RULES.

*Rules for the Protection of the Uma-ela Irrigation Works in the Province of Uva and for the Conservation of Water.*

1. No person shall obstruct, divert, cut the sides of, damage, or interfere in any way with any ela, channel, or other water-course comprised in the irrigation works.
2. No person shall encroach upon any ela, channel, or other water-course or the reservations thereto comprised in the irrigation works.
3. No person shall interfere with or in any way damage any sluice, spill, dam, or regulating work comprised in the irrigation works.
4. No person shall obstruct or interfere with or in any way damage any road or path comprised in the irrigation works, nor shall any carts be taken over them without the permission of officers of the Irrigation Department.
5. No person shall waste, or cause any other person to waste, water supplied from the irrigation works.
6. The control and distribution of all water in the irrigation works in the charge of the Director of Irrigation shall lie with the officers of the Irrigation Department, and no other person shall interfere with the distribution or flow of water therein or take any water therefrom. This rule shall not apply to the distribution of water by the Vel-Vidane after it has left the Government works.
7. Officers of the Irrigation Department shall have the power to stop the issue of water at any time in order to prevent damage being caused to any part of the irrigation works.
8. The following intervals between cultivation seasons are required for general repairs and maintenance of the irrigation works and except under exceptional circumstances and under special permit and on special terms no water will be issued to any of the sluices or channels in the portions of the irrigation works specified below, for distribution to the fields during these periods:—  
Portion between anicut and 6th milepost : September 1 to 30.  
Portion between 6th milepost and 8th milepost : August 1 to September 30.  
Portion between 8th milepost and end of channel : July 1 to September 30.

"Public stand" means a defined space provided or allotted by the Sanitary Board for the use of hiring cars, and indicated as such by a notice.

2. The Sanitary Board may issue permits authorizing hiring cars to use a public stand.
3. A fee of 50 cents shall be payable for a permit to use the public stand for one day, and a fee of Rs. 5 shall be payable for a permit to use the public stand for one month.
4. No motor car shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it and unless he produces it when required to do so by a Police Officer or Headman.

## RULES.

The Local Option Rules, 1928, published in *Gazette* No. 7,478 of August 14, 1925 (Excise Notification No. 146), and *Gazette* No. 7,661 of August 31, 1928 (Excise Notification No. 180), are amended as follows :—

1. Rule 25 is rescinded and the following is substituted therefor :—

25. Where on an estate, of 10 acres or more in area, or group of such estates, employing an adult male Indian labour force in all of 250 or more, reasonable facilities for the supply of liquor are considered desirable by any estate superintendent concerned ; such superintendent may apply to the Government Agent to hold a poll of the labour force for the purpose of ascertaining whether an " Estate Canteen " should be opened on such estate or group of estates. The term adult male shall mean a male who has completed his 18th year of age.

2. Rule 26 is rescinded and the following is substituted therefor :—

26. When such application has been made by an estate superintendent and approved by the Government Agent, a poll shall be held taking the estate labour register as the register of voters. Any adult male whose name is borne on the estate register at the time of the poll shall be entitled to vote. The poll shall be held by the Government Agent or any person expressly nominated by him to do so. Due notice shall be given of the date, place, and time appointed for holding the poll.

3. The following new rules shall be added immediately after Rule 26 :—

27. The officer holding the poll shall at the time appointed call the muster roll of all adult male labourers on the register, and each person whose name is called shall, if he so desire, mark his vote on a ballot paper provided for the purpose. If he is unable to understand the proper use of a ballot paper, the officer holding the poll shall ascertain his wish and record his vote in accordance therewith.

28. A canteen established as the result of such a poll shall be under the management and supervision of the superintendent of the estate on which such canteen is established in accordance with such rules as may be framed for the purpose by the Governor in Executive Council, provided that the canteen shall be subject to the supervision of the Excise Department.

29. All sales of liquor from such a canteen shall be limited to resident labourers of the estate or group. An off-sale shall not be permitted except on a written permit from the superintendent of the estate or in his absence the person in charge of the estate at the time, and a record of permits so issued shall be kept.

30. A canteen shall be open only during hours fixed by the superintendent-in-charge. The hour of opening shall not be earlier than 12 noon, except on Sundays and festival days, when the opening hour may not be earlier than 8 A.M. The hour of closing shall not be later than 7 P.M. Within those two limits the superintendent may fix the periods of sale so as to exclude working hours or to vary the hours of opening and closing.

31. A canteen may be for the sale of arrack, malt liquor, or toddy. Arrack shall be obtained under regulations issued by the Excise Commissioner. Toddy may be obtained from any trees not situated in a village or estate area which has gone " dry " as the result of a poll.

32. A canteen established in such a manner may be closed by a poll of the estate labourers or by the superintendent of the estate in respect of which application was made for its opening. The majority required either for opening or closing of a canteen by a poll shall be 60 per cent. of the adult male labourers, whose names are borne on the estate register at the time of the poll. The Government may at any time take action under the Excise Ordinance to withdraw the licence of any estate canteen.

33. The rules published by Excise Notification No. 130 in *Gazette* No. 7,264 of June 23, 1922, and by Excise Notification No. 142 in *Gazette* No. 7,401 of June 20, 1924, are hereby rescinded.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 6, 1929.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 174 (11 Burghers, 100 Sinhalese, 38 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 33·9, as against 28·8 in the preceding week, 35·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36·1 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 183 (10 Burghers, 112 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 7 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 35·6, as against 28·6 in the previous week, 28·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 183 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Twenty-seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 16 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana North, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 26 in the previous week and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Fourteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, 2 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered in Kotahena South, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 12 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 2 in Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Nineteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 8 from *Debility*, 5 each from *Dysentery* and *Accidents*, 4 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 2 from *Worms*, and 79 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-nine cases of *Chickenpox*, 11 of *Measles*, and 4 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 7, 8, and 6, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 79·9°, against 81·0° in the preceding week and 80·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·812 in., against 29·794 in. in the preceding week and 29·788 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·04 in., against 1·48 in. in the preceding week and 4·87 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

  - (p) To enter into any arrangement or agreement with Government, or any authorities and obtain rights, concessions, and privileges.
  - (q) To hire, lease, or purchase land either with any other person or company or otherwise, and to erect a factory and other buildings thereon or on any land already leased or owned by the Company at the cost of the Company and such other person or Company or otherwise, and to lease any factory or other buildings from any company or person.
  - (r) To enter into any agreement with any company or person for the working of any factory erected or leased as provided above, or for the manufacture, and preparation for market of tea, rubber, or any other produce in such or any other factory.
  - (s) To prepare, cure, manufacture, treat, and prepare for market tea, rubber, cocoa, coconuts, plumbago, minerals, and (or) other crops or produce, and to sell, ship, and dispose of such tea, rubber, cocoa, coconuts, plumbago, minerals, crops, and produce, either raw or manufactured, at such times and places and in such manner as shall be deemed expedient.
  - (t) To buy, sell, warehouse, transport, trade and deal in tea, rubber, coconuts, cocoa, coffee, and other plants and seed, and rice and other food required for coolies, labourers, and others employed on estates and other products, wares, merchandise, articles, and things of any kind whatever.
  - (u) To act as agents, attorneys, brokers or trustees for any person, firm, or company, and to undertake and perform sub-contracts, and also to act in any of the business of the Company through or by means or agents, attorneys, brokers, sub-contractors, or others.

- (v) To establish and carry on a dairy farm, and to buy and sell live stock, and to sell and deal in milk and dairy produce, wholesale or retail.

- (z) To borrow or receive on loan money for the purpose of the Company upon the security of cash credit bonds, or of hypothecation or mortgages of the Company's property or any part or parts thereof, or otherwise, as shall be thought most expedient, and the in particular by the issue of debentures, debenture stock or bonds to bearer or otherwise, either charged upon all or any part of the Company's present or future property (including uncalled capital) or not so charged, as shall be thought best.
- (z 1) To cause or permit any debenture stock, bonds, debentures, mortgages, charges, incumbrances, liens, or securities of or belonging to or made or issued by the Company or affecting its property or rights or any of the terms thereof to be renewed, extended, varied, redeemed, exchanged, transferred, or satisfied, as shall be thought fit, also to pay off and re-borrow the moneys secured thereby, or any part or parts thereof.
- (z 2) To draw, make, accept, and endorse bills of lading, warrants, bills of exchange, promissory notes, and other transferable or negotiable instruments for the purposes of the Company.
- (z 3) To unite, co-operate, amalgamate, or enter into partnership or any arrangement for sharing profits of union of interests or any other arrangements with any person or company already engaged in or hereafter to be established for the purpose of carrying on any business having objects wholly or in part similar or analogous or subsidiary to those of the Company or to any of them, or capable of being conducted so as to benefit this Company, either directly or indirectly, and to subscribe for or otherwise acquire for the benefit and in the name of the Company or otherwise and pay for in any manner that may be agreed upon, either in money or in shares or bonds or otherwise, and to hold any shares, stock, or other interest in any such company, and to promote the formation of any such company.
- (z 4) To amalgamate with any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to this Company.
- (z 5) To acquire by purchase in money, shares, bonds, or otherwise, and undertake all or any part of the business, property, assets, and liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business in Ceylon elsewhere which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purpose of this Company.
- (z 6) To sell the property, business, or undertaking of the Company, or any part or parts thereof, for such consideration as the Company shall think fit, and in particular for shares, stocks, debentures, or securities of any other company.
- (z 7) To procure the Company to be registered or incorporated in Ceylon, and if and when necessary or thought advisable, elsewhere.
- (z 8) To lend money on any terms and in any manner and on any security, and in particular on the security of plantations, factories, growing crops, produce, bills of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, bills of lading, warrants, stocks, shares, debentures, and book debts, or without any security at all.
- (z 9) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
- (z 10) To promote and establish any other company whatsoever and to subscribe to and hold the shares or stock of any other company or any part thereof.

- (z 14) To do all such other things as shall be incidental, or conducive to the attainment of the objects above-mentioned or any of them or any one or more of the objects aforesaid, it being hereby declared that in the foregoing clauses (unless a contrary intention appears) the word "Company" includes companies or coporations, and the word "person" any number of persons, and that the other objects specified in any paragraph are not to be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from any other paragraph.

#### ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF CEYLON PRINTERS, LIMITED.

The regulations contained in the table marked C in the schedule to the Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861 (herein after called table C) shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender, and words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and *vice versa*, and words importing persons shall include corporations.

2. Regulation 24 of table C is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely, "Subsequent General Meetings shall be held at least once in every year at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors."

3. A quorum at any General or Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company shall consist of not less than three Shareholders, and Regulation 32 of Table C is modified accordingly.

4. Regulations 39, 42, 43, and 44 are expressly excluded, and the following regulations substituted therefor, namely :—

- (a) On a show of hands every shareholder present in person shall have one vote. On a poll every shareholder shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.
- (b) No shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any general meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid.
- (c) On a poll votes may be given either personally or by proxy.
- (d) The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney duly authorized in writing or if the appointor is a corporation either under the common seal or under the hand of an officer or attorney so authorized.
- (e) The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid.
- (f) An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form or in any other form which the Directors shall approve :—

5. Regulations 45 and 46 are expressly excluded and the following regulations substituted therefor :—

#### DIRECTORS.

(a) The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than four ; but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least one hundred fully or partly paid shares in the Company upon which all calls for the time being have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors.

(b) As remuneration for their services the Directors shall each be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding Two thousand rupees annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration granted for special or extra services hereinafter referred to, nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Director or Managing Directors of the Company.

(c) The first Directors shall be Messrs. A. Gardiner, Regis Rajakarier and S. Ratnanather.

The first Directors shall hold office till the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

(d) One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Manager, Managing Director and (or) Agent, Visiting Agent or Superintendent for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office, and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Manager, Managing Director and (or) Agent, Visiting Agent, or Superintendent.

(e) The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be conferred on any Manager of the Company.

(f) If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money, as they shall think fit.

#### ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

6. Regulations 49 to 55 of Table C are expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely :—

(a) At the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company all the Directors shall retire from office and at the First Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 6B.

(b) The Directors to retire from office at the Second Ordinary General Meeting shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot : in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office.

(c) In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire, the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

(d) Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

(e) The Ordinary General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent Ordinary General Meeting.

(f) Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors or provisional Directors arising from death, resignation, or otherwise, may be filled up by the Directors, but any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

(g) A general meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also determine in what rotation such increased or reduced number is to go out of office.

(h) If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place the place of a retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the First Ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

(i) A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary or by leaving the same at the registered office of the Company, or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors, but not before, his office shall become vacant.

(j) Every Director or officer of the Company, and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him in or about the discharge of his duties, except such as happen from his wilful acts or defaults ; and no Director or officer shall, nor shall the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless same happen through his own wilful act or default.

(k) No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

## BORROWING POWERS.

7. (a) The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances as they may find necessary or expedient for the purposes of the Company. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or any other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing to any one time shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting exceed Rupees Ten thousand (Rs. 10,000).

(b) With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Directors shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

(c) For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised or for any other purposes the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company both present and future including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept or endorse on behalf of the company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

(d) Any such securities may be issued, either at part or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise.

(e) Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

8. Regulation 64 of Table C is expressly excluded, and the following substituted therefor, namely :—

(a) The Directors may at such times as the circumstances of the Company warrant the same, declare dividends to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to the number of their shares and the amount paid up or deemed to be paid up thereon respectively.

(b) The Directors may if they shall think fit declare from time to time such interim dividends on account as in their opinion the position of the Company justifies.

9. Regulation 80 of Table C is hereby expressly excluded, and the following substituted therefor.

(a) If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor, is not supplied at the Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person or persons who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment.

10. Regulation 85 of Table C is expressly excluded, and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely :—

(a) A notice may be served upon any Shareholder whose registered address is in Ceylon either personally or by posting it in a post office to such address in a prepaid envelope.

(b) Each holder of registered shares whose registered place or address is not in Ceylon may from time to time notify in writing to the Company an address which shall be deemed his registered place of address within the meaning of these Articles of Association.

(c) As regards those Shareholders who have no registered place of address in Ceylon a notice posted up in the office shall be deemed to be duly served on them at the expiration of twenty-four hours after it is so posted up.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on May 13, 1929, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated May 14, 1929.

*Present* :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Dr. F. Keyt; Mr. A. V. Perera; and Mr. D. K. McMinn.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 20, 1929; having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1928 to April 30, 1929, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for April.
- (d) Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April.
- (e) The reservoir readings for April.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes and house-service taps inspected during April.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Ratwatte presented petition from (1) the residents of Watarantenne asking that a well be sunk near the border of Watarantenne estate; (2) Mrs. Van der Straaten *re* the lighting of Lady Manning's Drive.

Mr. A. V. Perera presented petition from (1) M. Hameedu *re* the mutton monopoly at the Kandy market; (2) Secretary, Kandy Hotels Co., *re* disturbance and annoyance caused by buses and lorries, &c.

Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake presented petition from (1) Mr. G. Lindsay *re* the necessity for a light near the slaughter-house; (2) the residents of Welata *re* the nuisance caused by the dumping of refuse in the vicinity of the junction of Peradeniya road and Lady Blake's Drive; (3) M. C. Noordeen, late overseer, Works Department, *re* his discontinuance.

Mr. de Silva presented petition from the residents of Mavilimada *re* the necessity for a cemetery for the village.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the several petitions.

5. Correspondence :—(1) Letter No. W. 329/28 of April 27, 1929, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary forwarding for observations a draft of an Ordinance to amend the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.—Read.

(2) Letter No. W. 378/26 of May 9, 1929, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that Mr. D. K. McMinn, Provincial Engineer, Central Province, has been nominated a member of the Municipal Council, Kandy, *vice* Mr. E. H. Van der Straaten.

Mr. Ratwatte moved.—That this Council do place on record its appreciation of the very valuable services rendered by Mr. E. H. Van der Straaten during his tenure of office as a nominated member of the Council. Mr. de Silva seconded.—Carried unanimously.

(3) Letter No. C. E. 30210/6548 of April 29, 1929, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, *re* admission of motor cars into station compound, Kandy.—Read.

5A. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva asked—(1) Is the Council aware of the fact that traffic was held up for nearly 2½ hours along the Katugastota road on the 11th instant as a result of a fallen tree being allowed to remain across this road just by the railway arch? (2) Will the Chairman be pleased to inform who is responsible for this delay? (3) Will the Chairman also please take the necessary steps to prevent any delay resulting from accidents of this nature occurring in the future?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) I am informed that the trees fell at about 2.30 to 3 p.m., and that heavy vehicles, such as lorries and buses, were held up after some time owing to the detour becoming impassable till about 7 p.m., when the road was cleared, but that ordinary cars and other vehicles were not held up for any appreciable time. (2) The delay was due to unavoidable causes. The dadap tree was on the railway land, and the coconut tree on railway land. Both Katugastota road and Lady Anderson's road were blocked. Liability for cleaning the road was *prima facie* that of the Public Works Department, but as it was a matter of urgency it was attended to by our Works Department, who apparently happened to receive the first information. The dadap tree was 9½ feet in girth. (3) Considering the reasonable promptitude with which our Works Department acted in this matter, though they were not strictly responsible, I do not think that any special instructions on my part are called for.

5B. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva moved.—That the plot of land lying between the Kandy Club and the Planters' Association be opened to the public. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.—The motion was put to the meeting and carried by 6 to 3 :—

*Ayes* : Mr. Ratwatte, Mr. de Silva, Mr. Ismail, Mr. Wijayatilake, Dr. Keyt, Mr. Perera. *Noes* : The Chairman, Dr. Hay, Mr. McMinn.

6. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

*Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on April 20, 1929.*

(1) Draft by-law prohibiting the use of a portion of Peradeniya road by motor lorries between 9 p.m., and 6 a.m.—Recommended.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on April 20, 1929.*

(2) Letter No. 31 of January 31, 1929, from the Chairman, Municipal Education District Committee, applying for a lease of the land behind the Municipal Free School, Katukéle, on a nominal rental for use as a playground for the school children.—Recommended.

8. With the leave of the Council, Mr. Perera moved—That applications for travelling shows and performances on Municipal land should be circulated to the Council before a licence is granted. Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.—Carried.

No. 2,396 of June 6, 1929 (Date applied for under Section 50 of the Ordinance: July 4, 1928).

Improvements in or relating to the treatment of tea.

*Abstract.*—A series of rollers is provided at decreasing levels. The rollers have circular holes and longitudinal chambers. Each roller has a cutter operating on it.

The claims are:—

1. A method of separating stalk from tea leaf, wherein one or more movable or rotatable rollers, drums or equivalent members are adapted to engage with the stalk and separate it from the tea leaf.
2. A method as in claim 1, wherein the one or more movable or rotatable rollers, drums or equivalent members are adapted to receive the tea leaf and also engage with the stalk, and the stalk is capable of being released from the rollers, drums or equivalent members before the cut leaf passes therefrom.
3. A machine for separating stalk from tea leaf according to claim 1 or 2, wherein the rollers, drums or equivalent members are provided with means for engaging with the stalk when it is disposed lengthwise or approximately so thereof, for the purpose specified.
4. A machine as in claim 3, wherein the means are in the form of grooves, recesses, teeth or projections.
5. A machine as in claim 3 or 4, wherein the rollers, drums or equivalent members co-act with attachments and carry the stalks past the attachments and release it immediately thereafter.
6. A machine as in claim 5, wherein the rollers, drums or equivalent members are provided with circular recesses capable of receiving the tea leaf and of holding it during its travel past the attachments, for the purpose specified.
7. A machine as in claim 6, wherein the circular recesses are slightly chamfered at their edges, for the purpose specified.
8. A machine as in claim 5, 6, or 7, wherein the space above the rollers, drums or equivalent members and the attachments is separated into chambers.
9. A machine as in claim 8, wherein the chambers are separated from adjacent chambers by adjustable partitions.
10. A machine as in claim 9, wherein the partitions are mounted on pivot supports, for the purpose specified.
11. A method of separating stalk from tea leaf substantially as hereinbefore described.
12. A machine for the treatment of tea leaf constructed, arranged and adapted to operate substantially as hereinbefore described with reference to the accompanying drawings.

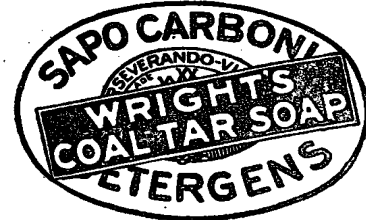

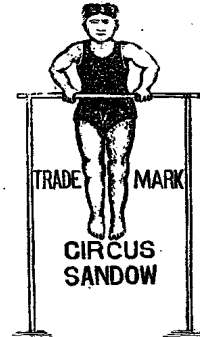
