VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 20, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 131 (1 European, 14 Burghers, 70 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 15 Moors, 8 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1929, viz., 266,186) was 25.7, as against 33.3 in the preceding week, 36.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 131 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 83 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 10 Moors, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.7, as against 26.6 in the previous week, 25.4 in the corresponding

week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 131 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year. Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana East, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana South, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 19 in the previous week, and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya,

as against 10 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered, I each in Kotahena North and Maradana hospital, as against 4 in the the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena North and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 11 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from Phthisis, of a resident of Colombo Town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Two deaths from Enteric Feyer (including 1 death of a non-resident) were registered in Maradana hospital.

The number registered during the previous week was also 2 and the weekly average for last year was 3.

4. One death from Plague was registered in Maradana hospital as against nil in the previous week.

5. Nine deaths from Enteritis were registered, 9 from Debility, 5 each from Infantile Convulsions and Accidents, 4 from Dysentery, 3 from Worms, 1 each from Diarrhoea and Puerperal Septicaemia and 53 from Other Causes.

6. Sixty-two cases of Chickenpox, 20 of Measles, 13 of Enteric Fever, and 2 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 62, 17, 3, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.8° against 80.7°, in the preceding week and 83.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.870 in., against 29.901 in. in the preceding week and 29.846 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4.35 in., against 3.61 in. in the preceding week and 0.60 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Monday, March 4, 1929, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 25, 1929.

Present:—Mr. H. E. Newnham, M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. A. H. G. Dawson; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike; Mr. J. S. Collett; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; and Mr. W. J. Thornhill.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of February 6, 1929, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of February 6, 1929, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah presented a petition from the residents of Slave Island, asking for a whole-time Instructor for this ward and moved that it be placed before the Sanitation and Finance Committees. The Chairman seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman the following questions:—(1) With reference to several letters that have appeared recently in the press on the increase of mosquitoes in the Wellawatta area, will the Chairman be pleased to state if the increase is due to the exclusion of the flood waters of the Kelani river from Colombo South, as predicted by the Medical Officer of Health in his Administration Report for 1921? (2) Will the Chairman be pleased to obtain from the General Manager of Railways a statement showing the number of times the railway gates at the level crossings in this city are closed, and the length of time of each closing between the hours of 6 A.M. and 8 P.M.?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The formation of ample breeding places for mosquitoes in Wellawatta is not dependent on the completion of the Flood Scheme. The chief breeding places are the abandoned quarries and the stagnant water that collects in and near the private lanes. Those who have built houses near these breeding places suffer in consequence. The Council has considered all possible means of dealing with the quarries and the only adequate solution is to fill them up. There are 15 such quarries, and it is reported that to fill one of the smaller ones would cost about a lakh of rupees. This is beyond the resources of the owners and of the Council. It may be possible for the Council to purchase one or more of them and gradually utilize the ash from the new refuse destructor for filling. The collections of stagnant water in and near the private lanes are due to the great increase of building in recent years, which has not only interfered with the natural drainage of these areas, but has produced large quantities of waste water, which in the absence of sewers has no proper place of disposal. It, therefore, tends to stagnate in compounds. The solution is to extend the rain water drains and sewers in these areas, and this the Council is doing as funds permit. (2) The General Manager of the Railways has been good enough to furnish the information and it is tabled.

Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman to request the General Manager of the Railways to be good enough to revise his statement in view of the new Time Table which came into force that day and that the revised statement be

circulated for the information of Members. The Chairman agreed to do so.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey asked the Chairman the following questions:—Will the Chairman be pleased to state—(a) (1) whether a start has been made with regard to the widening of Galle road from Bagatelle road southwards, if not (2) when the Chairman expects to start this work? (3) Whether, owing to the grave danger to life, the Chairman will take steps to start this work and see to its completion with as little delay as possible? (b) (1) Whether the Chairman is aware that Kirillapone canal (Layard's Folly), Wellawatta, is in an insanitary condition? (2) Whose duty it is to see to its dredging and cleaning? (3) If it is the Council's, whether steps would be taken to have this work attended to as early as possible? (4) If it is the Government's whether the Chairman would invite the attention of the authorities to this source of danger to health of the residents of the ward? (c) (1) If the new refuse destructor for Colombo South is likely to be ready for use by May this year, if not, when it is expected to be ready? (2) Whether the Chairman will consult the Committees concerned with a view to taking necessary steps to utilize the ash from the new destructor to fill up the large number of abandoned metal quarry pits in Wellawatta ward, especially as the exhaustive investigations and experiments carried out to remove or minimize the nuisance caused to the residents of the ward by myriads of mosquitoes breeding in the stagnant water in these pits, have all failed to give a satisfactory solution.

The Chairman replied as follows:—(a) (1) and (2) The acquisition inquiry has begun. It was delayed pending the arrival of the new Government Assessor. (3) The acquisition is difficult and will take time. The construction will as soon as possible be begun and will be then pressed forward with all speed. (b) (1) The Chairman lives close to the canal and is personally aware of its insanitary condition during periods of drought when there is not sufficient flow to keep the sandbar open. The water then stagnates; a certain number of mosquitoes breed there, though surprisingly few; and vegetable matter and rubbish undergoing putrefaction give off an offensive odour. (2), (3), and (4) The canal is in charge of the Crown, and the Cha rman, in September, 1928, requested the Director of Public Works to take action to obviate the nuisance. A heavy fall of rain immediately flushed out the canal and the nuisance disappeared for the time. It is now proposed that the Council should conserve the banks at the cost of the Crown and details of the proposal are being worked out. The Council deals with the mosquitoes with Paris-green. (c) (1) The Council accepted the tender for the new destructor on August 8, 1928, subject to further inquiry by the Municipal Engineer. The settlement of all details, the importation of the machinery and other materials, and their erection on the site is a large task, and the destructor is not likely to be ready for use until 1930. (2) The Chairman made this suggestion to the Committees on August 22, 1927, and its possibilities will be investigated in good time before the ash is available.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. N. R. Blande asked the Chairman the following questions:—In connection with the recent rioting at Maradana in which a Municipal Fire engine was damaged by the mob—(1) Is the engine repairable, and if so, at what cost? (2) If it is not repairable, the cost of a new engine? (3) At whose expense will repairs or replacement be made?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The Mechanical Engineer reports that the damaged engine cannot be safely repaired. (2) A new engine would cost about Rs. 25,000. (3) The Council has apparently no legal claim on anyone for the cost.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal wished to know whether these engines had been insured against fire.

The Chairman stated that the engine was insured, but whether with an outside Company, or in the Council's Scheme of Insurance he was, at the moment, unable to say. However, the insurance did not cover loss or damage through civil disturbance.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P., asked the Chairman the following question: - In the monthly statements of the Waterworks Engineer for November and December, 1925, after the completion of the raising of the dam, the total capacity of the Labugama Reservoir was given as 1,776 million gallons. From January, 1926, to April, 1927, the total capacity was given as 1,909 million gallons. From May, 1927, to December, 1928, the total capacity Will the Chairman be pleased to state how this has come about, and what is the has been given as 1,900 million gallons. total capacity of the reservoir to-day?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(a) By raising the spill level two feet six inches; (b) 1,900 million gallons.

7. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah asked the Chairman the following question:—(1) Does the Chairman or his deputy have a view of shows like "The White City" before they are granted licence by the Municipality? (2) Does the Municipal Engineer test the strength and safety of mechanical contrivances of shows like the above before they are licensed for patronage by the public?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The "White City" did not require a licence from the Council or the Chairman under the by-laws in force regarding places of public entertainment. Nevertheless, the Chairman inspected the premises on the morning of December 13, 1928. (2) As such shows do not require a licence they are not inspected, as suggested

in the question.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 8 to 12 (inclusive) on the agenda. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

ANNEXTRE A.

14. Should a Municipal Officer or Servant to whom a pension has been awarded take salaried employment in any public or quasi-public Department either in this Colony or in any other part of His Majesty's dominions his pension shall cease to be paid whilst he is so employed, if the official income of his new office is equal to the salary of the appointment from which he retired. But if such official income is less than the salary of his last former office, then so much of his pension shall be paid as shall make up his income to the amount of the salary last drawn by him previously to his retirement.

On final retirement the original pension shall be payable irrespective of such additional pension as shall have been earned in respect of such re-employment, but subject nevertheless to a redistribution of the additional five years' commonly known as "climate allowance." In no case shall more than five years' climate allowance be granted to any one person.

14 A. No Municipal officer or servant who is already in receipt of a pension, in the computation of which a climate bonus or an addition in respect of abolition of office shall have been taken into account, shall, in the computation of a pension which may be awarded to him, be entitled to the climate bonus referred to in rule 2, or the addition in respect of abolition of office referred to in rule 5 hereof.

- 14. (1) If any officer to whom a pension has been granted under these rules is appointed to another office in the service of the Council, then during his tenure of such office so much only (if any) of his pension from the Council shall be paid to him per annum as, together with-
 - (a) The annual emoluments of such office; and
 - (b) Where the officer receives in respect of his previous service with the Council both a gratuity and a pension, an annual amount equal to the difference between the reduced pension actually received and the full unreduced pension which he might have been granted if he had not been granted both a gratuity and a pension;

make up an amount not greater than the annual salary of the appointment from which he retired.

Provided that-

- (i.) Where the officer retired or was transferred from the service of the Council prior to January 1, 1924, the salary of the appointment from which he retired shall, for the purpose of this section, be deemed to be the salary to which the salary last drawn by him would have been converted under the Salaries Scheme brought into force from January 1, 1924, had he been drawing it on that
- (ii.) Any bonus or temporary increase whether on pension or on the salary of the new office, granted in respect of the high cost of living, shall be added to such pension or salary, as the case may be, for the purpose of this section.
- (2) In the event of an officer's re-employment with the Council, the original pension will be altogether cancelled if the officer on re-employment attains a rate of salary not less than that on which he first retired, and the ultimate pension will on final retirement be based on his final salary and the total length of his service as though the whole had been continuous; but if the salary received during the second period of service is less than that on which he first retired, the original pension will be revived on his ultimate retirement and a distinct pension will be grantable for the second period of service at the rate of 1/720th of his final salary for each month of such service, less any number of months that may have been previously added in respect of abolition of office, and without any addition for climate bonus already computed in the first pension.
- (3) A re-employed officer shall be deemed to have exercised, or not to have exercised, in respect of his service subsequent to re-employment, the option provided for in section 2A of these rules, according as he exercised, or did not exercise, such option in respect of his previous service. Where a revised pension based on final salary and the total length of his service is calculated on his ultimate retirement, the gratuity to be paid on such ultimate retirement to an officer who has exercised his option in favour of a gratuity and reduced pension shall be reduced by the amount of the gratuity already paid; but if a distinct pension is granted to such an officer for the second period of service he will draw a separate and distinct gratuity and a reduced pension for the second period of service.

Improvements in trawling gears.

Abstract.—A suitable length of the ground cables is kept in contact with the bottom by means of weights. The shear boards are attached to floats and linked to the two side cables at points in front of the weights so that the shear boards do not drag along the bottom.

A trawling gear of the type comprising a net adapted to swell upwardly under the action of floats or like means and two diverging shear boards or the like which act to open the net laterally and are drawn by a single boat by means of two hawsers, said boards being connected to the net wings by ground cables dragging on the bottom, characterized in that the boards are constructed and arranged in such manner as not to drag on the bottom, a suitable length of the ground cables being kept in contact with the bottom either by the own weight of said ground cables or by suitable loading members.
- 2. A trawling gear according to claim 1, characterized in that the net body is provided with two side cables, which latter transmit the tractive force until the rear part of the net without impairing the upward swelling of the net.
- 3. A trawling gear according to claim 1, characterized in that the hawsers coming from the boat extend to the net wings, the shear boards being attached on said hawsers at one or several intermediary points, either directly or through the medium of connecting cables or like means, the ground cables being formed by a part of the length of the hawsers.
- 4. A trawling gear according to claim 1, characterized in that the shear boards or the like are given such a lifting power or buoyancy as to partly compensate for the weight of the lowing hawsers.
- 5. A trawling gear according to claim 1, characterized in that each hawser is provided at several points of its length with rings or the like to which the boards and/or the loading members may be attached, whereby the distances between the various elements of the gear may be easily varied.
- 6. A trawling gear according to claim 3, characterized in that the connecting cables or like means extend from one or more points of the board to one or more points of the corresponding hawser, the respective positions and lengths of said cables being such as to impart to the board a suitable direction.
- 7. A trawling gear according to claim 1, characterized in that the loading members are formed by weights having a rounded or like shape in order to prevent them from catching on the ground.
- 8. A trawling gear according to claim 1, characterized by one or more supplementary cables which connect each wing of the net to the corresponding board or hawser.
- 9. A trawling gear according to claim 8, characterized in that the supplementary cable (or cables) and the corresponding ground cable are connected to the board at points on a vertical line with the attaching point of the hawser to said board.
- 10. A trawling gear according to claim 8, characterized in that the cables extending on each side of the gear between the net wing and the board are held apart at both ends by spreading slats.
 - 11. A trawling gear, substantially as described as shown in the accompanying drawing.

Improvements in feed water heaters and other apparatus for the condensation of steam and the like.

Abstract.—The object is to prevent loss of steam when water is driven out. In the bottom of the chamber are fixed both arms of a U tube. A valve is fixed in one arm and controls the outlet into a side tube. On one side of the valve the pressure is due to a constant head of water and on the other (open) side it is due to a head which decreases if nearly all the water is driven out of the chamber and steam begins to follow. The steam pressure acts equally on both sides:

The claims are :--

- 1. A device for discharging a liquid of determined density from a receptacle which also contains a fluid of less density and at any pressure, without any loss of fluid, while discharging the liquid at the pressure of the fluid, characterized in that the control of the discharge of the liquid is based upon the effect of the difference between the densities of the liquid and the fluid, said receptacle being, for example, in communication with the receptacle in which the liquid is to be discharged by means of a valve or any other suitable obturating member disposed in the liquid discharge tube, opening into the bottom of said receptacle, in such manner that one face of said valve is subjected to a pressure which depends both on the pressure prevailing at each instant in the said receptacle and on the weight of the column of liquid contained in said tube, while its opposite face is subjected to a pressure which depends only on the pressure prevailing in the said chamber, whereby said valve will close automatically when the level of the liquid is lowered below a predetermined limit.
- 2. A device according to claim 1, wherein said tube is a U-shaped tube, whose branches both open into the bottom of said chamber, said valve being mounted in one of said branches, whereby its upper face is constantly subjected to the pressure of the fluid increased or not by the pressure corresponding to the weight of the column of liquid which may fill said tube above said valve, according as said tube contains liquid or not, while its lower face is constantly subjected to the pressure of the fluid increased by the pressure corresponding to the weight of the column of liquid, which constantly fills the other branch.
- 3. A device according to claim 1, wherein said valve controls the communication between said chamber and a receptacle which may be open to the atmosphere and which may have any suitable position.
- 4. A device according to any of the preceding claims wherein said valve is constituted by a hollow piston slidably mounted in a cylinder, whereby said piston may contain an additional mass for adjusting the weight of said piston.

- 5. A surface heater adapted to be supplied with heating steam, wherein the lower part of the condensation water collector is in communication with a receptacle, which may be open to the atmosphere, by means of a tube opening into the lower part of said collector and provided with a valve or any other suitable obturating member, so disposed in said tube that one face of said valve is subjected to a pressure which depends only upon the pressure prevailing at each instant in said collector, while its opposite face is subjected to a pressure depending both on the pressure in said collector and on the weight of the water column contained in said tube, whereby said valve will close automatically when the level of the condensation water falls below a predetermined limit.
- 6. A heater wherein water to be heated is mixed with steam under pressure, for example steam delivered in a pulsatory manner, the bottom of the compartment of the heater which is adapted to receive the excess of hot water being in communication with a receptacle, which may be open to the atmosphere, by means of a tube opening into the lower part of said compartment and provided with a valve or any other obturating member so disposed in said tube that one face of said valve is subjected to a pressure depending only on the pressure prevailing at each instant in said heater, while its opposite face is subjected to a pressure depending both on the pressure in said heater and on the weight of the water column contained in said tube, whereby said valve will close automatically when the water level falls below a predetermined limit.
- 7. A heater comprising a mixing chamber wherein the liquid to be heated is mixed with steam and connected with a distribution chamber by means of a hydraulic joint or water seal, both chambers being substantially closed so as to contain the heating steam under a relatively high pressure, the hydraulic joint being so designed that the mixing chamber will contain substantially no water, the portion of the distribution chamber which is adapted to receive the excess of hot water being in communication with a receptacle, which may be open to the atmosphere, by means of a device adapted to allow the discharge of liquid without any loss of steam, for example by means of a valve disposed in a tube opening into the bottom of said distribution chamber, said valve being subjected on one face to a pressure depending only on the pressure depending both on the pressure in said distribution chamber and on the weight of the water column contained in said tube, whereby said valve will close automatically when the water level falls below a predetermined limit.
- 8. A heater according to claim 6, wherein the upper end of said tube opens into said heater at a point situated below the level of the steam supply orifice in said heater, said tube thus acting as an overflow tube.
- 9: A heater according to claim 7, wherein the upper end of said tube opens into said distribution chamber at a determined level above the bottom thereof, said tube thus acting as an overflow tube for the discharge of the excess of hot water.
- 10. A heater according to claim 6, 7, 8, or 9, wherein the water to be heated is delivered into the heater by means of an injector operated independently of the hot water pump adapted to deliver the heated water into the boiler, or any other utilization apparatus said tube having a sufficiently large diameter to provide for the discharge of so important excess of hot water:
- 11. A heater comprising an oil separating chamber adapted to be passed through by the heating steam, wherein said oil separating chamber is connected, for example, with the atmosphere by means of a tube opening at the lower part, of said oil separating chamber, and provided with a valve or other obturating member, so disposed in said tube that said valve is subjected on one face to a pressure depending only on the pressure of the heating steam, while the opposite face is subjected to a pressure depending both on the pressure of the heating steam, and on the weight of the column and/or oil contained in said tube, whereby said valve will close automatically when the level of the condensation water and/or oil falls below a predetermined limit, said tube thus providing for the discharge of the condensation water and the oil which collect in said oil separating chamber.
- 12. A device for discharging a liquid of determined density from a chamber which also contains a fluid of less density and at any pressure, without any loss of fluid, while discharging the liquid at the pressure of the fluid, substantially as described and as shown in the appended drawings:
- 13. Surface heaters, or heaters wherein steam and water are mixed together, and provided with a device according, to any one of the claims 1 to 4 and 12, substantially as described and as shown in the appended drawings.

Improvements in feed water heaters.

Abstract.—The feed water is pumped into a mixing chamber where it meets the steam and then collects in a depression in the floor. The steam pressure drives it through a pipe into a tank in a second chamber. From the bottom of the tank the hot water is pumped into the boiler. The overflow from the tank is driven through a U pipe into a tank whence it flows into the inlet pipe to the pump before the mixing chamber.

The claims are :-

- 1. A feed water heater for the feeding of locomotives and like boilers, wherein the water to be heated is mixed with the heating steam in a mixing chamber in communication with a following distribution chamber by means of a hydraulic joint or water seel, said chambers being closed and being adapted to contain heating steam under pressure, and the hydraulic joint being so designed that the mixing chamber contains substantially no water, while the portion of the distributing chamber which contains the excess of hot water is connected with the atmosphere by means of a second hydraulic joint or water seal adapted to support a difference of level which is sufficient to balance the pressure of the heating steams.
- 2. A feed water heater according to claim 1, wherein said hydraulic joint is constituted by a U-shaped tube of suitable height.
 - 3. A feed water heater according to claim 2, wherein said U-shaped tube comprises internal baffles.
- 4: A feed water heater according to claim 1, wherein said hydraulic joint is adapted to connect said distribution chamber with a suitable receptacle open to the atmosphere, forming part or independent of said heater, and adapted to receive the excess of hot water, which is thence supplied to any suitable utilization apparatus.

Improved manner of and apparatus for filling bags with finely divided or small material.

Abstract.—A funnel is inclined at an angle so that its narrow end enters the open mouth of a bag which is fed to it: the funnel resumes its upright position dragging the bag with it; the base of the bag preferably resting on a conveyor. The bag is then filled and may be given an up and down motion. Filling the bag partially disengages it from the funnel so that it readily separates by means of the movement of the conveyor.

The claims are :---

- 1. A manner of filling finely divided or small material, for example, tea, into bags, which consists in inserting the small end of a moving funnel into the open mouth of the bag, dragging or conveying the bag hanging from said funnel to a loading station, depositing a charge of the said filling material into the bag through said funnel, and carrying the bag still attached to said moving funnel to a further point where it is disengaged from the funnel and engaged by a conveyor or other means to pass it on to its next operation.
- 2. A manner of filling finely divided material, for example, tea, into bags, according to claim 1, which comprises inserting the small end of a moving funnel into the open mouth of a bag by raising and/or tilting the said funnel to an angle, for example, 30° to 45° to the vertical, to lift said smallend and cause it more readily to enter the mouth of the bag, and then causing said funnel to return to the vertical position, thereby, as it moves on, dragging the said bag away from the device which feeds it to the funnel engaging position, and moving the bag onwards to be subsequently filled with the required material and passed on.
- 3. A manner of filling finely divided or small material, for example, tea, into bags, according to claim 1 or 2, wherein the bag upon being engaged by the moving funnel and upon said funnel dropping into a vertical or lowered position in said bag, is held between said funnel and a travelling support.
- 4. A manner of filling finely divided or small material, for example, tea, into bags, according to claim 1, 2, or 3, wherein the bag, after receiving its desired charge of filling material, is shaken or given an up and down motion to shake down the contents before being detached from the funnel.
- 5. A manner of filling finely divided or small material, for example, tea, into bags, according to any of the preceding claims, wherein the bag is caused to partially disengage from the small end of the funnel owing to its shortening in length as its lower end expands when filled with the desired filling material, whereby the bag more readily is disengaged from the funnel by the conveyor.
- 6. A manner of filling finely divided or small material, for example, tea, into bags, according to any of the preceding claims in an automatic manner, wherein the funnels are successively moved to pass a bag supplying station, engage and remove bags therefrom, carry the bags to a bag filling station where they are filled, and move the bags to a delivery point, preferably shaking up the bag contents on the passage thereto.
- 7. Apparatus for filling finely divided or small material, for example, tea, into bags, in a manner according to any of the preceding claims.
- 8. Apparatus for filling finely divided or small material into bags, comprising a revolving head with a multiplicity of arms or equivalents pivoted, hinged, or articulated thereto, which are capable of lifting and/or tilting, funnels carried by said arms, and means whereby, as each said arm and funnel approaches or passes a certain position where the funnel is to engage a bag, it is caused to rise and/or tilt in such a manner as to cause the lower or small end of each said funnel to enter the mouth of an open mouthed bag and to drop therein and to drag the said bag from the bag supplying station, carry the bag to pass a filling station, each individual bag being filled as it passes the said filling station, and to carry each filled bag to a delivery point where it is disengaged, each said arm and funnel then travelling round to repeat the operation in regular sequence.
- 9. Apparatus for filling finely divided or small material, for example, tea, into bags, according to claim 8, having means whereby as each funnel is made to approach a bag to engage it the mouth of the said bag is blown open by a blast of air, preferably by a blast turned on to synchronise with the approach of the said funnel to the said bag.
- 10. Apparatus for filling finely divided or small material, for example, tea, into bags, according to claim 7, 8, or 9, wherein as each funnel carrying a bag pendant therefrom is caused to pass a material filling station it is filled with a charge preferably a measured charge, of the desired material, the filling device being geared to the mechanism driving the rotating funnel carrying head so as to synchronise with and deliver a charge only as a funnel passes under it to receive a charge.
- 11. Apparatus for filling finely divided or small material, for example, tea, into bags, according to any of the preceding claims 7 to 10, wherein the arms carrying the funnels are mounted on a revolving shaft, or head attached to a shaft, which revolving shaft is surrounded by a circular track presenting a waved or cam-like contour, against or upon which track the said arms, or parts attached to the said arms or funnels, make contact, the contour being such that the funnels will be raised, tilted as may be necessary, lowered, and, if desired, by the provision of suitable steps or notches in said track, shaken or vibrated in a sequence to conform to the desired movements before the various bag engaging, bag filling and filled bag disengaging stations.
- 12. Apparatus for filling bags according to claim 11, wherein the said circular track is formed on the edge of a fixed cylindrical member surrounding the said revolving shaft, upon the upper shaped or suitably waved edge of which member the arms supporting the said funnels rub as they revolve.
- 13. Apparatus for filling bags according to claim 11, wherein the arms carrying the funnels have extensions or parts adapted to rest upon said circular track, said extensions or parts having contacting ends which may be adjusted or replaced when worn.
- 14. Apparatus for filling bags according to any of the claims 7 to 13, wherein the funnels used have flattened and/or bevelled small ends adapted readily to enter the mouth of a bag when the same is blown or held open.
- 15. Apparatus for filling bags according to any of the preceding claims 7 to 14, wherein the funnels used have collars fixed thereto, or are so shaped that they will press down the edges of the open mouth of the bag attached thereto and contact closely with said edges.
- Apparatus for filling bags according to any of the preceding claims 7 to 15, wherein the bag, as it is being filled and when filled, is supported from below upon a surface moving with the fubbel, said surface being of a springy nature or being spring constrained, and a fixed rack, teeth, or serrations being provided against which the said surface or a part attached thereto; in moving, rubs or contacts to receive a vibrating or jerking up and down motion to shake down the contents of the filled bag.

- 17. Apparatus for filling bags according to any of the preceding claims 7 to 16, particularly adapted to fill tea into small paper bags to form small packets.
- 18. A method of filling paper bags automatically with finely divided or small material, for example, tea, substantially as described.
- 19. Apparatus for filling bags, and particularly small paper or like bags, automatically with finely divided or small material, for example, tea, constructed, arranged, or adapted to function substantially as described or substantially as described and illustrated.

Examination, &c., for Certificate of Efficiency as a Midwife.

- 1. Candidates for the examination for a certificate of efficiency as a midwife issued by the College Council will be examined at such times as the Council shall appoint.
- 2. Every examination shall be held in English and in the vernacular, and candidates shall present themselves for examination either in English or in the vernacular, but not in both.

 3. The certificate issued by the Council to any candidate who passes the examination in English shall be known
- as a First Class Certificate of Efficiency as a Midwife, and the certificate issued by the Council to any candidate who passes the examination in the vernacular shall be known as a Second Class Certificate of Efficiency as a Midwife.
- 4. The syllabus for the examination, whether in English or in the vernacular, shall be as set out in the schedule annexed to these regulations, and questions may be set or asked on any or all of the subjects or matters contained therein.
- 5. All examinations will be held in Colombo. The examination for a First Class Certificate of Efficiency shall consist of a written examination paper or papers, and also, an oral test, and the examination for a Second Class Certificate of Efficiency shall be entirely oral.
- 6. A six months free course of instruction in the subjects contained in the said syllabus will be held, both in English and in the vernacular, at the Lying in Home, Colombo, prior to the holding of any examination. Particulars of the course may be obtained free of charge from the Registrar, Ceylon Medical College.

- No woman shall be admitted as a candidate for any examination without the written permission of the Ceylon Medical College, who may require, as conditions of the grant of such permission, that Registrar,
 - (1) in the case of the examination for the First Class Certificate, the applicant shall-
 - (a) have passed the fifth standard of general education of Ceylon, or an equivalent standard; and
 - (b) have attended the six months' course referred to in regulation 6, or a similar course at some other training centre approved by the Council.
 - (2) in the case of the examination for the Second Class Certificate, the applicant shall have attended the six months' course referred to in regulation 6, or a similar course at some other training centre approved by the Council.
- 8. The entrance fee payable by candidates for the examination for a First Class Certificate of Efficiency shall be five rupees. No fee shall be payable in the case of the examination for a Second Class Certificate.

(A) Syllabus for the First Class Certificate of Efficiency.

- Elementary Anatomy and Physiology of the female pelvis and its organs.
- Pregnancy-

Midwives' Regulations.

A.—Interpretation.

Interpretation.

- (1) For the purpose of these regulations, a case of labour shall be deemed to be normal in which there are none of the conditions referred to in regulations 21 and 22.

 (2) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - - (a) "Lying-in period" means, in a case of normal labour, the time occupied by the labour and a period of seven days thereafter, and in the cases referred to in regulations 21 and 22, such other time as the medical practitioner summened shall decide.
 - (b) "Local authority" means the Chairman of any Municipal Council, Local Board, District Council, or Sanitary Board, or of the Nuwara Eliya Board of Improvement.

B.—Supervision of Midwives.

Local Supervising Officer.

2. (1) The work of all midwives in each area to which section 57 of the Medical Ordinance, 2. (1) The work of all midwives in each area to which section 57 of the Medical Ordinance, 1927, is applied shall be under the control and supervision of a registered medical practitioner for the area, who shall be appointed by the local authority, subject to approval by the Medical Council, for that purpose and shall be known as the Local Supervising Officer of the area.

(2) Every midwife, whether practising or not, shall notify the Local Supervising Officer immediately of any change in her name and address.

3. (1) I shall be lawful for the Local Supervising Officer to suspend a midwife from practice when necessary, for the purpose of preventing the spread of infection, whether or not she has contravened any of the provisions of the Medical Ordinance, 1927, or of these regulations.

(2) The Local Supervising Officer shall give notice in writing of such suspension to the midwife concerned and shall at once report the same, with the grounds thereof, to the Medical Council.

(3) The period of such suspension shall not ordinarily be more than 24 hours, to enable the midwife to disinfect herself, her clothing, and appliances, but if a longer period of suspension is necessary, the period shall be subject to the discretion of the Chairman of the Medical Council.

C.—PRACTICE OF MIDWIFERY.

I.—Cleanliness.

4. Every midwife shall be scrupulously clean in all respects including her person, clothing, appliances and residence. She shall keep her nails cut short, and preserve the skin of her hands as far as possible from cracks and fissures.

When called to an obstetricil case, the midwife shall take with her in a metal case or in a bag or basket, kept for that purpose only, and fitted with a removable lining which can be

disinfected-

(1) an appliance for giving vaginal injections, a different appliance for giving enemata, a metal catheter, a pair of seissors, a clinical thermometer, a suitable stiff nail brush, and soep:

(2) such efficient antiseptic or antiseptics as shall be prescribed by the Local Supervising Officer, for such purposes as-

(a) disinfecting the hands;

(b) douching in special cases; and

(c) cleaning the infant's eyes:

Provided that the Local Supervising Officer may in his discretion dispense with the requirements of this regulation, so far as they relate to the carrying of a catheter and appliances for giving vaginal injections or enemata.

Before touching the genital area or the neighbourhood thereof, the midwife shall on

each occasion disinfect her hands and fcrearms.

All instruments and other appliances shall be disinfected by boiling before being brought into contact with the patient's genital area.

Whenever a midwife

(1) has been in attendance, whether as a midwife or as a nurse, upon an obstetrical case; or

(2) has been in contact with a person suffering from puerperal fever or from any other

condition supposed to be infectious; or

(3) is herself liable to be a source of infection, she shall notify the Local Supervising Officer of the fact, and shall, unless the Local Supervising Officer dispenses with such requirement, disinfect herself and all her instruments and other appliances, and have her clothing thoroughly disinfected to the satisfaction of the Local Supervising Officer before going to any other obstetrical case.

II.—Duties to patient.

9. (1), A midwife in charge of an obstetrical case shall not leave the patient without giving an address where she can be found without delay.

(2) She shall remain with the patient during the second stage of the labour and until at least one hour after the completion of the third stage (the expulsion of the placenta and membranes).

(3) In cases where a medical practitioner has been summoned by the midwife on account of there being some abnormality or threatened danger, she shall await his arrival and faithfully carry out his instructions.

(4) If for any reason the services of a medical practitioner are not available when required,

she shall remain with the patient and do her best for her.

The midwife shall wash the patient's genital area with soap and water and then swab the region with an efficient antiseptic solution as prescribed by the Local Supervising Officer, on the following occasions:

(1) before making the first internal examination;

(2) after the termination of labour;

(3) during the lying-in period when washing is required; and

(4) before passing a catheter.

11. The midwife shall not make any more internal examinations than are absolutely necessary.

The midwife shall in all obstetrical cases examine the placenta and membranes before they are destroyed, and satisfy herself that they are completely removed.

13. The midwife shall remove soiled linen, blood, faeces, urine, placenta, and membranes from the neighbourhood of the patient and from the lying-in room as soon as possible after the labour, and in every case before she leaves the patient's house.

14. (1) The midwife shall be responsible for the cleanliness, and shall give all directions for securing the comfort and proper dieting, of the mother and child during the lying-in period.

(2) If for any reason the services of the midwife are refused before the lying-in period has expired, the fact must be entered by her in her case notebook, and reported by her immediately to the Local Supervising Officer.

15. The midwife shall endeavour to promote breast-feeding and when breast-feeding cannot

apparently be continued, shall summon medical assistance. 16. Every midwife, other than a midwife holding a Second Class Certificate of Efficiency,

shall take the pulse and temperature of the patient at each visit, and record the same in a notebook or on charts which must be carefully preserved.

III.—Duties to Child.

17. In the case of a child born apparently dead, the midwife shall carry out the methods of resuscitation which have been taught her.

18. As soon as the child's head is born, and if possible before the eyes are opened, its eyelids

shall be carefully cleansed by the midwife.

19. On the birth of a child which in the opinion of the midwife is in danger of deaths she shall immediately inform one of the parents of the child's condition.

20. Every midwife, other than a midwife holding a Second Class Certificate of Efficiency, shall be in possession of a case notebook and clinical charts. The pulse and temperature readings at each visit shall be entered in the case notebook and plotted on a chart, and a record of the progress of the case shall be kept by the midwife in her case notebook.

21. (1) In all cases of illness of the patient or of the child, or of any abnormality occurring during pregnancy, labour or the lying-in period, a midwife, as soon as she becomes aware thereof, shall explain to the patient or to any relative of the patient who may be present, that the case is one in which the attendance of a medical practitioner is necessary and shall summon medical assistance and inform the Local Supervising Officer accordingly.

(2) The Medical Council shall prepare a list of medical practitioners who are willing to be called in to attend such cases, and a copy of the list shall be supplied to each midwife.

22. Without prejudice to the generality of regulation 21, that regulation shall apply in the following particular cases:-

- (1) in all cases in which the woman or the child during pregnancy, labour or the lying-in period appears to be dying or dead;
- (2) in the case of a pregnant woman, when there is any abnormality or complication such as-
 - (a) Deformity or stunted growth;

(b) Loss of blood;

(c) Abortion or threatened abortion;

(d) Persistent vomiting;

Swelling of hands or face; (e)

(f) Fits or convulsions;

(g) Dangerous varicose veins;

(h) Purulent discharge;

- (i) Sores of the genital area;
- (3) in the case of a woman in labour at or near term, when there is any abnormality or complication such as-
 - (a) Fits or convulsions;

(b) Purulent discharge;

(c) Sores of the genital area;

(d) A malpresentation, i.e., a presentation other than the uncomplicated head or breech;

Where no presentation can be made out;

- Where there is excessive bleeding; Where one hour after birth of the child the placenta and membranes have not been completely expelled;
- (h) Rupture of the perineum or other injuries of the soft parts;
- (4) in the case of a lying in woman when there is any abnormality or complication

(a) Fits or convulsions;

(b) Abdominal swelling and tenderness;

Offensive discharge;

(d) Shivering with raised temperature

- (e) Rise of temperature above 100 4 F., with quickening of the pulse, for more
- (f) Unusual swelling of the breasts with local tenderness or pain;

(g) Secondary post-partum haemorrhage;

(h) White leg;

(5) in the case of the child when there is any abnormality or complication such as-

(a) Injuries received during birth;

(b) Any malformation or deformity endangering the child's life;

(c) Dangerous feebleness :

(d) Inflammation of, or discharge from the eyes, however slight;

(e) Serious skin eruptions, especially those marked by the formation of watery

(f) Inflammation about, or haemorrhage from the naval.

- (1) The midwife shall also inform the Local Supervising Officer in all cases—
 - (a) in which the death of the mother or of the child occurs before the attendance of a medical practitioner;

(b) of stillbirth, where a medical practitioner is not in attendance at the time of the birth.

(2) For the purpose of this regulation, a child shall be deemed to be stillborn when, after being completely born, it has not breathed or shown any sign of life.
