RULES.

The Local Option Rules, 1928, published in *Gazette* No. 7,478 of August 14, 1925 (Excise Notification No. 146), and *Gazette* No. 7,661 of August 31, 1928 (Excise Notification No. 180), are amended as follows:—

1. Rule 25 is rescinded and the following is substituted therefor:—

25. Where on an estate, of 10 acres or more in area, or group of such estates, employing an adult male Indian labour force in all of 250 or more, reasonable facilities for the supply of liquor are considered desirable by any estate superintendent concerned; such superintendent may apply to the Government Agent to hold a poll of the labour force for the purpose of ascertaining whether an "Estate Canteen" should be opened on such estate or group of estates. The term adult male shall mean a male who has completed his 18th year of age.

2. Rule 26 is rescinded and the following is substituted therefor:—

26. When such application has been made by an estate superintendent and approved by the Government Agent, a poll shall be held taking the estate labour register as the register of voters. Any adult male whose name is borne on the estate register at the time of the poll shall be entitled to vote. The poll shall be held by the Government Agent or any person expressly nominated by him to do so. Due notice shall be given of the date, place, and time appointed for holding the poll.

3. The following new rules shall be added immediately after Rule 26:—

27. The officer holding the poll shall at the time appointed call the muster roll of all adult male labourers on the register, and each person whose name is called shall, if he so desire, mark his vote on a ballot paper provided for the purpose. If he is unable to understand the proper use of a ballot paper, the officer holding the poll shall ascertain his wish and record his vote in accordance therewith.

28. A canteen established as the result of such a poll shall be under the management and supervision of the superintendent of the estate on which such canteen is established in accordance with such rules as may be framed for the purpose by the Governor in Executive Council, provided that the canteen shall be subject to the supervision of the Excise Department.

29. All sales of liquor from such a canteen shall be limited to resident labourers of the estate or group. An off-sale shall not be permitted except on a written permit from the superintendent of the estate or in his absence the person in charge of the estate at the time, and a record of permits so issued shall be kept.

30. A canteen shall be open only during hours fixed by the superintendent-in-charge. The hour of opening shall not be earlier than 12 noon, except on Sundays and festival days, when the opening hour may not be earlier than 8 A.M. The hour of closing shall not be later than 7 P.M. Within those two limits the superintendent may fix the periods of sale so as to exclude working hours or to vary the hours of opening and closing.

31. A canteen may be for the sale of arrack, malt liquor, or toddy. Arrack shall be obtained under regulations issued by the Excise Commissioner. Toddy may be obtained from any trees not situated in a village or estate area which has gone "dry" as the result of a poll.

32. A canteen established in such a manner may be closed by a poll of the estate labourers or by the superintendent of the estate in respect of which application was made for its opening. The majority required either for opening or closing of a canteen by a poll shall be 60 per cent. of the adult male labourers, whose names are borne on the estate register at the time of the poll. The Government may at any time take action under the Excise Ordinance to withdraw the licence of any estate canteen.

33. The rules published by Excise Notification No. 130 in *Gazette* No. 7,264 of June 23, 1922, and by Excise Notification No. 142 in *Gazette* No. 7,401 of June 20, 1924, are hereby rescinded.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 13, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 145 (2 Europeans, 17 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 20 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birthrate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 28.2, as against 33.9 in the preceding week, 33.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 178 (14 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 40 Tamils, 26 Moors, 4 Malays, and 8 Others). The deathrate per 1,000 per annum was 34.7, as against 35.6 in the previous week, 31.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 178 total deaths, 51 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty-eight deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 16 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Maradana North, 3 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Wollawatta South, 2 each in San Sebastian and Kotahena North, and 1 each in Pettah, Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 27 in the previous week and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Thirteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in St. Paul's, 2 each in Kotahena North and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana South, as against 14 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in Maradana North, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospital, as against 5 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twelve deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 12 from *Debility*, 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Tetanus*, 2 each from *Dysentery*, *Worms*, and *Accidents*, 1 from *Homicide*, and 63 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-one cases of *Chickenpox*, 3 of *Measles*, and 2 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 29, 11, and 4, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.6°, against 79.9° in the preceding week and 81.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.839 in., against 29.812 in. in the preceding week and 29.782 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.53 in., against 2.04 in. in the preceding week and 2.26 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

(6) *Viva Voce*: Candidates for the Kindergarten Course may be required to relate a story suitable for children from 5 to 6 years of age. Three stories should be prepared.

Training Class for the Surveyor-General's Licence.

AN examination for admission to the Training Class for the Surveyor-General's Licence in Surveying and Levelling will be held at Colombo on Monday, October 7, 1929, and the following day.

2. Application to enter for the examination must be made on the prescribed form, which can be obtained from the Surveyor-General.

The subjects of the examination will be as follows:—

(i.) *English*.—An exercise in composition and questions set to test the candidate's knowledge and command of English.

(ii.) *Arithmetic*.—The principles and process of arithmetic applied to whole numbers and vulgar and decimal fractions. The metric system. Approximations to a specified degree of accuracy. Contracted methods of multiplication and division of decimals. Ratio and proportion; percentage; averages. Practical applications of arithmetic.

(iii.) *Geometry*.—Theorems and problems, including graphical exercises, on the following: angles at a point; parallel straight lines; the side and angle properties of triangles and rectilinear figures; easy loci; the areas of triangles and quadrilaterals; the chord, angle, and tangent; properties of circles; proportion; similar triangles.

Candidates will also be expected to be acquainted with the forms of the simpler solid bodies, namely, the cube, the rectangular block, the tetrahedron, the sphere, the cylinder, the wedge, the pyramid, and the cone.

(iv.) *Algebra*.—Elementary algebraic operations. Simple equations. Simple simultaneous equations containing not more than two unknown quantities; problems leading to such equations. Resolution into factors, fractions, quadratic equations containing only one unknown quantity; problems leading to such equations. Fractional and

negative indices (formal proofs not required). Logarithms to base 10 and use of four-figure tables. Graphs and their applications. The solution of two simultaneous equations, one being linear and one being quadratic. Variation. The gradient of a graph. Arithmetical progression and finite geometrical progression.

(v.) *Trigonometry*.—Plane Trigonometry, including the solution of triangles and the use of logarithms. Questions will not be set involving angles greater than 360 degrees.

In order to qualify for admission to the class, candidates must obtain not less than 40 marks per cent. in each subject and 50 marks per cent. in aggregate.

4. The number of students admitted to the class will be limited to ten.

5. The fees for the course will be Rs. 200, payable in advance: in addition, a deposit of Rs. 100 must be made on admission, to be returned to the student at the end of the course, less the estimated value of any damage he may have done to instruments or other property of Government.

Abstract.—A central bulking chamber is provided for the air. From this by means of a horizontal fan the suitably heated and humidified air is forced into a pressure chamber. Fans at the ends of withering lofts can draw this air towards the ends of the building or by reversing the fans and allowing the prepared air to pass along the roof passage it can be driven in the opposite direction along the loft. Suitably placed valves or doors are supplied.

The movement of the fans, their reversing, and the opening and closing of the necessary doors are operated automatically and if desired the movements can be controlled by clock work.

The claims are :—

1. In Controlled Withering Installations, direct action of fans on all floors, substantially as described and illustrated.
2. In Controlled Withering Installations, fans manually, mechanically, or automatically movable from floor to floor, substantially as described and illustrated.
3. In Controlled Withering Installations, adjustable automatic mechanical alternation or reversing of the flow of air mixture, and automatic control of the necessary interconnected doors or valves, substantially as described and illustrated.

Improvements in Air-heaters.

Abstract.—The air passes through an initial air-heating chamber, then through an intermediate heating chamber and finally through a heating chamber having therein a number of tubes through which pass the products of combustion and hot gases from the furnace to the flue, so that the air absorbs heat from the wall of this chamber and also from the tubes.

The claims are :—

1. In an air-heater comprising a closed furnace casing surrounded at its sides, top, bottom, and back by chambers through which, in succession, the air passes and is heated by heat radiating either directly or indirectly, from the furnace casing, the provision of smoke boxes and tubes through which the products of combustion and hot gases are conveyed from the furnace to a flue, the said tubes extending through the final air-heating chamber so that the air in its passage through the said chamber absorbs heat radiating from the said tubes in addition to the heat radiating from the wall of the said chambers.
2. An air-heater in accordance with the preceding claiming clause, comprising a closed furnace, a final air-heating chamber surrounding the top and sides of the said furnace, an intermediate air-heating chamber in communication with and at one side and top of the said final air-heating chamber, an initial air-heating chamber at the rear of the said furnace and in communication with the said intermediate air-heating chamber, and smoke boxes and tubes through which the products of combustion and hot gases pass from the said furnace to a flue, the said tubes passing through the said final air-heating chamber so that the air in its passage therethrough absorbs heat radiating from the said tubes in addition to the heat radiating from the walls of the said final air-heating chamber.
3. An air-heater constructed, arranged, and adapted to operate substantially as hereinbefore described and illustrated in figures 1, 2, and 3 of the accompanying drawings.
4. The modified constructional form of air-heater substantially as hereinbefore described with reference to figure 4 of the accompanying drawings.

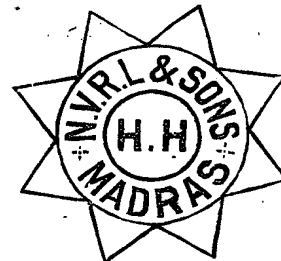

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Trincomalee, a place included within the said Eastern Circuit :

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Trincomalee, in the said Eastern Circuit, on or about Monday, July 29, 1929.

For the Eastern Circuit, twice at least at Batticaloa, and such other place or places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint, such Sessions commencing at Batticaloa in the month of February and the month of July in every year :

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to cancel the Sessions provided to be held at Batticaloa in view of the fact that there are not sufficient cases committed for trial from the District of Batticaloa at the July Sessions of the Supreme Court on its Second Eastern Circuit :

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do cancel the above Sessions, in pursuance of the last proviso to section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," as amended by section 2 of the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1924, and direct that the case likely to be committed for trial before the Supreme Court at the said July Assizes from the Police Court of Batticaloa, a place within the said Eastern Circuit, be tried at the Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court on its Second Eastern Circuit commencing at Trincomalee on Monday, July 29, 1929.
