Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 9, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 152 (2 Europeans, 17 Burghers, 85 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 26 Moors, 4 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1929, viz., 266,186) was 29.8, as against 33.7 in the preceding week, 34.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 144 (8 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 17 Moors, 6 Malays, and 9 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.2, as against 24.3 in the previous week, 28.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 144 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, February 6, 1929, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 30, 1929.

Present:—Mr. H. E. Newnham, M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. A. H. G. Dawson; Lieut.-Col. C. D. Myles, O.B.E., M.B., R.A.M.C.; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. J. S. Collett; Dr. R. G. Jayetileke; and Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P. 1. The Minutes of the General meeting of January 16, 1929, having been previously printed and copies thereof

having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of January 16, 1929, be confirmed.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal presented a petition from the traders who are tenants of the Municipal boutiques in Gasworks street and moved that it be placed before the appropriate Standing Committee or Committees for consideration and report. Mr. T. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene presented a petition from Mr. S. M. L. Cader Saibo of 120, Messenger street and others, and requested that the Chairman should look into the matter and deal with it in any manner he deems

best.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman the following question: --Will the Chairman be pleased to make a statement in regard to the long continued prevalence of rinderpest in this city giving the number of cases reported each month from March, 1928? Is there any possibility of it being stamped out in the near future?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) There were no cases of rinderpest in the city or the quarantine station during In 1928, the first case in the city occurred in March at a dairy in Skinner's road South. Almost simultaneously there was an outbreak in the quarantine station. (2) The infection undoubtedly originated from imported cattle, but it is curious that the first 6 cases at the Quarantine Station on March 2 were cattle that had been imported in the previous October and December, and had been at the station for two or more months before they developed the disease. (3) As it happened the main enclosure of the Quarantine Station had been closed to all discharges, except for slaughter, since February 25, owing to a suspected case of foot-and-mouth disease, which however had proved negative. The closure continued until the outbreak there was over. (4) Sick cattle are removed by ambulance to the hospitals. Contacts are segregated and inoculated. The infected areas are proclaimed and patrolled by Police guards provided with printed instructions to prevent the removal of contacts. The guards are supervised by overseers and by the Veterinary Inspectors. (5) None the less the infection spread, and the number of cases each month is shown in the annexed statement. (6) The spread of the infection is undoubtedly due to concealment of contacts. If an animal shows signs of disease the owners of all other cattle in the vicinity remove them elsewhere before the owner of the sick animal reports the case or before it is discovered by the staff. Similarly there have been cases in which sick animals have been concealed, removed, or abandoned on the road side. Carcases of diseased animals have been found thrown into a canal or river, or cut up and put into the sewers or thrown into a garden. In such circumstances the infection must spread. (7) Everything possible is being done to stamp out the outbreak, but the Chairman cannot predict when success will be attained. (8) Re-infection comes from India, and as pointed out in the Report of the Government Rinderpest Committee of November, 1924, the way to stop it is to prohibit importation or to make the system of quarantine efficient. Government on October 29, 1928, informed the Chairman that it had decided to prohibit the importation of slaughter cattle and to restrict the importation of other cattle from April 1, 1929. This should prevent re-infection. (9) The Veterinary Surgeon observed in a recent scientific journal a description of a new method of immunization practised with success in the Philippines. At his request the City Microbiologist has prepared an experimental batch of the necessary vaccine which is now under test on 9 animals with 3 controls. If the experiment is successful a new and encouraging method of dealing with the problem will be established:

H. E. NEWNHAM, Chairman of the Colombo Municipal Council, hereby notify that in virtue of the power vested 1, in me under section 203 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, prohibit the sale or exposure for sale of any articles in or upon any part of the following public streets and public open places :-

All public streets and public open places within the Pettah, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya Wards, including the Galle Face Green and Victoria Park.

Any person contravening this prohibition is liable to a fine of Rs. 20.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 19, 1929, at 8 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated January 16, 1929.

Present:—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Dr. F. Keyt; Mr. E. H. vander Straaten; and Mr. A. V. Perera.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meetings held on December 15, 1928, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and copies thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
 - 2. The following documents were submitted:—
 - (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1928 to November 30, 1928, on account of the Electricity Department.
 - (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
 - (c) Health Officer's report for December.
 - (d) Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December.
 - (e) The reservoir readings for December.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Council's Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table :-
 - Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during December.
- 4. Petitions:—(1) Mr. Wijayatilake presented petition from the market traders re sale of goods on the market pavement.
- (2) Mr. A. V. Perera presented petition from the residents of Bahirawakande re notices served on them for the construction of latrines.
- (3) Mr. A. V. Perera presented petition from Mr. J. de S. Jayasinghe re notice served on him to construct a latrine at 6. Bahirawakande road.
- (4) Mr. Ismail presented petition from the bus drivers, Temple street stand, praying that a tea kiosk may be allowed near the stand.

The Chairman undertook to look into matters referred to in the above petitions.

- 5. Correspondence:—(1) Letter No. Q 415/28 of December 19, 1928, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary rc printing done for non-Government bodies by the Government Printing Office.—Read.
- (2) Letter No. W 305/28 of December 20, 1928, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary sanctioning the purchase by Private treaty of the strip of land relinquished by the owner in connection with the demolition and rebuilding of certain Premises at the junction of Colombo street and Castle Hill street.—Read.
- (3) Letter No. W 153/28 of December 21, 1928, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the draft Ordinance under which the dissolution of the Board of Improvement, Kandy, can be effected will be shortly published in the Government Gazette.—Read.
- (4) Letter of October 21, 1928, from the Superintendent of Municipal Works forwarding estimate for Rs. 155,058 for altering the alignment of the Meda-ela, paving the bed and building side walls.—Resolved that the matter be deferred for consideration.
- (5) Letter of October 21, 1928, from the Superintendent of Municipal Works submitting estimate for Rs. 3,600 for stone pitching and cement pointing joints over the filling of a section of the Meda-ela.—Resolved that the matter be deferred for consideration.
- (6) Letter of October 4, 1928, from Messrs. Miller & Co., asking for permission to use the Halloluwa road for delivery of goods to Anniewatte estate bungalow by motor van.—Resolved to leave the matter to the Chairman's discretion subject to the observance of the one-way rule where in force.
- 5. (a) Pursuant to notice, Mr. Ratwatte moved—(1) That a surveyor be employed for tracing roads in village areas within the Municipality with a view to enabling building being constructed once the lines of the proposed roads are laid. Mr. Perera seconded.—Carried with the proviso that the Chairman do prepare a scheme and report to Council in the first place.
 - (2) That a sum of Rs. 10,000 be voted annually for village improvements. Mr. Perera seconded.

Resolved that a list of improvements be called for from the Health Department in consultation with the Ward Member and the Headmen and that thereafter the necessary funds be voted as available.

- 6. Papers re proposed gratuity to late Distraining Officer, E. R. B. Kahawatte.—Tabled.
- 7. To approve terms of contract to purchase engine oil from Messrs. Vacuum Oil Co.

Resolved that the terms be approved.

8. To approve agreement to be entered into with the Railway authorities in connection with the laying of electric cables across the railway track.

Resolved that the agreement be approved.

9. To obtain a vote of Rs. 50 for the purchase of articles required for the minimax Fire Engine.

Resolved that the vote be allowed.

- 10. To obtain a vote of Rs. 200 for filling up market site adjoining main road with temple excavation. Resolved that the vote be allowed.
- 11. Papers relating to the handing over of the upkeep of the Bogambara ground to the Kandy Sports Club.
 Resolved that the Kandy Sports Club be asked to furnish a statement of the gate money taken by the Club for the last two years.

12. Papers re the rates for electric current supplied to the Hotel Suisse.

Resolved that the rates be the same as before, namely 40 cents per unit.

- 13. To reappoint the following Special Committees:
- (1) Special Committee appointed to consider the question of taxation of paddy fields in the Municipal area.—Chairman, Messrs. Ratwatte, de Silva, and Dr. Hay.
- (2) Special Committee appointed to report from time to time on the working of the Electricity Department.—Chairman, Mr. de Silva, Dr. Hay, and Mr. vander Straaten.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, February 9, 1929, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated February 4, 1929.

Present:—Mr. L. W. C. Schräder, Chairman; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C.; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe; Mr. F. W. Sproule; Mr. S. H. Dahanayake; and Dr. T. de Kretser.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of January 12, 1929, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. The Chairman brought to the notice of the Council that Mr. D. I. Durham, having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings had, ipso facto, ceased to be a Councillor. He moved that in terms of section 30 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, the Council do restore him to his office. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Mr. Durham thanked the Council for restoring him to his office as a Councillor.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayake asked: —What is the usual procedure adopted by this Council when . a petition is addressed to the Chairman and members of the Council?

The Chairman replied: --When, in the opinion of the Chairman, such letters require the consideration of the Council,

they are submitted to the Council. Otherwise the Chairman deals with them.

4. In the absence of Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe the following questions standing in his name were asked by Mr. J. E. Perera: --(1) What was the amount of the tender of Mr. Hapugalla for laying the new water main? (2) What is the difference between the amount of his tender and the tender that has been accepted?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Mr. Hapugalla's tender was Rs. 159,045. (2) The difference between his

tender and the accepted tender is Rs. 48,186.

5. In the absence of Mr. D. W. Subasinghe the following questions standing in his name were asked by Mr. J. E. Perera:—(1) Was a tender received at the office from Mr. D. H. Hapugalla in connection with the notice calling for tenders to lay the new main from Hiyare? (2) If so, when did it reach this office, and why was it not submitted with other tenders for consideration by the Council at its last meeting? (3) If such a tender was received in time but was not submitted by an oversight or for any other reason, does not the Chairman consider it fair to call for tenders again so that the tenders be reconsidered?

The Chairman replied as follows:--(1) Yes. (2) The tender was received in time; but it was misplaced and lost sight of, and was not submitted for consideration with other tenders. (3) I do not consider it necessary to call for fresh tenders because Mr. Hapugalla's tender is Rs. 48,186 higher than the accepted tender.

6: Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked the following questions:—(1) How many times did the electric lights fail in the Galle bazaar and the Galupiadda area during the month of January? (2) What is the cause of such failure? (3) Does the Council charge the cost of replacing a fuse to the consumer when the same is replaced in a street standard from which his service is connected?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) and (2) The lights in the Galle bazaar and Galupiadda failed on the following occasions during the month of January last:—(1) On the 9th from 6.17 P.M. to 6.25 P.M., owing to a valve cotter pin on No: 2 engine being sheared off. (2) On the 27th from 7.45 P.M. to 7.47 P.M., owing to an accident to a man near Kachchiwatte Temple. (3) On the 29th at 6.40 P.M. momentarily, owing to a short circuit on Dangedara line. (3.) Yes; but only when the cause of the interruption is some defect in the consumer's premises

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayake moved that this Council do recommend to His Excellency the Governor the desirability of establishing a Health Unit for the town of Galle. Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded, for the

sake of a discussion, but wanted details.

Dr. T. de Kretser moved as an amendment that the question of establishing a Health Unit be referred to the Standing Committee on Sanitation for report. Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded the amendment, but was not sure that a Health Unit could be established in a Municipal town.

The Chairman and Mr. D. W. Subasinghe spoke against the motion and the amendment.

Mr. J. E. Perera spoke against the motion.

The mover replied. He was willing to withdraw the motion, and to agree to the amendment.

The amendment, which now became the substantive motion, was put to the meeting and carried by 5 votes to 4: 8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved that the cost of replacing a fuse in a street electric lighting standard which connects a private service be not charged to the consumer in the future. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded, and Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos was in sympathy.

The Chairman moved as an amendment that the question be referred to the Special Committee on Electric Lighting for consideration and report. Mr. S. H. Dahanayake seconded the amendment. The mover agreed to the amendment,

which was put to the meeting and carried!

9. With the leave of the Council Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe presented a petition from the Bope Sucharitawardene Samitive, asking that a road be opened from Pedurugewella junction through Kovillawatta and Bope to the Bope Cross road near the bridge.

The Chairman said he had received a similar petition, and had communicated with the Secretary of the Samitiya

10. To sanction, under rule 6 of the Municipal Leave Regulations, excess leave granted to the following officers:—
(1) Mr. W. W. Ranasinghe, 7 days in 1927 on half pay, and 5 days in excess of 36 days in 1928 on full pay, and 50 days on half pay; (2) Mr. A. Arndt, 2 days in excess of 36 days in 1928; (3) M. O. A. Hamid, 15 days in excess of 14 days on account of illness. Resolved that the excess leave be sanctioned.

11. To consider letter No. 35/151/28 (A.G.) of January 15, 1929, from the Hon. the Colonial Treasurer, inquiring whether the Council is prepared to assume liability far the proportionate amount of Mr. D. J. Unwin's half pay leave and passage represented by his eight months' service on the Galle Electric Lighting Scheme.

The Chairman recommended that in view of the saving on the salary of the Engineer in charge of the scheme,

the Council do allow the application.

The Municipal Office,

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe, Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, Mr. S. H. Dahanayake, and Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe opposed the application.—Resolved that it is regretted the application cannot be entertained.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

- 12. Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 8, 1928.
- (3) To consider the Superintendent of Work's report, with estimate, on the tarring of roads.—Recommended that (a) the sides of the roads already tarred should be metalled and tarred up to the drain curbs, and the road surfaces given a second coating of tar; (b) newly metalled surfaces of roads should immediately be tarred; the full width of the road up to the side drains should be metalled and tarred.
- (6) To consider the feasibility of acquiring and filling the marshy land along the railway line.—Resolved that, as the scheme will be too expensive, the Committee do not recommend any action at present.

Resolution.

With regard to item (3) resolved that the words "where necessary" be added at the end of recommendation (a), and the words "to the extent of the sanctioned vote" added at the end of recommendation (b).


