Know Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 109 (3) and subject to the provisions of section 109 (4) of the said Ordinance, do hereby confirm and proclaim the said by-laws.

SCHEDULE.

By-laws regarding the Tax on Vehicles and Animals.

- In these by-laws—
 - "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Galle Municipal Council.
 - "Ordinance" means the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.
- 2. The return required to be furnished under section 134 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person supposed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in a schedule which shall be supplied by the Council and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such schedule is addressed.
- 3. If any person, after having filled up and returned such schedule, shall acquire, keep, or use any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish such information as aforesaid shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

- 4. Subject to the provisions of section 132 of the Ordinance, any person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 2 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year succeeding that in which such schedule is furnished; and any person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 3 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.
- 5. Any person who, having furnished the schedule required by by-law 2 or the written notice required by by-law 3, claims to be exempt from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his pessession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.
- 6. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 132 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the Thirty-first day of March in every year in respect of all vehicles kept or used within the limits of the Municipality of Galle and in respect of the animals, if any, employed in drawing them, whether such vehicles have or have not been licensed under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916.
- 7. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the registers of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued. The colour and shape of the plates shall be determined by the Chairman.

Provided, however, that the owner or person in charge of any vehicle in respect of which a licence has been issued by the Chairman under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, shall not be required to affix a plate as

required by this by-law.

- 8. Should any vehicle licensed under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, by a "proper authority" other than the Chairman be kept or used within the limits of the Municipality of Galle, the owner of such vehicle shall, subject to the provisions of section 132 of the Ordinance, be liable to pay the tax prescribed in Schedule D of the Ordinance, in respect of such vehicle and in respect of the animal, if any, employed in drawing it and shall further affix to such vehicle the plate prescribed by these by-laws.
- 9. Where the plate prescribed by these by laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the limits of the Municipality of Galle, the owner or person in charge of any such vehicle in respect of which the prescribed plate should have been so affixed shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten rupees.
- 10. Any Municipal Inspector or Police Officer may detain any vehicle kept or used within the Municipality to which the prescribed plate is not duly affixed in accordance with these by-laws, and in such case shall forthwith bring the owner or person in charge of such vehicle before the Municipal Magistrate.
- 11. Chapter XI. of the by-laws of the Municipal Council of Galle appearing in Proclamation dated January 21, 1903, published in Government Gazette No. 5,901 dated January 23, 1903, is hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

Highways declared to be suitable for Use by Motor Cars other than Lorries subject to stated Conditions or Restrictions; and Highways on which Omnibuses are prohibited.

These regulations shall come into operation on July 26, 1929. Nothing in these regulations shall be construed so as to apply to lorries or the use of highways thereby.

- The highways specified in Schedule A are hereby declared to be suitable for use outside Colombo by all motor cars other than lorries and trailers, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that-
 - (a) The maximum weight of the motor car when fully loaded and equipped shall not exceed six tons in the case of four-wheeled motor cars and and seven tons in the case of six-wheeled mortor cars; and
 - (b) The maximum axle load shall not exceed four tons in the case of four-wheeled motor cars and three tons in the case of six-wheeled motor cars.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 20, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 182 (12 Burghers, 110 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 18 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 35.5, as against 28.2 in the preceding week, 30.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 153 (13 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 28 Moors, 5 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.8, as against 34.7 in the previous week, 29.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 153 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 51 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-six deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Maradana North, 3 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, 2 each in Kotahena North, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta North, as against 38 in the previous work, and 22 the models are fully asset for the previous work. week, and 23 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Nineteen deaths from Influenza were registered, 5 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, 3 in San Sebastian, 2 each in Kotahena North and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana North, as against 13 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Five deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents) and 1 each in New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 1 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. (a) Nine deaths from Phthisis were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South and I each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Korahena North, and New Bazaar, as against 17 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.
- (b) Three deaths from Phthisis of residents of Colombo Town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.
- 3. Two deaths from Enteric Fever (including 1 death of a non-resident (were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 1 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Sixteen deaths from Enteritis were registered, 8 from Debility, 4 from Infantile Convulsions, 3 from Puerperal Septicæmia, 2 each from Worms and Accidents, 1 from Dysentery, and 56 from Other Causes.
- 5. Reported cases: -Twenty-six cases of Chickenpox, 18 of Measles, 12 of Enteric Fever (3 in Port) were reported during the week, as against 21, 3, and 2 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.5°, against 79.6° in the preceding week and 80.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.873 in., against 29.839 in. in the preceding week, and 29.889 in. in the corrresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.08 in., against 1 53 in. in the preceding week and 0 06 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

 (e) To carry on in the Island of Ceylon or elsewhere the trade or business of ship builders or ship wrights, and of purchasing, hiring, selling, assembling, or otherwise acquiring motor cars, motor vans, buses, motor cycles, cycle cars, motors, scooters, cycles, bicycles, carriages, carts, trucks, launches, boats, vans, aeroplanes, hydroplanes, and other vehicles and conveniences of all kinds, to purchase, take in exchange, sell, hire, or otherwise acquire, and hold boats, barges, lighters, tugs, launches, and vessels of any description whatsoever to purchase, take in exchange, acquire, and hold live and dead stock, chattels, and effects required for the maintenance and working of the business of carriers by land or by water or by air of proprietors of docks, wharves, jetties, piers, warehouses, and boats and of tug-owners and wharfingers for the purpose of landing and shipping passengers or luggage or otherwise, and all machinery materials, component parts, accessories, and fittings of all kinds applicable or used as accessory thereto, and of letting or supplying all or any of the things hereinbefore specified and of repairing and maintaining the same respectively, whether belonging to this Company or not, and of selling exchanging or otherwise dealing in the same respectively, or of any other business which can or may conveniently be carried on in connection with the above respectively.

 - (k) To carry on business and to act as merchants, traders, commission agents, ship owners, carriers, or in any other capacity in the Island of Ceylon and elsewhere, and to import, export, buy, sell, barter, exchange, pledge, make advances upon or otherwise deal in goods, produce, articles, and merchandise by wholesale or by retail.
 - (1) To purchase, lease, take in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, or to enter into any agreement for the purchase, lease, exchange, or hire of any other land or lands, or any share or shares thereof, and any buildings, mines, minerals, mining and mineral properties and rights, machinery implements, tools, live and dead stock, stores, effects and other property, real or personal, movable or immovable of any kind, and any contracts, rights, easements, patents, licences or privileges in Ceylon or elsewhere (including the benefit of any copy-right, trade mark, or trade secret), which may be thought necessary or convenient for the purpose of the Company's business, and to erect, construct, maintain, or alter any buildings, machinery, plant, roads, ways, or other works, or methods of communication.

(t) To carry on in the Island of Ceylon and elsewher: all or any of the following business, to wit:—booksellers, stationers, and advertising agents, money changers, dealers in exchange and currency, manufacturers of and dealers in furniture, suppliers of provisions, both solid and liquid refreshment, caterers and contractors, carriers of passengers and goods by land, water, or air, forwarding agents, merchants, exporters, importers, traders, engineers, and any other business or businesses which can or may be conveniently carried on in connection with any of them.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF BARTLAM AND COMPANY, LIMITED.

1. The regulation contained in the table marked "C" in the schedule in the Company's Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861 (hereinafter called Table "C") shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated h rewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender, and the words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and vice versi, and words importing persons shall include

2. Regulation 24 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely: "subsequent general meeting shall be held at least once in every year at such time and place as may be determined by

the Directors.

3. The following new regulations shall be added after regulation 10 of Table "C" under the Heading "Transfer of Shares," namely:—

TRANSFER OF SHARES. (10 A) A share may be transferred by a member or other person entitled to transfer to any member selected by the transferor, but save as aforesaid and save as provided by regulation (10 r) hereof, no share shall be transferred to a person who is not a member so long as any member (or person selected by the Directors as one whom it is desirable in the interests of the Company to admit to membership) is willing to purchase the same at the fair value.

(10 B) Except where the transfer is made pursuant to regulation (10 F) hereof, the person proposing to transfer any shares (hereinafter called the proposing transferor) shall give notice in writing (hereinafter called a transfer notice), to the Company that he desires to transfer the same. Such notice shall specify the sum he fixes as the fair value, and shall constitute the Company his agent for the sale of the share to any member of the Company (or person selected as aforesaid) at the price so fixed, or, at the option of the purchaser, at the fair value to be fixed by the Auditor in accordance with these regulations. A transfer notice may include several shares, and in such case shall operate as if it were a separate notice in respect of each. A transfer notice shall not be revocable except with the sanction of the Directors.

(10 c) If the Company, within the space of twenty-eight days after being served with a transfer notice, find a member (or person selected as aforesaid) willing to purchase the share (hereinafter called the purchasing member), and shall give notice thereof to the proposing transferor, he shall be bound, upon payment of the fair value, to transfer

the share to the purchasing member.

(10 D) In case any difference arises between the proposing transferor and the purchasing member as to the fair value of the share, the Auditor shall, on the application of either party, certify in writing the sum which, in his opinion, is the fair value, and such sum shall be deemed to be the fair value, and in so certifying the Auditor shall be

considered to be acting as an expert, and not as an arbitrator.

(10 E) If in any case the proposing transferor, after having become bound as aforesaid makes default in transferring the share the Company may receive the purchase money, and shall thereupon cause the name of the purchasing member to be entered in the register as the holder of the share, and shall hold the purchase money in trust for the proposing transferor. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a good discharge to the purchasing member, and after his name has been entered in the register in purported exercise of the aforesaid power the validity of the proceedings shall not be questioned by any person.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Wednesday, June 12, 1929, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated June 5, 1929.

Present:—Mr. H. E. Newnham, V.D., M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Mr. R. L. Pereira, K.C.; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. A. H. G. Dawson; Lieut.-Col. C. D. Myles, O.B.E., M.B., R.A.M.C.; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike; Mr. J. S. Collett; Dr. V. van Langenberg, V.D.; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. W. J. Taornhill; Mr. A. H. Morgan; and Mr. H. J. Hutchings.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of May 8, 1929, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of May 8, 1929, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah presented a petition from the bus owners of Slave Island for a separate stand for three buses on the Lotus road.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey presented a petition from some of the Muslim residents of Wellawatta. Ward with regard to permission to erect a school.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman the following questions:—(1) With reference to the statement in the report of the Special Committee regarding the rinderpest, that the Veterinary Department had gradually drifted into chaos, which began even before the last rinderpest outbreak, will the Chairman be pleased to say why timely action was not taken to prevent this? (2) As great inconvenience and loss is now caused to householders and contractors owing to the delay experienced in getting drainage works inspected and passed by officers of this Council, will the Chairman be pleased to place before the Works and Finance Committees proposals to remedy matters? (3) As, from reports in the public press, plague appears to be on the increase in this city, will the Chairman be pleased to submit a statement of the number of cases this year giving date of occurrence, and locality, and also compare this year's situation with those of 1928 and 1927. (4) Will the Chairman be pleased to (a) invite the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health on the present lay out of the Kochchikadde Slum Scheme, and (b) place before the Works and Finance Committees at their

next meeting proposals for the construction of the buildings?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Such action as was possible has been consistently taken for at least the last $4\frac{1}{2}$ years. So long, however, as by Ordinance, the Chairman has not the effective control of officers whose salaries exceed R3. 100 a month, it is impossible for him to prevent the occurrence or indeed the recurrence of such lapses. (2) Investigation does not confirm the allegation of great inconvenience and loss due to delay in inspection, and four of the largest contractors, on being questioned, state that they have no complaint to make or suggestions to offer on this point. As a matter of routine the work is inspected within 2 days of the contractor giving notice that any portion of it is ready for inspection, although the contractor is expected to give 7 days' notice. There have been a few very rare occasions when the inspection could not be carried out for 4 days owing to sickness or leave. The drainage of about 100 premises is completed each month and complaints are singularly few. Investigation almost always proves that any delay was due to the contractor and not to the department. The facts and figures will be placed before the Committees. (3) The statement asked for is tabled. The number of cases in the first 5 months of 1927, 1928, and 1929 was 64, 27, and 30. There has, therefore, been no great increase this year. Eight cases have occurred in the Pettah Ward, 7 in Mutwal, and 5 in St. Paul's. The Pettah and St. Paul's are the chief grain centres of the city. Until it is possible to improve or evacuate the rat-ridden private grain shops little positive improvements can be expected. (4) (a) Yes. (b) It is not clear what proposals are meant. All necessary proposals will be put before the Committees in time for construction to begin when the land is available.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah asked the Chairman the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman direct the attention of the responsible authorities to the unsatisfactory condition of the sheet of water extending from near the New Colombo Ice Co., to a little beyond Slave Island Station and behind Christ Church, Galle Face? (2) Will the Chairman see that necessary action is taken to restore this portion of the canal to a sanitary condition? (3) What is the delay in erecting the much needed shed on Newnham Playground when it was stated that work was nearly being

started several months ago?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Yes: the authority responsible for the pollution of the lake is the Colombo Municipal Council on whose behalf the Chairman has had his attention directed to the unsatisfactory condition of the water during frequent inspections on, and once in, it. (2) The problem has for many years received the attention of the Council's officers. Definite improvement can only be effected by the connection of the foul drainage of all adjoining properties with the sewers and the provision of silt traps for the rainwater drains. Both these expedients have been adopted with greatly increased speed in recent years, but very much still remains to be done. (3) The Chairman sees that in May last year it was intended to put up a shed constructed of old materials and he is informed that the proposal-did not materialize, as it was felt that the playground merited a more permanent structure. It is proposed to include a vote for Rs. 1,200 for this purpose in the next year's Budget.

6. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, who had arrived late, with the permission of the Chairman, presented the petition, of which he had given notice, from residents of the St. Sebastian Ward, praying for a full time Instructor to be appointed to the Price Park playground.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene moved:—This Council requests the Chairman not to make any part acquisition of the land required for the Kochchikade Slum Scheme, until he is satisfied after due inquiry that the whole area could be acquired for the sum of Rs. 750,000 (the figure given by him in his revised estimate), and also not to commence work on the buildings till the acquisition of the whole area is completed.

In moving the motion, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene emphasized that its object was not to upset the scheme as passed by the Council, but merely aimed at keeping the work within the estimate. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

pro forma.

The Chairman and the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando spoke in opposition to the motion which, after further discussion was put to the meeting and lost.

8. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey moved:—That this Council do resolve that when street lines in private lanes before 1915 were cancelled, it was not the intention of the Council to see that all applications for any additions or alterations whatsoever to an existing building in such lanes be turned down unless the applicant agrees to throw into the street in question, without compensation, such land as might be deemed necessary for bringing up the width of the street to the required standard and that, therefore, this Council do sequest the Chairman to refer all such applications to the Housing and Town Improvement Committee. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

The Chairman explained the law on the subject.

Mr. T. G. Jayewardene moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Housing and Town Improvement Committee. Dr. E. A. Coorey agreed and seconded the amendment which was put to the meeting and carried.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos 9 to 15 (inclusive) on the agenda. The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing and the Special Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:

With regard to item No. 2 (corresponding to item No. 5 of the extracts from the minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of May 28, 1929), Mr. R. L. Pereira inquired whether it was the intention to keep the Library open on Wednesdays.

The Chairman pointed out that Rule 13 referred to the Lending Library, and rules 25 and 28 to the Reading Room

and Reference Library, respectively.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Library Committee be adopted.

The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved, as an amendment, that in view of the fact that the Government Salaries Scheme contained in Sessional Paper XLVIII.—1928 had been published, the authority of the Council be obtained for the revision of the salaries of the subordinate staff for report to Council in July, 1929, it being understood that any increase given to the subordinate staff, and also later to the higher staff, be dated from May 1, 1929. (b) The recommendation of the Superintendent of Fire Brigade (supported by the Acting Municipal Treasurer) that the quotation of Messrs. Dennis Brothers, Ltd., Guildford, for a pump capable of delivering 500-700 gallons per minute at a cost of £1,425 f.o.b., London, be accepted.

Note.—Funds are available.—(b) Recommended.

Resolutions.

With regard to item No. 3, it was resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted. The Chairman mentioned that he had received an application from the Ceylon Social Service League for the free use of the Municipal Hall on the 24th instant, for a prize distribution in connection with their Night Schools. Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike opposed the application which was supported by Dr. S. Muttiah and Mr. R. L.

Pereira.

The Chairman pointed out that the application was for a Prize-giving for their Night Schools and that the Council had nothing to do with schools.

Dr. S. Muttiah moved that the application of the Ceylon Social Service League be allowed. Mr. R. L. Pereira

seconded.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike rose to a point of order as to whether this application could be considered in connection with item No. 3.

The Chairman ruled that it was in order.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted. It was resolved that the contents of the letter referred in the following item, which was approved of in circulation be formally approved of in Council:

(27) To consider letter No. K 10 of May 24, 1929, from the Director of Electrical Undertakings stating that Government accepted the Council's proposals, subject to a right of appeal to His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council against any resolution of the Municipal Council that overhead lines be removed.

ANNEXURE A.

By-laws of the Municipal Council of Colombo, with respect to the Meetings of the Council and to the conduct of business and preservation of order thereat:

CHAPTER II.*

CONDUCT OF BUSINESS.

Existing By-laws.

Adjournment of meetings

1. Notice of an adjourned meeting shall be served on members at least twenty-four hours before the time fixed for such meeting.

Presence of strangers.

Strangers, including the press, may be present at Council meetings in the places set apart for them, but must withdraw when called upon to do so by the Chairman, when, in the opinion of the majority of the members of the Council present at the meeting, expressed by resolution, such exclusion is deemed advisable in the public interest.

Order of business

The business of the Council shall be transacted in the following order:-

(1) Confirmation of the minutes of the last preceding meeting

(2) Memorials, petitions, complaints, and communications addressed to the Council, of which due notice has been given by a Councillor, shall be laid before the Council.

(3) Questions of which previous notice has been given.

(4) Motions.

- (5) Any other matter set down in the notice shall be proceeded with, provided that the Council may, if it sees fit, deviate from the order herein prescribed.
- (6) Monthly statements of receipts and disbursements, progress reports of works, and such other documents as are required by the Council shall be submitted to the Council.

Order of precedence.

4. For all purposes connected with the Council, the precedence and seniority of Councillors shall be regulated as follows:

After the Chairman shall rank the Councillors in order of the priority of their nomination or election, and in the case of former Councillors re-nominated or re-elected, of the priority of their continuous membership of Council (such continuous membership being deemed to be unimpaired during the absence of a nominated member for whom a temporary successor has been nominated).

Minutes.

5. Minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the Council shall be drawn up and fairly entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall be signed by the Chairman after each meeting and shall at all reasonable times be open at the Municipal Office to the inspection, without charge, of any Councillor, and to the inspection of any other person on payment of a fee of twnety-five cents.

The minutes of each meeting shall be printed and At the next or some subsequent meeting the circulated. question shall be put that the minutes be taken as read and confirmed. In the absence of objection or correction, the

minutes as printed shall be confirmed.

Memorials petitions, &c.

- (a) A member presenting a petition or memorial to the Council may state concisely the purpose of the petition or memorial.
- (b) Any member presenting a petition or memorial or other communication will be held responsible for its contents being throughout respectful.

- (d) No debate shall be permitted on such motion nor shall any other member speak upon or in relation to such petition or memorial, except to second the motion formally.
- (e) Such motion being seconded, the question shall be put whether the petition or memorial shall be read.
- 8. In any cases wherein individual rights or interests Hearing may be affected by any act, order, or proceeding of Council, pet tioners all parties so affected may be heard upon petition before the Council when in Committee, either in person or by Counsel.
- 9. When it is intended to examine any witnesses, the List of petitioner or Councillor requiring such witnesses shall witnesses deliver to the Secretary, three days at least before the day appointed for their examination, a list containing the names, residences, and occupations of such witnesses.
- (a) Questions relating to Municipal affairs may be Questions. put to the Chairman.
- (b) At least four clear days' notice—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—shall be given of such questions.
- (c) A written reply shall be read by the Chairman to each question.
- (d) No member shall address the Council upon any question nor shall the terms of any question contain any argument or expression of opinion or statement of fact, except in so far as may be necessary to explain such question.
- (e) Any member may put a supplementary question for the purpose of further elucidating any matter of fact regarding which an answer has been given: Provided that the Chairman shall disallow any supplementary question if, in his opinion, it infringes the rules as to the subject-matter of questions, and in that case the question shall not appear on the record of the minutes of the Council.
- (a) Every notice of motion shall be in writing, Motions. signed by the member of the Council giving the notice, Unless such notice shall be in the hands of the Secretary four clear days-exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays-before the meeting of Council, the motion shall not be included in the agenda.
- (b) All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered as received, and shall be entered by the Secretary upon the agenda paper in the order in which they are received.
- (c) Before any notice of motion is placed on the agenda paper, it shall be submitted to the Chairman who, if he be of opinion that it is out of order, shall cause the giver of the notice to be so informed.
- (d) Every notice of motion shall be relevant to some question affecting the Municipal administration of Colombo.
- (e) No motion to rescind any resolution which has been passed within the preceding six months nor any motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived within the preceding six months shall be in order, unless notice thereof shall have been given and specified in the agenda, and the notice shall bear, in addition to the member who proposes the motion, the signatures of five other members; and when such motion has been disposed of, it shall not be competent for any member to propose a similar motion within a further period of six months.
- (f) No motion shall be deemed to have been submitted for debate until it shall have been proposed and seconded.
- : (g) Any member may second a motion or amendment by rising in his place and bowing to the Chair, without prejudice to his right to speak at a later period of the debate.
- (h) Every motion moved in Council, and of which previous notice has not been given, shall be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and handed to the Secretary.
- (i) When a motion has been made and seconded, and the debate thereon concluded, the question thereupon shall be put to the vote by the Chairman.

Withdrawal of motion or amendment. Existing By-laws.

12. A member who has made a motion or amendment may withdraw the same by leave of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon it after the mover has asked for permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

Reintroduction of motion.

13. A motion which has been withdrawn may be made again at any subsequent meeting; but no motion shall be proposed which is the same in substance as any motion which, within the period of six months referred to in rule 11 (e), shall have been resolved in the affirmative or negative.

Amendments.

- 14. (a) Every amendment shall be in writing and handed to the Secretary by the member proposing it.
- (b) Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.
 - (c) Every amendment shall be read before being moved.
- (d) No amendment shall be discussed or put to the Council until it shall have been seconded.
- (e) A member who has seconded an amendment in a formal manner shall be permitted afterwards to speak upon it.
- (f) Whenever an amendment upon an original motion has been moved and seconded, no second or subsequent amendment shall be moved until the first amendment shall have been disposed of. If an amendment be carried, the motion as amended, shall take the place of the original motion, and shall become the question upon which any further amendment may be moved.

Debate ceases when question fully put. 15. No member may speak to any question after the same has been fully put by the Chairman. A question is fully put when the voting has been taken thereon.

Voting and recording of votes.

- 16. (a) The question shall be put by the Chairman and the votes may be taken by a show of hands, and the result shall be declared by the Chairman; but any member may call for a division, when the votes shall be taken by the Secretary, asking each member separately, according to the order of precedence, how he desires to vote, and recording the votes accordingly.
- (b) On any question being put, either in Council or in Committee of the whole Council, every member present shall, unless he declines to vote, record his vote either for the ayes or noes.
- (c) In the event of a member declining to vote, the Secretary, in case a division has been called for, shall enter his name upon the minutes as having declined to vote.

of Chairman.

- (d) The Chairman shall have an original vote in common with the other members of the Council, as also a casting vote if upon any question the votes are equal.
- (e) When the Council is in Committee of the whole Council, the Chairman shall have an original vote in common with the other members, and also a casting vote if upon any question the votes shall be equal.

Members dissenting. 17. It shall be competent for any Councillor who is in a minority to record the reasons of his dissent from the opinion of the majority and such written dissent, if sent to the Secretary within one week of the Council Meeting in question, shall be entered by the Secretary at the end of his minutes of the proceedings.

Order of the

18. The "Order of the Day" shall include all business to be transacted, arranged according to Rule 3. Unless otherwise resolved, the business shall be taken in the order printed.

Preservation of order.

- 19. (a) It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order, and his decision on all disputed points of order shall be final.






