convicted criminal and the name shall be registered in the Island Register. of the entry shall be forwarded by the Registrar to the District Supervisor concerned. shall enter up the extract in his District Register and forward the same to the officer in charge of the station or to the chief headman, within whose jurisdiction the criminal resided prior to the conviction. On receipt the officer of the station or the chief headman shall enter up the extract in his register and return the extract to the District Supervisor with a note as to the number of the page of his register on which it is entered. The District Supervisor will inform the Registrar of the consecutive number of the page of the District Register on which the criminal's name and particulars of convictions have been entered.

Procedure on

- Every conviction which has not been set aside by the Supreme Court for a further "crime" committed by a criminal shall be entered in the Island Register, and the Registrar shall, furnish particulars of such conviction to the District Supervisor to be entered in his register. The District Supervisor will forward the particulars of the conviction to the officer in charge of the station or to the chief headman in whose register the criminal's record appears.
- 7. The station officer and each chief headman shall note in their respective registers all information as to any change in the place of abode and as to the circumstances of each criminal within his jurisdiction. An extract thereof shall be sent to the District Supervisor for information and such action as may be deemed necessary.

further conviction

Procedure on changes in places of abode and circumstances of a re-convicted criminal.

- When a criminal leaves a division, notice shall be given by the officer in charge of the station, or if there is no station in such division, by the chief headman thereof to the officer in charge of the station or chief headman of the division to which the criminal goes, whether it is in the same province or not, and to the District Supervisor concerned. When a criminal is haunting several divisions his name shall be registered in the station register of each of them. When it is found that a criminal has left a division and has been residing in another station or chief headman's limits regularly for six months the District Supervisor in whose register the name of the criminal appears shall report the fact to the Registrar. The Registrar shall after due inquiry from the district where the criminal has gone to reside cause the name of the criminal to be entered in that District Register and furnish the District Supervisor whose district the criminal left with the new district register The District Supervisor shall note in his District Register the new district register page number. number, residence, and date of transfer of the name of the criminal from his District Register, and cause the name of the criminal to be cancelled from the Station Register and also strike off the name from his list of criminals of the district.
- 9. To prevent unnecessary accumulation of finger print documents in the Finger Print Identification Office the Registrar shall obtain authority to cancel the records of a criminal who has not been reconvicted for a period of 20 years.
- 10. The finger print document of every criminal who dies shall be destroyed and his records shall be cancelled from all registers. For the purpose of evidence of death a notice of death from a Superintendent of Prison or a certificate from the Registrar of Deaths of the district and in the case of criminals dying in hospital a certificate from the Medical Officer in charge will be sufficient proof.
- 11. The District Supervisor shall enter in the Prison Discharge Book immediately after conviction the due date of discharge of every re-convicted criminal in the district sentenced for a crime to a term of imprisonment. In the Prison Discharge Book the name of every re-convicted criminal sentenced to 12 months and under shall be entered in black ink and the names of those who are sentenced to over 12 months shall be entered in red ink. In calculating the date of discharge of prisoners the District Supervisors will note that ordinarily prisoners earn no remission in respect of the first year of imprisonment, but a maximum of 3 months is allowed for every succeeding year. The due date of discharge of every person sentenced for a crime to a term of imprisonment exceeding one year shall be furnished by the Superintendent of Prison from which he will be discharged to the Registrar. The Registrar shall inform the District Supervisor in whose district the place of abode of the criminal is of the intended discharge of such criminal. It shall be the duty of the District Supervisors to keep themselves informed of the arrival or the non-arrival in their districts of such criminal. A re-convicted criminal sentenced to a term of imprisonment for a crime shall be transferred to the jail of first reception for discharge, on expiration of his sentence.
- 12. The Superintendent of the Prison in which is confined any prisoner having a sentence of over 12 months and about to be transferred to another prison for release on licence or discharge shall send the necessary information on the prescribed form to the Superintendent of the Prison from which such prisoner will be released or discharged to enable rule 11 and rule 34 hereafter provided to be carried out.
- 13. The Superintendent of the Prison from which a prisoner has been pardoned and released, or released on bail on the order of the court which committed such prisoner pending decision of appeal, or escaped while undergoing imprisonment for a crime shall inform the Registrar of the date on which the prisoner was released or released on bail or escaped.
- IDENTIFICATION.

 14. When a person accused of a non-summary crime as defined in the Prevention of Crimes Ordinance, No. 2 of 1926, has been committed for trial, the Police Magistrate shall at any time after such committal and before the trial call upon the Court Officer or any other Police Officer present in court to take the finger prints of the accused. The Court Officer or any other Police Officer so ordered shall at once take the finger prints on the form set forth in Schedule B to Ordinance No. 2 of 1926 in duplicate (Police Form 225) insert full name with aliases, father's name, and forward the finger print slip duly signed direct to the Registrar of Finger Prints with a covering memorandum (Police Form 114) stating particulars of the charge, number of the case, and date of postponement.
- 15. Provided that in the case of a female accused of a crime her finger prints shall be taken by a matron, and if this is not possible, the matron shall be present when the finger prints are taken and the word "Female" shall be written in red ink on the front page of the finger print slip.
- 16. On receipt of the finger print slip, the Registrar will take steps to ascertain if there is any corresponding finger print slip in his office. (a) If a finger print slip is found of a registered criminal who has already been at least twice convicted of a crime and sentenced on those convictions for not less than one year's rigorous imprisonment in the aggregate, the Registrar shall issue to the Police Magistrate a certificate in terms of section 5 (2) of the Ordinance, and forward it to the Police Magistrate with a memorandum (Police Form 114, Part II.). (b) If a corresponding slip is not found the Registrar will return one slip to the Police Magistrate with a report to that effect on Police Form 114 and the other to the Court Officer with a like report.
- 17. But if a corresponding slip is found of a registered criminal, who though he has not been convicted and sentenced as required in the previous rule has been convicted of other offences the Registrar shall furnish on Police Form 93 particulars of the conviction or convictions traced to the Attorney-General or the Agent of the Attorney-General conducting the prosecution in the higher court.
- 18. If the accused does not admit before the Police Magistrate the previous convictions recorded in the certificate furnished by the Registrar, the Court Officer will take steps to prove, in terms of section 7 of the Ordinance, such of the said convictions as the accused does not admit.
- 19. When a person is accused of a summary crime as defined in the Prevention of Crimes Ordinance, No. 2 of 1926, and the Police Magistrate is satisfied after the case for the prosecution has been closed that there is a primā facie case against him, the Police Magistrate may, if he thinks fit, call upon the Court Officer or any other Police Officer present in the Court to take the finger prints of the accused. The Court Officer or any other Police Officer so ordered will at once take the finger prints of the accused on the form set forth in Schedule B to Ordinance No. 2°of 1926 in duplicate (Police Form 225), insert full name with aliases, father's name, and forward the finger print slip duly stating particulars of the charge, number of the case, and date of postponement.

Persons who have not been finger printed or photographed may be required by the Police Magistrate to appear to be finger printed and photographed.

Finger print document of all persons to be retained unless they are afterwards acquitted.

District Judge or Police Magistrate to report to Inspector-General of Police all eases in which a conviction or sentence for a crime is set aside or varied in appeal.

Provided that in the case of a female accused, the procedure indicated in rule 15 shall be followed.

- On receipt of the finger print slip, the Registrar will take steps to ascertain if there is any corresponding finger print slip in his office. (a) If a corresponding slip is found of a registered criminal who has already been at least twice convicted of a crime and sentenced on those convictions to not less than one year's rigorous imprisonment in the aggregate, the Registrar shall issue to the Pol ce Magistrate a certificate in terms of section 5 (2) of the Ordinance.
- (b) If a corresponding slip is not found, the Registrar will return one slip to the Police Magistrate with a report to that effect on Police From 114, Part II., and the other slip to the Court Officer with a like report.
- But if a corresponding slip is found of a registered criminal, who though he has not been convicted and sentenced as above has been convicted of other offences the Registrar shall furnish on Police Form 93 particulars of the conviction or convictions traced to the Court Officer to be submitted to the Police Magistrate when a verdict of guilty has been recorded.
- 22. If a person convicted of a crime is sentenced to imprisonment or is committed to prison in default of payment of fine the Court Officer shall-
 - (1) Note on the back of the committal the Register number assigned to the prisoner in the Finger Prints Identification Office and all his previous convictions, if any. The Jailer of the prison to which such prisoner is admitted shall note such number in the Admission Register. If there is no number on the committal, the Jailer shall report the fact to the District Supervisor who will take necessary action.

(2) Enter on Part III. of Police Form 114 the details of conviction and other particulars required thereon and forward it to the District Supervisor. The District Supervisor shall cause the details of conviction furnished by the Court Officer to be compared with the warrant of commitment of the prisoner and return it to the

Registrar with the prison admission number assigned to the prisoner.

(3) Prepare in the case of a person not previously convicted a finger print slip (Police Form 113) insert all particulars required thereon and forward the same to the District Supervisor together with Police Form 114, Part II., and the "Untraced" certificate which he received from the Registrar. The District Supervisor shall cause the details of the conviction furnished by the Court Officer to be compared with the warrant of commitment of the prisoner and return the documents to the Registrar with the prison admission number assigned to the prisoner.

This rule will also apply to persons convicted of a crime and sentenced to pay a fine or to receive cuts or ordered to be detained in a reformatory.

- When an accused person is identified as a re-convicted criminal the Registrar shall intimate to the District Supervisor in whose register the criminal's record appears particulars of the offence with which the criminal is charged, and the District Supervisor on receipt of this intimation shall communicate direct with the officer in charge of the station, who sent the finger print slip to the Registrar, and obtain from him all information as regards the charge and the result of the case.
- 24. If it is found after admission to prison that any person convicted of a crime has been previously convicted, but the police have failed to identify him, the fact shall be reported to the Inspector-General of Police, and the record of previous conviction forwarded to him, and a reward may be given from the Police Reward Fund to the prison officer who discovered the identity of the convict.
- In Village Tribunal cases, when the officer in charge of a station receives information that a criminal is before the Village Tribunal in regard to any case of theft or receiving stolen property, he will make a written application to the President, stating the facts and request him to suspend further hearing of the case and to report it to the Government Agent with a view to action as provided for in section 66 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1924.
- 26. The District Supervisor shall prepare on every Monday a weekly return of persons convicted in the district and finger printed, and forward it to the Registrar who shall insert the register number of the criminals and return the form to the District Supervisor. The District Supervisor shall enter the criminal's number in red ink in his register and comply with the requirements of rule 22
- 27. If it is found that a criminal's photograph is necessary for efficient supervision the District Supervisor concerned shall make arrangements with the Superintendent of Prison and get the criminal photographed before the criminal's discharge from jail.
- A Police Magistrate may, on the application of a Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police, by notice in writing require any person who has been convicted of a crime and has not been finger printed or photographed to attend in order that such person may be finger printed or photographed, and it shall be the duty of such person to attend at the time and place specified in such notice.
- 29. The finger print document of every person convicted of a crime shall be forwarded to the Registrar to be placed in his records, except in the case of a person who has been convicted and the conviction has afterwards been set aside in appeal.
- In all cases in which a District Judge's or Police Magistrate's judgment of conviction or sentence for a crime is set aside or varied by the Supreme Court the District Judge or the Police Magistrate shall communicate without delay to the Inspector-General of Police-

 - (a) Number of the case.(b) The name of the accused.
 - (c) The order made by the Supreme Court.

GRANTING LICENCES.

Granting licence.

A licence to be at large under section 14 of Ordinance may be granted by the Governor to every prisoner sentenced to a term of imprisonment for such period as the Governor may direct.

32. Every licence holder shall, before he is enlarged on licence, notify the place where he intends to reside to the Superintendent of the Prison and the terms of his licence shall be clearly explained to him, and the consequence of his failing to observe them. A copy of the licence shall be handed to the convict on his discharge.

Licence holder to notify his place of residence.

SUPERVISION OF CRIMINALS SENTENCED TO POLICE SUPERVISION AND OF LICENCE HOLDERS.

- 33. The District Supervisor of each district shall keep a register of all persons under sentence of police supervision or at large on licence in his district.
- 34. The Superintendent of every prison shall, fourteen days before the release from such prison of any prisoner sentenced to police supervision or of any licence holder, inform the Registrar of such intended release, and of the place of his release, and of the place and district which the prisoner has notified as his intended place of residence, forwarding with the information, which shall be on the prescribed form, a copy of the committal and, in the case of a licence holder of the licence, on which the date of expiry of the period on licence shall be inserted by the Superintendent of Prison.
- 35. The Registrar shall note in the Island Register the date of discharge as notified by the Superintendent of Prison and shall forward an intimation on Police Form 170 to the Supervisor of the district in which the prisoner intends to reside, and of the Province or district in which he will be released.
- 36. On receipt of the intimation of discharge referred to in rule 35, the District Supervisor shall note the same in his District Register and inform the officer in charge of the police station (or chief headman where there is no station) of the division in which the prisoner intends to reside. Such officer or chief headman shall take steps to inform himself of the arrival or non-arrival of the prisoner, and shall also inform the District Supervisor of the actual date on which the prisoner was discharged from jail and the place he intends to reside. The District Supervisor shall enter the same information in his District Register and transmit the information to the Registrar on Police Form 170.
- 37. On receipt of Police Form 170 from the District Supervisor with the date of discharge and place of residence of the prisoner, the Registrar shall enter the name of the prisoner in the Island Supervision Register, and send an extract from it to the District Supervisor. On receipt of this extract, the District Supervisor shall enter the same in his District Supervision Register and forward the extract to the officer in charge of the police station (or chief headman where there is no station) of the division in which the prisoner intends to reside who shall enter the same in his Station Register.
- 38. Every person sentenced to police supervision shall within forty-eight hours of his release personally report himself to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the district in which he resides, and he shall within forty-eight hours thereafter report his arrival at his residence to the officer in charge of the police station, or in his absence to the officer acting for him, or if there is no police station to the chief headman of the division in which he resides. Every such person shall also thereafter report himself once in every month to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the district, or to the person deputed by such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of of Police to receive his report. And whenever any such person shall change his residence within the same division he shall personally notify such change to the officer in charge of the police station, or in his absence to the officer acting for him, or where there is no police station to the chief headman of the division within forty-eight hours of such change. And whenever he shall change his residence from one division to another or move for any period whatsoever beyond the jurisdiction of the officer to whom he is liable to report himself within such first mentioned division, he shall at least fortyeight hours before changing his residence or so moving personally notify such change or such moving to the officer in charge of the police station, or in his absence to the officer acting for him, or where there is no police station to the chief headman of the division which he is leaving, and shall within forty-eight hours of his arrival at his new residence or to place which he has so moved report himself to the officer in charge of the police station, or in his absence to the officer acting for him, or where there is no police station to the chief headman of the division to which he has changed his residence or so moved. And whenever he shall change his residence or move for any period whatsoever from one district to another, he shall also at least forty-eight hours before changing his residence or so moving, personally notify such change or such moving to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the district which he is leaving, and shall report himself within forty-eight hours of his account of the superintendent of Police of the district which he is leaving, and shall report himself within forty-eight hours of himself within forty-eight hours. of his arrival, and in the case of a change of residence thereafter once a month, to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the district to which he has changed his residence or so moved, or to the person deputed by such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police to receive his reports, and also whenever he shall leave the Island he shall at least forty-eight hours before leaving personally notify the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the district which he is leaving or the person deputed by such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent to receive such reports and shall whenever he returns to the Island, if his period of supervision has not expired report himself personally within forty-eight hours of his arrival to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of the district in which he lands, or to the person deputed by such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent to receive such reports.
- 39. Whenever any such person shall report himself as required by rule 38, he shall sign his name in the Supervision Register kept by the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police (or by the person deputed by such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police) to record his several reports. And such person shall be duly instructed as to the requirements of rule 38, as to the date and place at which he should make his subsequent report, and a copy of rule 38 in the appropriate vernacular shall be handed to such person on his discharge from jail by the Superintendent of Prisons.
- 40. The Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police may depute any Police Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, Inquirer, with their consent, or Police Officer in charge of a police station (or officer acting for him in his absence) headman not under rank of Muhandiram or Korala, or other persons of approved position to receive reports except on first release.
- 41. The Inspector-General of Police may, if a person under sentence of police supervision appears to him to be leading a steady and honest life, permit him to report himself at longer intervals than those stated in rule 38.

Register of criminals sentenced to police supervision and of licence holders.

Notice to be given to Registrar regarding date of their discharge by Superintendent of Prison.

Inspector-General of Police may allow such reports to be made at longer intervals. Receipt on non-receipt of such reports to be reported to Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police.

Supervision of convicts at large on licence.

What persons may demand production of licence.

District Supervisors to report to Inspector-General of Police of completion of term of licence.

Monthly returns of criminals under police supervision and convicts at large on licence

- 42. The receipt or non-receipt of all reports required by rule 38 shall be forthwith reported to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police by the person deputed by him to receive such reports, or by the officer in charge of the station or chief headman. The Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent of Police shall inform the Registrar.
- 43. Whenever any person sentenced to police supervision changes his residence, such change shall be forthwith reported by the officer in charge of the station or chief headman to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police who will report the same to the Registrar, and such change shall be duly entered in their respective supervision registers. And if such change shall be from one district to another it shall be reported by the Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent of Police of the former district at once to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the latter district who shall duly note the name and residence of such person in his Supervision Register.
- 44. If any person sentenced to police supervision fails to report himself or his change of residence or occasions of moving as required by these rules, prosecution shall at once be entered and the fact notified to the Registrar.
- 45. A convict at large on licence shall observe strictly the conditions endorsed on his licence, and the procedure to be followed as regards the supervision to be exercised over him by the police shall be the same as laid down in rules 38 to 44 inclusive for the supervision of a person sentenced to police supervision.
- 46. No police officer of a rank inferior to that of sergeant or headman appointed to perform police duties, unless he is specially authorized by an officer of or above the rank of an officer in charge of a police station or chief headman, shall call on a licence holder to produce his licence.
- 47. When a criminal has completed his term of licence without a breach of the conditions of his licence the officer to whom he has been making his monthly reports will report that the period of licence has expired without incident to the District Supervisor, who will forward the report to the to the Inspector-General of Police for communication to the Inspector-General of Prisons.
- 48. The District Supervisors shall send to the Registrar monthly returns on Police Form 164 of criminals under police supervision and convicts at large on licence.

Schedule.

(To be endorsed on back of the Licence.)

This licence is liable to be forfeited if the holder does not observe the following conditions:—

He shall preserve his licence and produce it when called upon to do so by a Magistrate or Police Officer.

He shall abstain from any violation of the law.

He shall not habitually associate with notoriously bad characters.

He shall not lead an idle life, or be without visible means of obtaining an honest livelihood.

He shall within forty-eight hours of his liberation personally notify the place of his residence to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the district in which he is going to reside, and he shall thereafter within forty-eight hours report his arrival to the officer in charge of the police station or in his absence to the officer acting for him, or where there is no police station to the chief headman. And whenever he changes his residence or moves for any period whatsoever out of the area within which he is liable to report himself he shall personally notify such change to the officer in charge of the police station, or in his absence to the officer acting for him, or where there is no police station, to the chief headman of the division at least forty-eight hours beforehand, and he shall also notify his arrival at his residence or the place to which he has moved as aforesaid, if in another division, to the officer in charge of the police station or in his absence to the officer acting for him, or where there is no police station to the chief headman of that division within forty-eight hours. And whenever he changes his residence or moves for any period whatsoever from one district to another, he shall personally notify such change or such moving forty-eight hours beforehand to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the new district, and also, whenever he shall leave the Island, he shall at least forty-eight hours before leaving personally notify the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent or Police of the district which he is leaving, or the person deputed by such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent to receive such reports, and shall whenever he returns to the Island, if his period on licence has not expired, report himself personally within forty-eight hours of his arrival to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of the district in which he lands, or to the person deputed by such Superintendent to receive such reports.

He shall once a month report himself personally at such time and place as may be ordered by the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the district in which he resides to such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent or to a person deputed by him.

The Inspector-General of Police may after the lapse of six months from the granting of the licence, during which the conduct of the licence holder shall have been satisfactory, permit the reports to be made at longer intervals than above.

If the holder of the licence fails to report himself within forty-eight hours of his release, or of his changing his residence or moving as aforesaid, or once in each month as required above, or if he fails to comply with any of the above conditions, he is liable to be arrested by any police officer or headman and to have his licence revoked, and to be sentenced to a term of rigorous imprisonment not exceeding six months; and if he shall be convicted of any crime as defined in Ordinance No. 2 of 1926, committed during the time in which he shall have been at large under such licence, or if his licence shall be revoked as above for failing to comply with the conditions of such licence, he is liable, after undergoing any other punishment to which he may be sentenced, further to undergo a term of imprisonment equal to the portion of his term of imprisonment that remained unexpired at the time of the grant of the licence.

Rules regulating the Treatment of Re-convicted Criminals undergoing Sentences of Preventive Detention.

1. The general rules made on June 9, 1913, by the Governor acting with the advice of the Executive Council, under the Prisons Ordinance, No. 16 of 1877, shall apply to all persons undergoing preventive detention, in so far as they are not inconsistent with the following rules:-

General.

2. Persons undergoing preventive detention shall be divided into three grades

Grades.

-Ordinary.

-Special. TT.

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III.-Disciplinary.

On entering preventive detention they shall be placed in the Ordinary Grade. 3.

Ordinary Grade. Special Grade.

Promotion from the Ordinary Grade to the Special Grade will be open to only those prisoners who show zeal and industry in the work assigned to them. Such a prisoner may be awarded a "Certificate of Industry and Conduct" at the expiration of each continuous period of six months in the Ordinary Grade during which he conducts himself well. Four of these certificates will entitle him to promotion to the Special Grade.

Prisoners who are considered by the Superintendent unfit to be employed in any trade or who have proved themselves incapable or unwilling to better themselves in any way and thereby earn no certificate shall be employed in prison services and kept in the Ordinary Grade. Prisoners in this category can, should they turn and endeavour to better themselves, work their way up during any part of their sentence and be granted certificates.

5. On promotion to the Special Grade a prisoner may be granted a Good Conduct Badge carrying a monthly grant of Rs. 2.

Good Conduct Pay.

6. Persons under preventive detention shall earn no remission of their sentence by marks.

Remission. Disciplinary Grade.

7. A prisoner may be placed in the Disciplinary Grade by order of the Superintendent as part of a punishment for misconduct, or because he is known to be exercising a bad influence on others, and may be kept there for a period not exceeding thirty days as may be necessary in the interests of himself and others. While in the Disciplinary Grade he will not be associated with others except at labdur.

Gratuities.

8! Prisoners may be trained and employed at useful trades provided they show adaptability for such training. Those in the Special Grade will be allowed to earn a gratuity of 50 cents per mensem by their work (in addition to the Good Conduct Pay in terms of rule 5 above). They will be allowed to spend a sum not exceeding half their gratuities and Good Conduct Pay each month in the purchase of books or/and additions to their diets should they so desire, or to send it to their families, or to allow such sums to accumulate to be paid to them together with the balance on discharge from prison.

A prisoner who is in hospital or medically unfitted for full work will, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer, who will certify that the disability was genuine and not caused by the prisoner's fault, be credited with gratuity in proportion to his earnings when in health, or calculated on his general disposition to work, coupled with good conduct.

10. Prisoners undergoing preventive detention shall be allowed to grow their hair; those in the Special Grade may be allowed to associate at meal hours and also to have slates and books in their cells.

Privileges.

Prisoners in the Ordinarry and Special Grades shall receive Ordinary No. 2 diet and those in the Disciplinary Grade Penal No. 2 diet as laid down in the Dietary Scale in the Manual of Rules for the Management of Prisons in Ceylon.

Diets.

Prisoners in the Disciplinary Grade shall neither correspond nor receive visits. Those in the Ordinary Grade after they have earned their First Certificate and not before will be allowed to write and receive letters and to be visited in accordance with the following scales:

Letters and visits.

First Certificate.—To write and receive a letter, and to be visited once for 15 minutes every three months.

Second Certificate: To write and receive a letter, and to be visited once for 20 minutes every two months.

To write and receive a letter, and to be visited once for 30 minutes Third Certificate. every month.

Fourth Certificate.—(Special Grade) to write and receive two letters and to be visited once for 30 minutes every month.

Those kept in the Ordinary Grade through lack of zeal and industry and employed in prison services may be allowed to write and receive a letter and to be visited once for 15 minutes every six months.

The following punishments shall be awarded for any of the offences except No. 18

Punishments.

(a) By the Inspector-General—

"(i.) Sanction the placing of a person in irons or body belt under sections 71, 72, and 73 of the Prisons Ordinance of 1877.

(ii.) Any of the punishments a Superintendent is authorized to inflict.

mentioned in rule 259 of the Manual of Rules for the Management of Prisons in Ceylon :-

(b) By the Superintendent acting in conjunction with one or more visitors.—

(i.) By confinement in a punishment cell for any period not exceeding fourteen days on Penal No. 2 diet.

(ii.) Forfeiture of any of the privileges mentioned in these rules, or of gratuity and Good Conduct Pay earned.

(iii.) Any of the punishments the Superintendent is empowered to inflict.

(c) By the Superintendent—

- (i.) Confinement in a punishment cell on Penal No. 2 diet for a period not exceeding ten days.
- (ii.) By reduction to the Disciplinary Grade for a period not exceeding thirty days.
- (iii.) By reduction from the Special to the Ordinary Grade for a period not exceeding sixty days.
- (iv.) By forfeiture of any privileges prescribed by these special rules for a period not exceeding thirty days.
 - v.) By forfeiture of one good conduct badge or gratuity earned for a period not exceeding thirty days.
- (vi.) By ordering a prisoner to have his hair cropped, provided that no prisoner who is within three months of his discharge shall have his hair cut.

Special reports.

14. Superintendents of all prisons shall submit to the Inspector-General of Prisons on the Prisons Form No. 26, accompanied by a full report as to the conduct, industry, and general behaviour, the name of every re-convicted criminal who has been sentenced, whether before or after the passing of Ordinance No. 2 of 1926, to rigorous imprisonment for a term of five years and upwards, and who has since attaining the age of 16 years been three times previously convicted of a crime, and sentenced on such conviction or convictions to not less than one year's rigorous imprisonment in the aggregate on the expiration of 3, 5, 7, 10, and 15 years of his sentence of rigorous imprisonment, for the consideration of His Excellency the Governor as to whether the residue of the sentence shall be commuted to a sentence of preventive detention.

Provision for employment on discharge. 15. With a view to obtaining suitable employment on discharge for persons undergoing preventive detention, the Superintendent of the Prison in which such persons are confined shall put himself in communication with the officers of the Salvation Army and other philanthropic societies, as well as employers of labour whose names are submitted to him by any of the prisoners. Should the Superintendent receive an assurance of permanent employment, or employment for a period not less than one year, for any convict deserving of being discharged on licence, after a period of three years' preventive detention, he shall make a full report on the case for the consideration of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Jail for preventive detention prisoners.

16. Persons undergoing preventive detention shall until further orders be confined in Bogambara Prison, Kandy, or Welikada Prison, Colombo.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 22, 1928.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 207 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 125 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 32 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1928, viz., 264,713) was 40·9, as against 36·9 in the preceding week, 33·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 167 (2 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 101 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 20 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.0, as against 36.9 in the previous week, 27.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 167 total deaths, 42 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding previous week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-four deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Slave Island, 2 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Maradana North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana East, and Wellawatta North, as against 32 in the week and 19 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Kotahena South, as against 9 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 in Kotahena North and the other in Kollupitiya, as against 6 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. (a) Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South and Maradana North, as against 13 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.
- (b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.
- 3. One death (of a non-resident) from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospital, as against 9 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average fror last year.
- 4. Two deaths from *Bubonic Plague* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No death from *Plague* was registered within the city.
- 5. Eighteen deaths from Debility were registered, 11 from Enteritis, 9 from Dysentery, 8 from Infantile Convulsions, 6 from Puerperal Septicaemia, 5 from Worms, 2 from Accidents, 1 each from Tetanus and Homicide, and 63 from Other Causes.
- 6. Forty-seven cases of Measles, 13 of Chickenpox, 2 of Enteric Fever, and 2 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 41, 10, 9, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·2°, against 80.2° in the preceding week and 79·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·901 in., against 29·890 in. in the preceding week and 29·951 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 1·48 in. in the preceding week and 0·91 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.





REGULATIONS made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 9 of "The Plant Protection Ordinance, No. 10 of 1924."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No tea plants or parts of tea plants (other than tea seed or leaf for manufacture) may be removed or received by any person from any plantation or garden without a permit in writing from the Director of Agriculture, except in the case of plants required for the purpose of scientific investigation in the laboratories of the Department of Agriculture or of the Tea Research Institute of Ceylon.
- 2. All tea plants or parts of tea plants (other than tea seed or leaf for manufacture) transported or caused to be transported or offered or received for transportation beyond the limit of the plantation or garden of origin must be packed and the package or packages plainly marked with the nature of the contents, the name and address of the sender, and the name of the plantation or garden of origin.
- 3. No permits will be granted for the removal of any tea stumps or plants from any infested area to or through any area which is not infested, and no person in an area which is not infested shall receive any tea plants or parts of tea plants from an infested area.
- 4. All tea plants or parts of tea plants sold or offered for sale or transported beyond the limits of the plantation or garden of origin shall be taken only from nurseries registered as such with the Department of Agriculture, and such nurseries shall be graded by the Department in the following classes:—
 - A. Nurseries in areas free from Shot-hole Borer and containing good plants under good cultivation.

B. Nurseries in infested areas and containing good plants under good cultivation.

C. Nurseries in infested areas and containing moderately good plants under a poor state of cultivation.

D. Nurseries in infested areas and containing poor plants under a poor state of cultivation.

- E. Nurseries in infested areas and containing plants which are themselves infested with Shot-hole Borer.
- 5. Certificates of registration and grading will be issued to all registered nurseries by the Department of Agriculture and such certificates shall specify the period during which they hold good.
 - 6. Permits for the removal of plants from registered nurseries will be granted as follows:-

From Class A nurseries, throughout the Island.

From Class B nurseries, throughout infested areas.

From Class C nurseries, throughout infested areas within the Revenue District in which the nursery is situated. From Class D nurseries, throughout infested areas within the Chief Headman's division in which the nursery is situated.

From Class E nurseries, no permit shall be granted.

7. All tea plants or parts of tea plants in registered nurseries found to be infested with Shot-hole Borer shall be uprooted and destroyed by fire and no permit shall be issued authorizing the removal of plants or parts of plants from such nurseries until all the infested plants have been so uprooted and destroyed by fire.

8. Any person who commits a breach of any of the above regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

9. The regulations dated September 4, 1924, and published in *Gazette* No. 7,413 of September 5, 1924, are hereby rescinded.
