Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from the date hereof, establish, by virtue of the power in Us vested by section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial and cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

## NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the contract for the conveyance of mails from January 1, 1930, for a period of three years; thrice daily each way, between Kahawatta Railway Station and Kahawatta Post Office; and twice daily each way between Kahawatta and Rakwana Post Offices and intermediate offices:—

- (a) By motor van, car, cab or omnibus; or  
(b) By motor lorry.

2. The number of trips may be increased by the Postmaster-General, and if any increase in the number of trips involve or necessitate the employment by the contractor of motor vehicles for the purpose than are being used by the contractor at the time when the alteration is proposed, the contractor shall provide the necessary motor vehicles. The contractor shall receive payment for any additional trips at the same rate per mile according to the subsidy paid for the original contract.

3. The motor conveyances, when fully equipped and loaded, should not weigh more than three tons.

4. The hours of arrival and departure to be fixed from time to time by the Postmaster-General.

5. The contractor will be required to provide such number of motor conveyances as will, in the opinion of the Postmaster-General, be necessary for the service, and every such motor before being employed in the service will be subject to the approval of the Postmaster-General. The motor conveyances should also be provided at the contractor's cost with a separate locked receptacle for conveying mails. To some convenient part of every such motor shall be affixed, at the cost of the contractor and subject to the approval of the Postmaster-General, a suitable box provided with lock and key for the reception of any letters which may be posted on the road.

6. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent to him through the post.

7. Tenders should be marked "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails between Kahawatta and Rakwana" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on Tuesday, April 23, 1929.

8. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application to the Postmaster-General, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form.

9. Any alteration in the tender must bear the initials of the tenderer, otherwise the tender may be treated as informal and rejected.

10. A deposit of Rs. 100 for the service tendered for must be made at the General Treasury or a Kacheheri, and a receipt produced for the same before a tender form is issued. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Postmaster-General, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposits will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon signature to the contract.

11. Security to the amount of one-tenth of the annual subsidy asked will be required in cash for the service.

12. Tenders for above service must be accompanied by a scale of the rates which it is intended to charge the public during the period of the service for the conveyance of passengers, luggage, and parcels, and the quantity of luggage per passenger allowed to be conveyed free. When such scale has been accepted by the Government, the contractor shall not, without the express permission of Government, increase the rates charged for the conveyance of passengers, luggage, and parcels above the amount shown in the scale, or reduce the allowance of free luggage below the amount therein stated.

13. Further particulars regarding the terms of the contract will be found in the contract form. Post Office N 10, a copy of which will be sent when forwarding tender

forms. Further information about the terms of the contract and any other information can be obtained on application to the Postmaster-General.

14. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

15. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors; either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the Postmaster-General, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

16. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Head of the Department, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

17. Contracts may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board.

18. A Government contractor must not issue a power of attorney to a person whose name is on the defaulting contractors' list authorizing him to carry on the contract.

19. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all of the tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

WITH reference to the rules of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce, and relative appendices, published on pages 135 *et seq.* of Part I. of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,624 dated January 13, 1928, it is hereby notified that at a General Meeting of the Chamber duly convened and held at their rooms on Monday, February 25, 1929—

(2) *Rules for Weighing Shipments of Coconuts in Bags.*—The following rules were included under an additional Appendix "P" :—

1. Upon receipt of an application to weigh a shipment of coconuts in bags, the surveyor shall obtain from the shipper a statement giving the reputed number and gross weight of the bags of each mark comprising the shipment, also the name of the Lighterage Company responsible for loading the shipment.

2. Surveyors shall satisfy themselves that the whole of the shipment for which a weight certificate is required is actually at the wharf at the time of survey, except under exceptional circumstances when surveyors may use their discretion. In all cases surveyors shall state on their certificates whether they have seen the whole shipment or not.

3. Surveyors shall weigh not less than 10 per cent. of the bags of each of the marks comprising the shipment. The bags so weighed shall be selected at random and shall include as far as possible bags from inside as well as from different points round the outside of the stack. The gross weight of each mark shall be recorded separately in the certificate.

4. Surveyors shall advise the Lighterage Company responsible when they have completed their survey.

5. The fee payable by a shipper to a surveyor for a weight certificate issued under these rules shall be 50 cents per shipping ton calculated from the weights taken; fractions of under half a ton being ignored and half a ton and over being counted as one ton.†

6. The Chamber registration fee for a weight certificate shall be 10 per cent. of the surveyor's charges and shall be payable by the surveyor.

7. All weight certificates shall be on the form issued by this Chamber.

† *Note.*—An allowance of 10 per cent. for dryage to be deducted up to and including March 7, 1929, after which date freight will be paid on total shipped weight.

(3) *Rules for the Measurement of Baled Fibre.*—The following additional rule No. 9 was included under Appendix "N" :—

9. Chamber registration fee for a measurement certificate shall be 10 per cent. of the surveyor's charges and shall be payable by the Surveyor.

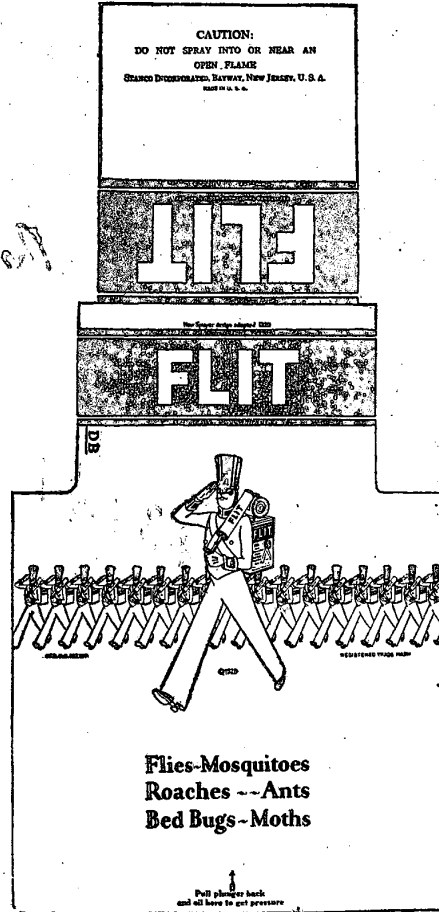
