KNOW Ye that We, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 41 of the Branch Roads Ordinance, No. 14 of 1896, do hereby declare that the road called and known as Kadugannawa-Gampola road, constructed partly by the District Road Committee, Kandy, and partly by estates, shall, as from and after the date hereof, be treated as a road made under the Branch Roads Ordinance, No. 14 of 1896, and that the provisions of such Ordinance relating to improvement, upkeep, and repairs, shall be applied to the said road as if it had been originally constructed under the provisions of the said Ordinance:

And We do hereby define the limits of the district the estates in which will be assessed for the improvement, repair, and upkeep of the said road, to be those specified in the schedule hereto.

"THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, NO. 45 OF 1917."

K 1286/28

RULE made by the proprietors of the land within the Walawe-ganga Right Bank Irrigation Scheme, under section 12 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council in terms of section 19 of the said Ordinance.

RULE.

The rules published in *Gazette* No. 7,439 of January 9, 1925, are amended by substituting for rules Nos. 5, 13, 16, and 27 the following new rules:—

5. Cultivation for yala shall begin on March 13 and the sowing shall be completed by May 10 every year. Cultivation for maha shall begin on September 20 and the sowing shall be completed by November 12 every year.

13. The act of sowing after the dates mentioned in rule 5 without special permit from the Assistant Government Agent shall be an offence for which the goiya as well as the resident proprietor or gambaraya will be liable to prosecution. Such permits may be issued by the Assistant Government Agent after consultation with the Irrigation Engineer, should it be deemed necessary.

In ordinary circumstances no extension will be allowed, which will involve an extension of the irrigation period. The permit will denote the extension allowed, the name of the field, and the kind of seed to be sown. Contravention of any of the conditions of the permit shall render the offender liable to a fine.

16. The cultivators shall construct the necessary fences and watch huts as directed by the Vel-Vidane, and keep the same in repair and shall keep regular watch in accordance with the orders of the Vel-Vidane. The fences shall be constructed within one week from the dates fixed for the completion of sowing. If any cultivator fails to construct the necessary fences or watch huts within the prescribed time, the Vel-Vidane shall construct them within 10 days of such default and recover the cost from the defaulting cultivator or the gambaraya or the resident proprietor.

Fences shall be constructed of barbed wire consisting of at least 4 strands, or of live or dry fence sticks. Huts shall be so constructed as to be 6 feet from the level of the ground.

27. Owners of land within the irrigable area shall keep their lands free from jungle.

Every proprietor, gambaraya, or lessee of a paddy field in extent exceeding 10 acres shall manure at least 1/10 of the extent of the field owned, possessed, managed, or leased by him before sowing is completed for any season

RULES.

1. *Register of Ma-del.*—The Patabendi Arachchi of Welipatanwila totamuna and the Patabendi Arachchi of Kalameti totamuna shall make a list of the ma-del owned by the residents or used within their respective totamunas. The turns of fishing shall be in the order of the said register. A copy of this shall be kept by each Patabendi Arachchi and be open to inspection gratis by the owners of every ma-dela.

2. *Ma-del to be cast in Turns.*—Every ma-dela so registered shall be cast by turns in the order of the register (of which order each owner is to keep himself informed). The turn of each net shall begin at sunrise and terminate on the net being drawn ashore, but if such owner has not exercised his right by sunrise of the following morning, his turn shall be considered as having passed to the next on the roll.

3. *Order of Fishing.*—On each net being drawn ashore the next on the roll shall have the right to cast his net, and his turn shall terminate in like manner on his net being drawn ashore, or at sunrise next morning. In this manner any number of nets may be drawn on one and the same day, provided, however, that the next on the roll may elect to wait for his turn to begin till sunrise next day.

4. *No Net allowed inside Ma-dela.*—After both ends of the ma-del are brought on shore for the purpose of being drawn, no casting or other net shall be thrown or used within the ma-dela.

5. *Other Nets allowed.*—Besides ma-del, nets known as "visi-del" and nets not exceeding ten fathoms in length and the same in breadth may be used but no "nul-del" are allowed under any circumstance.

6. *All others forbidden.*—Except the foregoing no other nets whatever shall be used within the above limits.

7. *Disputes to be settled by Committee.*—All disputes regarding fishing which cannot be settled by the Patabendi Arachchi of the totamuna should be referred to the Committee whose decision shall be final.

8. *Registered Boats.*—That every registered ma-del boat be used for ma-del fishing only.

9. *Registered Nets.*—That every registered ma-del net be used in the registered boat to which it belongs.

10. *Removal of registered Boats and Ma-del.*—No registered boats or ma-del shall be removed from the totamuna without a permit from the Patabendi Arachchi or the Committee.

11. *Outside Fishers.*—Fishers other than those residing in the totamuna shall inform the Patabendi Arachchi of the division soon after arrival in the totamuna before the construction of any huts on the seabeach.

12. *Launching of Ma-del.*—Ma-del shall be launched with permission from the Patabendi Arachchi.

CHAPTER LII.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order of the Board of Trade relating to the rate of royalties on mechanical contrivances for the performance of musical works. [3rd August, 1928.] A.D. 1928.

WHEREAS the Board of Trade have made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Copyright Act, 1911: 1 & 2 Geo. 5 c. 46.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Order set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force.

2. This Act may be cited as the Copyright Order Confirmation (Mechanical Instruments: Royalties) Act, 1928.

COPYRIGHT.

MUSICAL WORKS MECHANICAL INSTRUMENTS ROYALTIES.

Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under Section 19 of the Copyright Act 1911 increasing the rate of royalties on mechanical contrivances for the performance of musical works.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 19 of the Copyright Act 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5. cap. 46) it is provided that it shall not be deemed to be an infringement of copyright in any musical work for any person to make within the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends records perforated rolls or other contrivances by means of which the work may be mechanically performed if such person proves (inter alia) that he has given the prescribed notice of his intention to make the contrivance and has paid in the prescribed manner to or for the benefit of the owner of the copyright in the work royalties in respect of all such contrivances sold by him and calculated at the rate thereinafter mentioned:

And whereas by sub-section (3) of the said section it is provided that the rate at which such royalties as aforesaid are to be calculated shall—

- (a) in the case of contrivances sold within two years after the commencement of the Act by the person making the same be two and one-half per cent.; and
- (b) in the case of contrivances sold as aforesaid after the expiration of that period five per cent.

on the ordinary retail selling price of the contrivance calculated in the prescribed manner so however that the royalty payable in respect of a contrivance shall in no case be less than a half-penny for each separate musical work in which copyright subsists reproduced thereon and where the royalty calculated as aforesaid includes a fraction of a farthing such fraction shall be reckoned as a farthing provided that if at any time after the expiration of seven years from the commencement of the Act it appears to the Board of Trade that such rate as aforesaid is no longer equitable the Board of Trade may after holding a public inquiry make an order either decreasing or increasing that rate to such extent as under the circumstances may seem just but any order so made shall be provisional only and shall not have any effect unless and until confirmed by Parliament but where an order revising the rate has been so made and confirmed no further provision shall be made before the expiration of fourteen years from the date of the last revision:

And whereas by sub-section (7) of the said section it is provided that in the case of musical works published before the commencement of the Act the foregoing provisions shall have effect subject (inter alia) to the modification that the rate of two and one-half per cent. shall be substituted for the rate of five per cent. at which royalties are to be calculated:

And whereas the Board of Trade held a public inquiry into the matter during the months of March and April, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight and it appears to them that such rate as aforesaid is no longer equitable:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the above-recited enactment and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby order as follows:—

1. The rate at which such royalties as aforesaid are to be calculated as provided by the above-recited sub-section (3) shall be increased from five per cent. to six and one-quarter per cent. so however that the royalty payable in respect of a contrivance shall in no case be less than three farthings for each separate musical work in which copyright subsists reproduced thereon and where the royalty calculated as aforesaid includes a fraction of a farthing such fraction shall be reckoned as a farthing.

2. The rate of three and one-eighth per cent. shall be substituted for the rate of two and one-half per cent. payable in pursuance of the provisions of paragraph (b) of sub-section (7) of the said section in the case of musical works published before the commencement of the said Act.

3. This Order may be cited as the Copyright Mechanical Instruments (Royalties) Order 1928 and shall apply to contrivances sold on or after the first day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight or after the expiration of three months from the date of its confirmation by Parliament whichever be the later.

- (8) The purchaser or his agent or his workman shall not damage any boundary pillars or calamander plants, or block up the boundaries by depositing any brushwood or branches. All lines so blocked must be recleared by the purchaser.
- (9) A general removal permit will be issued by the Divisional Forest Officer authorizing the purchaser to remove the firewood standing in one-third of the trees according to the purchase amount paid, *vide* conditions 2 and 3, in such daily quantities as will be specified in cartnotes which must accompany each and every cart track in transit. The Forest Ranger or Forest Overseer or the Forest Guard will measure up the wood which is ready for removal twice daily at 9.30 A.M. and 3.30 P.M. and will issue the necessary cartnotes which shall accompany each and every cart in transit.
- (10) The purchaser shall agree that for each and every infringement of the above conditions, he shall become liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100 to be imposed by the Divisional Forest Officer in writing at his discretion, and to be recovered from the purchaser's security money.
- (11) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid up purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each removed cubic yard of firewood shall be reckoned at full royalty rates.
- (12) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of the enforcement of any of the penalties specified in the conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as final and binding.
- (13) In the case of Service " B " (coupes 2 and 3) the purchaser shall be required to cut all materials in the coupes in the coppice system by four distinct operations as follows :—

Operation 1.

All herbaceous and undergrowth other than tree growth shall be cut out. This operation shall commence along the full length of one boundary of each coupe and proceed in a straight line to the opposite boundary of that coupe. The whole area of each coupe must thus be covered including those portions, if any, which contain no tree growth.

Operation 2.

All tree seedlings and saplings which are under one inch diameter shall be coppiced out within two inches of the ground by means of sharp cutties or any other instrument authorized by the Divisional Forest Officer. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries and in the same alignment as operation 1. Not less than three days shall have elapsed between the execution of operation 1 and the commencement of operation 2 in any portion of the area, and there shall be an interval on the ground of not less than one chain between operations 1 and 2 except where the terminating boundary is reached.

Operation 3.

All saplings which are over one inch in diameter and not exceeding eight inches diameter shall be felled within twelve inches of the ground, and on the day of felling the stools shall be coppiced by means of sharp adzes cleanly and flush with the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 2, as the latter is required to proceed with in relation to operation 1.

Operation 4.

All trees over eight inches in diameter shall be felled within two inches of the ground, and within three days of felling all the stools which are between eight inches and fifteen inches diameter shall be coppiced cleanly and to within one inch of the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 1.

Separate working parties shall be assigned to these four separate operations, and separate workmen shall be detailed to keep the coppicing tools invariably sharp. The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure this work being executed efficiently, or employ an efficient supervisor.

(14) In the case of Service " A "—

(a) A penalty up to Rs. 100 will be levied by the Divisional Forest Officer, for any wanton damage caused by carts or careless felling to calamander plants or to small poles or undergrowth.

(b) Dragging of timber by elephants is prohibited ; all timber is to be sawn on the spot and firewood removed by head load.

(c) Carting is to be confined to the tracks opened by the Forest Department.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 12, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 210 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 107 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 47 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1929, viz., 266,186) was 41·1, as against 41·3 in the preceding week, 39·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 192 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 111 Sinhalese, 41 Tamils, 28 Moors, 1 Malay, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 37·6, as against 35·5 in the previous week, 29·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 192 total deaths, 47 were of infants under one year of age, as against 39 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in each Kotahena South and New Bazaar, 2 each in Maradana South and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 32 in the previous week and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twelve deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena North, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 10 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in St. Paul's and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, and Maradana South, as against 13 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Two deaths (both of non-residents) from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in New Bazaar, as against 2 in the previous week and one in the corresponding week of last year.

5. One death from *Measles* was registered in Kollupitiya, as against nil in the previous week.

6. Twenty deaths from *Debility* were registered, 11 from *Enteritis*, 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 3 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 2 each from *Worms* and *Tetanus*, 1 each from *Homicide* and *Accident*, and 86 from *Other Causes*.

7. Thirty-nine cases of *Measles*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, 4 of *Chickenpox*, and 3 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 85, 8, 16, and 2 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78·2°, against 77·7° in the preceding week and 79·7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·982 in., against 29·916 in. in the preceding week and 29·957 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·61 in., against 2·35 in. in the preceding week and 3·35 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 187 (6 Burghers, 107 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 24 Moors, 8 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36·6, as against 37·6 in the previous week, 33·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 187 total deaths, 39 were of infants under one year of age, as against 47 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 22.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena North, as against 18 in the previous week and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twelve deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Maradana South. The number registered during the preceding week was also 12 and the weekly average for last year was 8.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta South, as against 12 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 7, and of the Special Meeting of November 21, 1928, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Mr. Clarke has been a Member of the Council since 1923, and during that time his advice has been of great value to the Chairman and Council, who will be sorry to lose his co-operation. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried unanimously.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy moved—That the resolution of Council of September 5, 1928, fixing the rents of the Polwatta Laundry at Rs. 11 for a single room and Rs. 22 for a double room, be rescinded, and that the rents be fixed at Rs. 8.50 for a single room and Rs. 17 for a double room, as representing nett returns approximating to the nett returns at present obtained from the Wekanda and Bloemendahl Laundries. Mr. R. L. Pereira seconded.

Dr. S. Muttiah supported the motion, which was put to the Meeting and carried.

(15) To consider:—(a) An application from the Director of Electrical Undertakings for extension of H. T. underground mains as shown in plan attached to papers for Distribution Area No. 10. (b) A report of the Municipal Engineer dated November 17, 1928, re the Kiosks and Feeder Pillars shown.—Recommended:—(a) That underground mains be allowed as approved of in each case by the Municipal Engineer. (b) That Feeder Pillars should be allowed at the following sites:—(1) Fishers' quarters on Crown land, (2) The Harbour Pumping Station, (3) On the Galle road, opposite the public lavatory. (c) That Feeder Pillars be only allowed on the Council's land or roads on the condition that they be removed at any time, if so required by the Council without expense to the Council. (d) That Feeder Pillars or Transformer Kiosks be not allowed at the sites shown on the plans submitted in—(1) Ingham street, (2) Church street, (3) Saunder's Court, (4) Colpetty, (5) The College street-Alvis street junction, (6) The smaller Feeder Pillars on the Galle road, opposite Vihare lane, and (7) Pamankada road—and that the matter should be discussed by the Electrical authorities with the Municipal Engineer.

(16) To consider the reports by the Municipal Engineer and the City Microbiologist with regard to the Madampitiya Treatment Works.—Recommended that Mr. N. M. Ingram, Municipal Engineer, be requested to make inquiries on the subject when in England.

(17) To consider :—(a) The tenders received for the supply of stone setts.—(a) Considered. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Engineer that the following tenders be accepted :—(i.) Mr. C. V. Fernando of Uggalboda, Kalutara, for the supply of 225,000 setts at Rupees Two hundred and five per 1,000 setts, minimum monthly supply to be 30,000 ; (ii.) Mr. T. D. Fernando of Uggalboda, Kalutara, for the supply of 155,000 setts at Rupees Two hundred and five per 1,000 setts, minimum monthly supply to be 20,000.

Note.—The cost will be charged to sanctioned votes in due course.—(b) Recommended.

(18) With regard to the purchase of manhole covers and frames from Messrs. J. W. Carr & Co., sanctioned by Council on November 7, 1928, to consider the report of the Municipal Engineer dated November 20, 1928, stating that Messrs. Carr & Co.'s manhole covers and frames are unsatisfactory and requesting sanction to purchase 12 manhole covers of each kind per Agents from the only other tenderer Messrs. Ham Baker & Co., as follows :—12 manhole covers at 65s. = £39 ; 12 ventilating manhole covers at 66s. = £39. 12s. ; total £78. 12s.—Recommended.

(19) To consider :—(a) The application of Mr. O. T. F. Senaratne requesting that he be given return passage to Ceylon, *vide* Rule 6 of the Passage Scheme. (b) A memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer suggesting that the question of refunding the return passage money to Mr. Senaratne be considered on his return to Ceylon on certificates being produced. (c) A memorandum of the Chairman stating "it now remains to define study passages."—Recommended the matter should be considered on Mr. Senaratne's return.

(22) To consider :—(a) The design submitted by the Architects for the ornamental ponds in connection with the proposed fire protection of the New Town Hall.—(a) Considered. (b) A report of the Waterworks Engineer, dated October 25, 1928, suggesting that the original proposal of the Superintendent, Fire Brigade, namely, that two underground tanks of 1,000 gallons capacity each, with 5-in. intake, be constructed.

Note.—These two tanks are estimated by the Waterworks Engineer to cost Rs. 3,500. Supplemental provision for Rs. 3,500 has been sanctioned by Council on September 5, 1928.—(b) Recommended.

(23) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated August 29, 1928, regarding the qualifications for Waterworks Inspectors.—Recommended that the resolution of Council of February 1, 1928, regarding the qualification of Waste Inspectors, and the qualification of Waterworks Inspectors as laid down in the Salary Scheme of 1924, be amended to read :—The passing of either the Plumbing Examination of the Technical Schools, or the City and Guilds of London Institute Examination, Grade I. in Plumbing. In either case, they must have attended a course of instruction at the Technical Schools or have had sufficient practical experience in the Department, as certified by the Waterworks Engineer.

(24) To consider :—(a) An application from Mr. B. P. Fernando for water service to his block of land situated in Lily avenue, Wellawatta, which is a private lane.—(a) Considered. (b) A plan and an estimate of Rs. 2,579 from the Waterworks Engineer for laying a 3-in. diameter water main for a distance of 357 yards in the lane. The lane being a private lane, the application will have to be dealt with under Ordinance No. 9 of 1916. The under-mentioned property owners have expressed their willingness to contribute their proportions of cost as follows :—Mr. R. P. Fernando, Rs. 177.39 ; Mr. N. D. S. Silva, Rs. 761.73 ; Mr. M. Sameer, Rs. 237.18 by monthly instalments of Rs. 10 ; Mr. B. P. Fernando, Rs. 766.01, Rs. 250 at once, and the balance within six months. Total, Rs. 1,942.31.

Note.—The Waterworks Engineer recommends the laying of the main on payment of the above sum of Rs. 1,942.31.—(b) Recommended.

The lane being a private lane, the application will have to be dealt with under Ordinance No. 9 of 1916. The applicant applies to pay the above amount by monthly instalments of Rs. 50 with interest of 6 per cent. a year on the balance outstanding.

Note.—The Waterworks Engineer recommends that the application be granted.—(b) Recommended.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Budget Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, December 12, 1928, at 3 p.m.

THE Council met this day at 3 p.m. pursuant to notice dated December 5, 1928, to consider finally the Budget for the year 1929, in accordance with the provisions of section 98 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.
