RULE made by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council under section 5 of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902."

RULE.

Rule 35 (a) and (b) of the rules relating to the conveyance of traffic by passenger trains published by Notification dated October 11, 1907, in *Gazette* No. 6,210 of the same date, and amended by Notification dated February 25, 1926, in *Gazette* No. 7,514 and *Gazette* of February 26, 1926, and by Notification dated October 1, 1926, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,548 of October 1, 1926, is hereby revoked and the following is substituted therefor:—

35. **Perishables, Newspapers, and Library Books at reduced Rates.**—(a) Live poultry and pigeons (in crates or baskets with flat tops and bottoms so constructed as to admit of proper ventilation from sides, ends, and top, and sufficiently strong to admit of other packages being placed upon them), fish, game, fresh or frozen meat and poultry, fresh butter, bread, pastry, cut flowers, plants and cuttings, eggs, yeast, milk, cream, papaw juice, tea seed in bags or cases, newspapers and books to and from circulating libraries, imported fruits, imported vegetables, imported potatoes, and imported yams will be conveyed at owner's risk at half parcels rate. The freight on these must be prepaid. Minimum charge, 20 cents.

Bundles of plants and cuttings when tendered for despatch by passenger train should not exceed 56 lb. weight per bundle.

Note.—Packages of moss, ferns, branches, and leaves for decorative purposes are charged at full parcels rate, and if bulky in proportion to weight will be charged 50 per cent. extra in terms of rule 39. Poultry and pigeons not contained in crates, baskets, or hampers in accordance with the conditions in paragraph (a) will be charged at 50 per cent. increase upon the ordinary parcels rate.

(b) Country-grown fruits, vegetables, potatoes, and yams; ice and also fish, poultry, game, and fresh meat packed in ice will be conveyed at owner's risk at quarter parcels rate, provided that not less than one pound weight of ice for each pound weight of fish, poultry, game, or fresh meat is provided at the time the consignment is tendered for conveyance by the railway. The freight on these consignments must be prepaid. Minimum charge, 20 cents.

REGULATIONS.

Highways declared suitable for Use by Lorries or particular Types of Lorries subject to stated Conditions or Restrictions.

1. These regulations shall come into operation on March 27, 1929.
2. The highways specified in Schedule A are hereby declared to be suitable for use by lorries other than trailers, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that—

- (a) The maximum weight of the lorry when fully loaded and equipped shall not exceed six tons in the case of four-wheeled lorries and seven tons in the case of six-wheeled lorries; and
- (b) The maximum axle load shall not exceed four tons in the case of four-wheeled lorries and three tons in the case of six-wheeled lorries.

NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted :—

No. 2,368 of February 7, 1929 (Date applied for under Section 50 of the Ordinance, August 28, 1928).

Improvements in or relating to three-colour photography.

Abstract.—In a tri-pack the front layer is highly sensitive to red but not to green; the middle layer is sensitive to green but not to red; the black layer is non-sensitized but is highly sensitive. A colour filter is used in front of the pack to absorb ultraviolet and in part blue, but to transmit violet. The front layer has a decreased amount of silver halide per unit area. The back layer may be treated with a dye to reduce its green sensitivity and the middle layer with a dye to reduce its blue violet sensitivity.

The claims are :—

1. A tri-pack comprising a front layer of silver halide emulsion rendered highly sensitive to the red region of the spectrum but not sensitive, or only slightly sensitive, to the green region, an intermediate layer of silver halide emulsion rendered sensitive to the green region of the spectrum but not to the red region, and a back layer of non-colour-sensitized silver halide emulsion having a substantially higher sensitivity than either of the other two emulsions, in combination with light filtering means in front of (or incorporated in) the front layer arranged to absorb ultra-violet radiation, to transmit violet light, and to absorb, wholly or in part, blue light.

2. A tri-pack according to Claim 1 wherein the front layer (and preferably also the intermediate layer) has a quantity of silver halide per unit of area which is only a small fraction (for example, one-fifth or one-quarter) of that of a normal emulsion coating, while its characteristics are so chosen that a normal degree of contact in the developed image can be readily obtained, for example, a degree of contrast the same, or approximately the same, as that given by the back emulsion layer with the same developer and time of development.

3. A tri-pack according to Claim 1 or Claim 2, wherein the back emulsion layer is treated with a substance which depresses its inherent green-sensitivity, for example, a dye having that property.

4. A tri-pack according to any one of the preceding claims wherein the intermediate emulsion layer is treated with a dye which depresses its blue-violet sensitivity, but, nevertheless, transmits sufficient violet light to enable a satisfactory image to be obtained on the back layer.

5. A tri-pack according to any one of the preceding claims wherein the light-filtering means comprises aesculine, a small proportion of filter yellow, and mandarin orange.

6. A tri-pack according to any one of the preceding claims, wherein the sensitivities to daylight of the front, intermediate and back layers are substantially in the ratio, 10 : 6 : 17, for example, the front layer has a sensitivity of about 500 H. and D., the intermediate layer a sensitivity of about 300 H. and D., and the back layer a sensitivity of about 850 H. and D.

7. The tri-pack for colour photography, substantially as hereinbefore described.

Improved apparatus for delivering measured quantities of material in separate charges.

Abstract.—A measuring member moves between an upper and a lower plate. An orifice in the upper plate is below a feeding hopper but is kept closed by a plate attached to the measuring member except when this is directly below it and filling occurs. A hole in the bottom plate is over the funnel and the measuring member discharges here when its movement brings it to this position.

The claims are :—

1. Apparatus for delivering in separate charges measured quantities of finely divided or small material, for example tea, which consists of a hopper or a chute supplied with the required material and adapted to discharge through an orifice in a plate or other part at the bottom of the hopper, a measuring member having a cavity therein and passing therethrough in a vertical direction, which cavity is of the correct size to contain at each filling the desired quantity of material to be measured and delivered, said measuring member being arranged to reciprocate, swing or oscillate backwards and forwards in a horizontal plane, between said plate or hopper bottom above and a faced slide plate below, and in said movement the cavity therein to come opposite to, or register with, said hopper orifice, preferably at one end of said measuring member's movement, and to receive when in register therewith the said charge of filling material, the said faced slide plate having therein an orifice or having an edge through which, or over which, the same charge will discharge upon the cavity in the measuring member, in its further movement, coming opposite to or registering with said second orifice or passing beyond said edge.

2. Apparatus according to Claim 1 in which the cavity through the measuring member is in a part which is a close sliding fit between a top plate or part (through the orifice in which the measuring cavity is filled) and a bottom or faced slide plate (through the orifice in which, or beyond the edge of which, the contents of said measuring cavity discharge).

3. Apparatus according to Claim 1 or 2, in which the orifice in the upper plate or the discharge opening from the hopper or the like is completely closed by the measuring member or by a part working in conjunction therewith except when the measuring cavity in said member passes under the said orifice in the upper plate or discharge opening.

4. Apparatus according to Claim 1, 2, or 3, in which the orifice in the upper plate or hopper bottom is separated from the orifice in or from the edge of, the lower plate by a horizontal clear distance equal to, or greater than, the width of the measuring cavity.

5. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims, in which the measuring member reciprocates backwards and forwards sliding between an upper and lower plate and is so arranged as to receive a charge of filling material at one end of its travel and to discharge said charge when at the other end of its travel, said charging and discharging points being where the measuring member changes direction and accordingly is moving with its least velocity.

6. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims, in which the measuring member has two measuring cavities, one at each end, and oscillates about a central point receiving and delivering measured quantities of material at two points.

7. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims, in which the measuring member is mounted on a shaft which is geared to mechanism for filling the said measured quantities of material into bags or the like, and is so arranged that the discharge will be synchronized with the passage of a bag or the like under the discharge opening or position.

8. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims, adapted to load small measured quantities of material, in which the capacity of the cavity which measures the same may be adjusted, for example by screwing a screw so that its end projects for a greater or less distance into the cavity.

9. Apparatus according to any of the preceding claims having a cut off slide whereby the discharge of material from the hopper or the like may at any time be discontinued.

10. Apparatus for feeding measured quantities of finely divided or small material, for example, tea, in separate charges, constructed, arranged, or adapted to function substantially as described or substantially as described and illustrated.
