Jaffna.

From the Fort (Jafina) by the shore of the lake westward to the junction of Jafina-Karaitivu (road and road connecting Kayts and Punnalai roads) by the latter road eastwards to its junction with the Jafina-Punnalai road by that road to the south-west corner of the tract of fields called Paddiveli along the western boundary of these fields, along the boundary between the villages of Vannarponnai West and Kokkuvil and of Vannarponnai East and Kokkuvil to the Brown road, by that roadito its junction with Nachehimarkovil road by the latter road to its junction with Palal road by that road and then along Nachehimarkovil road to its junction with the Point Pedro road and the boundary between the Jafina division and the Valikamam East division to the Chemmani road along that road to its junction with Anandanvadali road by that road till it meets the paddy fields, then along the inner limits thereof to the lane known as Thuravadi olungai, along that lane till it meets the lane known as Mathippankulaththu olungai by that lane till it meets the lane known as Nerunchiady olungai by that lane till it meets the railway line and then along the railway line eastwards till it meets the western boundary of the coconut estate commonly known as Mr. Price's estate, along that boundary to the shore of the lake, by the shore of the lake to a point 20 chains on the east from the junction of the Maravakulam road and the Beach road from that point by a straight line to the south-eastern corner of the Reclamation road, by the Reclamation road westward, to the south-western corner of the Reclamation road and from that corner by a straight line to the Fort.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 9, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 170 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 105 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 21 Moors, 6 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1929, viz., 266,186) was 33.3, as against 33.9 in the preceding week, 50.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 163 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 100 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 25 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 31.9, as against 32.3 in the previous week, 31.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 163 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty-one deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 5 each in New Bazaar and Maradana South, 3 each in Kotahena South and Slave Island, 2 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Wellawatta North, as against 24 in the previous week, and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana South, and Wellawatta South, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.
 (c) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island,

(c) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island, as against 12 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly avearge for last year.

2. Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in San Sebastian, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 7 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. (a) Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana hospitals, as against nil in the previous week.

(b) One death from Bubonic Plague of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Fifteen deaths from Debility were registered, 11 from Enteritis, 7 from Accidents (5 due to gun shot wounds at Maradana riots), 5 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 from Worms, 3 from Diarrhoea, 1 each from Homicide and Puerperal Septicaemia, and 66 from Other Causes.

5. Fifty-nine cases of *Chickenpox*, 34 of *Measles*, 3 of *Enteric Fever*, 3 of *Plague*, and 1 of *Smallpox* were reported during the week, as against 18, 51, 4, 2, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $79 \cdot 5^{\circ}$, against $79 \cdot 3^{\circ}$ in the preceding week and $79 \cdot 5^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29 \cdot 898$ in., against $29 \cdot 865$ in. in the preceding week and $29 \cdot 927$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $0 \cdot 93$ in., against $3 \cdot 93$ in. in the preceding week and $2 \cdot 24$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.



Improvements in or relating to electrically operated vibratory devices.

Abstract.—A bar capable of twisting is rigidly fixed at its ends: at right angles to the centre a stiff member is fixed which carries the armature.

The claims are :---

1. In or for a vibratory device of the type set forth for use in the inter-conversion of electrical and mechanical vibrations, a vibratory member comprising an armature of magnetic material and means for mounting the armature for rotation about an axis, that portion of the vibratory member which lies between said axis of rotation and the heel of said armature being stiff in relation to the armature itself.

2. A vibratory member according to claim 1, in which said stiffened portion lies between said armature and a member which is subjected to torsional stress by the magnetic forces acting upon said armature.

3. A vibratory member according to either of the preceding claims in which said armature is provided with slots or corrugations in a direction substantially parallel to the direction of the magnetic flux.

4. A vibratory member according to claim 1 or 2 wherein said armature is provided with slots or corrugations in a direction substantially parallel to said axis of rotation.

5. A vibratory member as claimed in any one of the preceding claims in which there is provided, projecting from said axis of rotation in adifferent direction from said armature, a flexible member by means of which said armature may be adjusted about said axis.

6. A vibratory device embodying a vibratory member according to claim 5 wherein said flexible member is subjected to bending stress.

7. A vibratory device as claimed in claim 6 wherein said flexible member is also subjected to tension.

8. A vibratory device as claimed in claim 7 wherein said tension is adjustable and when altered produces rotation of said armature about said axle.







46A. A Director may with the consent of his co-Directors be absent from the meetings of the Directors for such period or periods as he shall think fit.

46B. Each Director shall have the power to appoint in writing any person whether a Shareholder of the Company or not to act as a Deputy Director in his place during his absence or inability to act as Director and at his discretion to remove such Deputy Director.





A Warrant Officer or Non-Commissioned Officer of the Regular Army doing duty with the Ceylon Defence Force will receive free dental treatment (including provision of dentures, if necessary,) for himself, and free dental treatment (excluding the provision of dentures) for his wife, and children under 14 years of age, subject to compliance with the following sections (ii.) and (iii.) :-

.) In order to receive the benefit of the above concession the officer, on joining the Ceylon Defence Force for duty, will be required to produce to the Commandant a certificate, signed by an officer of the Army Dental Corps, to the effect either (a) that his teeth, and those of his wife, and of any children under 14 years of age, are in good condition, or (b) that the following dental treatment is required (full particulars to be given).

(iii.) In no circumstances will free dental treatment be provided by the Colonial Government in respect of treatment noted under certificate (b), but where an officer has arranged for the treatment required to be carried out locally at his own expense he will thereafter become eligible to receive free treatment.

Page 24.—Delete regulation 201 and substitute the following :-5.

"A horse allowance of Rs. 6 per diem will be paid for each day in Camp or proceeding to and from Camp to the following officers of the Ceylon Defence Force :-

The Officer Commanding, Ceylon Garrison Artillery.
 The Officer Commanding, Ceylon Light Infantry.
 The Officer Commanding, Ceylon Planters' Rifle Corps.

(4) Majors, Ceylon Garrison Artillery, Ceylon Light Infantry, Ceylon Planters' Rifle Corps.
 (5) Captains Commanding Companies in Camp, Ceylon Garrison Artillery, Ceylon Engineers, Ceylon Light Infantry, Ceylon Planters' Rifle Corps, and Ceylon Medical Corps...

provided that each officer detailed above is in possession of a suitable horse, which must be his own property. A horse allowance of Rs. 240 (maximum) per annum can be earned by each officer, Warrant Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer, and Trooper of the Ceylon Mounted Rifles, i.e., Rs. 10 for every mounted drill up to 12 and Rs. 120 to be paid to each member attending the Annual Regimental Camp for at least 6 days. This allowance will be paid only to a member owning a suitable horse.'

Page 27.—Insert new regulation 220 A-

"Instructors on first posting to the Ceylon Defence Force and those relinquishing their appointments will be allowed to transport baggage up to a maximum of 12 cwt. less that allowed by steamer and railway companies at Government expense."
