“THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897.”

WHEREAS by a declaration dated January 3, 1929, the proper authority, to wit, the Government Agent, Uva, declared that the area described in the schedule hereto shall be a “diseased locality” within the meaning of “The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and the regulations made thereunder:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, do hereby confirm the said declaration dated January 3, 1929, in accordance with the regulations made under “The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and published in the *Supplement to the Government Gazette* No. 7,481 of August 28, 1925, and do hereby declare that the area described in the schedule hereto shall, until further notice, be a “diseased locality” for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Ordinance and the regulations made thereunder.

Bintenne korale, in the Chief Headman's division of Bintenne in the Province of Uva, within the following boundaries:—

- North : Boundary of Eastern Province.
- East : Maduru-cya.
- South : Boundaries of Aralupitiya korale and Pelwatte korale.
- West : Mahaweli-ganga.
