WHEREAS by section 12 of the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, No. 15 of 1921, as amended by the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Amendment Ordinance, No. 11 of 1922, it is enacted that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any British Possession or any territory under His Majesty's protection, for the enforcement within such possession or territory, of maintenance orders made by courts in Ceylon, the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, extend that Ordinance to maintenance orders made by courts within such possession or territory, and thereupon the said Ordinance shall apply to such maintenance orders as if they had been made in England or Ireland:

NOW Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, do hereby declare, in the exercise of the power vested in Us by section 3 (1) of the Dried Meat Ordinance, No. 19 of 1908, as amended by Ordinance No. 1 of 1927, that, from and after March 8, 1929, it shall be unlawful to remove dried meat from any of the following Chief Headmen's divisions of the North-Central Province, that is to say, Kalagam palata, Hurulu palata, Nuwaragam palata, and Tamankaduwa, except in accordance with the following conditions:—

- 1. Dried meat may not be removed from any of the said divisions except under licence from the Government Agent for that purpose, and the Government Agent may refuse a licence to any person applying for the same on any of the following grounds:—
 - (a) if the applicant has been convicted of shooting game without a licence;

(b) if he is known or reasonably suspected to be a poacher;

(c) if he is suffering from a contagious disease such as to make meat handled by him unsafe for human consumption.

The licence shall be cancelled if the licensee employs any person suffering from such a disease.

- 2. A fee of Rs. 50 per annum shall be payable to general revenue for every such licence, but the Government Agent may issue a licence for any portion of a year on payment of a proportionate fee. He may issue a licence at a reduced fee if the conditions of the trade do not justify the recovery of the full rate.
- 3. The licensee shall permit the Government Agent or any person appointed by him to examine all dried meat removed on licence or to seal all vessels containing dried meat.
- 4. The licensee shall obey any orders given by the Government Agent as to the routes through which such dried meat shall be removed or the storing of such dried meat in any depôts or places appointed by the Government Agent.
- 5. Any licence may be cancelled by the Government Agent, if the licensee commits a breach of any of the conditions of the licence, or if in the course of his operations he causes damage to crops or plantations.





VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 2, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 172 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 103 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 25 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1929, viz., 266,186) was 33.7, as against 32.5 in the preceding week, 36.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 124 (3 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 59 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 22 Moors, 1 Malay, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 24:3, as against 29:6 in the previous week, 25:0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30:3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths. Of the 124 total deaths, 34 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 20 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Principal Causes of Death. 1. (a) Fifteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals, 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana South, and I each in Fort, Pettah, Kotahena North, Maradana North, Maradana East, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 22 in the previous week and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South,

New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta South, as against 9 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from Bronchitis were registered, I each in Kotahena North, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), and Maradana North. The number registered during the previous week as also the weekly average for last year was 3. (a) Six deaths from Phthisis were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya. The number registered during the previous week was also 6 and the weekly average for last

year was 11. (b) One death from Phthisis of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Two deaths from Enteric fever were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospital and Wellawatta North, as against 4 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fifteen deaths from Debility were registered, 7 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 each from Diarrhoea, Puerperal Septicaemia, and Accidents, 3 each from Enteritis and Worms, 2 from Dysentery, 1 each from Tetanus and Homicide, and 46 from Other Causes.

5. Thirty-nine cases of Measles, 37 cases of Chickenpox, and 5 of Enteric fever were reported during the week, as

against 25, 52, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.
