**GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATION.**

“ THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897.”

M 1/29

WHEREAS by a declaration dated December 31, 1928, the proper authority, to wit, the Chairman, Local Board, Kegalla, declared that the area described in the schedule hereto shall be a “ diseased locality ” within the meaning of “ The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and the regulations made thereunder :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, do hereby confirm the said declaration dated December 31, 1928, in accordance with the regulations made under “ The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and published in the *Supplement to the Government Gazette* No. 7,481 of August 28, 1925, and do hereby declare that the area described in the schedule hereto shall, until further notice, be a “ diseased locality ” for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Ordinance and the regulations made thereunder.

SCHEDULE.

That portion of the bazaar area of the Local Board town of Kegalla bounded on the west by the western limit of the Post Office compound and open space to west of Dingiri Appuhamy's boutique, on the north by a line drawn two chains from the centre of the Colombo-Kandy road and running parallel with the road, on the east by a Jubilee Ambalam and paddy field, and on the south by a line drawn two chains from the centre of the Kandy-Colombo road and running parallel with the road.
